

Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Big Ten/Iowa Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

February 6, 2020

Chair Matheson called the session to order at 4:00 p.m.

Chair Matheson introduced and welcomed McLeran, who assumed the role of interim vice president for Student Life on January 1, 2020. The university is in the midst of a search.

I. Approval of Minutes - December 5, 2019

Colin moved to approve the December 5, 2019, minutes. The motion was seconded by Nonnenmann. PCA members granted full approval.

II. Head Coach Introduction - Vicki Brown, Women's Volleyball

Coach Brown spoke about her educational background and the path that led her to the University of Iowa in 2017. She touted her student-athletes as hardworking—both athletically and academically. The team will compete this fall in the new Xtreme Arena in Coralville, IA, while maintaining their practice site at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Coaches and team members will travel to Brazil and Peru this summer to experience a higher level of competition to improve their quality of play against talented international teams. Team members are excited to learn about the culture in these countries.

Barta credited Coach Brown for her efforts in working with volleyball student-athletes to gain their trust during the head coach transition last year and to develop a new team culture. He also announced the Big Ten Network interviewed Coach for a segment on The Big Show as part of Black history month.

Coach Brown answered questions from the PCA. Chair Matheson thanked her for the presentation; a round of applause followed.

III. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Kehoe

David Brown is the new assistant volleyball coach. Kehoe thanked Bowden for serving on the search committee.

IV. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement - Bowden

Bowden reported a discussion took place at the subcommittee's last meeting regarding tutor training and the process of assigning tutors to work with student-athletes. Student-Athlete Academic Services staff who attended the meeting spoke about the increase in numbers of student-athletes who require academic accommodations and the process to assist these individuals.

B. Equity - Dillavou

Equity Subcommittee members met twice since the last PCA meeting. Tovar reviewed student-athlete year-end survey data from 2019; Dillavou stated nothing of concern surfaced. Clerry presented participation and scholarship data for male and female student-athletes, which encompassed a discussion about roster management.

The guest speaker at the next meeting is Modestou.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner

Several Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee members attended the January 27, 2020, subcommittee meeting. A good discussion took place concerning career development, mental health, time management, social media, etc. Student-athletes addressed concerns with the national topic of name, image, and likeness and its potential ramifications.

V. ISAAC Report - Kerst

A. Student-athletes who apply for a position on ISAAC are currently required to complete a paper application. Work is underway to convert to an electronic submission.

B. Kaleigh Haus, soccer, is organizing student-athletes to participate in a Dance Marathon event by visiting patients at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics. The goal is to raise \$2600 to benefit UI Stead Family Children's Hospital.

- C. The 14 presidents of the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) are reviewing how this organization is structured. The group will create an executive board whose members plan to communicate monthly through Zoom sessions.

SAAC representatives are developing best practices for diversity, equity, and inclusion as well as for career development, which will be made available to Big Ten student-athlete advisory cohorts.

VI. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Barta reported ongoing discussions are taking place nationally about name, image, and likeness. The NCAA has a task force that has been working diligently on this topic for several months. They will present a proposal to the NCAA Board of Governors at their April 2020 meeting.

The Big Ten Conference developed a proposal allowing all student-athletes to transfer one time during their eligibility and play automatically. Further discussion will take place at the February 17-18, 2020, Big Ten Joint Group meetings.

VII. Athletics Director's Report - Barta

- A. The sports report and schedules for February are enclosed. Barta summed the report by stating the Athletics Department has incredible momentum in all sports. The many successes began last fall and have carried into the winter. Spring sports are gearing up.
- B. The annual NCAA Report is complete. Barta explained the NCAA's reporting process and how it differs from the Athletics Department's operating budget.
- C. The Board of Regents, State of Iowa, met February 5, 2020. A proposal to name the clubhouse at Finkbine Golf Course to the Nagle Family Clubhouse was granted. The UI also received Regents' approval to begin planning a new wrestling training facility south of Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

VIII. Adjourn

McLeran moved to adjourn the meeting; all members agreed. Chair Matheson ended the session at 4:56 p.m.

FEBRUARY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 16-6 Overall (7-4 B1G)

Next Event: Wednesday at Purdue - 6 p.m.

Notables: Iowa has registered five victories over nationally-ranked opponents, a total that ties Baylor for the most in the country. Also, the Hawkeyes have racked up a Big Ten-best 10 Quad 1 and Quad 2 wins, which is a computer metric the NCAA uses to help select teams for the NCAA Tournament.

Iowa has won 10 of its last 13 games, dating back to Dec. 9. The Hawkeyes have been nationally-ranked the last three weeks. Iowa has defended its home court, winning 11 of its 12 games, including 10 in a row. The Hawkeyes have also registered five wins away from Iowa City, tying for second most among Big Ten teams this season.

Luka Garza is having an All-American season, leading the Big Ten in scoring (23.0 ppg) and double-doubles (13), while ranking second in rebounding (10.4). He is the one of only two players nationally to average 23 points and 10 rebounds.

Garza has recorded five games this season with at least 25 points and 10 rebounds, the most among major conference players, and tying two others for the most in a single-season by a Big Ten student-athlete over the last decade. Garza was named to the *Sporting News* Midseason All-America First Team, and named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 and Lute Olson Award Midseason Top 30. Garza has amassed 507 points, the most by a Hawkeye to start a season in 49 years.

Connor McCaffery leads the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.15) and is one of only two players nationally since the 2007-08 season to total 80 or more assists and less than 20 turnovers in at least 20 games played.

Garza and Joe Wieskamp combine to average 38.1 points per game, which is the sixth highest scoring duo in Division I basketball this season.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 18-4 Overall (9-2 B1G)

Next Event: Thursday vs. Nebraska at Carver-Hawkeye Arena - 6:30 p.m.

Notables: Iowa is 18-4 on the season and 9-2 in conference play, winning nine straight Big Ten contests from Dec. 31-Jan. 30, the most consecutive regular-season conference wins since 1995-96 (12).

Iowa leads the nation in field goals assisted (70.8 percent) with 438 assists on 619 baskets.

The Hawkeyes rank fourth in assists per game (19.9), fifth in total assists (445), fifth in field goal percentage (48.2), and ninth in free throws made (331).

Iowa is also ranked in the top 25 in five additional categories, including 14th in scoring offense (79.0), 16th in assist turnover ratio (1.3), 22nd in 3-point percentage (36.8) and 25th in won-lost percentage (81.8).

The Hawkeyes are leading the Big Ten in six categories, including total assists (438), assists per game (19.9), field-goal percentage (48.2), free throws made (331), 3-pointers made (170), and 3-pointers per game (7.7).

Iowa ranks second in assist turnover ratio (1.31), free throw attempts (445), free-throw percentage (74.4), scoring offense (79.0 ppg), and 3-point percentage (36.8).

The Hawkeyes are third in fewest fouls (330), fouls per game (15.0), and 3-point attempts (462).

Four Hawkeyes have earned eight Big Ten weekly honors, including senior Kathleen Doyle's two player of the week (Jan. 6, Jan. 13) and two honor roll (Nov. 25, Jan. 27) honors, freshman McKenna Warnock's freshman of the week honor (Jan. 27), two honor roll mentions for senior Makenzie Meyer (Dec. 16, Dec. 23), and an honor roll mention for sophomore Monika Czinano (Jan. 20).

FOOTBALL

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Final Season Record: 10-3 Overall (6-3 B1G)

Notables: Iowa concluded the season on a four-game winning streak and an overall record of 10-3 following a 49-24 win over No. 22 USC in the Holiday Bowl on Dec. 27. The win was Iowa's third straight post-season victory and gives the Hawkeyes a 12-game non-conference winning streak.

The Hawkeyes ended the season ranked 15th in the final Associated Press rankings and coaches poll. Iowa football won as many as 10 games for the ninth time in school history (six under Kirk Ferentz, three under Hayden Fry). Iowa's 47 wins since 2015 are the most in any five year period at Iowa and rank ninth best nationally.

Junior wide receiver Ihmir Smith-Marsette was named the offensive MVP in the Holiday Bowl, scoring one rushing touchdown, one receiving touchdown, and one touchdown on a 98-yard kickoff return. Smith-Marsette is just the second Iowa player ever to score rushing, receiving and kick return touchdowns in the same game.

Junior defensive end A.J. Epenesa was named the defensive MVP. Epenesa recorded 2.5 sacks to tie Iowa's school record for a bowl game and the Holiday Bowl record, as the Iowa defense allowed USC just 22 net rushing yards in the contest.

Junior kicker Keith Duncan earned Consensus All-America honors, while Epenesa and junior offensive tackle Tristan Wirfs each earned first and second-team All-America recognition.

Duncan established Iowa and conference records with 29 field goals (34 attempts). He also set Iowa records for field goal attempts in a game (six) and season (34).

Duncan was named the Big Ten's Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year. In addition, Wirfs was named the Rimington-Pace Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: JD Reive

Season Record: 4-4 Overall (1-1 B1G)

Next Event: Saturday at Oklahoma - 5 p.m.

Notables: The No. 9 Hawkeyes won their home opener against No. 10 Minnesota and No. 19 UIC Feb. 1. The Hawkeyes posted their second highest team score of 400.000. Junior Bennet Huang won the all-around (81.050) and earned his season-best on the high bar (13.500). Sophomore Evan Davis won the rings event and tied his career-best score of 13.500.

The Hawkeyes fell to Nebraska on Jan. 26, 409.850-402.950. Davis earned his career-best scores on the floor (14.400), rings (13.500), parallel bars (13.650) and high bar (13.750). Senior Mitch Mandozzi won the vault event with a career-high score (14.600). Senior Brandon Wong won the rings event with a score of 13.800.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Season Record: (4-4, Overall, 1-2 B1G)

Next Event: Saturday at Minnesota - 6 p.m.

Notables: The GymHawks won their home opener (195.500) over Ball State (192.775) and Air Force (188.650) on Jan. 11, and set a season-high team score of 49.200 on floor at Maryland on Jan. 19. Two Hawkeyes etched their names into the record book, including freshman Allyson Steffensmeier with 9.925 on bars, tying for sixth and sophomore Lauren Guerin earned a 9.925 on vault, tying for ninth in the record book and a 9.950 on floor, to tie for third all-time at Iowa.

Iowa recorded a season-high team score on vault (49.150) on Feb. 1 against Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye arena. Four freshmen earned career-high scores on vault including, Dani Castillo (9.775), Ariana Agrapides (9.850), and Maddy Solomon (9.800).

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Marc Long

Season Record: 3-3 Overall (2-3 B1G)

Next Event: Friday vs. Western Illinois at UI Campus Wellness & Recreation Center - 6 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeyes collected a victory over Notre Dame, 159.50-140.50, but fell to Northwestern, 143-157, in a B1G brawl. Iowa also notched a second-place finish at the Shamrock Invitational with 917 points.

In January, the Hawkeyes won 15 individual events and tallied three entries into the program record books. Freshman Sergey Kuznetsov broke into the top 10 in the 100 fly with a time of 47.97.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Marc Long

Season Record: 5-4 Overall (3-3 B1G)

Next Event: Friday vs. Western Illinois at UI Campus Wellness & Recreation Center - 6 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeyes notched a victory over Illinois, 223-86, on Jan. 11. Iowa also fell to Notre Dame (89.50-309.50) and Northwestern (101-199). Iowa placed fourth at the Shamrock Invitational with 629.5 points.

In January, the Hawkeyes won three individual events and tallied nine entries into the program record books. Senior Allyssa Fluit and freshman Macy Rink, Julia Koluch, Millie Sansome, and Kennedy Gilbertson all made it into Iowa's top 10 rankings. Sansome, Gilbertson, and Koluch all notched times in the 200 back.

MEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Season Record: 4-1 Overall (0-0 B1G)

Next Event: Saturday at Drake - 6 p.m.

Notables: After dropping its season opener to Texas Tech, the Hawkeyes have won four straight home matches, beating Western Michigan, Omaha, Marquette, and Creighton.

Kareem Allaf is ranked No. 60 nationally, the highest the redshirt senior has been ranked in his career. He now owns the third most singles wins in school history (72). Allaf is also tied for fourth all-time in combined wins in program history.

The doubles duo of junior Will Davies and sophomore Oliver Okonkwo is ranked No. 16 in the country, the highest ranking for an Iowa doubles team since Ramel/Aguirre (No. 25 in 1989). Davies/Okonkwo are currently the third highest ranked doubles team in the Big Ten.

Junior Joe Tyler leads the team in singles victories this season with four.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Season Record: 1-3 Overall (0-0 B1G)

Next Event: Friday at Minnesota - 4 p.m.

Notables: Iowa won their season opener against South Alabama, 6-1. The Hawkeyes are 4-0 in season openers under head coach Sasha Schmid. Senior Elise van Heuvelen Treadwell was 3-0 in singles and 1-1 in doubles in January.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at Frank Sevigne Husker Invite in Lincoln, Nebraska, and Meyo Invite in South Bend, Indiana

Notables: Iowa took first at the Larry Wieczorek Invitational. Sophomore Wayne Lawrence ran the 600 meters for the first time in competition and took first while breaking a school record. He leads the Big 10 in both the 400 (46.40) and 600 meters (1:16.55), and ranks second in the 200 meters (21.11).

Senior Jaylan McConico earned his second B1G Track Athlete of the week for his performance in the 60-meter hurdles. He leads the Big 10 and ranks third in the country for his time of 7.66 that was set at the Jimmy Grant Invitational on Dec. 14.

Senior Nathan Mylenek posted a personal-best 7:58.37 in the 3,000 meters at the UW Invitational, which ranks second in the Big Ten and all-time for Iowa.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at Frank Sevigne Husker Invite in Lincoln, Nebraska, and Meyo Invite in South Bend, Indiana

Notables: At the Black and Gold Invite on Jan. 31-Feb. 1, senior Laulauga Tausaga led the women by taking first and breaking meet records in both the weight throw and shot put. By the end of this weekend, Tausaga's weight throw (21.33m) ranks third in the Big Ten and her shot put (16.72) from the Larry Wieczorek Invite on Jan. 25 ranks fifth. She made school history when she was named to the 2020 Bowerman Watch List on Jan. 6.

Senior Jenny Kimbro set a personal best (8.25) in the 60-meter hurdles at the Jimmy Gant Invitational on Dec. 14. Her time leads the Big 10 and ranks 22nd in the nation.

WRESTLING

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Season Record: 10-0 Overall (7-0 B1G)

Next Event: Saturday at Michigan - 7 p.m.

Notables: Iowa is ranked No. 1 in the country. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 2 Penn State, 19-17, on Jan. 31 in front of 14,905 fans, the fourth wrestling sellout in the history of Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Senior Michael Kemerer (10-0) upset top-ranked Mark Hall, 11-6, at 174 pounds, and redshirt freshman heavyweight Tony Cassioppi (15-0) put Iowa in front with a 7-0 win in the dual's final match.

All 10 Iowa wrestlers are ranked, led by No. 1 Spencer Lee. The two-time defending NCAA champion is 12-0 with 12 bonus-point wins. He has outscored his last seven opponents 110-2.
