Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Chair Hollingworth brought the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

I. Head Coach Introduction - Larissa Libby, Women's Gymnastics

Barta introduced Coach Libby who was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2016-17. She is beginning her 14th year as head coach.

Coach Libby explained the team's mission statement and philosophy. She spoke highly of the renovated gymnastics facility as well as the student-athletes who comprise this year's team. Five new freshman have joined the team and are learning the culture, which should guide them through their remaining years at Iowa.

Committee members asked various questions relating to the gymnasts and recruiting. Chair Hollingworth thanked Coach Libby for her report.

II. Approval of the November 2, 2017, PCA Minutes

Friestad moved to approve the minutes of the November 2, 2017, PCA meeting; Hill seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from Committee members.

III. Guest Speaker - Nicole White, Director of Nutrition

White explained the process of choosing nutritional food choices for student-athlete consumption, described her staff members and their job duties, addressed communication tools used for dissemination of information to student-athletes and coaches, explained the involvement of local dining establishments as teaching tools for healthy eating choices, etc. Her PowerPoint presentation is attached for perusal. Chair Hollingworth announced questions can be posed to White after the meeting today. She then thanked White for the presentation.

IV. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Dillavou

Dillavou reported a search is underway for a head athletic trainer in football. Rhodes is the PCA representative on this committee.

V. Subcommittee Updates

A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Bruhn

Attached is a draft of proposed "Guiding Principles for Iowa Student-Athletes, Student Managers, and Spirit Squad Members in Their Use of Social Media Sites." This subcommittee, the Iowa Student Athlete Advisory Committee, and the UI General Council staff have vetted the draft.

Colin moved to approve the guiding principles; Bruhn seconded the motion. Committee members voted in full to approve the document. Chair Hollingworth will update the PCA Operations Manual and send the updated manual to the President's Office for posting on the UI President's home page.

B. Academic Achievement - Bowden

Chair Bowden reported student-athletes who entered the UI in the fall of 2010 graduated at a rate of 90% when the rate was calculated using the criteria for the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR). This places the UI fourth among Big Ten institutions. Student-athletes who entered the UI in the fall of 2010 graduated at a 77% rate using the federal government's benchmark for graduation success. This ranking puts the UI in third place among Big Ten peers. The UI's general student population rate was 70%. The GSR percentages more accurately assesses the academic success of student-athletes by taking into account mid-year transfers and mid-year enrollees.

Chair Bowden noted 90 student-athletes were named to the 2017 Big Ten Fall Academic All-Conference Team. Iowa had 24 more student-athletes recognized in 2017 than in 2016.

Twenty-two student-athletes will graduate next week at commencement ceremonies.

The PCA Student-Athlete Academic Recognition will take place Saturday, February 17, 2018, during the Iowa-Indiana men's basketball game.

C. Equity - Matheson

Chair Matheson stated Tovar reviewed the extensive calendar the Student-Athlete Academic Services staff members establishes each year for the student-athletes. Subcommittee members were impressed with the national, high profile speakers engaged to present to student-athletes on issues of equity and diversity.

VI. ISAAC Report - Colin, Guagliardo

- A. UI student-athletes recorded over 1,452 hours of community activities this fall. The top two teams with the highest numbers of volunteer hours were rowing and women's gymnastics.
- **B.** Thirty-seven student-athletes joined efforts to 'adopt a family' for the holiday season. They purchased and wrapped the gifts. The presents were then delivered to family members.
- C. In recognition of Martin Luther King, Jr, Day on January 15, 2018, Athletics Department staff members have enlisted the services of Janet Judge, a higher education and employment law attorney. She will present a session to the student-athletes and another to Athletics administrators and coaches. The title of her presentation is "Sexual Misconduct & Social Media: Know Your Rights & Responsibilities."

Following Judge's presentation to student-athletes, a Dance Marathon kick-off event will be held by the student-athletes.

As part of the alcohol harm reduction efforts on the UI campus, ISAAC members are encouraging sports teams to take advantage of the Red Watch Band Training – a course which teaches methods for being responsible and safe when alcohol is present; attendees also become CPR certified as part of the program. The swimming team took the course and highly encourages other sports teams to participate.

VII. NCAA Report - Drake, Grosland, Barta

Grosland reported discussions took place regarding student-athlete time management plans and scheduling official & unofficial recruiting visits.

Barta stated discussions continue on student-athlete transfers. The goals are to provide consistency among sports and to make the process more student-athlete friendly.

VIII. Athletics Director's Report - Barta

The December sports report and schedules are enclosed. Barta highlighted the following:

A. Football student-athletes are going to have an incredible experience at the Pinstripe Bowl in New York. To date, about 2,000 tickets have been sold.


- **B.** Wrestling defeated Illinois due to a pin by Iowa's heavyweight.
- C. The women's basketball team won at Iowa State. The Hawkeyes have not won at that venue since 1989.
- **D.** Men's basketball has many new young team members. They compete tonight at Iowa State.
- E. Construction fences surround the Kinnick Stadium north end zone. Demolition has begun.
- **F.** Refurbishment of the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center is ongoing. The project should finish in late spring or early summer.
- G. The UI football program received the 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award for the "Kinnick Wave" on December 7, 2017, during ESPN's College Football Hall of Fame event in Atlanta, GA. Coach Ferentz accepted the award on behalf of the football program.
- **H.** Athletics Department staff members launched a new look to their website, hawkeyesports.com. The Hawkeye Sports app was also updated.

Appendix F. Guiding Principles for Iowa Student-Athletes, Student Managers and Spirit Squad members in Their Use of Social Media Sites

Social Media Sites:

Social media sites (such as Facebook, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Twitter, Vine, and similar sites and blogs) enable individuals to interact with an expansive universe of new people and to connect with friends and family. Postings by student-athletes of personal profiles and comments in chat rooms and blogs are in the public domain, however, and are easily accessible by anyone including reporters, parents, coaches, recruits, fans, groupies, predators, potential employers, and graduate school admissions officials. Even after it has been deleted, information once posted on a social media site can often be retrieved.

Athletics Department Policy:

Participation in intercollegiate athletics at the University of Iowa is a privilege that imposes certain obligations on student-athletes, including the responsibility of being a positive representative of the university to the public. Student-athletes, therefore, are expected to conduct themselves at all times with honesty, dignity, and good sportsmanship. The Athletics Department believes in protecting the rights of student-athletes to freedom of speech, association, and privacy, including their right to participate in social media. Neither coaches nor team rules may require student-athletes preemptively to disclose private social media information to anyone. Student-athletes, however, agree to team rules that may authorize a coach to impose temporary social media restrictions to address specific concerns related to the observance of these guiding principles. The Athletics Department does not intend to monitor student-athletes' social media sites on a systematic basis, but Athletics Department administrators may periodically conduct random checks of student-athletes' social media sites. Student-athletes are expected to monitor their own social media sites and post only information and images that conform to these guiding principles and appropriately represent themselves and the university to the public.

The Athletics Department reserves the right, under the Student-Athlete Code of Conduct (Category II Misconduct) to investigate and take action against any student-athlete who is posting material on a social media site that violates, or appears to violate, NCAA, university, or Athletics Department rules. Postings that violate these guiding principles are posts consisting of information, images or language that inappropriately represent the student-athlete or the university to the public, including, but not limited to, partial or total nudity, sexual misconduct, underage alcohol consumption, use of illegal drugs or controlled substances, hazing activities, tobacco use, and obscene gestures.

Recommended Actions:

It is recommended that student-athletes immediately review and then regularly monitor any social media sites on which they may have posted material to ensure that the postings are consistent with NCAA, university, and Athletics Department rules, and that they present the student-athlete in the way he/she wants to be portrayed. To better achieve the purposes of these guiding principles, student-athletes are also encouraged to monitor the social media sites of their

teammates.

For reasons of safety and privacy, it is recommended that student-athletes refrain from posting on social media sites, and if posted, promptly remove any personally identifiable information, such as telephone number, address, class schedule, and places frequented. Student-athletes should regularly check tagged photos and monitor electronic photo albums, social media sites and blogs to avoid posted photos or messages that would be considered inappropriate.

Student-athletes should be cautious in joining groups on social media to be sure they want to be publicly associated with each specific group. Student-athletes should particularly refrain from creating or joining a group that is obviously inappropriate for student-athletes or is malicious. Student-athletes should also understand that once they become a group member, they are linked to the online discussion that takes place within that group, and only the group's administrator will be able to delete them from the group membership or remove postings made to the group site.

Student-athletes should alert their Coach and/or Sport Administrator

Student Athlete Academic Services office if they discover the existence of any social media site created by others that falsely appears to be their site. The creation of such bogus sites may constitute identity theft, and the university will assist in their efforts to have the offensive sites removed.

By my signature below, I hereby affirm that I have read and understand the University of Iowa Athletics Department's "Guiding Principles for Iowa Student-Athletes, Student Managers and Spirit Squad members in their Use of Social Media Sites."

Furthermore, I understand that failure to abide by these guiding principles by posting materials on social media sites that violate Athletics Department policy may result in sanctions under Category II Misconduct, as outlined in the Student-Athlete Code of Conduct.

DECEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 4-5 Overall, 0-2 B1G

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery **Next Event:** Thursday at Iowa State

Notables: Iowa has lost five is its last six games after starting the season 3-0. The Hawkeyes have yet to play a regular season game with a full healthy roster as four different players have missed time due injury and illness. Iowa's top seven scorers are underclassmen. Thursday night's game at Iowa State will conclude a stretch of playing six of seven contests away from Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Sophomore guard Isaiah Moss was named to the Cayman Islands Classic All-Tournament Team after averaging 18 points and leading the squad in scoring in two of the three games during Thanksgiving Break.

Luka Garza was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Nov. 13 after averaging 13.5 points, nine rebounds, and 2.5 blocked shots in a pair of home wins over Chicago State and Alabama State.

Fran McCaffery is eight wins from notching career victory No. 400 as a head coach.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 8-1 Overall, 0-0 B1G

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Next Event: Wednesday at Iowa State

Notables: The Hawkeyes enter Wednesday's Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup against Iowa State with an 8-1 overall record. Iowa got off to a 7-0 start – its best start since 2010 – before falling to No. 13/11 Florida State, 94-93, on Nov. 29 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Hawkeyes have defeated three 2017 NCAA Tournament teams through their first nine games of the season.

As of Dec. 5, the Hawkeyes lead the nation in four categories, including assists (225), assists per game (25.0), defensive rebounds per game (34), and personal fouls per game (11.1). The Hawkeyes also rank third in field goal percentage (52.5), fourth in rebounds (414) and assist/turnover ratio (1.72), fifth in free throw percentage (79.2), sixth in blocked shots (51), and eighth in scoring offense (87.2). Iowa is receiving votes in both major polls.

Junior Megan Gustafson has earned four straight conference honors. The junior was named the Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 13 and Dec. 3. She was named to the conference's weekly honor roll on Nov. 20 and Nov. 27. She is ranked in the top-16 nationally in nine different categories. She leads the nation in field goals made (87) and double-doubles (8).

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Notables: The Hawkeyes placed 10th at the Big Ten Championships with 235 points, a 106-point improvement from last season. Six Hawkeyes showed year-over-year improvements in place at the Big Ten Championships. Sophomore Nathan Mylenek was lowa's top runner. He placed 28th overall and has led the men in four of five races this season. He also set a school-record in the 10,000 meters at the NCAA Regional in Ames, lowa, with a time of 29:53.15.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Notables: Iowa placed 11th at the Big Ten Championships with 303 points. Five Hawkeyes showed year-over-year improvement from last season. Junior Andrea Shine was Iowa's top runner. She placed 29th overall, and has led Iowa in all five races this season.

FOOTBALL

Season Record: 7-5 Overall, 4-5 B1G

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Next Event: Dec. 27 vs. Boston College at Pinstripe Bowl - 4:15 p.m. CT, at Yankee Stadium in New York. **Notables:** lowa closed the regular season with a 2-2 record in November, including a 55-25 win over No. 3 Ohio State in Kinnick Stadium and a 56-14 win at Nebraska.

For the season, lowa won three of four trophy games by defeating lowa State, Minnesota, and the Cornhuskers. The loss was at Wisconsin.

Senior linebacker Josey Jewell was named the Big Ten Linebacker of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year, while junior defensive back Josh Jackson was named the B1G Defensive Back of the Year. Both Jewell and Jackson earned first team All-Big Ten honors, as did senior offensive lineman Sean Welsh. Senior RB Akrum Wadley and sophomore tight end Noah Fant were third team selections, while senior LB Ben Niemann, senior DL Nathan Bazata, junior OL James Daniels and sophomore QB Nate Stanley earned honorable mention recognition.

The Hawkeyes had one of the toughest schedules in the nation, competing against bowl teams in nine of 12 contests.

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz moved past 150 career wins, and has 142 wins as Iowa's head coach. With Iowa's next victory he will tie Hayden Fry as Iowa's all-time winningest head football coach.

The Pinstripe Bowl marks lowa's 15th both appearance under Ferentz.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 3-0 Overall, 3-0 B1G

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: Jan. 12-13 vs. Illinois and Notre Dame

Notables: The Hawkeyes are off to a 3-0 start in dual meets -- defeating Michigan State, Minnesota, and Purdue. Iowa also place second at the Minnesota Invitational. Sophomore Michael Tenney and junior Kenneth Mende each posted two victories on the weekend. Tenney won the 500-free (4:25.69) and 400-IM (3:52.54), while Mende won the 100-back (47.28) and 200-back (1:44.02).

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 2-2 Overall, 1-2 B1G

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: Jan.12-13 vs. Illinois and Notre Dame

Notables: The Hawkeyes opened their 2017-18 season defeating Michigan State (189-108) and Northern Iowa (184-113) on Oct. 5-6. Iowa last competed at the Minnesota Invitational. Sophomore Hannah Burvill posted a school record in the 100-free, posting a time of 49.19 in the prelims before bettering her time in the finals, posting a 49.10. She finished third overall in the event.

WRESTLING

Season Record: 5-0 Overall, 1-0 B1G

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Next Event: Friday at Rutgers - 7 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeyes are ranked seventh in the USA Today/NWCA Division I Coaches Poll. Six Hawkeyes are represented in the national rankings, including returning All-American Brandon Sorensen and Michael Kemerer. Sorensen is ranked No. 2 at 149 pounds, while Kemerer is ranked No. 3 at 157. Sophomore Cash Wilcke (197) and junior Sam Stoll (285) are also ranked in the top 10. All four top 10 wrestlers are 5-0. Wilcke's No. 8 ranking is the best of his career. Kemerer was named Big Ten Wrestler of the Week on Nov. 28. He is 5-0 with three wins over ranked opponents. Stoll is also 5-0 with a team-high four falls.

VOLLEYBALL

Season Record: 18-15 Overall, 7-13 B1G

Head Coach: Bond Shymansky

Notables: Iowa's 18 wins are the second most for the program since 1994. The Hawkeyes had 19 wins in 2016 and 24 victories in 1994.

This is Iowa's second winning season under head coach Bond Shymansky. Iowa finished the 2016 season 19-13 overall. 2016 and 2017 mark the first back-to-back seasons since Iowa had five straight winnings seasons from 1986-90.

Three Hawkeyes -- senior Annika Olsen, junior Taylor Louis, and senior Jess Janota -- earned All-Big Ten honors for the first time since 1989. All three earned Big Ten honorable mention.
