Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

The meeting was brought to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chair Hollingworth.

I. Approval of the November PCA Minutes

Courter moved to approve the minutes of the November 3, 2016, PCA meeting. Chang seconded the motion. Full approval was granted.

II. Paula Jantz Farewell

Chair Hollingworth announced that today will be Jantz' final attendance at a PCA meeting due to her retirement in February 2017. Jantz spoke of her background at the University of Iowa and stated she will treasure her time at the institution as well as the people with whom she has worked with over the past 36 years. A congratulatory round of applause was attributed to Jantz for her service.

III. Athletics Department Hiring Report - Jennifer Modestou

Attached is Modestou's PowerPoint presentation entitled "Hiring Activity Report" focusing on the Athletics Department's hiring practices for fiscal years 2014-2016. She stated the Athletics Department follows the same hiring procedures as other UI

departments. Recommended "Best Practices" are noted on slide 18. Chair Hollingworth thanked Modestou for the report.

IV. Athletics Department Searches - Dillavou

Dillavou reported Rhodes is serving on the search committee for an athletic trainer for women's gymnastics.

V. <u>Subcommittee Updates</u>

A. Student Athlete Well-Being - Chung

The Student Athlete Well-Being subcommittee toured the Jacobson Athletic Building in November 2016. Terry Noonan, Assistant Athletic Director for Sports Medicine and Sports Performance spoke to subcommittee members on the training and sports medicine programs for student-athletes and how he and his staff interact with the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and other areas of the UI to provide medical assistance to student-athletes. Tovar, Associate Athletics Director for Student-Athlete Academic Services, attended the meeting also to discuss student-athletes' practice and academic schedules with the group.

B. Academic Achievement - Kelly

Academic Achievement members met November 10, 2016. Chair Kelly reported a panel of student-athletes from several sports attended the subcommittee meeting to discuss common concerns; a discussion on the Missed Class Days policy took place as well.

Chair Kelly highlighted the announcement of a 90% Graduation Success Rate for student-athletes who entered the UI in the fall of 2009.

C. <u>Equity - Bowden</u>

Bowden stated Equity Subcommittee members met in November and were given a report by Modestou on the Athletics Department's hiring procedures. Tovar attended the meeting and spoke about academic monitoring of undergraduate student-athletes and the Graduation Success Rate (GSR). Seven sports teams (field hockey, men's golf, women's golf, women's gymnastics, men's tennis, women's tennis, and volleyball) scored a 100% GSR. Some of these sports have recorded a 100% GSR over a number of years.

VI. ISAAC Report - Woods

- A. ISAAC members adopted a family for the holidays. All sports teams are participating by providing gifts for each family member.
- **B.** Discussions are underway to elect a UI student-athlete to serve on the Big Ten Student Athlete Advisory Committee.

VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Jantz/Burke, Drake, Grosland

The NCAA Convention will take place January 2017. Student-athlete time demands and several football proposals will be voted upon.

VIII. PCA Manual Discussion and Vote

Chair Hollingworth stated the PCA Manual stipulates the rules and regulations by which Committee members operate. She noted updates to the manual have been made and asked for a vote for approval. Bowden moved to approve the PCA Manual; Courter seconded the motion.

Discussion on technical updates to the manual ensued. Chair Hollingworth stated the Missed Class Days Policy was updated to allow further consideration to the number of class days missed for a student-athlete competing in individual competitions, and to address student-athletes who are at academic risk.

The Student-Athlete Rights and Responsibilities Statement was revised to include a list of individuals who student-athletes can contact when they believe their rights have been violated. The responsibilities were updated to include a statement regarding unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature and aligns with statements in the UI Code of Student Life and Operations Manual.

Following the discussion, Chair Hollingworth called for a vote. Unanimous approval was recorded from Committee members. The PCA Manual will be finalized and posted on the UI President's website.

IX. Athletics Director's Report

G. Taylor presented the following report:

- *A.* The December sports report and schedules are enclosed.
 - *I.* Volleyball had 19 wins this past season. Head Coach Bond Shymansky is pleased with his team's progress.
 - 2. The field hockey team needed one win in the Big Ten Tournament to get into post season play but couldn't reach that goal. Senior Natalie Cafone was named the 2016 National Field Hockey Coaches Association's West Region Player of the Year.
 - 3. Soccer team members continue to improve with each competition.
 - 4. The baseball team traveled to the Dominican Republic over Thanksgiving break. Senior student-athlete Corbin Woods stated it was an eye-opening experience and made him and his peers more appreciative of everything in their lives. Team members participated in community service events during the trip.
 - 5. The women's basketball team beat North Dakota in Grand Forks, North Dakota, and played very well against #1 Notre Dame on Wednesday night.
 - 6. Men's basketball is improving with each competition.
 - 7. Wrestling beat Purdue at West Lafayette, Indiana.

- 8. The football team will participate in a bowl game. Bowl invitations will be extended Sunday, December 4, 2016.
- **B.** The following facility updates were presented by G. Taylor:
 - 1. Interviews have begun to select a construction manager for the Kinnick Stadium North End Zone Project.
 - 2. An architectural firm has been chosen for the Finkbine Clubhouse project; an announcement is pending.
 - 3. The indoor track is being painted. The first event on the new surface will take place Friday, December 9, 2016.
 - 4. Construction start date is pending for upgrades to the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center.
 - 5. Long-term usage plans for the Jacobson Athletic Building are being discussed.

Chair Hollingworth adjourned the meeting at 4:53 p.m. The next PCA meeting will be February 2, 2017.







DECEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 3-4 Overall, 0-0 Big Ten Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Next Event: Saturday vs. Omaha at 1 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: Senior Peter Jok poured in 42 points in lowa's 100-92 loss to Memphis on Saturday. The 42 points are the most by a Hawkeye in 40 years and tie for the fourth most in a single-game in program history, tying Bruce King's 42 points against Pittsburgh in 1976. Jok, who scored his 1,000th career point in the game, has scored double digits in all seven games, including netting 27 or more points in four of the contests. He leads the Big Ten in scoring, averaging 25.3 points per contest.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 5-2, 0-0 Big Ten Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Next Event: Wednesday vs. No. 1 Notre Dame at 8 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City, Iowa; Sunday vs. UNI at 2 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena -Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: The Hawkeyes opened the 2016-17 season with back-to-back wins over Oral Roberts and Hampton on Nov. 11 and 13. Following the weekend, sophomore Megan Gustafson was named Big Ten Player of the Week. The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native posted back-to-back double-doubles and netted a career-high 25 points against Oral Roberts.

After securing its first road win of the season against North Dakota, Iowa returned to Carver-Hawkeye Arena to host the 2016 Hawkeye Challenge. Iowa defeated Massachusetts in its opening game. The Hawkeyes held the Minutewomen to just 10 first half points, breaking a program record for fewest points allowed in a first half. Iowa held UMass just 30 points total, tying a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for fewest points allowed. Gustafson and senior Ally Disterhoft were named to the all-tournament team.

The Hawkeyes defeated James Madison, 90-75, in the 2016 Cancun Challenge on Nov. 25. Gustafson was named to her second all-tournament team after scoring a game-high 23 points on 11-of-16 shooting from the field. She also led the Hawkeyes with eight rebounds.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Big Ten Finish/ NCAA Finish: 12th (341)/ 11th (351)

Notables: Michael Melchert was named Iowa's male Student-Athlete of the month for September. Senior Ben Anderson was Iowa's top finisher in five races this season. Melchert, sophomore Daniel Soto and freshman Nathan Mylenek each paced the Hawkeyes in one race this season.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Big Ten Finish/ NCAA Finish: 11th (318)/ 17th (452)

Notables: Senior Tess Wilberding was named Iowa's Student-Athlete of the Month for September. She was Iowa's top finisher in every meet this season. She is the third runner since 2000 to complete the feat (Sarah Arens - 2000, Madison Waymire - 2015).

FIELD HOCKEY

Season Record: 12-7 Overall, 4-4 Big Ten Head Coach: Lisa Cellucci

Notables: Natalie Cafone, Chandler Ackers, and Katie Birch earned National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-West Region recognition. Cafone garnered first team honors, while Ackers and Birch were each named to the second team. Cafone is now a three-time first team All-Big Ten honoree, a threetime All-West Region honoree, and a two-time Big Ten Offensive Player of The Year winner.

Ackers earned her second straight second All-West Region accolade, while Birch earned her first All-West Region honor.

Cafone was named the 2016 Big Ten Offensive Player of the year, and Birch was named the 2016 Big Ten Freshmen of the Year. Cafone was a unanimous All-Big Ten first team selection, while Birch and Ackers earned second team All-Big Ten selections. Senior Sophie Plasteras is Iowa's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

FOOTBALL

Season Record: 8-4 Overall, 6-3 Big Ten Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Next Event: Bowl Game, TBA

Notables: Iowa completed the regular season with three straight wins to post an overall 8-4 record. The Hawkeyes earned a second place tie in the Big Ten's West Division with a 6-4 league record. Iowa is ranked by both the Associated Press (22nd) and in the coaches poll (25th).

Iowa stunned the third-ranked Michigan Wolverines 14-13 on a last-second field goal to begin the winning streak, and followed that with a 28-0 defensive shutout at Illinois.

The Hawkeyes closed the regular season with a 40-10 win over No. 15 Nebraska, earning the Heroes Trophy for the third time in four seasons.

In fact, Iowa completed the regular season by winning three of four trophy games, defeating Iowa State, Minnesota and Nebraska, while falling to Wisconsin.

Senior DB Desmond King and senior DT Jaleel Johnson were named first team All-Big Ten following the regular season. Junior LB Josey Jewell earned second team honors. Iowa players earning third team honors include junior RB Akrum Wadley, senior OL Cole Croston, junior OL Sean Welsh, sophomore OL James Daniels, and senior punter Ron Coluzzi. Honorable mention recognition went to junior OL Ike Boettger, senior RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., sophomore DE Parker Hesse, senior TE George Kittle, senior DB Greg Mabin, senior WR Riley McCarron, junior DT Nathan Bazata, and senior QB C.J. Beathard.

Daniels, Jr. earned Iowa's Sportsmanship Award. Iowa will learn its bowl destination on Sunday..

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 6-6 Overall, 2-3 Big Ten

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: Jan. 12-13 vs. Notre Dame/Illinois – South Bend, Ind.

Notables: The Iowa men's swimming and diving program started November off strong, knocking off South Dakota, Missouri State, and Purdue all at home.

In the triple dual against Missouri State and Purdue (Nov. 4), the meet-winner was decided in the final event of the day. The Hawkeyes took first in the 400-free relay, edging Purdue, 151-149, and topping Missouri State, 176-118. Iowa tallied a total of 22 first-place finishes over the course of the two home events, which includes a school-record performance from sophomore Will Brenner, who dove to a score of 368.00 on the 1-meter against South Dakota (Nov. 3).

lowa also competed at the Ohio State Invitational (Nov. 18-20), placing fifth out of an eight-team field that included #22 Kentucky and #25 Ohio State. Iowa notched 18 top-10 finishes at the three-day event, while 12 Hawkeyes set personal bests in at least one event, including sophomore Jack Smith who swam a career best, NCCA 'B'-cut 20.04 in the 50 free.

Overall, four Hawkeyes have posted NCCA 'B' cut times in at least one event: Smith (50 free), freshman Will Scott (50 free), sophomore Kenneth Mende (100 and 200 back), and junior Jerzy Twarowski (100 fly).

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 8-7 Overall, 2-3 Big Ten Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: Dec. 9 vs. Iowa State at 6 p.m. - Campus Recreation & Wellness Center - Iowa City

Notables: The Iowa women's swimming and diving program competed in three events in November. The Hawkeyes topped South Dakota in a home dual (Nov. 3) before splitting with Purdue and Missouri State in a home triple dual (Nov. 4). Iowa also took fifth at the Ohio State Invitational (Nov. 18-20).

Facing the likes of five-time Olympic gold medalist Katie Ledecky and #1 Stanford, along with #23 Kentucky and #24 Ohio State among others, the Hawkeyes posted 18 top-10 finishes, while 16 Hawkeyes swam career bests at the OSU Invitational. Senior Emma Sougstad swam season bests, posting NCAA 'B' cut times in four individual events (200 IM, 100 fly, 100 breast, 200 breast). She was Iowa's top finisher in all four events.

A total of five Hawkeyes have posted NCAA 'B' cut times in at least one event this season: Sougstad (50 free, 100 and 200 breast, 100 fly), freshman Hannah Burvill (50, 100, and 200 free), junior Mekenna Schietlin (50 free, 100 fly), sophomore Tereysa Lehnertz (100 and 200 fly), and junior Meghan Lavell (100 and 200 back).

Halfway into the season, the Hawkeyes have already swam to three new school records. Sougstad, who was named Big Ten co-Swimmer of the Week on Nov. 2, swam to the fastest times in program history in the 100 fly (53.30) and as a member of the 200-medley relay (1:39.15) -- both coming at the Ohio State Invitational. Sougstad now owns a total of nine school records. Freshman Hannah Burvill sprinted to a new school record in the 100 free (49.22) while competing at the USA College Challenge -- an elite event that featured members of the Big Ten Conference squaring off against the USA Swimming National Team.

MEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Next Event: Jan. 21 vs. Western Michigan - Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: The doubles teams of junior Josh Silverstein and junior Lefteris Theodorou, and sophomore Jonas Larsen and redshirt freshman Kareem Allaf reached the doubles semifinals at the Big Ten Indoor Championships. Allaf won the consolation bracket at the ITA Regionals.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schimd

Next Event: Jan. 15 at Central Florida

Notables: Freshman Elise van Heuvelen finished the fall season with a team-best 9-3 singles record, and senior Aimee Taurn finished the fall with a, 9-4 singles record. Junior Zoe Douglas and van Heuvelen finished the fall with a team-best, 11-5 doubles record.

VOLLEYBALL

Season Record: 19-13 Overall, 9-11 Big Ten Head Coach: Bond Shymansky

Notables: Iowa finished the regular season with a 19-13 overall record and a 9-11 mark in Big Ten play, which marks the first winning record for the program since 2000.

The 19 wins was the most for the program since 1994, while the nine conference wins was the most for since 2000.

Following a weekend where she amassed 32 kills and six blocks over nine sets to lead the Hawkeyes to wins over Northwestern and # 24 Illinois, sophomore Reghan Coyle was selected as the Big Ten Player of the Week. Coyle is the program's first Player of the Week since 2012 (Alex Lovell).

WRESTLING

Season Record: 3-0 Overall, 1-0 Big Ten Head Coach: Tom Brands

Next Event: Friday at South Dakota State

Notables: The Hawkeyes are 3-0 overall and 1-0 in the Big Ten with a 34-3 win at Purdue on Nov. 27. The Hawkeyes' varsity lineup has a combined 68-2 record.

Seven Hawkeyes are nationally ranked, including top-ranked wrestlers Thomas Gilman at 125 and Cory Clark at 133. Brandon Sorensen is ranked No. 2 at 149, Michael Kemerer is ranked No. 7 at 157, Alex Meyer is ranked No. 6 at 174, Sammy Brooks is ranked No. 7 at 184, and heavyweight Sam Stoll, who is out with an injury, is ranked No. 6. Stoll is expected to return late December, early January.
