Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

The meeting was called to order at 4:01 p.m. by Chair Matheson.

I. Approval of Minutes - February 6, 2020

Courter moved to approve the February 6, 2020, minutes; Torner seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was granted from PCA Committee members.

II. Diversity Pledge - Tovar

Tovar reminded Committee members that diversity training is an annual requirement for Athletics staff and student-athletes. In January 2020, the Student-Athlete Academic Services Office hosted the Ross Initiative in Sports for Equality (RISE). RISE staff facilitated leadership workshops for student-athletes aimed at raising knowledge and encouraging conversation about diversity, equity, and inclusion. One objective of the program was to develop a department-wide diversity, equity, and inclusion statement drafted by student-athletes. Broderick Binns, Interim Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, spearheaded this project with input from UI student-athletes and assistance from Athletics External Relations staff. The result was the "Hawkeye Pledge." PCA members viewed a video, which is one tool that will be used to disseminate the pledge. Discussion took place on further plans to share the pledge with various groups.

III. Report on Equity in Hiring - Jennifer Modestou

Attached is a PowerPoint presentation presented by Modestou entitled "UI Athletics: Hiring Activity Report FY 2017-FY 2019." Her report covered the hiring activity for the Athletics Department in FY 2019. Data presented encompassed three years to illustrate recruitment activity and trends, demographic data, and comparisons relating to hiring

within the Big Ten Conference and the UI for women and ethnic minority positions. She reminded the Committee that search policies for the Athletics Department mirror those of the UI. Athletics Department initiatives and best practices for diversity were depicted in the presentation.

Modestou answered questions from PCA members. Chair Matheson thanked her for the report.

IV. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Kehoe

Chair Matheson gave the following report in Kehoe's absence. Advertising for the position of Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion will begin next week. Nonnenmann will serve on the search committee.

V. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement - Bowden

In Bowden's absence, Friestad reported a discussion at the February 27, 2020, subcommittee meeting encompassed student-athlete grade changes, summer school policy, and Finkbine Banquet award nominees.

B. Equity - Dillavou

Dillavou stated Modestou previewed the "UI Athletics: Hiring Activity Report FY 2017-FY 2019" with subcommittee members. Hilleman will be the guest speaker at their next meeting and will discuss compensation for select positions.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner

Toner reported that Assistant Athletics Director for Sports Medicine and Sports Performance Terry Noonan attended the meeting on February 24, 2020. He gave an overview of the Sports Medicine program and discussed communication aspects between the medical staff, trainers, and student-athletes, as well apps used to track student-athletes' stress, pain, sleep, and nutrition habits. Sport Psychologist Aubrette Kinne also attended to report on sport performance and counseling services for student-athletes and avenues of communications she and her associate Carmen Tebbe use to converse with student-athletes. Kinne highlighted several programs in existence to aid/promote the health and well-being of student-athletes.

A tour of their newly renovated office space followed in the Jacobson Athletic Building.

VI. ISAAC Report - Kerst

A. ISAAC has been working with the Hawkeye Wellness Outreach Committee to plan health and well-being events for the spring semester.

- **B.** On March 26, 2020, a speaker from #SameHere program will interact with student-athletes to talk about mental health. ISAAC will meet with Athletics staff on March 27, 2020, to discuss plans to share this training with all student-athletes.
- C. Twenty-eight applications were received as of last week for the Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee for 2020-21, six of those were for executive positions. The application process ends March 25, 2020. ISAAC members created a video to entice membership, with assistance from Athletics External Relations; the video was posted on the Student-Athlete Academic Services and ISAAC social media sites.
- **D.** An advisor from International Programs will speak at the ISAAC meeting tomorrow, March 11, 2020, about concerns related to the coronavirus. All international student-athletes received an invitation.
- E. The annual Golden Herkys event will take place May 3, 2020. Details to follow.

VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Discussions continue on the topics of transfers and NIL (name, image, and likeness) per Barta.

VIII. Athletics Director's Report - Barta

- A. Enclosed are the sports report and schedules for March. Barta highlighted the following:
 - 1. Kathleen Doyle, Luka Garza, and Spencer Lee each received "Athlete of the Year" in their sport. This is the first time in Big Ten history those three sports have been awarded to the same school.
 - 2. Luka Garza received National Player of the Year honors today by *Sporting News*.
 - 3. Iowa wrestling won the Big Ten Championship. Three student-athletes were crowned champions. The NCAA Championships take place in Minneapolis, MN.
 - 4. The women's basketball team competed at the Big Ten Tournament. On Monday, March 16, 2020, the team finds out who/where they will play in the NCAA Tournament.
 - 5. The men's basketball team plays Thursday, March 12, 2020, in the Big Ten Tournament. On Sunday, March 15, 2020, the NCAA will extend invitations to its participants.
 - **6.** Spring sports are getting underway.
- **B.** The Finkbine Clubhouse is in the final stages of construction.
- C. Fundraising continues for Carver Circle, the new wrestling complex.

D. Barta reassured Committee members he and his staff are closely monitoring the coronavirus outbreak to ensure the health and well-being of all student-athletes and staff.

A motion was made by Hollingworth to adjourn; Kerst seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was granted. Chair Matheson closed the session at 4:55 p.m.

MARCH REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

BASEBALL

Head Coach: Rick Heller

Season Record: 7-5 Overall (0-0 B1G)

Next Event: Tuesday vs. Kansas -- 4:05 p.m. -- Duane Banks

Field in Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeyes won five of its last six games, including a 22-2 win over Georgetown and two wins over ranked ACC opponents. Iowa's wins over No. 20 North Carolina and No. 14 Duke both came in comeback fashion. The Hawkeyes trailed the Tar Heels 4-0 entering the ninth inning and won 5-4 in the bottom of the 10th on an Austin Martin walk-off home run. Against the Blue Devils, the Hawkeyes overcame two multi-run deficits to win 7-5.

Junior infielder Izaya Fullard is leading lowa offensively, leading the Big Ten in RBIs (20), tied for second in runs scored (17), and ranking eighth in batting average (.385). Fullard has recorded five straight multi-RBI and multi-hit games. Seniors Zeb Adreon (.333), Ben Norman (.306), and Austin Martin (.302) are all hitting above .300. Iowa's .291 team batting average ranks third in the Big Ten.

Led by senior Grant Judkins (2-0, 3.00 ERA) and redshirt sophomore Jack Dreyer (2-1, 3.32 ERA), the Hawkeyes own the fifth best ERA (3.94) in the Big Ten.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 20-11 Overall (11-9 B1G)

Next Event: Thursday vs. Minnesota/Northwestern at B1G

Tournament -- 1:30 p.m. -- Indianapolis, Indiana

Notables: Iowa finished the regular season tied for fifth place in the Big Ten standings, posting 10 or more victories for the fifth time in six seasons. Fran McCaffery has guided Iowa to upper division finishes in the league seven of the last eight seasons.

lowa has been nationally ranked for a majority of the season, registering seven victories over nationally-ranked opponents, a total that ties for the most in the country. Also, the Hawkeyes have totaled a combined 13 Quad 1 and Quad 2 wins, which ties for third most among Big Ten teams.

Luka Garza has had a sensational season. The junior center was named Big Ten Player of the Year on Monday, becoming the first Hawkeye to be named "MVP" of the conference since Sam Williams in 1968. Garza, also a unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection, broke the school's 50-year old single-season scoring record. He also tied Fred Brown's 49-year old record of 16 straight games of scoring 20 points or more in a game. Garza's 16-game streak of 20+ points against Big Ten competition is the longest by any player since Ohio State's Dennis Hopson

(16) in 1987. Garza is a finalist for five national awards: Naismith Trophy, Oscar Robertson Trophy, Wooden Award, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, and the Lute Olson Award.

In addition to Garza's honors, Joe Wieskamp was named third-team All-Big Ten, while CJ Fredrick was honored on the five-player All-Big Ten Freshman Team. Connor McCaffery is the recipient of the lowa men's basketball team's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.

McCaffery leads the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.59) and is one of only two players nationally since the 2007-08 season to total 120 or more assists and less than 30 turnovers in at least 30 games played.

Garza and Wieskamp combine to average 37.9 points per game, which is the fifth highest scoring duo in Division I basketball this season.

Notables: Senior Kathleen Doyle was named Big Ten Player of the Year (March 2). Doyle also earned unanimous first team All-Big Ten honors (coaches & media). Sophomore Monika Czinano earned first team All-Big Ten honors from the media and second team accolades from the coaches. Senior Makenzie Meyer earned second team All-Big Ten honors from the coaches and media and was named Iowa's Sportsmanship Award honoree. McKenna Warnock was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team by the coaches.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: April 5-7 at Calusa Cup -- Naples, Florida

Notables: Iowa finished sixth at the Colleton River Collegiate, 10th at the Puerto Rico Classic, and finished fifth at Big Ten Match Play so far this spring.

Sophomore Gonzalo Leal Montero paced Iowa at the Puerto Rico Classic, finishing in 13th place. He carded a four-under-par 68 in the final round, which ties for the seventh lowest 18-hole score in Iowa history.

Senior Alex Scahake finished in seventh place at the Colleton River Collegiate. His 54-hole score of 213 ties for the 12th lowest score in program history.

Senior Benton Weinberg and Schaake each posted 3-1 records at Big Ten Match Play, while Leal Montero was 2-1-1 to lead the Hawkeyes.

Notables: Freshman Lea Zeitler was named Big Ten Golfer of the Week for her performance at the All State Sugar Bowl. Zeitler carded a career-best four-under-par 215 and fired three straight under-par rounds to tie for a career-best eighth place. She sank 13 birdies and finished three shots off the lead. The Hawkeyes finished the All State Sugar Bowl 13th with a three-round score of 915 (+39).

As a team, lowa is ranked sixth in the country on floor,

vault, and high bar.

Junior Bennet Huang is fourth in the country in the allaround, while Davis is eighth.

Iowa earned five individual career highs, tied four additional career highs, two Hawkeyes earned season highs, and the team recorded season highs on bars and floor, tied the season vault high, and broke the team season high.

Two Hawkeyes etched their names into the record book, including freshman Allyson Steffensmeier with 9.925 on bars, tying for sixth and sophomore Lauren Guerin earned a 9.925 on vault, tying for ninth in the record book and a 9.950 on floor, to tie for third all-time at Iowa.

Notables: lowa is two wins shy of tying the team's win total from 2019 (19). lowa is currently ranked first in the Big Ten and is 7-3 in the team's last 10 games. That stretch is tied for best in the Big Ten.

Freshman Nia Carter leads the Big Ten in batting average with a .509 along with nine RBIs, two doubles, and one triple.

lowa is the best defensive team in the Big Ten, holding a Big-Ten leading .976 fielding percentage.

Senior Allison Doocy (2nd, 1.54 ERA) and Lauren Shaw (4th, 1.71 ERA) both rank inside the top five in the conference in ERA.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 4-3 Overall (2-3 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes placed sixth at the 2020 Big Ten Championships in Bloomington, Indiana; their highest placing since 2012. Iowa broke several records, including three from sophomore Anze Fers Erzen and one from junior Daniel Swanepoel.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Notables: The Hawkeyes collected 430 points at the 2020 Big Ten Championships, hosted here at the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center; the most points scored since the introduction of the new scoring format in 2016. Freshman Millie Sansome (2) and junior Kelsey Drake (1) both notched school records during the championships.

MEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Season Record: 12-2 Overall (1-0 B1G)

Next Event: March 20 vs. Minnesota -- 6 p.m. -- Hawkeye

Tennis & Recreation Complex in Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeyes have won five straight matches, including winning their last match over No. 16 Cornell, its highest ranked win in two years. lowa boasts a 10-1 home record to start the season.

lowa is currently ranked No. 28 nationally and was ranked as high as No. 23 in February, its highest team ranking in program history. The Hawkeyes are 3-0 against ranked opponents this season, having beaten No. 16 Cornell, No. 35 Denver, and No. 50 VCU all by 4-3 margins.

Junior Will Davies and sophomore Oliver Okonkwo are ranked No. 12 nationally in doubles, while senior Kareem Allaf is ranked a career-best No. 51 in singles. Davies is riding a 12 match win streak playing on court four.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 6-6 Overall (1-1 B1G) Next Event: Friday at Minnesota -- 4 p.m.

Notables: The team earned its first win over a ranked

opponent since 2014, defeating #50 Kansas State, 4-3.

Senior Elise van Heuvelen Treadwell was named Big Ten Women's Tennis Athlete of the Week on March 3rd. Van Heuvelen Treadwell has seven wins in a row and is 10-1 in singles, which is the best start by a Hawkeye since Sonja Molnar went 11-1 in 2010.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

NCAA Next Event: Friday-Saturday Indoor

Championships -- Albuquerque, New Mexico

Notables: The men's team placed second at the Big Ten Indoor Championships in Geneva, Ohio, last month. With 107 points, this is the team's highest finish since 1963.

Sophomore Wayne Lawrence took home three gold medals at Big Tens (200 meters, 400 meters, 1,600-meter relay). Lawrence earned new PRs in each event, including setting a new school record in the 400 meters (45.56). He was named the Big Ten Track Athlete of Meet. Senior Jaylan McConico won gold in the 60-meter hurdles (7.61). The 1,600-meter relay made up of Raymund Clarke, DeJuan Frye, Antonio Woodard, and Wayne Lawrence finished first (3:04.91). Senior Austin Lietz was runner-up in the 600 meters. Senior Will Daniels was runner-up in the heptathlon (5639 points).

Six men qualified for the national meet, Will Daniels (heptathlon), Jaylan McConico (60-meter hurdles), Wayne Lawrence (400 meters, 1,600-meter relay), Raymund Clarke, DeJuan Frye, Antonio Woodard (1,600-meter relay).

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at NCAA Indoor

Championships -- Albuquerque, New Mexico

Notables: The women's team took eighth at the Big Ten Indoor Championships in Geneva, Ohio, last month. They scored 51 points.

Senior Laulauga Tausaga took home gold in weight throw (22.21m) and silver in shot put (17.37m). She was named Big Ten Field Athlete of the Meet on March 4. On March 6, Tausaga was named Midwest Field Athlete of the Year by USTFCCCA.
