Chair Hollingworth called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

I. Head Coach Introduction - Andrew Carter

Chair Hollingworth introduced Head Rowing Coach Andrew Carter. Coach welcomed the PCA to the home of Iowa rowing--the P. Sue Beckwith, M.D., Boathouse. He spoke about the facility, team composition and competition, and recruiting. The Hawkeye rowing team is currently ranked thirteenth in the nation.

II. Tour of the P. Sue Beckwith, M.D., Boathouse - Rod Lehnertz, Andrew Carter, Troy Lyons

Tour guides Lyons, Lehnertz, and Carter provided input on the construction, engineering, and use of the boathouse throughout the excursion. Each addressed expertise about the design of the facilities that includes special features to withstand flooding, the mechanics of the rowing tanks, ergonomic room, medical and training spaces, boats and associated equipment, other entities that use the facility, safety, etc. The building was the first LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certified building on the UI campus; it was also the first building named solely after the UI's first female benefactor P. Sue Beckwith, M.D. PCA members posed questions throughout the tour. Chair Hollingworth thanked everyone for the input.

III. Approval of the March PCA Minutes

Friestad moved to approve the minutes of the March 7, 2017, meeting. Rhodes seconded the motion. Full approval was granted from Committee members.

IV. Athletics Department Searches - Dillavou

Searches are underway for two assistant swimming coaches. Ryan will serve on the search committees; Dillavou will provide support as needed.

Kelly reported a discussion was held regarding end-of-year meetings with student-athletes in various sports. Exceptions to the Missed-Class Days' Policy were also addressed.

C. Equity - Bowden

Bowden stated Equity Subcommittee members toured Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Associate Athletics Director Curtis led the tour.

He added the high numbers of student-athletes in the rowing program helps the Athletics Department staff to meet equity numbers.

- C.*** The Golden Herky Awards is scheduled for May 3, 2017, at the Englert Theatre, downtown Iowa City. The Golden Carpet begins at 7:15 p.m.; program starts at 8:00 p.m. and concludes at 9:00 p.m. PCA members were reminded they are welcome to attend.

VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Drake, Grosland

- A.** Drake reported the Big Ten Joint Group meeting will be held May 15-16, 2017, in Chicago, IL.
- B.** Barta added the NCAA Board of Directors will meet April 12-14, 2017. Clerry is on the NCAA Legislative Committee and will be in attendance to represent the Big Ten Conference and the University of Iowa. The directors will vote on the football package that includes adding a tenth football coach, a change in the football calendar, baseball items, health and safety items, and time management issues.

VIII. Athletics Director's Report

- A.** Highlights from the April sports report and schedules (enclosed) were given by Barta:

- 1.** Postseason competition in the WNIT and NIT provided young team members good experience. Attendance records at both the men's and women's events outpaced other schools.

Ally Disterhoft's name is in the history books as Iowa's career scoring leader.

Coach Bluder is one win away from 700 career victories.

Former basketball student-athlete Jarrod Uthoff recently signed a professional contract to play for the Dallas Mavericks.

Senior basketball player Peter Jok won the 3-point shooting contest held as part of the festivities during the NCAA Final Four. He is the first Hawkeye to win this event.

- 2.** The wrestling team competed in the Big Ten Wrestling Championships and the NCAA Wrestling Championships. Cory Clark became a National Champion and was recognized by the Iowa State Senate and House of Representatives on March 29, 2017. The Hawkeye team captured fourth place at the NCAA Championship.

- 3.** Head Women's Gymnastics Coach Larissa Libby received Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Two gymnasts will compete at the NCAA Championships on April 14-15, 2017, in St. Louis, MO. Senior Angel Metcalf will compete in the all-around; freshman Clair Kaji will compete on the beam.

- 4.** Head Rowing Coach Andrew Carter and his team are currently ranked thirteenth in the country.
- 5.** The UI baseball team is on a seven-game winning streak.

6. Men's gymnastics will be at the Big Ten Championships in Champaign, IL, this weekend.
- B.** Work is ongoing to develop the FY2017-18 budget.
- C.** The Kinnick North End Zone project is underway. Underground utility work has begun. New turf will be installed this summer.
- D.** Upcoming facility improvements will take place at the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center and at Finkbine Golf Course. The Athletics Department 10-year plan includes upgrades to the softball and baseball facilities.
- E.** Student-athlete exit interviews are underway. Input from these sessions will be shared with the Student-Athlete Well-Being Subcommittee, head coaches, and sport administrators.
- F.** Athletics staff members have been in Des Moines this week promoting the Iowa Hawkeye football team. The team will hold a practice there tomorrow night that is open to the public. Social media sites have been busy this week chatting about the Hawks.

APRIL REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

BASEBALL

Season Record: 18-9 Overall, 2-1 Big Ten

Head Coach: Rick Heller

Next Event: Friday-Sunday at Northwestern

Notables: The Hawkeyes have won a season-high seven games following their 4-3 come-from-behind victory over South Dakota State on Tuesday night at Duane Banks Field. It was the team's 18th straight midweek win dating back to the 2015 season. Iowa is a season-high nine games over .500.

Iowa finished its home stand with an 8-1 record, taking 2-of-3 games from Purdue in its Big Ten opener before sweeping UNLV last weekend.

Five Hawkeyes rank in the top 15 in the Big Ten in batting average with sophomore Robert Neustrom leading the team and sitting in third with a .366 average. Junior Jake Adams has a Big Ten-leading 11 home runs and 37 RBIs, while Neustrom has 30 RBIs. Adams is the first Hawkeye since 2007 to hit 10 or more home runs in a single season.

During Iowa's 8-1 home stand, the pitching staff posted a 2.00 team ERA and limited opposing hitters to a .220 average. Sophomore Zach Daniels went 4-0 during the stretch, running his season record to 6-1. The six victories are tied for the national lead. Junior Nick Gallagher is 3-1 with a 2.54 ERA in six starts and has 36 strikeouts to six walks.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 19-15 Overall, 10-8 Big Ten

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Notables: Iowa advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT before falling to eventual champion, TCU, in overtime (94-92) in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes beat South Dakota (87-75) in the first round. Iowa has advanced to postseason tournament play the last six seasons (3 NCAA, 3 NIT) under head coach Fran McCaffery.

Freshman Jordan Bohannon became the first Hawkeye in school history to register three straight double-doubles in points and assists. The point guard posted career bests in points (25) and assists (13) in the overtime loss to TCU.

Senior Peter Jok earned a couple additional postseason accolades in March. Jok was named to the five-player NABC All-District First Team and was a

Senior CLASS Award second team All-American. To be eligible for the Senior CLASS Award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

Jok also competed in the College 3-Point Championships in Phoenix as part of the Final Four activities on March 30. Jok became the first Hawkeye in school history to win the contest.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 20-14 Overall, 8-8 Big Ten

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Notables: Iowa advanced to the fourth round of the WNIT before falling to Washington State, 74-66, in Carver-Hawkeye Arena on March 26. The Hawkeyes ended the season with a 20-14 overall record, marking the 10th, 20-win season under head coach Lisa Bluder.

With 21 points against Missouri State on March 16, senior Ally Disterhoft became Iowa's all-time leading scorer. Disterhoft surpassed former Hawkeye Cindy Haugejorde's previous record of 2,059 set in 1980. She ended her career with 2,102 career points – the second most by any Hawkeye – male or female – in Iowa basketball history. Disterhoft also ended her career tied for seventh all-time in 3-point field goals made (162), 11th in blocks (78) and rebounds (788) and 14th in assists (313).

Sophomore Megan Gustafson broke the program's single-season rebounding record against Missouri State on March 16. She ended the season with 343 rebounds, shattering the previous record of 306 set by Amy Herrig in 1999. Gustafson scored 628 points on the year to become just the fourth Hawkeye in program history to score 600 points in a single season. She is the first person to accomplish the feat since 1990. In Iowa's second round WNIT contest against South Dakota, Gustafson scored a career-high 33 points on 15-of-16 shooting from the field while adding 13 rebounds. Her 15-of-16 (.938) shooting from the field is the best field goal percentage by an Iowa women's basketball player with a minimum of 15 attempts.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: Hawkeye Invitational - April 15-16 - Finkbine Golf Course - Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: The University of Iowa men's golf team finished first at the Chechessee Creek Club Dual, defeating Michigan State for the second time this season. The win came during the second round of the Big Ten Match Play where the Hawkeyes opened their season defeating MSU, 3-3, via a tiebreaker.

The Hawkeyes finished 7th at the Mason Rudolph Championship posting a 54-hole total of 854 (+2). Sophomore Matthew Walker led Iowa finishing in 15th carding a 210 (-3). Walker's tournament was highlighted with a 69 in the second round. This was his fourth top-20 of the season.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: April 21-23 at Big Ten Championships - Cincinnati, Ohio

Notables: The University of Iowa women's golf team hosted the first annual Hawkeye-El Tigre Invitational at El-Tigre Golf Club in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, earlier this week. The Hawkeyes finished 10th overall with a three-round total of 910 (+46). Four Hawkeyes notched top-35 finishes, including freshman Sophie Liu (T-24; +7; 223), juniors Morgan Kukla (T-28; +9 225) and Jessica Ip (T-31; +10; 226), and senior Jessie Sindlinger (T-35; +11; 227). Kukla's second round 71 (-1) marked a career low.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 6-10 Overall, 2-9 Big Ten

Head Coach: JD Reive

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at Big Ten Championships - Champaign, Illinois

Notables: Junior Austin Hodges' event title on parallel bars helped Iowa defeat Arizona State, 406.850-391.700, in a tri-meet with Minnesota on March 11.

Iowa defeated Big Ten foe Nebraska, 408.300-400.000 on senior night, winning event titles on the all-around, high bar, pommel horse, and rings.

Senior Cory Paterson set a season-best score of 14.400 on high bar, which marks the highest individual score on the apparatus this season.

Iowa won three event titles in a loss to Penn State, including the all-around, floor, and high bar,

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 15-6 Overall, 7-2 Big Ten

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Next Event: April 14-15 at NCAA Championships - St. Louis, Missouri

Notables: The No. 17 University of Iowa women's gymnastics team finished second (196.400) at the Big Five Meet to qualify for the night session of the Big Ten Championships. The GymHawks faced No. 11 Michigan (197.150), Penn State (195.450), Minnesota (194.825), and Rutgers (192.650) inside Carver-Hawkeyes Arena. Senior Mollie Drenth tied for the event title on beam with a score of 9.900, while senior Angel Metcalf finished at the top of the podium on bars with a career-high 9.950.

The GymHawks finished third at the 2017 Big Ten Championships (196.725) on March 18. The score marked their highest at the Big Ten Championships, improving from its previous high of 196.500 in 2015. Drenth took the title on beam with a score of 9.925.

Drenth and Metcalf were named to the Big Ten All-Championship Team for the third consecutive year and junior Lanie Snyder received her first such honor, while sophomore Nicole Chow collected the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. Head coach Larissa Libby was also named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year.

The GymHawks capped their season in NCAA Regional action with a third place finish (196.050). The team shattered the school record on beam with a score of 49.600, replacing the previous high of 49.425 in 2004. Metcalf and freshman Clair Kaji qualified as individuals for the NCAA Championships. Metcalf finished third in the all-around (39.300), while both Metcalf and Kaji finished at the top of the podium on beam (9.950). Metcalf will participate as an individual in the all-around, while Kaji will appear as an event specialist on beam.

ROWING

Head Coach: Andrew Carter

Next Event: Saturday vs. Ohio State and Rutgers - Bloomington, Indiana

Notables: The I Eight, II Eight, and I Four boats finished runner-up to Texas at the Longhorn Invitational March 25.

Iowa defeated Big Ten foe Michigan State, 63-54, and Louisville, 65-50 at the Double Dual April 1. The I Eight, II Eight, and I Four boats swept the Spartans and Cardinals.

SOFTBALL

Season Record: 8-21 Overall, 2-4 Big Ten

Head Coach: Marla Looper

Next Event: Friday-Sunday at Wisconsin

Notables: The Hawkeyes went 4-1 at the Hawkeye Invitational. Senior Claire Fritsch exploded at the plate during the tournament, going 6-for-7 with three doubles, three runs scored, and an RBI over a three-game stretch.

After falling in the first game at Purdue, Iowa's bats came alive with a 5-0 win in game two and an 8-3 series-winning victory in the rubber match.

Freshman Lea Thompson has 11 sacrifice hits this season. She currently leads both the conference and the nation with 0.46 sacrifice hits per game.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 6-3 Overall, 3-1 Big Ten

Head Coach: Marc Long

Notables: Senior Brandi Heffner, sophomore Matt Mauser and sophomore Will Brenner represented the Hawkeyes at the 2017 NCAA Zone D Diving Championships. Heffner placed 14th off the 1-meter (624.75) and 3-meter board (672.75). Mauser placed 18th off the 1-meter board (592.75) and 21st off the 3-meter board (299.70), while Brenner placed 20th off the 1-meter board (292.75).

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 8-4 Overall, 3-2 Big Ten

Head Coach: Marc Long

Notables: Seniors Emma Sougstad and Calli Head were named to the College Swimming and Diving Coaches Association of America Women's Division I All-America team.

Sougstad earned the second distinction of her Hawkeye career following her sixth-place finish in the 100-yard breaststroke at the NCAA Championships. A three-time NCAA qualifier, Sougstad posted a school-record time of 58.79 to garner first-team honors. The time is fifth-fastest all-time in Big Ten history.

Head garnered her first career All-America honor off the platform in the diving well. She finished sixth overall with a 280.45 score. Head, a three-time NCAA qualifier, finished her career as the co-school record holder off the platform with a 312.20.

MEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 11-9 Overall, 1-4 Big Ten

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Next Event: Saturday at Northwestern at Noon

Notables: Junior Jake Jacoby went on a seven match win streak with only one of those matches going to a third set. He has the best record on the team (12-5). Redshirt freshman Kareem Allaf is now 10-7 on the season. On April 2, he played in the top spot and defeated Penn State's Contant De La Bassetiere. Junior Josh Silverstein has two Big Ten wins over Minnesota's Stefan Milicevic and Penn State's Christian Lakoseljac.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 13-5 Overall, 3-3 Big Ten

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Next Event: Friday vs. Ohio State at 6 p.m. - Hawkeye Tennis & Recreation Center - Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: On March 11, the Hawkeyes won a Big Ten Conference match for the first time since March 2015, defeating Indiana, 6-1. The Hawkeyes have since won three conference matches under first-year head coach Sasha Schmid, and sit in eighth place in the Big Ten with five matches to go. The top 10 teams make the conference tournament, something Iowa has not done since 2014.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Notables: The 800-meter relay of junior O'Shea Wilson, senior Brendan Thompson, freshman Collin Hofacker and senior Jared Ganschow set the school record of 1:23.02 at the Florida Relays last weekend.

Sophomore Mar'yea Harris ranks third in the nation in the 400 meters after running 45.73 at the same meet.

Sophomore Reno Tuufuli was named co-Big Ten Field Athlete of the Week on March 22 following a personal best throw of 59.04m (193 feet, 8 inches) in the discus at the Baldy Castillo Invitational. He is currently fifth in the nation in the event.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Director: Joey Woody

Next Event: Thursday-Saturday at Jim Click Shootout - Tucson, Arizona

Notables: The Iowa women are led by freshman Laulauga Tausaga in the field events. Tausaga set the school record in the discus (56.10m, 184 feet, 1 inch) at the Florida Relays. She now ranks sixth in the nation and first in the Big Ten in that event.

The 1,600-meter relay team of sophomore Briana Guillory, junior Brittany Brown, senior Alexis Hernandez and sophomore Sheridan Champe ranks ninth in the country in the event (3:32.37) following their performance at the Florida Relays. That time ranks second all-time in Iowa history. Hernandez also set a personal best split during the race.

WRESTLING

Season Record: 13-2 Overall, 8-1 Big Ten

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Notables: Senior Cory Clark won the 133-pound NCAA title to lead the Hawkeyes to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships on March 18 in St. Louis.

Clark became the 54th Hawkeye in program history to win a national title, and the 19th wrestler to win four All-America honors.

Iowa sent four wrestlers to the semifinals and crowned five All-Americans, including Clark, senior Thomas Gilman (3rd/125), Brandon Sorensen (3rd/149), Michael Kemerer (3rd/157), and Sammy Brooks (4th/184).
