

Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Big Ten/Iowa Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

February 7, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 4:02 p.m. by Chair Matheson.

I. Approval of Minutes - December 6, 2018

Rhodes moved to approve the December 6, 2018, minutes; Kelly seconded. Unanimous approval was recorded from Committee members.

II. Report on Equity in Hiring - Jennifer Modestou

Modestou presented the attached PowerPoint on the Athletics Department Hiring Report for FY 2016-18. Her presentation covered coaching and administrative hires, the numbers of women and racial/ethnic minorities in that cohort, comparative data with the University of Iowa and the Big Ten Conference, demographic data on applicants, recruitment activity/trends, and initiatives and best practices for diversity. Slide 25 of the presentation highlights "Recommended Best Practices for Diversity."

PCA members asked questions throughout her presentation. Chair Matheson thanked Modestou; she received a round of applause from Committee members.

Hilleman reported the second phase of the Athletics Department employment review by Fredrikson & Byron, P.A. is complete; the report can be viewed on the UI's Human Resources website. The evaluation was positive overall and did not uncover inequities based on gender, ethnicity, or anything else. Recommendations for improvement were noted, some of which had already been put into action by Athletics' staff. The employment review for the Athletics Department is finished.

Fredrikson & Byron staff will now begin focusing on UI's employment practices.

III. Athletics Department Searches - Kehoe

Kehoe reported three candidates were interviewed for the assistant soccer coach position. Blair Quinn was the successful candidate.

IV. Subcommittee Updates

A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Dillavou

Dillavou noted subcommittee members met January 17, 2019, to discuss the Student-Athlete Grievance Policy as well as the Student-Athlete Travel Policy. Dialog on the Grievance Policy will be continued at the February 25, 2019, meeting. Minor wording changes will be made to the Travel Policy.

B. Academic Achievement - Bowden

Student-Athlete Academic Services staff members John Bruno and Betsy Kern attended the meeting on January 24, 2019, to discuss the personalized academic support system for student-athletes.

C. Equity - Osborn

Osborn reported the group met with Tovar on December 14, 2018, to review student-athlete exit surveys. The Equity Subcommittee met again on February 4, 2019, to discuss the Athletics Department Hiring Practices with Modestou and Hilleman.

V. ISAAC Report - Gustafson, Colin

Chair Matheson announced that Gustafson received her 20th Big Ten Player of the Week career award. Women's basketball competes at home tonight against Michigan State.

Colin reported the following:

- A.** Staff members from the Taylor Hooton Foundation met with student-athletes to educate them on steroid usage.
- B.** Eighty-five student-athletes earned "Hawkeye 5" honors during the fall semester. This initiative challenges student-athletes to complete five hours of volunteer service each semester. The plan is to recognize these individuals at the Golden Herkys event on April 23, 2019, at Hancher Auditorium.
- C.** Student-athletes spent quality time with Stead Family Children's Hospital patients and their families playing games, signing autographs, etc. as part of the UI Dance Marathon activities.

Football student-athletes Levi and Landan Paulsen cut their shoulder-length hair and trimmed their beards to raise funds for Dance Marathon. The efforts garnered over \$15,000 for this cause.

- D. Applications are now available to freshman student-athletes who would like to serve on ISAAC.

VI. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

- A. Hollingworth announced she attended the NCAA Annual Convention in January 2019. She stated a Pac-12 legislative proposal passed 80-0 requiring institutions to make mental health services and resources available to its student-athletes through the department of athletics and/or the institution's health services or counseling services department. Effective date is August 1, 2019. Iowa was in compliance prior to this passing.

Nominations are being accepted for a position on the NCAA Board of Governors per Hollingworth.

- B. Barta added two other topics widely discussed at the Convention were student-athlete transfers and sports wagering.


VII. Athletics Director's Report - Gary Barta

- A. Barta presented highlights from the enclosed February sports report and schedules:
 - 1. Iowa football was victorious over Mississippi State in the 2019 Outback Bowl.
 - 2. Field hockey went to the Big Ten Championships and NCAA Tournament, and finished in the top 10.
 - 3. Women's basketball is currently ranked 16th in the country. Tonight they compete at home against Michigan State at 8:00 p.m.
 - 4. Ranked #20 in the country is the Iowa men's basketball team. They play Indiana tonight in Bloomington, IN. Iowa beat #5 Michigan last week.
 - 5. The #3 ranked Iowa wrestling team is undefeated. Maryland is their next opponent on Friday, February 8, 2019.
 - 6. The women's indoor track team is ranked 15th, which is the highest ranking in Iowa's history in this sport.
 - 7. The Larry Wiecek Invitational was held January 18-19, 2019. The indoor track event continues to attract big programs each year.
 - 8. Student-Athlete Lauluga Tausaga is #1 in weight throw in America. She is the second female in Big Ten history to receive National Athlete of the Week honors in her sport.
 - 9. Spring sports are underway.

- B.** Barta anticipates the sports wagering bill will pass in Iowa. Any regulatory measures will be determined by state legislators; how they plan to educate, monitor, and ensure compliance are yet to be announced.
- C.** The annual NCAA Financial Report was filed reflecting a \$6 million surplus in revenue over expense. Barta said that money appeared in the report as a surplus because of the reporting requirements established by the NCAA. In reality, the \$6 million was committed as follows: \$2 million was transferred to the UI for campus initiatives, i.e., diversity, alcohol harm reduction, financial aid, etc.; \$2 million was transferred into the Athletics Department's Reserve Fund, and \$2 million was directed to reinstallation of the Digital Antenna System in Kinnick Stadium.
- D.** HERky's Brunch, the second annual celebration of women's sports, will take place May 4, 2019, 10:30 am, Feller Club Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

FY 2018: Summary of Applicant Data

Coaching Positions

- 12 hires via searches; one hire via search waiver
- Four coaches hired for men's teams, five for women's teams, and four for combined teams
- Women made up 13% of the total pool and 46% of hires (6 individuals)
- Minorities made up 19% of total pool and 31% of hires (4 individuals)

Administrative Positions

- 22 hires via searches; no search waivers this year
- Women made up 32% of the total pool and 59% of hires (13 individuals)
- Minorities made up 13% of total pool and 5% of hires (1 individual)

- Applicants invited to complete a *voluntary* Applicant Self-Identification Form
 - May indicate their race/ethnicity, sex, age (40 or older), disability and/or veteran status, and how they learned of the position
 - Overall, 64% of applicants for P&S positions in the Athletics Department in FYs 16 – 18 provided some self-identification information
 - Campus response rate for P&S positions \approx 48%

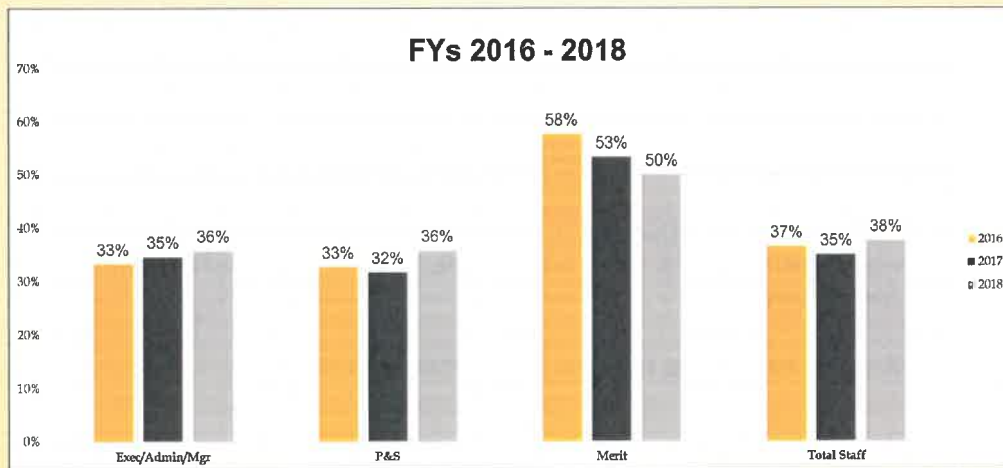

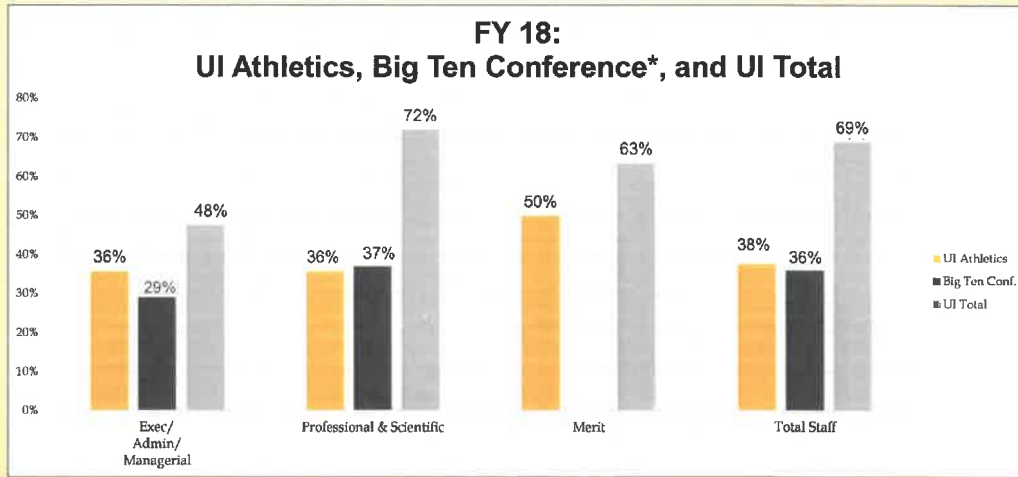

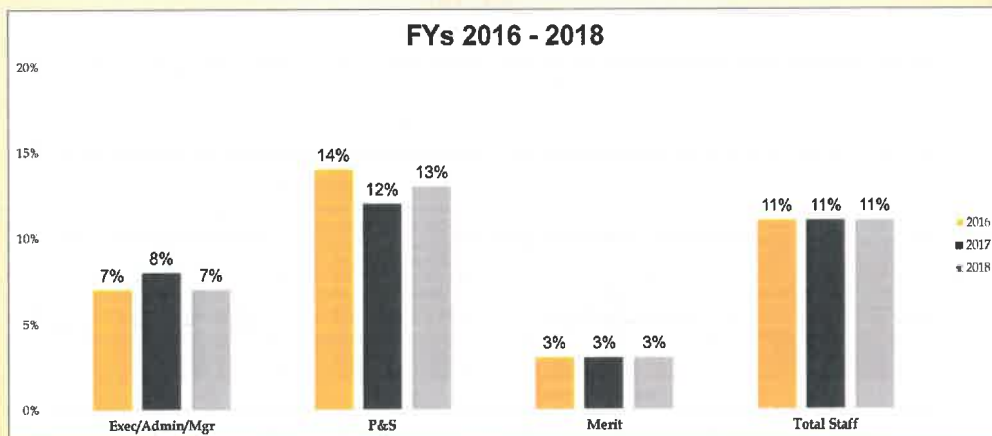

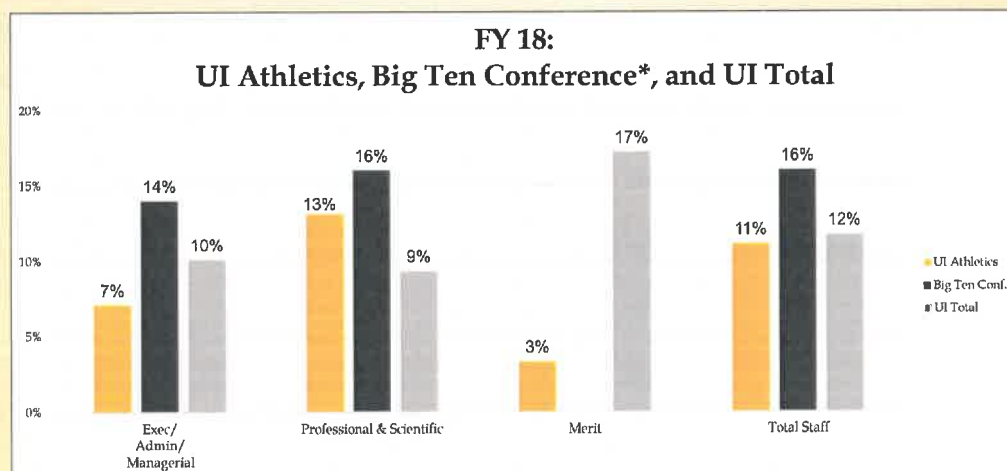

FEBRUARY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 17-5 Overall, 6-5 B1G

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Next Event: Thursday at Indiana at 8 p.m. - Assembly Hall - Bloomington, Indiana (ESPN)

Notables: Iowa won all of its non-conference games (11-0) for the first time since the 1986-87 season. The Hawkeyes have won 11 of their last 14 games, dating back to the victory over Iowa State on Dec. 6. Iowa's 16-3 record to start the season matches its best start in the Fran McCaffery era (2015-16).

Freshman Joe Wieskamp has been named Big Ten Freshman of the Week two of the last three weeks, including Monday following Iowa's 74-59 win over No. 5 Michigan. Wieskamp totaled 16 points, seven rebounds, five steals, and two assists in lifting the Hawkeyes to their highest win over a ranked opponent since beat fourth-ranked Michigan State on Jan. 14, 2016. The win over the Wolverines moved McCaffery into a tie with Lute Olson for second most wins in program history (168).

Iowa has had two players top 1,000 points in their careers – juniors Tyler Cook and Jordan Bohannon. Cook is one of 20 players in program history to amass 1,100 points and 500 rebounds. Bohannon joins brothers Matt (UNI) and Jason (Wisconsin) in the 1,000-point club.

Iowa set a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for field goal percentage when it made 68 percent of its attempts in a 95-71 win over Illinois. The Hawkeyes also made history in an 89-82 road win against Penn State, scoring the most points it has ever scored in a game at Penn State, dating back to 1955.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 17-5 Overall, 8-3 B1G

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Next Event: Thursday vs. Michigan State at 8 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City (BTN)

Notables: The Iowa women's basketball team is ranked 16th in the AP Poll and the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Hawkeyes are off to their best start in Big Ten play since 2014-15. Through 22 games this season, Iowa leads the nation in field goal percentage (52.3 percent) and total assists (488). The Hawkeyes also rank second in assists per game

(22.2), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.61), 15th in scoring offense (80.2), and 18th in free throw percentage (76.3). Entering into Thursday's contest vs. Michigan State, Iowa is in second place in the conference standings, just one game behind first-place Rutgers and Maryland (9-2).

Senior Megan Gustafson broke a Big Ten Conference record with her 20th career Player of the Week award on Feb. 4. She also broke her own single-season record (10). The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native has been honored by the conference every week this season, including 10 Player of the Week awards and three Honor Roll mentions.

Gustafson is on several Player of the Year Watch Lists. They include the Wade Trophy Award (WBCA) Watch List, John R. Wooden Award Late Season Top-20, Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Top-15, and the Lisa Leslie Award Watch List. On Feb. 6, Gustafson was named one of 10 finalist for the 2019 Senior CLASS Award.

FOOTBALL

Season Record: 9-4 Overall, 5-4 B1G (Tie-2nd)

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Notables: Iowa won its ninth game of the season with a 27-22 win over No. 18 Mississippi State in the 2019 Outback Bowl. The Outback Bowl marked the 16th postseason appearance for Iowa under coach Kirk Ferentz, including the 11th January bowl game.

Iowa won its postseason game for the second straight year and improved to 16-15-1 overall in 32 bowl appearances.

Senior wide receiver Nick Easley was named the Outback Bowl MVP after grabbing eight receptions for 104 yards and two touchdowns. Easley surpassed 100 career receptions and 1,000 career receiving yards with his bowl performance.

The Hawkeyes ended the season with a three-game winning streak. Iowa closed the regular season with wins over Illinois (63-0) and Nebraska (31-28).

Iowa tied for second in the Big Ten West Division and for the fourth straight year won trophy games against Iowa State, Minnesota and Nebraska.

Three Hawkeye players earned individual Big Ten honors, as T.J. Hockenson was named Tight End of the Year, Amani Hooker was named Defensive Back

of the Year, and Ihmir Smith-Marsette was recognized as Return Specialist of the year.

In addition to the conference honor, Hockenson was named the recipient of the John Mackey Award as the top tight end in the nation. Under Ferentz, nine Hawkeye players have earned 10 national Player of the Year award.

A total of 33 members of the football team earned Academic All-Big Ten honors. Defensive end Anthony Nelson was named a second team CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Head coach Kirk Ferentz improved his Iowa record to 152-101. He is Iowa's winningest football coach and ranks fifth in the Big Ten Conference in career wins at a conference school.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 1-2 Overall, 0-2 B1G

Head Coach: JD Reive

Next Event: Saturday vs. Oklahoma at 2 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeye men's gymnastics team has competed in three meets, and have bested their previous overall team score each time. The last time Iowa competed, it broke 400 team points with a score of 401.600 to place second in a meet with No. 6 Minnesota and Illinois-Chicago. Sophomore Bennet Huang and junior Andrew Herrador tied for the vault title with career-high scores (14.550) at Illinois. Nine Hawkeyes earned 14 season bests in their meet against No. 6 Minnesota and Illinois-Chicago, two of which include career-bests from senior Jake Brodarzon on vault (14.450, 2nd), and junior Mitch Mandozzi on parallel bars (13.750, 4th).

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 2-4 Overall, 1-2 B1G

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Next Event: Sunday at No. 10 Michigan at 1 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeye women's gymnastics team is ranked 40th in the country in the latest road to nationals poll. Iowa earned a season high score of 194.775 vs. No. 15 Ohio State. The GymHawks beat Rutgers, 194.575-191.625 on Jan. 26 for their first Big Ten win of the season. Freshman Bridget Killian won two events, beam (9.725) and vault (9.750), freshman Lauren Guerin won floor (9.875), and senior Nicole Chow won bars (9.900) vs. Rutgers.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 6-2 Overall, 3-2 B1G

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: Feb. 27-Mar. 2 - Big Ten Championships, hosted by Iowa at the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center in Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeye men swept Western Illinois in all 12 events last Friday to improve to 6-2 on the season. Thomas Pederson (2), Will Brenner (2), Caleb Babb (1), Will Scott (1), Steve Fiolic (1), Jackson Kuhlers (1), and Anze Fers Erzen (1) all took home individual victories.

The men also took home the top four spots in the 200 free, 50 free, and 100 free to complete the dominant sweep.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 6-6 Overall, 2-4 B1G

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: Feb. 20-23 at Big Ten Championships in Bloomington, Indiana

Notables: The Hawkeye women posted two victories, downing Western Illinois (172-49) and Northern Iowa (137-86) in the home finale. Iowa dominated the 3-meter springboards with sophomore Jayah Mathews (380.20), freshman Sam Tamborski (355.05), and senior Jacintha Thomas (310.20) placing 1-2-3. All three scores were career bests. Mathews also won the 1-meter springboard with a score of 324.70. Allyssa Fluit led the charge in the pool with three first place finishes in the 200 free, 500 free, and 100 free.

MEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Next Event: Friday vs Miami at 3 p.m. - Hawkeye Tennis & Recreation Complex - Iowa City

Notables: The Iowa Hawkeyes men's tennis team is off to its best start in five seasons (5-0), outscoring its opponents, 29-6 in its five January matches.

Doubles has dominated, scoring the team point in each dual, most notably at No. 1 Kareem Allaf and Jonas Larsen have started the season undefeated.

Sophomores Will Davies and Piotr Smietana are undefeated in singles, boasting a combined 13-0 record.

Iowa hosts Miami (Friday) and Utah (Sunday) this weekend at the HTRC.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Next Event: Friday vs. Iowa State at 7 p.m. - Hawkeye Tennis & Recreation Complex - Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeyes have opened the season with four straight wins. They host Iowa State on Friday, their first of three nonconference matches before opening the Big Ten season Feb. 22 at Northwestern.

Tausaga also improved her shot put school record (16.70 meters, 54-9 1/2) at the Larry Wiczorek Invitational. Kimbro improved her second all-time 60-meter hurdles rank after running 8.27 at the Frank Sevigne Invite, and Simmons improved to fourth all-time at Iowa in the high jump (1.78 meters, 5-10) and broke onto the top-10 list in the 60-meter hurdles (8.55).

The USTFCCCA ranked the women's track and field program 15th in the country, the highest ranking in program history.
