

*Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics*

*McCord Indoor Club, Press Box, Kinnick Stadium*

*February 1, 2018*

Chair Hollingworth brought the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

**I. Approval of the December 7, 2017, PCA Minutes**

Courter moved to approve the minutes of the December 7, 2017, PCA meeting. Osborn seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from Committee members.

**II. Introduction and Update on Football Signing Day - Scott Southmayd**

Barta introduced Scott Southmayd, Director of Player Personnel - Football. Southmayd expressed his appreciation to present to PCA members.

Southmayd presented statistical data on the average number of prospects evaluated in the recruiting period, number of campus visits, and roster & walk-on numbers. He discussed Iowa's recruiting budget ranking in relation to other Big Ten institutions and recruiting demographics. Southmayd explained each visit is personalized for a particular recruit; each meets with the head football coach, the head strength & conditioning coach, the associate athletics director for Student-Athlete Academic Services, and a UI advisor in the degree program the prospect plans to enter. He thanked faculty and staff for their willingness to participate in the recruiting process.

The NCAA recently approved additional signing dates in December of each year for football. Football coaches are currently visiting prospects in preparation for the next signing date on February 7, 2018.

Southmayd answered questions focused on recruiting. Chair Hollingworth thanked him for his report.

**III. Presentation/Demonstration - Damian Simcox Report on the North End Zone Construction**

Barta introduced Assistant Athletics Director of Facilities Damian Simcox. Simcox reported that JE Dunn Construction is the general contractor for the north end zone project. Construction started on November 19, 2017, and is on schedule. Seats will be in place for fans for the first football game this fall. Other amenities such as restrooms and concessions will not be ready but fans will have access through other accommodations. The north scoreboard will not be in place for this season but a possession clock will be installed in that area for football games.

The north end zone will consist of three levels: a lower level, a concourse level, and an outdoor club seating level. Barta added fans have access to all price points of seating options. Of the 1,600 club seats available in the north end zone, about 1,300 seats have already been sold.

Construction work will continue during the football season. The entire project will be complete by the first home football game of the 2019 season.

Chair Hollingworth stated questions can be addressed to Simcox after today's meeting. She thanked him for his report.

**IV. Report on Equity in Hiring - Jennifer Modestou**

Attached is a PowerPoint presentation presented by Modestou. Her report covers the hiring activity for the Athletics Department primarily in FY2017. Data presented covers a three-year period (FY2015-2017) to illustrate trends and comparisons relating to hiring within the Big Ten Conference as well as for administrative and coaching positions. Within these categories the numbers of women and minorities are reflected. She also explained demographic data relation to the job application, reviewed search policies for the UI and the Athletics Department, which mirror each other, and addressed the recommended best practices for the Athletics Department.

Barta explained measures he takes to ensure all searches have a diverse pool of candidates. He answered questions from Committee member on the hiring of women and female coaches in the Athletics Department.

**V. Athletics Department Searches - Dillavou**

Dillavou reported Ryan is the PCA representative on the search for an assistant coach in track and field.

## **VI. Subcommittee Updates**

### **A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Bruhn**

1. Chair Bruhn stated Terry Noonan, Director of Sports Medicine and Sports Performance, spoke to subcommittee members about sports performance and a global positioning system worn by student-athletes to monitor physical exertion.
2. Student-Athlete Well-Being Subcommittee members reviewed the Student-Athlete Grievance Process housed in the PCA Operations Manual. The group recommends all references to financial aid be removed because aid is handled through the Financial Aid Office and is covered in an Athletics Department policy. A draft copy is attached. ISAAC members and General Counsel Office staff have reviewed the draft.

After further discussion, Friestad moved to approve the Student-Athlete Grievance Process as amended. Rhodes seconded the motion. The Committee granted full approval. Updates will be made to the PCA Operations Manual and available on the President's website.

### **B. Academic Achievement - Bowden**

Chair Bowden reported subcommittee members had a good discussion with Student-Athlete Academic Services staff about how tutors are selected, trained, and assigned to student-athletes. Student-athletes in attendance spoke about choosing majors, access to tutors, and challenges associated with being a student-athlete.

The subcommittee's next meeting is Thursday, February 8, 2018.

### **C. Equity - Matheson**

Chair Matheson noted Steve Roe, Director of Athletics Communications, attended the Equity Subcommittee's last meeting. Roe spoke about how his staff is assigned to sports, followed by a thorough discussion about Athletics Communications.

Jennifer Modestou previewed her PowerPoint presentation on Athletics Department Hiring Practices.

## **VII. ISAAC Report - Colin and Guagliardo**

Colin and Guagliardo highlighted the following:

- A. Janet Judge, a renowned speaker and sports attorney, spoke to a group of over 300 student-athletes on January 15, 2018. The topic was "Sexual Misconduct & Social Media: Know Your Rights & Responsibilities."

- B.** After Judge's presentation, over 400 student-athletes participated in a mini version of the UI's Dance Marathon. About \$1,500 was raised; profits will go to the Dance Marathon.

About 12 student-athletes will participate during "spirit hour" of the UI's Dance Marathon on Saturday, February 3, 2018.

- C.** The PCA 3.0 Academic Recognition will take place on Saturday, February 17, 2018, during the men's basketball game versus Indiana. These individuals will be recognized on court during halftime. For fall 2017, 334 student-athletes achieved a 3.0 or higher grade point average.
- D.** "Fuel Up to Play 60" begins February 12, 2018. Student-athletes have been participating in this national program for the last four years by visiting with Iowa City and Coralville elementary school students about nutrition and healthy lifestyles. The University of Iowa is ranked number one in the country for hours donated to this cause.
- E.** "Helper Helper," an app whereby student-athletes log community service hours, currently ranks the University of Iowa in the 28 position among D-1 institutions for total number of hours volunteered.

**VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Drake, Grosland**

Barta and Clerry attended the NCAA Annual Convention in Indianapolis, IN, in January 2018. Legislation was approved stating all universities will offer medical aid to student-athletes for two years after completing eligibility; Barta said the University of Iowa had already been doing this for student-athletes. The NCAA Transfer Working Group was granted an extension to continue their work on student-athlete transfer proposals. A vote on their recommendations will take place in June 2018.

Big Ten Joint Group meetings will take place February 19-20, 2018, in Chicago, IL.


**VIII. Athletics Director's Report - Barta**

- A.** The Laureus World Sports Awards take place in Monaco, Italy, on February 28, 2018. The University of Iowa is a nominee for the "World's Best Sporting Moment of the Year," i.e., Stead Family Children's Hospital "The Wave."
- B.** Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder is the recipient of the Iowa Girls' High School Union's First Lady Award. Bluder is the 13<sup>th</sup> recipient of this prestigious award.
- C.** The February sports report and schedules are enclosed. Highlights follow:
- I.** The women's basketball team competes tonight against Michigan State at 5:00 p.m. in East Lansing, MI. The game will be on the Big Ten Network.

2. Men's basketball team members and coaches are preparing for their next competition Saturday, February 3, against Penn State in University Park, PA.
  3. The women's gymnasts are currently 3-0 in Big Ten competition. Their next meet is Friday, February 2, 2018, against Illinois in Champaign, IL.
  4. The Larry Wieczorek Invite, held in the Recreation Building on January 19-20, 2018, drew world champions and Olympians from across the country. Some of the fastest times were recorded by the runners on the indoor track.
  5. Iowa wrestlers beat Oklahoma State and lost to Michigan. The last two home competitions are this weekend against Minnesota and Northwestern.
  6. The men's swim team is currently undefeated in Big Ten competition.
- D.* A tour of the Gerdin Athletics Learning Center was given to the Gerdin Family who donated the money for the entire renovation. The project will be complete by spring 2018.
- E.* Work will begin this spring on construction of the new Finkbine Clubhouse. This project is funded in its entirety by two private donors.
- F.* Carroll Reasoner, Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel, reviewed the Office of Civil Rights (OCR) process for the Title IX gender equity review started in 2015. After a review of all of the documents submitted to them by Athletics' Department staff, and a five-day on-site visit, the OCR contacted the university and proposed a voluntary resolution of the investigation. A voluntary resolution was reached between the UI and OCR which ends the investigation with no findings of violations of Title IX. The Agreement requires additional reports for the 2016-2017 academic year in seven areas. The Athletics Department staff provided additional documentation on participation and financial aid by the OCR's deadline of January 30, 2018. By April 30, 2018, Athletics staff will provide documentation on five additional categories.



## FY 2017: Summary of Applicant Data

- Women made up 10% of the total pool and 39% of hires (7 individuals)
- Minorities made up 21% of total pool and 22% of hires (4 individuals)

**Administrative Positions**

- 20 hires via searches; no search waivers this year
- Women made up 32% of the total pool and 50% of hires (10 individuals)
- Minorities made up 17% of total pool and 20% of hires (4 individuals)

## **Appendix E. Student-Athlete Grievance Process**

### **Preamble:**

This grievance process is intended to comply fully with NCAA requirements and to be available to all student-athletes. When a student-athlete grievance issue arises and is brought to the attention of any member of the Athletics Department administrative staff, regardless of the source of disclosure, efforts to resolve the issues should include the Head Coach, Sport Administrator, and the Deputy Director of Athletics. Some discretionary decisions entrusted solely to a Head Coach, such as but not limited to, a student-athlete's playing time, and selection for out-of-town team travel, are not reviewable under this grievance process. If there is a disagreement over whether a specific issue is subject to grievance under this process, a panel comprised of the Chair of the PCA, the Chair of the PCA Subcommittee on Student-athlete Well-Being, and the Faculty Athletics Representative(s) will resolve the question by majority vote.

### **1. Athletic Grievance Process**

#### **a. Informal Process within the Athletics Department**

- i. During the initial stages of this process, the Deputy Director of Athletics will function in the role of advocate for the student-athlete to ensure that the student-athlete's interests are paramount. This collaborative involvement will begin during the initial stages of discussion with the student-athlete and continue throughout the informal process. As necessary, and at the request of the student-athlete, these discussions may involve the student-athlete's parents or guardian, with the objective of arriving at an informal resolution. The Deputy Director of Athletics will also ensure that everyone involved understands the relevant rules and procedures of the Department of Athletics and the University, both informal and formal.
- ii. At all times during this informal process, a student-athlete has the right to be assisted by legal counsel, at his or her own expense, or by another advisor of choice.
- iii. If a student-athlete protests a suspension or other disciplinary action imposed by a coach or other member of the Department of Athletics or alleges a violation of his or her rights as set forth in the Statement of Student-Athlete Rights and Responsibilities, the student-athlete should request a meeting with his or her Head Coach to attempt to resolve the matter informally. Such a request for a meeting should be granted by the Head Coach as soon as possible. The student-athlete should attempt to exhaust all options for resolution of the grievance with the Head Coach. If the student-athlete would prefer to have a third party present for meetings with the Head Coach, he or she may request assistance from several sources. These include, but are not limited to, the Sport Administrator, the Deputy Director of Athletics, the Senior Woman Administrator, or the university Ombudsperson.
- iv. If the student-athlete's grievance is not resolved satisfactorily with the Head Coach in step (3), the student-athlete may then request a meeting

with the Sport Administrator for the student-athlete's team to make a further effort to resolve the grievance informally.

- v. If the student-athlete's grievance is satisfactorily resolved in step (3) or step (4) of the informal process, a written statement of the disputed issues, along with the settlement agreed upon, should be prepared jointly and signed by the student-athlete and the person from the Athletics Department with whom the settlement was reached. This written statement should then be filed with the Athletics Director and retained.

#### **b. Formal Appeal Process within the Athletics Department**

- i. If no satisfactory agreement is reached through steps (3) and (4) of the Informal Process, the student-athlete may then submit a written appeal to the Athletics Director. The written appeal should accurately summarize the facts of the dispute and indicate the relief sought by the student-athlete. After appropriate review, the Athletics Director should make a decision on the appeal and notify the student-athlete of the decision within seven (7) working days.
- ii. If the Athletics Director resolves the dispute to the satisfaction of the student-athlete, the terms of the settlement should be stated in a letter sent to both the student-athlete and the person in the Athletics Department against whom the grievance was initiated. A copy of this settlement letter should be kept in Athletics Director's files.
- iii. If no satisfactory agreement is reached with the Athletics Director, the student-athlete may request a hearing before the Review Panel of the PCA. A request for such a hearing shall be submitted in writing to the Chair of the PCA within seven (7) days after receiving the decision from the Director of Athletics. When notified of a request for a hearing, the Chair of the PCA should proceed to implement the PCA appeal procedures for Review of Student-Athlete Grievances with all deliberate speed.

### **2. PCA Appeal Procedures for Hearings on Student-Athlete Grievances**

**Scope.** These procedures apply to any grievance initiated by a student-athlete regarding action taken by the Department of Athletics relating to the student-athlete's athletic status ~~or financial aid~~, provided that all alternative means for resolving the dispute specified above have been exhausted.

**Waivers.** By initiating an appeal under these procedures, the student-athlete shall be deemed to have waived his or her rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 USC 1232g) with respect to any persons present for whatever purpose during the course of any proceedings hereunder. If the student-athlete puts at issue his or her mental or physical health, the student-athlete shall be deemed to have waived any privilege for any communication made in professional confidence as provided in Iowa Code Section 622.10.

**Hearing Panel Composition.** Hearings shall take place before panels composed as follows:

**Hearing before PCA.** A panel of PCA members shall hear all cases concerning student-athletes ~~except those described in this section~~, and subject to the provisions of this section. The PCA panel shall consist of the Chair of the PCA, the Big Ten Faculty Athletics Representative(s), and the chairs of the standing subcommittees of the PCA. The Chair of the PCA shall serve as the Presiding Officer in any hearing before a panel of the PCA. At his or her option, the Chair may appoint from among the remaining PCA members substitutes for the above-listed panel members, when an incumbent is unavailable.

~~**Hearing before Committee.** The Financial Aid Non-Renewal Committee (the "Committee") shall hear all cases concerning any reduction or cancellation of financial aid during a period of award or concerning the non-renewal or reduction of a student-athlete's financial aid for the ensuing year. The Director of Financial Aid shall appoint the Committee. Each of the following units may have one representative member on the Committee: Office of the Dean of Students; Office of the Registrar; Student Financial Aid University Charter Committee. The Director of Financial Aid shall appoint the Committee Chair, who shall serve as Presiding Officer in any hearing before the Committee.~~

~~**Joint Hearings.** If, in the judgment of the Director of Financial Aid, the Denial of Relief requested by a student athlete has potential financial aid implications, a joint hearing shall be held before two panels: the Committee shall adjudicate the financial aid issue(s), and a panel of the PCA shall adjudicate all other issues. The Committee Chair and the Chair of the PCA shall preside over the hearing, making procedural determinations jointly. Any evidentiary determinations affecting the merits of the case before either panel shall be made by the Presiding Officer of the panel adjudicating the issue in question.~~

**Rights before Hearing.** The student-athlete bringing the complaints is granted the following rights:

1. To be advised of the hearing procedures; and
2. To review copies of any documentary or other physical evidence expected to be presented in opposition to the student-athlete's position, provided that the student-athlete has requested such materials at least two university business days before the hearing. Additional evidence may be admitted at the hearing at the discretion of the Presiding Officer, provided that the other party has an opportunity to review and respond to the additional evidence. In that event, the parties shall exchange copies of the documents and physical evidence.

**Rights at Hearing.** The student-athlete bringing the complaint, like the university or any of its units, is granted the following rights at the hearing:

1. To present his or her position;
2. To present witnesses and evidence;

3. To cross-examine witnesses presenting evidence in opposition to the student-athlete, provided, however, that such cross-examination shall be limited to questions that are relevant, material, and not unduly repetitive, as determined by the Presiding Officer; and
4. To be represented by counsel or other advisor at the student-athlete's expense.

**Burden of Proof and Standard of Judgment.** In all cases under these Procedures, the University bears the burden of proving, by the preponderance of the evidence, that the action disputed by the student-athlete was justified.

**Hearing.** The Presiding Officer (see Section C (1)) shall open the hearing and answer any procedural questions posed.

**Persons Excluded.** The hearing shall be closed unless the student-athlete specifically requests, in writing, at least two university business days before the hearing, that it be open. If the student-athlete requests an open hearing, the Presiding Officer nevertheless may elect to close all or part of the hearing. The Presiding Officer also may elect to exclude non-parties who are to appear as witnesses.

**Recording.** The hearing shall be recorded by means to be determined by the Presiding Officer. Videotape, audio tape, and stenographic reporting all are satisfactory recording options. If a stenographic recording is made, the expense of transcription shall be borne by the party requesting it. Discussion regarding procedural matters need not be recorded.

**Opening Statements.** At the outset of the hearing, first the university, then the student-athlete, may present very brief statements to the hearing panel outlining their respective positions in order to crystallize the issues for the panel. These statements shall not be considered evidence.

**Evidence.** The university shall present its position first, calling witnesses and presenting evidence in accordance with these procedures. After the university has concluded, the student-athlete may present his or her position. Witnesses shall swear or affirm that they will testify truthfully before the panel(s). Formal rules of evidence shall not apply, although objections to evidentiary offers may be made and shall be noted in the record. At the discretion of the Presiding Officer, members of the panel(s) also may be permitted to question witnesses.

**Closing Arguments.** At the close of all the evidence, each party may present a very brief summary of its position to the panel(s). The student-athlete shall present his or her argument first, and the university, bearing the burden of proof, shall present its argument last. The Presiding Officer may cut off any argument on the basis of its undue length, repetition, or irrelevancy. These arguments shall not be considered evidence.

**Legal Advisor to the Panel.** The PCA panel ~~or the Committee~~, at their option, may avail themselves of a legal advisor. That advisor should be a representative of the University's Office of the General Counsel. The legal advisor's role may include conducting the hearing and otherwise assisting the panel with any procedural matters that arise during the hearing, in deliberations, or in writing the panel's report. The legal advisor shall have no input whatsoever



to the substantive adjudication of any issues by the panel.

### **Decision and Report.**

**Deliberation.** The PCA panel ~~or the Committee~~ (see Section 3a) shall deliberate among themselves to reach a decision on the merits of the case. ~~If the hearing took place before the PCA panel and the Committee, jointly, each panel shall deliberate only among its own members; no member of the PCA panel shall deliberate with any member of the Committee on any substantive matter.~~

**Sequential Decisions in Joint Hearings.** ~~Pursuant to Paragraph 3(c), in some cases where the PCA panel and the Committee conduct hearings jointly, the decision of the PCA panel on non-financial aid matters might render moot the decision of the Committee on financial aid matters. In those cases, the PCA panel shall issue its decision first, before the Committee renders its decision.~~

**Majority Needed.** Decisions by either the PCA panel ~~or the Committee~~ shall be based on the majority of the panel hearing the case. In the event an even number of persons served on a panel, the Presiding Officer of that panel shall deliberate with the panel, but shall not vote, thereby allowing the remaining panel members to reach a majority decision. Decisions shall be based on the kind of evidence on which reasonably prudent persons rely in the conduct of their serious affairs.

**Report of Decision.** The panel hearing the case shall present its decision in a written report. The report shall state briefly the majority's findings of fact and conclusions drawn from those facts. The minority view, if any, may be presented at the option of the panel hearing the case. Copies of the report shall be sent to the student-athlete, the Director of Athletics, the office of the General Counsel, the ~~Director of Financial Aid~~, the President or his/her designee in any case before the Committee, ~~the Presiding Officer of the other panel in any case in which a joint hearing was held~~, and to other appropriate university officers.

**President's Review.** The student-athlete may appeal to the President the decision of the PCA panel ~~or the Committee.~~

**Request for Appeal.** To appeal, the student-athlete must send a written request with supporting materials (if desired) to the President's office within five (5) university business days following receipt of the written notification of decision.

**Standard for Review.** To overturn the decision of the hearing panel, the President must find that the decision is not supported by a preponderance of the evidence, or is clearly inconsistent with university or other governing policy.

**President's Decision.** The President or the President's designee shall render a decision within 30 calendar days of the receipt of the request for appeal, and that decision shall constitute final agency action. The President's (or designee's) decision shall be

transmitted to the student-athlete, the General Counsel, the Director of Athletics, ~~the Director of Financial Aid in any case before the Committee~~, and to other appropriate university officers.

# FEBRUARY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## MEN'S BASKETBALL

**Season Record:** 12-12 Overall, 3-8 B1G

**Head Coach:** Fran McCaffery

**Next Event:** Saturday at Penn State

**Notables:** Iowa posted its second largest road comeback in school history, rallying from a 20-point deficit to win in overtime at Illinois (104-97) on Jan. 11. The 104 points are the most the Hawkeyes have ever scored against the Illini in the series history.

Freshman Luka Garza was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Jan. 2 for his efforts in Iowa's nonconference finale win against Northern Illinois. Garza's rebounding average (6.7) ranks first among Big Ten freshman this season, while his field goal percentage of 57.4 percent is second best.

Fran McCaffery notched his 400th career win as a head coach on Jan. 30, when Iowa upended Minnesota, 94-80, in Iowa City. Iowa scored 57 second-half points en route to victory, marking the first time since 1990, that Iowa netted 57 or more points in the second half of a Big Ten game.

Point guard Jordan Bohannon is leading the charge for the Hawkeyes. The sophomore is averaging a team-best 18 points, 6.3 assists, and 3.5 3-pointers made in nine games during the month of January. Furthermore, Bohannon made all 30 of his foul shots in January, moving him four shy of Chris Street's consecutive free throws made record (34) set in 1993.

## WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

**Season Record:** 16-6 Overall, 4-5 B1G

**Head Coach:** Lisa Bluder

**Next Event:** Thursday at Michigan State

**Notables:** Iowa has defeated seven teams that made the 2017 NCAA Tournament, including Quinnipiac, Western Kentucky, Elon, Iowa State, UNI, Drake, and Ohio State. The Hawkeyes have also beaten a pair of ranked opponents this season. Iowa defeated No. 19 Michigan, 82-72, in Iowa City on Dec. 31, before beating 12th-ranked Ohio State, 103-89, on Jan. 25. The win over the Buckeyes marked the first time Iowa scored 100 points against a Big Ten opponent since 2014-15 (102, Northwestern).

Junior Megan Gustafson has been recognized by the Big Ten Conference in 11 of the first 12 weeks of the season (6x Player of the Week, 5x Player of the Week Honor Roll). On Jan. 15, Gustafson tied a Big Ten single-season record with her sixth Player of the Week award of the season (Jantel Lavender, Ohio State, 2010-11).

Gustafson has registered a double-double in 20 of Iowa's 22 contests this season. She needs one double-double to tie the Iowa basketball record (men and women) for double-doubles in a career. Former Iowa men's basketball player Kevin Kunnert (1971-73) currently holds the record of 48.

## MEN'S GYMNASTICS

**Season Record:** 2-4 Overall, 0-3 B1G

**Head Coach:** JD Reive

**Next Event:** Sunday vs. Illinois

**Notables:** Senior Austin Hodges broke his own pommel horse record at the Windy City Invitational on Jan. 13 with a 14.700, the fourth-highest pommel horse score in the country. The Hawkeyes are currently ranked third in the country on pommel horse.

## WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

**Season Record:** 3-3 Overall, 3-0 B1G

**Head Coach:** Larissa Libby

**Next Event:** Friday at Maryland

**Notables:** Iowa is a perfect 3-0 in Big Ten competition after topping Michigan State and Maryland on the road, and defeating Ohio State at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes have improved their score each week during the first four meets. They posted a season-high 196.000 at Maryland on Jan. 25.

Nicole Chow won beam with a career-high 9.900 at Maryland, while Lanie Snyder registered a season-high 9.900 to win floor.

## **MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

**Notables:** The University of Iowa men's swimming and diving team posted a 194-101 victory over Northwestern on Jan. 20, its fourth Big Ten win of the season. Three Hawkeye men won multiple individual events – Jerzy Twarowski, Joe Myhre, and Kenneth Mende. Twarowski locked a 48.23 NCAA "B" qualifying time to win the 100 fly. He also won the 200 fly with a time of 1:49.54.

The Hawkeyes finished third overall in the team race at the Shamrock Invitational. Jack Smith posted an NCAA "B" qualifying time of 44.18 in the 100 free to finish second overall.

In the diving well, freshman Anton Hoherz finished second off the 3-meter springboard with an NCAA Zone Standard and season-best score of 389.50.

In the diving well, freshman Jayah Mathews dove to an NCAA Zone Standard score of 288.30 off the 3-meter springboard to finish third overall.
