

*Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics*

The PCA was brought to order by Chair Hollingworth at 4:00 p.m.

**I. Head Coach Introduction - Tom Brands, Wrestling**

Barta introduced Head Wrestling Coach Tom Brands. Coach Brands was named the Head Wrestling Coach in 2006.

The Hawkeyes placed third in the country at the NCAA Championships this year. Coach Brands spoke about the NCAA Championship and how his coaches and team strive to be the best. Freshman wrestler Spencer Lee was crowned NCAA Champion; five wrestlers received All-American honors.

Committee members posed questions to Coach Brands. Barta asked him to talk about the 2018 Men's Freestyle World Cup taking place in Carver-Hawkeye Arena this weekend. The Convention and Visitors Bureau staff is working in conjunction with University of Iowa and the Iowa Athletics Department personnel to host the premier event. World-renowned wrestlers from eight countries will compete. Former Iowa wrestler and Big Ten Champion Thomas Gilman will participate in the 125 lb. weight class.

***II. Approval of the March 8, 2018, PCA Minutes***

Rhodes moved to approve the March 8, 2018, PCA minutes. Matheson seconded. Unanimous approval was granted by Committee members.

***III. PCA/FAR Leadership Transitions***

Chair Hollingworth announced President Harreld has appointed Matheson as Chair-Elect of the 2018-19 PCA Committee effective August 2018. The President extended Grosland's appointment as Faculty Athletics Representative for an additional five-year term. As of July 1, 2018, Hollingworth will take over the Faculty Athletics Representative role previously filled by Drake.

***IV. Women's Athletics Showcase Event - Burke***

An inaugural event to celebrate women's athletics at the University of Iowa entitled "herky's BRUNCH" will take place Saturday, May 5, 2018, 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., at the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center. Athletics Department staff intend to hold this event annually to cultivate female leadership inside and outside of the university.

***V. Underrepresented Student-Athlete Task Force: Barta, Burke, Tovar, Clerry, Hill***

Barta noted the Athletics Department's Strategic Plan contains a section devoted to diversity and explained that student-athlete graduation rates are reviewed annually. An ongoing concern regarding declining trends in rates for underrepresented student-athletes has prompted the creation of a Task Force. An update on the Task Force membership, goals, and timeline will be provided to PCA members in fall 2018.

***VI. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Dillavou***

Dillavou reported Gerke will be the PCA member on the search committee for an assistant athletic trainer position in football.

Chair Hollingworth reminded Committee members she may be in contact with them throughout the summer should additional staff searches take place requiring a PCA member.

***VII. Subcommittee Updates***

***A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Bruhn***

Chair Bruhn reported Tovar attended the subcommittee's last meeting to present the Hawkeye Life Program. Burke attended also to discuss the Student-Athlete Code of Conduct, which is currently under revision and will be finalized by fall 2018.

***B. Academic Achievement - Bowden***

The Academic Achievement Subcommittee will meet April 12, 2018, in the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center per Bowden.

***C. Equity - Matheson***

Matheson reported two minority student-athletes attended the last Equity Subcommittee meeting to discuss their experiences as underrepresented student-athletes at the University of Iowa. Hilleman attended as well to speak about coaches' compensation; she will attend the next subcommittee meeting to complete her report.

***VIII. ISAAC Report - Colin, Guagliardo***

The following highlights were presented:

- A.*** The annual Golden Herkys event takes place Wednesday, May 2, 7:00 p.m., at the Englert Theatre. Social media platforms will be used to promote the event. PCA members are welcome to attend.
- B.*** Executive Committee elections will take place at the next ISAAC meeting on Sunday, April 15, 2018. The Executive Committee is expanding leadership positions to include six additional members, each of who will represent one of the six pillars of the Hawkeye Life Program.
- C.*** Student-athletes interested in participating in the Care & Pace program are submitting applications. This program affords individuals to job shadow professionals in healthcare and other fields during the summer.
- D.*** The annual Hawkeye Day of Caring is Sunday, April 22, 2018. Twenty-four volunteer sites have been identified; over 250 student-athletes will participate. The HelperHelper app will track hours. To date, Iowa's rowing team has logged the highest number of community service hours. The next highest rankings are held by women's gymnastics and softball.
- E.*** ISAAC members toured the renovated Gerdin Athletic Learning Center last week. All were very impressed with the improvements.

***IX. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland***

- A.*** Barta will attend NCAA Transfer Working Group meetings April 15-18, 2018, in Indianapolis, IN.
- B.*** Big Ten Joint Group meetings take place May 14-15, 2018, in Chicago, IL.
- C.*** Condoleezza Rice is the Chair of a recently formed task force entitled "Commission on College Basketball." The charge of the group is to get control and improve collegiate basketball. The Commissions' recommendations will be presented to the NCAA Board of Directors on April, 25, 2018.

**X. Athletics Director's Report - Barta**

- A. Finkbine Golf Course opened today.
- B. The Gerdin Athletic Learning Center (GALC) held an open house for Athletics Department staff today. The GALC staff will move into their offices tomorrow.
- C. The Kinnick Stadium north end zone project is on schedule. Seats will be in place by the first football game. Restroom and concession areas will not be completed as expected; alternative options will be available.
- D. Athletics Department budget preparation is ongoing. Barta explained the potential impacts of the new tax reform laws and possible increases in tuition rates. Athletics staff have been instructed to anticipate a flat budget next year.

The Athletics Department budget will be presented to the PCA in fall 2018.

- E. Highlights from the attached April sports report and schedules follow:
  - 1. Baseball and softball team members have had wins over ranked opponents. Weather conditions have caused several games to be rescheduled.
  - 2. The rowing team is currently in 17<sup>th</sup> place in the nation.
  - 3. The women's gymnastics team will travel to Minneapolis, MN, to participate in the NCAA Regionals on Saturday, April 7, 2018.
  - 4. The men's gymnastics team will compete in the Big Ten Championships April 6-7, 2018, in Ann Arbor, MI.

# APRIL REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## BASEBALL

**Season Record:** 16-9 Overall, 3-2 B1G

**Head Coach:** Rick Heller

**Next Event:** Wednesday vs. Grand View; Saturday-Monday vs. Ohio State

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes won two of three games last weekend at No. 22 Illinois, giving Iowa its first road series victory over a ranked foe since the 2015 season. Iowa sits at 3-2 in the Big Ten with all three victories coming against ranked opponents.

Senior Tyler Copley is pacing the team with a .356 average with team-highs in doubles (10) and RBIs (24). Junior Robert Neustrom has a .347 average with 25 runs, 35 hits, and five home runs.

On the mound, Iowa has used the same starting weekend rotation throughout the season. Friday night starter Nick Allgeyer is 3-2 with a 2.45 ERA, while junior Brady Schanuel has a team high four wins. Junior Cole McDonald notched his second victory on April 1, going 6 1/3 innings in the series-clinching win at No. 22 Illinois.

## WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

**Season Record:** 24-8 Overall, 11-5 B1G

**Head Coach:** Lisa Bluder

**Notables:** Iowa ended the season with a 24-8 overall record and an 11-5 mark in Big Ten action. The Hawkeyes finished third overall in the conference.

The Hawkeyes made their 25th NCAA Tournament appearance and their first since 2015, earning a No. 6 in the Kansas City region. The Hawkeyes fell to 11th-seeded Creighton, 76-70, inside Pauley Pavilion on the campus of UCLA.

Iowa has made 11 consecutive postseason appearances (9 NCAA, 2 WNIT). The Hawkeyes have made a postseason appearances in 17 of head coach Lisa Bluder's 18 seasons at the helm of the program.

Junior Megan Gustafson was named an All-American by several outlets. They include Sports Illustrated (first team), the Associated Press (second team), USBWA (second team), College Sports Madness (second team), USA Today (second team), and ESPNW (third team).

Gustafson was named the Big Ten Player of the Year by the media on Feb. 26. She became the fifth Hawkeye in program history to be named the Big Ten Player of the Year and the first to do so since 1998. She joins former Hawkeye honorees Michelle Edwards (1988), Franthea Price (1990), Toni Foster (1993), and Tangela Smith (1998). Gustafson is the only Hawkeye to earn the award as a junior. Gustafson was also a unanimous first team All-Big Ten selection by coaches and media. It marked the second All-Big Ten honor of her career.

Gustafson finished the season as the nation's leader in points per game (25.7), field goal percentage (67.1), and field goals made (320). She also ranked third in double-doubles (28) and total points (823), fourth in defensive rebounds per game (9), fifth in rebounds per game (12.8), sixth in total rebounds (411), and ninth in free throws made (183).

Sophomore Kathleen Doyle was named a second team All-Big Ten selection by league coaches and an Honorable Mention honoree by the media. In 16 conference games, Doyle averaged 12.6 points, a Big Ten-best 7.5 assists, 3.3 rebounds, and 2.0 steals. Junior Hannah Stewart was named Iowa's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

## MEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Tyler Stith

**Next Event:** April 14-15 - Hawkeye Invitational in Iowa City

**Notables:** Iowa finished eighth out of 18 teams in the Southern Intercollegiate with sophomore Alex Schaake registering his third top-five finish of the year at two-under-par.

The Hawkeyes recorded their second lowest 18-hole team score of the season on March 17 in the second round of the Schenkel Invitational with a nine-under-par (279). Schaake shot three-under-par to tie for 12th, while junior Matthew Walker shot one-under-par to tie for 23rd.

Schaake leads the team in strokes per round (71.70), top-10 finishes (3), and rounds at or below par (9). He has been Iowa's top finisher in the three stroke-play events of the spring.

## WOMEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Megan Menzel

**Next Event:** Saturday-Sunday vs. Bradley University at Burlington, Iowa

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes have a stroke average of 76.1 for the spring season. Senior Jessica Ip leads the team with a stroke average of 75. Freshman Rachel Fujitani carded her first career top-20 finish at the Bruzy Challenge (T-13th) earlier this week.

## MEN'S GYMNASTICS

**Season Record:** 6-9 Overall, 2-7 B1G

**Head Coach:** JD Reive

**Next Event:** Friday-Saturday at Big Ten Championships - Ann Arbor, Michigan

**Notables:** The #9 Hawkeyes upset Big Ten foe Minnesota and Air Force in a tri-meet on March 11.

Senior Austin Hodges broke his own school record on pommel horse for the second time this season (14.850) at Nebraska on March 24.

Senior Dylan Ellsworth tied the school record on vault (14.950) at Nebraska on March 24.

## WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

**Season Record:** 5-7 Overall, 3-2 B1G

**Head Coach:** Larissa Libby

**Next Event:** Saturday at NCAA Regional - Minneapolis, Minnesota

**Notables:** The GymHawks are one of 36 teams nationally and one of eight Big Ten teams to qualify for NCAA regional competition. Iowa will compete against No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 12 Kentucky, No. 13 Denver, No. 24 Minnesota, and Iowa State in the Minneapolis regional. Individual competitors from Utah State, Air Force, Wisconsin-La Crosse, Wisconsin-Eau Claire, Wisconsin-Stout and Wisconsin-Whitewater will also be present.

Iowa posted a season-best 196.400 to finish fourth at the Big Ten Championships on March 24. The Hawkeyes registered a season-high 49.100 on vault, while eight GymHawks tallied 15 top-20 finishes during the competition. Sophomore Charlotte Sullivan was named to the Big Ten All-Championship team, while seniors Lanie Snyder and Nikki Youd, and junior Nicole Chow earned second team All-Big Ten honors.

## ROWING

**Head Coach:** Andrew Carter

**Next Event:** Saturday at Michigan, vs. Michigan State - Ann Arbor, Michigan

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes opened their spring slate at the Pac-12 Invite last weekend. No. 17 Iowa defeated No. 12 USC in the NCAA boat classes (I Varsity Eight, II Varsity Eight, I Varsity 4).

## SOFTBALL

**Season Record:** 15-17 Overall, 1-4 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marla Looper

**Next Event:** Saturday-Monday vs. Wisconsin - Iowa City, Iowa

**Notables:** Sophomore pitcher Allison Doocy leads Iowa with a 1.34 ERA and 129 strikeouts in 115.0 innings pitched. The Ankeny, Iowa, native is third in the Big Ten with a 1.34 ERA and 129 strikeouts. After a career-high 15 strikeouts and a 2-0 weekend, Doocy was named co-Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on March 12. This was the first pitcher of the week award for Doocy and the first time a Hawkeye has earned the honor since Kayla Massey on March 31, 2014. Doocy was also selected as the College Sports Madness Big Ten Player of the Week on March 12.

Junior Mallory Kilian leads Iowa with a .341 batting average, a .591 slugging percentage, and a .450 on-base percentage. She has a career-high five stolen bases and a team-high 18 runs scored.

Freshman Aralee Bogar has 26 hits, 16 runs, 14 stolen bases, and a .255 batting average during her time in black and gold. She is fourth in the Big Ten with 14 stolen bases. She is currently a perfect 14-for-14 in stolen base attempts. She is the only student-athlete in the top five with a perfect stolen base percentage.

The Hawkeyes picked up their third win over a ranked opponent on March 23 when they defeated No. 17 Michigan, 4-3, ending the Wolverines 18-game win streak.

It is the first time Iowa has defeated three ranked opponents in a season since 2014 when Iowa topped No. 23 Northwestern (4-3) and No. 13/15 Michigan twice, 3-1 and 13-8.

## **MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

**Season Record:** 5-1 Overall, 4-0 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes finished in 39th place at the NCAA Championships with two team points, courtesy of the All-America 200-yard freestyle relay.

The quartet of junior Jack Smith, sophomore Will Scott, junior Matt Kamin, and sophomore Joe Myhre posted a school-record time of 1:17.46 to earn the All-America distinction and earn a spot in the consolation finals. The relay went on to finish 16th with a time of 1:18.17.

Smith also competed individually in the 100 free, where he went finished 33rd with a time of 43.39 seconds.

In the classroom, Iowa had eight student-athletes garner Academic All-Big Ten recognition.

## **WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

**Season Record:** 5-4 Overall, 2-4 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Notables:** Iowa had three student-athletes compete at the 2018 NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio in sophomores Hannah Burvill (100 free, 200 free), Thelma Strandberg (platform), and freshman Jayah Mathews (1-meter).

Burvill broke a school record in the 100 freestyle, finishing with a time of 48.94 seconds to place 37th in the prelims.

In the classroom, the Hawkeye women had 16 student-athletes garner Academic All-Big Ten recognition, including senior Summer Campbell, who had a perfect 4.0 GPA.

## **MEN'S TENNIS**

**Season Record:** 12-10 Overall, 2-3 B1G

**Head Coach:** Ross Wilson

**Next Event:** Friday at Dayton and at No. 3 Ohio State.

**Notables:** Iowa has won three of its last four matches. The Hawkeyes boast two nationally ranked tandems in No. 51 Jonas Larsen and Kareem Allaf and No. 62 Piotr Smietana and Will Davies. Larsen/Allaf have posted four wins over nationally-ranked opponents. Senior Jake Jacoby has ascended to ninth in career doubles wins at Iowa with 56. Iowa has not lost a doubles match on court three since March 2.

Iowa is 11-4 this season in home matches. Iowa has won the doubles point 16 out of 21 times this season.

The Hawkeyes will end the month of April by hosting the Big Ten Tournament at the HTRC, April 26-29.

## **WOMEN'S TENNIS**

**Season Record:** 9-10 Overall, 1-5 B1G

**Head Coach:** Sasha Schmid

**Next Event:** Saturday at Maryland and Sunday at Rutgers

**Notables:** Sophomore Elise van Heuvelen and senior Anastasia Reimchen are ranked No. 47 in the country with a 7-2 doubles record.

Van Heuvelen leads Iowa with 12 wins in singles. Half of those wins have come from the No. 1 position. The other have have come from No. 2 singles.

Iowa will recognize seniors Montana Crawford, Zoe Douglas, and Reimchen on April 22 at the HTRC during Iowa's match against Wisconsin. The trio has combined for 174 singles wins since arriving on campus in 2014.

Adrienne Jensen, a walk-on senior from Iowa City who joined the team in late March due to injuries and illness on the roster, will also be recognized.

## **MEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** Saturday at the Battle on the Bayou - Baton Rouge, Louisiana

**Notables:** The men's 4x400 meter relay ranks third in the country after the Florida Relays. Iowa ran 3:04.38 to place seventh on Iowa's all-time performers list.

Sophomore Nate Mylenek is 10th in the nation after running a personal best 8:48.66 in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. Mylenek is now second in school history behind former All-American Deacon Jones' school record from 1956.

Junior Reno Tuufuli is fifth in the nation in the discus throw with a mark of 193-feet 8-inches (59.03m). He leads the Big Ten.

Three Hawkeyes were named Big Ten Athletes of the Week on March 21. Three weekly honors are the most in a single week in program history, and 14 of Iowa's 36 Big Ten weekly honors have been under Director of Track and Field Joey Woody.

## **WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** Saturday at the Battle on the Bayou - Baton Rouge, Louisiana

**Notables:** Senior Brittany Brown holds the fourth-fastest 200 meter time in the country (22.83). The three-time Big Ten Champion was also on Iowa's school-record setting 4x200-meter relay at the Florida Relays. They finished with a time of 1:35.11. She was joined by freshman Kyara Avant, senior Sheridan Champe, and sophomore Sarah Plock.

Junior Andrea Shine bested her previous top time in the 10,000 meters by 59 seconds when she clocked a 33:50.25 at the Stanford Invitational last weekend. It was the fastest 10,000-meter race for Iowa in 10 years and places her sixth in school history.

## **WRESTLING**

**Season Record:** 12-3 Overall, 6-3 B1G

**Head Coach:** Tom Brands

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes finished the 2017-18 season with one NCAA individual champion (Spencer Lee, 125), five All-Americans, and 10 academic All-Big Ten honors.

Iowa sent nine wrestlers to the national tournament, placing third overall. It marks the 10th time in 12 years Iowa placed fourth at the NCAA Championships. Iowa scored 97 team point - including 30.5 bonus points in the tournament, their highest total since setting the team scoring record in 1997 (33.5).

The Hawkeyes return all but the 13 points scored by senior Brandon Sorensen next season. Sorensen became the 20th four-time All-American in school history.

Spencer Lee won the 125-pound national title. He rolled through the championship bracket, scoring more team points than any of the 330 competitors in the tournament.
