

*Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics*

*Big Ten/Iowa Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena*

*April 4, 2019*

Chair Matheson called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

**I. Approval of Minutes - March 5, 2019**

Colin moved to approve the March 5, 2019, minutes. Dillavou seconded the motion. Committee members granted unanimous approval.

**II. Discuss 2019-20 PCA Membership Turnover, Subcommittee Assignment, and Leadership Planning**

Chair Matheson announced Committee members Bowden, Bruhn, and Rhodes will end their terms on the PCA this summer. Two other members, Ryan and Yockey, plan to resign due to other time commitments and responsibilities. An email will be sent to remaining PCA members asking which subcommittees they would like to serve on for the 2019-20 academic year and if they have the interest to chair that subcommittee.

**III. Compliance Program - Clerry**

Clerry's PowerPoint entitled "The Role of Compliance" (enclosed) encompassed an overview of the Athletics Compliance Office staff and their roles & responsibilities. They work closely with Faculty Athletics Representatives (FARs) Grosland and Hollingworth adding much of the work completed by the Compliance Office staff requires FAR review and signature. She read the Compliance mission statement and described three components they focus on: education, monitoring, and enforcement.

Committee members posed questions throughout the presentation. Chair Matheson thanked Clerry. A round of applause followed.

***IV. Athletics Department Searches - Kehoe***

Kehoe reported the assistant football coach position will be advertised through Friday, April 5, 2019. This vacancy was created due to Coach Reese Morgan's retirement. Rhodes will serve on the search committee.

***V. Subcommittee Updates***

***A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Dillavou***

At the March 25, 2019, meeting, a question/answer session took place with five student-athletes to receive input on the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center, fueling stations, etc. Dillavou stated nothing of concern surfaced. Assistant Athletics Director for Sports Medicine and Performance Terry Noonan attended the meeting also to discuss student-athlete health and well-being.

The Student-Athlete Well-Being Subcommittee will meet next on April 22, 2019, at the Field House.

***B. Academic Achievement - Bowden***

In Bowden's absence, Chair Matheson reported Associate Vice President Brent Gage attended the subcommittee's last meeting to speak about the collaboration between UI Admissions, Student-Athlete Academic Services, and Athletics Compliance. Gage spoke highly of the positive communication lines between the three areas. Several student-athletes were present and shared their views. A good exchange of information took place.

***C. Equity - Osborn***

Associate Athletics Director for Human Resources Hilleman spoke to subcommittee members on coaches compensation, focusing on equity. Osborn noted there were no concerns.

The Equity Subcommittee will meet again on April 24, 2019.

***VI. ISAAC Report - Gustafson, Colin***

Colin highlighted the following:

- A.** Nominees for various Golden Herky awards were voted upon at the March ISAAC meeting.

PCA members were reminded they are invited to the Golden Herkys on Tuesday, April 23, 2019, at Hancher Auditorium, 7:00 p.m.

- B.** The Annual Day of Caring takes place Sunday, April 28, 2019. Student-athletes will volunteer time and effort towards community service projects.

- C.** Student-athlete applicants for vacant positions on ISAAC outnumbered seats available. The outpouring was welcome news to ISAAC members.

- D. ISAAC Executive Board elections will take place soon.
- E. The University of Iowa Student Government (UISG) voted unanimously to create a permanent student-athlete liaison position to increase collaboration between UISG and student-athletes. The position is non-voting.

**VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth**

Burke announced the federal judge in the Alston case ruled the NCAA itself cannot bar schools from offering players compensation and benefits related to education in excess of their scholarship money and cost-of-attendance payments. This would include things like computers, postgraduate scholarships, pre/post eligibility tutoring. The NCAA and other conferences are appealing the ruling.

**VIII. Athletics Director's Report - Barta**

Burke presented the Athletics Director's report in Barta's absence.

- A. Highlights from the enclosed April sport report and schedule follow:
  - 1. The women's basketball team won the Big Ten Championship. Co-Big Ten Championship honors were attained by the wrestling team and men's gymnastics team.
  - 2. The men's basketball, women's basketball, and women's gymnastics teams participated in NCAA postseason competition. Swimming & diving, wrestling, and indoor track each had individuals who qualified to compete in NCAA postseason events.
  - 3. The University of Iowa hosted the Big Ten Men's Swimming and Diving Championships in February 2019. Iowa will host Big Ten Men's Gymnastics on April 5-6, 2019, as well as the Big Ten Men's and Women's Outdoor Track on May 10-12, 2019.
  - 4. Wrestling student-athlete Spencer Lee was dubbed National Champion for the second time during his career at Iowa. The wrestling team finished in fourth place at the NCAA Championships. Six wrestlers received All-American honors.
  - 5. Men's basketball earned the program's 26<sup>th</sup> appearance in NCAA competition. The Iowa Hawkeyes were nationally-ranked for 16 straight weeks.
  - 6. Women's basketball matched their program record with 29 wins. This year marked their fourth appearance in the Elite 8.

The University of Iowa hosted the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Iowa set a new overall NCAA attendance record at a first/second round site with a two-day total of 23,096 individuals.

7. Megan Gustafson was just named Associated Press Player of the Year.
8. Women's rowing is currently ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the country. The Hawkeyes will host their lone home meet of the year at Lake MacBride on April 12-13, 2019.
9. Softball and baseball have begun their seasons.
10. The Musco Twilight Track and Field meet will be held April 13, 2019, at the Cretzmeyer Track & Field Complex on the UI campus.
11. Men's golf will host the Hawkeye Invitational on April 20-21, 2019, at Finkbine Golf Course.
12. Women's golf competes April 11-13, 2019, in Athens, GA.
13. Spring football practice has begun.

**B.** The following facilities report was presented by Burke:

1. Work has begun at Finkbine Golf Course to build a new clubhouse.
2. The north end zone renovation project is on schedule.
3. Kinnick Stadium turf replacement is underway. Water intrusion on two occasions necessitated that the turf be removed to ensure the drainage system is working correctly.

**C.** Athletics Department staff members continue work on the development of a new Strategic Plan.

**D.** Football ticket renewals are underway.

# APRIL REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## BASEBALL

**Season Record:** 16-10 Overall, 3-3 B1G

**Head Coach:** Rick Heller

**Next Event:** Friday vs. Rutgers at 6:05 p.m. – Duane Banks Field - Iowa City, Iowa

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes are on a five-game winning streak including a three-game sweep of No. 23 Illinois. It was Iowa's first series sweep over a top-25 team since 2015.

Iowa's pitching staff only gave up 10 runs in the past five games and got contributions from many arms. Sophomore Trenton Wallace threw 7 1/3 innings throughout the week earning a win versus Bradley and a save versus No. 23 Illinois on Saturday. Reliever Grant Leonard earned a win on Friday and a save on Sunday versus No. 23 Illinois. Leonard has six saves this season, which rank for second-most in the Big Ten. Grant Judkins threw seven innings and got the win on Sunday, allowing only one run to lower his ERA to 1.67, which is the fourth-best in the conference. Iowa's team ERA of 3.99 ranks fifth in the Big Ten.

Offensively, junior catcher Austin Martin has been Iowa's best, most consistent hitter batting .345 with two home runs and 14 RBIs. Martin's batting average ranks eighth in the Big Ten. Sophomore Izaya Fullard, who is hitting .292, is on a nine-game hitting streak. Iowa's offense leads the Big Ten in walks (126), second in stolen bases (32), fourth in on-base percentage (.368), and eighth in batting average (.259).

Iowa's defense has the fourth-best fielding percentage in the Big Ten at .970.

## MEN'S BASKETBALL

**Season Record:** 23-12 Overall, 10-10 B1G

**Head Coach:** Fran McCaffery

**Notables:** Iowa finished its season in sixth place in the Big Ten and earned the program's 26th NCAA Tournament appearance. Its 23 season wins are the second highest total in 13 seasons and most under Fran McCaffery for an NCAA Tournament team. Iowa was nationally-ranked for 16 straight weeks in either the Associated Press or Coaches Poll (Nov. 19, 2018 – Feb. 25, 2019).

Iowa, seeded 10th, rallied from a 13-point deficit to upend No. 7 seed and 22nd-ranked Cincinnati (79-72) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in

Columbus, Ohio. The win was Iowa's fifth over a nationally-ranked opponent this season equaling the most by an Iowa team in the Fran McCaffery era. It also marked Iowa's second win as a lower seed in the Round of 64 in program history. The Hawkeyes rallied from a 25-point deficit to force overtime against second-seeded and sixth-ranked Tennessee, but the Volunteers ultimately prevailed, 83-77. The 25-point comeback equaled the largest comeback in NCAA Tournament history.

Fran McCaffery has guided Iowa to 20 wins or more in five of the last seven seasons and upper division finishes in the Big Ten six of the last seven seasons.

Four Hawkeyes earned postseason recognition from the Big Ten. Tyler Cook was voted to the all-conference second team; Jordan Bohannon was a third team honoree; Luka Garza earned honorable mention accolades; Joe Wieskamp was selected to the five-player All-Big Ten Freshman Team. Cook was also selected to the USBWA and NABC all-district teams.

Nicholas Baer is Iowa's lone graduating senior, who finished his Hawkeye career as the only player to total more than 750 points, 500 rebounds, 100 steals, 100 assists, 100 blocks, and 100 three-pointers made.

## WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

**Season Record:** 29-7 Overall, 14-4 B1G

**Head Coach:** Lisa Bluder

**Notables:** Iowa's 29 wins in 2018-19 matches a program record. The Hawkeyes also won 29 games in in 1987-99 (29-2).

The Hawkeyes made the program's fourth appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight and its first since 1993. Iowa defeated Mercer (66-61) and Missouri (68-52) in the NCAA First and Second Rounds in Iowa City on March 22-24. The Hawkeyes went on to beat NC State, 79-61, in the Sweet Sixteen in Greensboro, North Carolina on March 30.

Iowa claimed the 2019 B1G Tournament Title with a 90-76 win over top-seeded Maryland on March 10. It marked Iowa's first conference title since 2001. The Hawkeyes defeated Rutgers, 72-67, in the semifinal and Indiana, 90-76, in the quarterfinals to advance to the championship game. Senior Megan Gustafson was named the Big Ten Tournament's Most Valuable



Player, while senior Hannah Stewart was named to the All-Tournament team.

Senior Megan Gustafson ended her career as the most decorated Hawkeye in program history. The two-time Big Ten Player of the Year was named the unanimous ESPNW National Player of the Year. She is a finalist for every major Player of the Year award including the Wade Trophy (WBCA), Ann Meyers Drysdale Award (USBWA), John R. Wooden Award, Naismith Trophy, and the AP Player of the Year.

### **MEN'S GOLF**

**Head Coach:** Tyler Stith

**Next Event:** April 20-21 at Hawkeye Invitational - Finkbine Golf Course in Iowa City

**Notables:** Iowa only had one competition during the month of March; the Hawkeyes earned its fifth top-10 finish of the season placing fourth out of 14 teams at the Colleton River Collegiate.

Alex Schaake finished runner-up at the Colleton River Collegiate. The junior tied a career best finish and earned his third best individual finish for Iowa this season with a second-place score of 209 (-7). It is his team leading fourth top-10 finish and fifth top-20 finish this season. The native of Omaha, Nebraska, posted three straight rounds at or below par with a third-round score of 71 (-1), giving him a team leading 14 rounds at or below par this season.

Freshman Gonzalo Leal Montero leads the team with a 70.47 scoring average. Schaake leads the team with four top-10 finishes, five top-20 finishes, and 14 rounds at or below par. Senior Matthew Walker has the low-round on the team with a 66 (-5).

### **WOMEN'S GOLF**

**Head Coach:** Megan Menzel

**Next Event:** April 11-13 at Liz Murphy Collegiate Classic - Athens, Georgia

**Notables:** Freshman Manuela Lizarazu led the Hawkeyes through three rounds, earning an eighth-place finish at the Bruzzy Challenge on April 1-2. Iowa finished 13<sup>th</sup> with a three-round score of 899 (+35).

Sophomore Brett Permann tallied a final round score of 74 (+2) to finish with a career-best 54-hole score of 219 (+3) at the Bruzzy Challenge.

Senior Kristin Glesne notched a personal-best, 18-hole score of 68 (-4) during the third round of the Hawkeye-El Tigre Invite on March 23. She finished with a three-round score of 226 (+10), tying for 26th.

### **MEN'S GYMNASTICS**

**Season Record:** 5-4 Overall, 4-3 B1G

**Head Coach:** JD Reive

**Next Event:** Friday-Saturday at B1G Championships - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City, Iowa

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes defeated two higher ranked teams in March including No. 7 Nebraska (406.700-403.550) and No. 3 Michigan. Iowa posted 11 career-bests and eight season bests to top the Corn Huskers.

Iowa scored a 408.250, its highest team score of the year, to beat the No. 3 Wolverines in Ann Arbor.

Stewart Brown captured Freshman of the Week honors after placing third on vault and parallel bars to help Iowa defeat the Wolverines.

Iowa captured a share of the Big Ten regular-season title at a tri-meet with Minnesota and Penn State. Senior Jake Brodarzon and junior Andrew Herrador took the crown on rings and high bar respectively, to lead the Hawkeyes to a second place finish at the meet.

### **WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS**

**Season Record:** Ranked 32 in Country (Road to Nationals Poll 3/25) RQS : 195.705

**Head Coach:** Larissa Libby

**Next Event:** Thursday at NCAA Corvallis Regional - 4 p.m. (CT)

**Notables:** The GymHawks qualified for their 19<sup>th</sup> Regional appearance under head coach Larissa Libby. Iowa is set to compete at the Corvallis Regional on April 4-6. There are three rounds at the NCAA Regional. The top two teams in the third round of the Regional will qualify for the National Championships in Fort Worth, Texas April 19-20.

Libby and the GymHawks competed at the B1G Championships March 23 and took sixth out of 10 with a score of 196.075 - their third highest score of the season.

Freshman Lauren Guerin scored her sixth 9.900 of the season. Iowa had three gymnastics named to the All-Big Ten teams. Junior Clair Kaji was named to the first team, while senior Nicole Chow and freshman Lauren Guerin were named to the second team.

## **SOFTBALL**

**Season Record:** 15-15 Overall, 1-5 B1G

**Head Coach:** Renee Gillispie

**Next Event:** Friday at Wisconsin - 5 p.m.

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes rank first in the Big Ten with 12 triples on the season, leading the conference by two, and rank 12th in the country with .40 per game.

Sophomore Aralee Bogar is 21-for-23 stealing bases this season. She leads the Big Ten with 21 stolen bases and has stolen a base in 11 of her last 15 games.

Junior Allison Doocy was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on March 11 following her performance at the Saluki Invitational. Doocy tossed two complete games, striking out 19 and giving up only two runs in 18 innings of work.

The Hawkeyes have been quick to strike. In games, the Hawkeyes score first, they are 14-1 and Iowa is 10-1 when scoring in the first inning.

## **MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

**Season Record:** 6-2 Overall, 3-2 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Notables:** Senior Will Brenner, sophomore Anton Hoherz and sophomore Jonatan Posligua competed at the NCAA Zone D Diving Championships from March 11-13. Brenner (1-meter) and Hoherz (platform) earned NCAA Championship qualifying standards, returning to Austin two weeks later.

At the NCAA Championships, Brenner recorded a score of 227.05 to earn 44th overall. Hoherz capped the season for the Hawkeyes with a score of 250.40, reaching 40th overall.

## **WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

**Season Record:** 6-6 Overall, 2-4 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Notables:** Freshman Sam Tamborski and sophomore Jayah Mathews both earned NCAA Championships qualifying standards at the 2019 NCAA Zone D Diving Championships in Austin, Texas from March 11-13.

Tamborski, Mathews, and junior Hannah Burvill competed at the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas, March 21-23. Tamborski placed 19th on the 3-meter springboard (304.55), while Mathews competed on the 1-meter (268.90) and 3-meter (281.55). Burvill placed 28th overall in the 200 free (1:45.89), broke the school record in the 100 free (48.92) and competed in the 50 free (22.87).

## **MEN'S TENNIS**

**Season Record:** 12-6 Overall, 3-2 B1G

**Head Coach:** Ross Wilson

**Next Event:** Friday vs. Penn State at 6 p.m. - Hawkeye Tennis & Recreation Complex - Iowa City

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes swept No. 18 Minnesota (4-3) and Wisconsin (4-3) to improve to 3-0 in Big Ten play for the first time since 1998. The two wins marked the first time in 30 years that Iowa swept border rivals Minnesota and Wisconsin in the same season.

Sophomore Will Davies leads the way with a team-best 14 wins in singles this spring. Freshman Oliver Okonkwo has won 20 total doubles matches (fall & spring), which ties for seventh all-time in a single-season in program history. Iowa, which was ranked as high as 41st in the country last month, will finish the regular season with five of their remaining matches played at the HTRC. The Hawkeyes boast a 10-1 record in Iowa City this spring.

## **WOMEN'S TENNIS**

**Season Record:** 10-8 Overall, 2-4 B1G

**Head Coach:** Sasha Schmid

**Next Event:** Friday vs. Rutgers at 2 p.m. - Hawkeye Tennis & Recreation Complex - Iowa City

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes opened a five-game home stand with wins over Purdue (4-1) and Indiana (4-3) last weekend. Iowa is 6-1 at the Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Complex this season.

Freshman Sophie Clark and junior Elise van Heuvelen Treadwell lead Iowa with 10 wins apiece. Van Heuvelen has three wins at the No. 1 singles spot. Freshman Samantha Mannix has four wins at the top spot. Van Heuvelen and Mannix have held down the top two spots in the singles lineup all season.

## **MEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** Friday-Saturday at Sun Angel Classic-Tempe, Arizona

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes qualified eight men, including two alternates, for the 2019 NCAA Indoor Championships on March 8-9, including Karayme Bartley, Chris Douglas, Mar'yea Harris, Collin Hofacker, Wayne Lawrence Jr., Jaylan McConico, Chris Thompson, and Antonio Woodard. Bartley (200 meters), Douglas (60-meter hurdles), and the 4x400-meter relay team consisting of Hofacker, Bartley, Lawrence, and Harris earned first-team honors. McConico (60-meter hurdles) and Lawrence (400 meters) earned second team honors. Collectively with the women, the Hawkeyes tied the most All-American honors in school history with eight first team and six second team.

At the Florida Relays, the 4x400-meter relay team, including Lawrence, Woodard, Hofacker, and Harris won for the first time with the third fastest time (3:03.10) in school history.

## **WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** Friday-Saturday at Sun Angel Classic-Tempe, Arizona

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes qualified four women (ranked in the top 16) for the 2019 NCAA Indoor Championships on March 8-9, including Briana Guillory, Jenny Kimbro, Tria Simmons, and Laulauga Tausaga. Guillory and Tausaga earned first team All-America honors in the 400 meters and weight throw, respectively. Kimbro and Simmons competed in the pentathlon, and Tausaga competed in shot put, earning second team All-America honors. Collectively with the men, the Hawkeyes tied the most All-American honors in school history with eight first team and six second team.

## **WRESTLING**

**Season Record:** 14-1, 9-0 B1G

**Head Coach:** Tom Brands

**Next Event:**

**Notables:** Sophomore Spencer Lee won the 125-pound title at the 2019 NCAA Championships on March 23. The Hawkeyes placed fourth as a team, crowning six All-Americans – Lee, Austin DeSanto (133), Pat Lugo (149), Kaleb Young (157), Alex Marinelli (165), and Jacob Warner (197). All six All-Americans return next season.

Marinelli won a Big Ten title at 165 pounds on March 10. It was the 200<sup>th</sup> individual Big Ten championship in program history.

A school-record 13 Hawkeye wrestlers earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, and the Hawkeyes led the nation in average attendance (8,826) for the 13<sup>th</sup> year in a row.
