Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

I. Approval of Minutes - December 3, 2020

Weinstein moved to approve the December 3, 2020, minutes; Torner seconded. Full approval was granted from PCA members.

II. Chair Report - Zaharis

Chair Zaharis reported for Cavey Lang, noting a PCA member has been assigned to a search committee formulated by the Athletics Department.

III. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement - Gerke

Subcommittee members met January 28, 2021, to discuss academic majors/minors of student-athletes. No issues were noted.

B. Equity - Nonnenmann

- 1. Chair Zaharis reported on behalf of Nonnenmann. Equity Subcommittee members met in January to discuss diversity, equity, & inclusion (DEI) plans for sports teams and other DEI initiatives with Binns. The cohort finalized questionnaires used during annual interviews with coaches, which will take place this semester.
- 2. Burke noted February 3, 2021, was National Girls and Women in Sports Day. In celebration, the UI Athletics Department hosted a webinar, sponsored by HERkys, which included four senior woman administrators from the Big Ten Conference. Webinars planned for remaining Wednesdays, Noon 1:00 p.m. CT, follow:
 - February 10, 2021- Debbie Antonelli, National Basketball Analyst
 - February 17, 2021 UI Women Coaches
 - February 24, 2021 Joni Comstock, Senior Vice President of Championships, NCAA
- **3.** February is Black History Month. Binns highlighted the following Athletics Department initiatives to celebrate:
 - Videos of former UI Black student-athletes will be released on three Mondays.
 - On Fridays, graphic spotlights of memorable stories 'near and dear' to Iowa City will appear. Tomorrow's release will be the story of the Tate Arms House.
- 4. Binns reported Dr. Derek Greenfield, a consultant on inclusive excellence and positive change, held three virtual training sessions for UI coaches, staff, and student-athletes on January 27, 2021. The presentation was well-received.

C. <u>Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner</u>

Torner stated the subcommittee has not met since the December PCA meeting.

IV. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report - Roethler

Nolan Roethler, track & field student-athlete and ISAAC's Career Development Chair, presented the following:

- **A.** ISAAC's first meeting of the semester took place yesterday. Five new members joined.
- **B.** Highlights from the Hawkeye Life Program follow:
 - 1. Leadership

- a. The Impact Program is underway whereby student-athletes serve as mentors to junior high school students to discuss academic planning. Interactions will take place virtually.
- **b.** Student-athletes who are part of the Hawkeye Inspire Panel will visit elementary school children about their experiences as a UI student-athlete.

2. Community Engagement

- **a.** Fundraising is ongoing for the UI Dance Marathon.
- **b.** ISAAC members are writing thank you notes to UI health-care providers.
- **c.** The food drive has been extended through February.

3. Career Development

A Hawks 2 Professionals ICON page was created as a resource for student-athletes. The site contains information regarding career-related events and modules, financial literacy, transition after graduation, etc. Videos of professionals in various fields of work are available 'on demand.'

4. Health and Well-Being

- a. Victoria Garrick, former University of Southern California volleyball student-athlete, will be presenting a TED Talk on mental health to interested student-athletes.
- **b.** Student-Athlete Academic Services staff members are partnering with the UI Speaking Center to assist student-athletes who need help with speaking assignments.

V. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Barta reported the following:

- **A.** Virtual Big Ten Meetings are ongoing. The NCAA Division I Council will meet February 17, 2021.
- **B.** Discussions continue on Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) across the country. The U.S. Department of Justice instructed the NCAA not to put forth legislation regarding NIL. Some legislators have instigated legislation within their states, Iowa included.

Dialog ensued among the PCA on the pros and cons of NIL and the welfare of the student-athletes. Various opinions and information were shared on this complex

matter, with most supporting student-athletes' rights to earn NIL income. This subject will remain at the forefront of discussions at the local, state, and national levels.

C. Matheson asked Barta for thoughts on the Knight Commission's recent article relating to NCAA Division I Governance restructuring. Barta commented that pulling football out of the mix would also reduce the funding source for most of Iowa's other sports; there is also talk about taking basketball out of the equation. It's a challenging issue.

VI. Athletics Director's Report - Barta

- **A.** The February sports reports and schedules are attached. Highlights follow:
 - 1. Football finished the season with 6 wins and 2 losses. They ranked 15th in the country.
 - 2. Men's basketball competes against Ohio State tonight at 8:00 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The game is on ESPN. The Hawkeyes are currently ranked 8th in the country.
 - 3. Ohio State hosts the Iowa women's basketball team tonight. Competition begins at 5:00 p.m. CT on the Big Ten Network.
 - **4.** Men's track debuted at number 9, the highest ranking in program history.
 - **5.** The women's gymnastics team achieved their highest ranking in school history at number 9.
 - **6.** Wrestling is ranked number 1 in the country.
- **B.** Barta and his staff keep a close eye on the student-athletes to ensure their mental health and safety during this unprecedented time dealing with COVID. He praised student-athletes for their perseverance and dedication to keeping themselves, teammates, and others safe.

MARCH REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 18-7 Overall (12-6 B1G)

Next Event: Thursday vs. Nebraska - 8 p.m. (BTN)

Notables: Iowa's seven wins over ranked opponents is tied for the most in the country (Kansas). The Hawkeyes are currently ranked fifth in the nation.

Iowa has won nine Big Ten games by double digits, the most in a single season in five years (10 in 2015-16).

Senior Luka Garza became Iowa's all-time leading scorer on Feb. 21, versus Penn State. The All-American is a finalist for every major national award, including the Wooden Award, Naismith Trophy, Oscar Robertson Trophy, and the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award.

Senior Jordan Bohannon became the program's all-time assists leader on Feb. 28 in lowa's win at No. 4 Ohio State. Bohannon is one of four players nationally since the 1992-93 season to amass more than 600 assists and 325 3-pointers made.

Iowa has 11 combined victories over Quad 1 and Quad 2 teams, tied for second most among Big Ten teams.

Garza is the first and only student-athlete in Big Ten history to accumulate 2,000 points, 850 rebounds, 125 blocked shots, and 100 3-pointers.

Junior Joe Wieskamp is one of five finalists for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award. He is the first junior in school history with 1,200+ points, 500+ rebounds, 150+ 3-pointers, 100+ assists, and 75+ steals.

lowa's final two games of the regular season are this week at home against Nebraska and Wisconsin.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 14-7 Overall (10-7 B1G)

Next Event: Wednesday at Indiana - 3:30 p.m. (BTN)

Notables: As a team, lowa is ranked in the top-7, nationally, in seven statistical categories, including second in field goal percentage (51.8) and scoring offense (88), third in 3-point percentage (41.2), fourth in assists per game (20.8), fifth in total assists (436), sixth in 3-pointers made (436), seventh in 3-pointers per game (9.9).

Junior Monika Czinano leads the nation in field-goal percentage (69.2), shooting 171-of-247 from the field.

Freshman Caitlin Clark leads the nation in total points, recording 564 on the season. She ranks second in total assists (149), assists per game (7.1), points per game (26.9), 3-pointers made (82), triple doubles (1), and 3-pointer attempts (202). The West Des Moines, Iowa, native ranks in the top-50, nationally, in seven additional statistical categories, including third in field goals made (188) and 3-

pointers per game (3.9), eighth in field goal attempts (394), 17th in free throws made (106), 28th in free throw attempts (125), 44th in 3-point percentage (40.6), and 45th in free-throw percentage (84.8).

Three Hawkeyes have earned Big Ten Weekly recognition, including Clark (12 Freshman of the Week, five Player of the Week, and three honor roll nods), Czinano (Player of the Week), and sophomore McKenna Warnock (Honor Roll).

Czinano has been named to the NCAA Starting Five, once. Clark was the first Big Ten freshman to be named the ESPN National Player of the Week on Dec. 14.

Clark has earned National Freshman of the Week honors from the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) three times (Jan. 5, Feb. 16, Feb. 23), was named ESPN National Player of the Week on Dec. 14, making her the first Big Ten freshman to earn the award, was named to the NCAA Starting Five three times (Dec. 9, Dec. 30, Feb. 17), was named to the Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Midseason Team on Feb. 9. She is one of two freshmen on the list, was named to the Dawn Staley Late Season Watch List on Feb. 5. The list includes 16 of the nation's top guards in women's basketball, was named one of five finalists for Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year award, and was named a semifinalist for the 2021 World Exposure Report Women's Freshman of the Year award.

Notables: The Hawkeyes held Indiana scoreless (Feb. 27) and did not allow a single shot in the 1-0 win over the Hoosiers. Senior Maddy Murphy scored the lone goal.

The Mieming Tyrol, Austria, native placed second in the tournament with a 54-hole score of 216 (E) and etched her name in the lowa record books, tying for 10th on the top-15 individual performance list. Zeitler carded 30 pars and 13 birdies over three rounds, and her low score of 66 (-6) marks the lowest individual performance for 18 holes in program history.

lowa finished fourth out of 133 teams at the UNLV Rebel Beach Invitational with a 54-hole score of 895 (+31). The Hawkeyes' second-round score of 284(-4) is the second best 18-hole score in program history and lowa's best performance since 2015 when the Hawkeyes recorded a 282 at the Johnie Imes Invitational during the 2015 fall season.

Black, an outside hitter, has recorded four straight games with at least 10 kills and is third on lowa in kills (102) and total attacks (305). Lowry, a defensive specialist, has averaged 1.38 digs per set.
