

Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Big Ten/Iowa Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

March 8, 2018

Chair Hollingworth brought the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

I. Head Coach Introduction - Tyler Stith, Men's Golf

Barta noted Coach Stith is very familiar with the philosophy of the Athletics Department due to his background. Stith started at Iowa as a student-athlete in golf, became an assistant men's golf coach under Mark Hankins, accepted an assistant golf coach position at Minnesota, and then came back to serve as Iowa's head golf coach.

Coach Stith confirmed his commitment to the Athletics Department's mantra "Win. Graduate. Do It Right." He explained how it shapes the way he helps Iowa golf student-athletes achieve balance in academics and athletics. His teams have participated in nine straight NCAA Regionals and achieved four straight perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores. The current golf team has also earned the highest grade point average since 2011. Coach Stith believes his responsibilities to his student-athletes go beyond coaching, and he is dedicated to preparing his student-athletes to be successful in whatever profession they pursue after graduation.

Currently the golf team is midway through the season and working hard to fill the void left by last year's seniors. Coach Stith thanked PCA members for inviting him and encouraged them to attend the April 14-15 home meet at Finkbine Golf Course.

Committee members posed questions regarding recruiting, conditioning, and building team camaraderie in a sport that relies on individual play. Chair Hollingworth thanked him for his report.

II. Approval of the February 1, 2018, PCA Minutes

Courter moved to approve the February 1, 2018, minutes; Bowden seconded. Committee members granted full approval.

III. Guest Speaker: Aubrette Kinne, PhD, Embedded Staff Psychologist

Barta described to PCA members the vision the Athletics Department had years ago of creating an integrated student-athlete performance team consisting of trainers, sports medicine staff, strength & conditioning coaches, sports psychologists, and a nutritionist. Terry Noonan now leads this team and, as one of the Athletics Department's staff psychologists, Kinne combines with other team members to help student-athletes with performance and overall health.

Kinne conveyed to the PCA members her pleasure in serving Iowa's student-athletes and the Athletics Department. She presented the attached PowerPoint presentation entitled "University of Iowa Sport Psychology Services Overview." Kinne highlighted how her staff innovatively finds approaches to incorporate the values of the Department into services provided, purposely identifies resources at the university and in the Iowa City community to best meet student-athletes' needs, and creatively finds time necessary to work with Hawkeyes to improve performance and quality of life.

Kinne answered questions regarding pilot programs matching student-athletes with similar injuries, courses required to become a sports psychologist, and stigmas associated with mental health that prevent student-athletes from seeking treatment.

Chair Hollingworth thanked her for her presentation.

IV. Athletics Department Searches - Dillavou

Searches are underway for an assistant strength & conditioning coach for football and for an associate head volleyball coach. Friestad and Bowden are the respective PCA representatives.

V. Subcommittee Updates

A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Bruhn

Chair Bruhn shared that Damian Simcox, Assistant Athletics Director for Facilities, reported to subcommittee members regarding feasibility studies for new facilities for softball and wrestling and ongoing facilities projects. Simcox provided an update on the status of the north end zone and Finkbine Clubhouse projects and announced the renovations at Gerdin Athletic Learning Center are complete and the building will reopen on March 30.

B. Academic Achievement - Bowden

Chair Bowden stated that Brent Gage, Associate Vice President for Enrollment Management, briefed subcommittee members on the UI use of the Regent Admission Index to evaluate students applying for admission to the university.

Gage confirmed all applicants must meet the same assessment criteria, with no preferential treatment given to athletic recruits. Bowden noted that meeting NCAA benchmarks does not guarantee a recruit will meet UI admission requirements.

C. Equity - Matheson

Chair Matheson reported Hilleman and Clerry met with Equity Subcommittee members to discuss diversity and inclusion. Hilleman presented a PowerPoint named “Employee demographics-Hiring and Maintaining a Diverse Workforce,” and Clerry reviewed the Athletics Department Diversity and Inclusion Plan.

VI. ISAAC Report - Colin and Guagliardo

Colin and Guagliardo highlighted the following:

- A.** ISAAC members are in the planning stages for the Golden Herkys Awards Show May 2, 2018, at the Englert Theatre, downtown Iowa City. In correlation with ISAAC’s focus on leadership, myriad student-athletes have key roles in the planning, writing, and production of the show, with the Student-Athlete Academic Services’ staff providing guidance and direction.
- B.** Guagliardo announced Mid-American Energy has agreed to collaborate with ISAAC on the Annual ISAAC Day of Caring. The April 22, 2018, service event will include approximately 200 student-athletes volunteering in various community projects. In an effort to include as many Hawkeyes as possible, student-athletes with conflicts due to competition may participate in planned service events on alternative days.

VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Drake, Grosland


Barta reported on the positive movements in the discussions involving student-athlete transfers. The NCAA Transfer Working Group will present proposed transfer legislation to the NCAA Division I Council; the Division I Council will review and submit the proposals to the NCAA Board of Directors for their vote in June 2018.

VIII. Athletics Director’s Report - Barta

- A.** Tax Law Reform has directly affected the Athletics Department’s budget. The excise tax will immediately increase its expense budget by over a million dollars. In addition, the elimination of previously allowed deductions is negatively impacting contributors who generously support Iowa Athletics.
- B.** The NCAA has tasked the newly formed Commission on College Basketball, chaired by Condoleezza Rice, to study some of the major issues faced by men’s basketball. Under review is the NBA’s one-and-done rule, which requires a player to be one year removed from high school to be eligible to enter the NBA draft. The rule has a negative effect on college basketball as reluctant participants are forced to go to college for one year.

- C. The March sports report and schedules are enclosed. Highlights follow:
1. Softball improved on its early season performance with a win against ranked Baylor.
 2. The UI baseball team travels to Las Vegas on March 9 to play UNLV.
 3. Postseason play for the women's basketball team will be decided on Monday, March 12, 2018. Megan Gustafson continues to earn accolades.
 4. Nine Iowa wrestlers will compete in the 2018 NCAA Wrestling Championships on March 15-17, 2018, in Cleveland, OH.
 5. The Hawkeye women's tennis team defeated Notre Dame for the first time in 19 years.
 6. Men's tennis recorded the highest ranked victory in program history by upsetting 14th-ranked Dartmouth.
 7. Qualifiers from the Iowa track and field team travel to College Station to compete in the NCAA Indoor Championships.
 8. The women's NCAA Swimming and Diving Championship will take place in Columbus, OH, March 15-17, 2018. Hawkeye qualifiers will compete.
 9. Select members of the men's swimming and diving team will travel to the Men's NCAA Swimming and Diving Championship in Minneapolis, MN, March 22-24, 2018.

The meeting adjourned at 5:16 p.m. The next PCA meeting will be Thursday, April 5, 2018, at the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center.

MARCH REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

BASEBALL

Season Record: 8-2 Overall, 0-0 B1G

Head Coach: Rick Heller

Next Event: Friday-Sunday at UNLV

Notables: The Hawkeyes opened the 2018 season with a weekend series sweep at the Diamond 9 Sunshine State Classic Series. Iowa defeated Toledo, 4-3, in its first contest of the season via a walk-off, two-run single by sophomore Ben Norman in the bottom of the ninth inning. Iowa then downed Oakland and Old Dominion to round out the weekend.

Iowa's home opener vs. Cornell College brought 1,059 fans to Duane Banks Field on Feb. 27. The Hawkeyes scored a season-high 15 runs en route to the 15-1 victory.

The Hawkeyes faced UAB this past weekend in Birmingham, Alabama, taking 2-of-3 games against the Blazers. Iowa opened the weekend with a 4-1 win for its seventh win of the season. Junior left-hander Nick Allgeyer allowed one run over 6 2/3 innings to send Iowa to a series opening victory. Iowa won game two, 11-3, commanding nine innings, before falling to the Blazers in the final game of the series.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 14-19 Overall, 4-14 B1G

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Notables: Iowa concluded its season at the Big Ten Tournament at Madison Square Garden. The Hawkeyes posted a 96-87 opening round win over Illinois before being edged by No. 13 Michigan, 77-71, in overtime.

Iowa's top four leading scorers and top two rebounders this season were underclassmen. Jordan Bohannon and Tyler Cook were named honorable mention all-conference.

Bohannon became the first Division I men's basketball player to amass 150+ assists and 80+ 3-pointers as a freshman and sophomore. Bohannon made national news on Feb. 25, when he tied Chris Street's consecutive free throws made record of 34 and then purposely missed attempt No. 35 so that he could share the record with the legendary Hawkeye, who did not have an opportunity to extend his streak due to an auto accident taking his life in 1993.

Cook led the squad with seven double-doubles, the most by a Hawkeye since Adam Woodbury registered seven as a senior two seasons ago.

Iowa played only two games this season – in December -- with a full and healthy roster.

This season marked the first time in seven seasons under head coach Fran McCaffery that the Hawkeyes did not finish in the Big Ten upper division. McCaffery has totaled 151 wins as Iowa's head coach, one victory from Steve Alford for third all-time.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season Record: 24-7 Overall, 11-5 B1G

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Next Event: NCAA Selection Show on March 12 at 6 p.m. on ESPN

Notables: The Hawkeyes tied for third in the Big Ten Conference – the No. 3 conference in the nation according to the latest NCAA Conference RPI.

The Hawkeyes defeated Northwestern, 55-45, in the second round of the Big Ten Tournament, before falling to fourth-seeded Minnesota, 90-89, in the Quarterfinals. Junior Megan Gustafson netted a Big Ten Tournament and Iowa single game record 48 points on 19-of-26 shooting from the field in the contest. She also added 15 rebounds, two assists, and three blocks.

Gustafson was named the Big Ten Player of the Year by the media on Feb. 26. She became the fifth Hawkeye in program history to be named the Big Ten Player of the Year and the first to do so since 1998. She joins former Hawkeye honorees Michelle Edwards (1988), Franthea Price (1990), Toni Foster (1993), and Tangelia Smith (1998). Gustafson is the only Hawkeye to earn the award as a junior. Gustafson was also a unanimous first team All-Big Ten selection by coaches and media. It marked the second All-Big Ten honor of her career.

Gustafson is currently ranked in the top-5 nationally in eight statistical categories, including leading the nation in scoring (25.6), field goal percentage (66.8), and field goals made (308). Gustafson is one of 15 finalists for the John R. Wooden Award which is presented annually to the nation's best player.

Sophomore Kathleen Doyle was named a second team All-Big Ten selection by league coaches and an Honorable Mention honoree by the media. In 16 conference games, Doyle averaged 12.6 points, a Big Ten-best 7.5 assists, 3.3 rebounds, and 2.0 steals. Junior Hannah Stewart was named Iowa's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

Iowa's NCAA Tournament fate will be announced Monday, March 12 at 6 p.m. (CT) on ESPN. The Hawkeyes will enter postseason play winning eight of their last nine contests.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: Monday at Southern Intercollegiate in Athens, Georgia

Notables: Iowa went 2-2 and finished ninth at the Big Ten Match Play Championships in Florida. Iowa convincingly won their last two matches over Ohio State and Maryland. Alex Moorman and Matthew Walker each had three individual wins. Walker extended his career match play record to 10-2.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: March 16-17 at Hawkeye-El Tigre Invitational in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico

Notables: Iowa's 54-hole score of 885 (+21) at the Westbrook Spring Invitational in Peoria, Arizona, is the seventh lowest score in program history, while its 36-hole score of 556 (+20) is the third-best score in program history. Senior Jessica Ip carded an 18-hole score of 67 (-5) at Westbrook, which ties for first in program history.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 4-7 Overall, 1-5 B1G

Head Coach: JD Reive

Next Event: Sunday vs. Minnesota & Air Force

Notables: No. 10 Iowa upset No. 2 Penn State at Carver-Hawkeye Arena on March 3. Senior Dylan Ellsworth was named Big Ten Gymnast of the Week and Bennet Huang was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after the victory. Ellsworth won three event titles against Penn State, including the top all-around score of 80.350. Huang registered five top-10 finishes, including two podium finishes on pommel horse and in the all-around.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 5-7 Overall, 3-2 B1G

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Next Event: Friday at Iowa State, vs. Missouri

Notables: The GymHawks had a program-record 3,502 Hawkeye faithful attend their Feb. 10 meet against No. 8 Nebraska. The Hawkeyes earned a season-high 49.225 on floor against Texas Woman's University. Seniors Melissa Zurawski and Lanie Snyder tied for the floor title against SEMO, both posting a 9.925, a mark that ties for tenth-best in program history. This is a career high for Zurawski.

SOFTBALL

Season Record: 5-7, 0-0 B1G

Head Coach: Marla Looper

Next Event: Saturday-Monday at Grand Canyon Invitational in Phoenix, Arizona

Notables: Sophomore pitcher Allison Doocy's ERA of 1.58 is currently the seventh-lowest in the Big Ten. She has collected 42 strikeouts this season – eight of those against then-No. 8 Baylor, leading Iowa to a 3-1 win over the Bears.

Freshman Aralee Bogar has 11 hits, nine runs, eight stolen bases, and a .289 batting average through her first three weekends in black and gold. She also has a .395 slugging percentage and a .325 on-base percentage.

The Hawkeyes defeated then-No. 8 Baylor, 3-1, in their final game at the Judi Garman Classic. The win was Iowa's first over a top 10 team since beating then-No. 4 Michigan in Ann Arbor on March 29, 2015.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 5-1 Overall, 4-0 B1G

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: March 22-24 at NCAA Championships

Notables: The Hawkeyes posted an NCAA "A" qualifying time in the 400-freestyle relay with a time of 2:51.58 at the 2018 Big Ten Championships, while also posting an NCAA "A" qualifying time in the 200-free relay, touching in at 1:17.50. Iowa finished in seventh place in the team race at the conference championships.

Juniors Kenneth Mende and Jack Smith, and freshman diver Anton Hoherz all posted school records at the championships. Mende touched in at 1:42.12 in the 200 back, Smith posted a time of 42.71 in the 100 free, while Hoherz shattered the previous record off the platform with a score of 415.65.

Senior Jerzy Twarowski set a school record in the 100 fly with a time of 46.07, while senior Chris Dawson posted a NCAA "B" qualifying time of 3:46.80 in the 400 IM.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 5-4 Overall, 2-4 B1G

Head Coach: Marc Long

Next Event: March 15-17 at NCAA Championships

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished 11th at the 2018 Big Ten Championships. Senior Meghan Lavelle swam to a school record in the 100 back at the championships. The Chicago, Illinois, native touched in at 53.36 in the event.

In the 200-freestyle relay, the quartet of sophomore Hannah Burvill, senior Mekenna Scheitlin, Lavelle, and freshman Sarah Schemmel finished with a time of 1:31.18 -- the second-best time in school history.

Burvill qualified for the NCAA Championships in the 200-free for the first time in her career. A native of Pyrford, Great Britain, she will compete in the 200-yard freestyle on Friday, March 16. She currently ranks 22nd nationally in the event with a time of 1:44.42. The time, which was set at the 2018 Big Ten Championships, is a school record.

MEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 8-6 Overall, 0-0 B1G

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Next Event: Monday vs. No. 31 Texas Tech in La Jolla, California

Notables: The Hawkeyes are ranked 42nd nationally. Iowa has won six of its last seven matches, including upsets over No. 14 Dartmouth and No. 40 Oregon. The win over Dartmouth is Iowa's highest ranked win in program history.

Freshmen Will Davies and Piotr Smietana have won 10 straight doubles matches and have ascended to No. 51 in the national rankings. Junior Jonas Larsen and redshirt sophomore Kareem Allaf are ranked 54th in the country in doubles. Davies has won six consecutive matches at No. 6 singles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 7-4 Overall, 0-0 B1G

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Next Event: March 14 at Penn State

Notables: Sophomore Elise van Heuvelen and senior Anastasia Reimchen broke into the doubles rankings at No. 49 after defeating No. 13 Alex Chatt and Lee Or, 6-3, from Northwestern. Van Heuvelen is 8-2 in doubles and 8-3 in singles including a win over No. 88 Lee Or, 6-2, 1-6, 7-5. Freshman Yufei Long is 10-1 in singles with two straight-set wins over ranked opponents, and is 6-2 in doubles when paired with senior Zoe Douglas. The Hawkeyes face Iowa State in the annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk series on March 7.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at NCAA Indoor Championships in College Station, Texas

Notables: The men are coming off a seventh place finish (54 points) at the Big Ten Championships.

The distance medley relay of sophomore Nathan Mylenek, freshman Chris Thompson and seniors Carter Lilly and Michael Melchert won the program's first Big Ten title in the event after running 9:45.10. The relay (Mylenek, sophomore Collin Hofacker, Lilly, Melchert) also set the school record in the event a week before with a time of 9:33.90.

Junior Reno Tuufuli broke the school record in the shot put at the Big Ten Championships. Tuufuli threw 63-3.25 (19.28m) to place second overall in the event and break John Hickey's school record that stood since 2008.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at NCAA Indoor Championships in College Station, Texas

Notables: Senior Jahisha Thomas became the sixth individual in Big Ten history to win the long jump and triple jump at the Big Ten Championships. Thomas jumped personal bests in both events with a long jump mark of 21-0 $\frac{3}{4}$ (6.42 meters), tied for third longest jump ever in a Big Ten meet and Iowa's first long jump title, and a triple jump mark of 43-4 $\frac{1}{4}$ (13.22 meters). She was named Big Ten Women's Field Event Athlete of the Championships.

Junior Briana Guillory won the 400 meter title for her first conference championship. Guillory ran 52.08 for fifth-fastest time in the country and also finished runner-up to teammate Brittany Brown in the 200 meters.

Iowa's four Big Ten Champions are the most in a single meet in school history.

WRESTLING

Season Record: 12-3 Overall, 6-3 B1G

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Next Event: March 15-17 at NCAA Championships in Cleveland, Ohio

Notables: The Hawkeyes qualified nine wrestlers to the NCAA Championships. Nine Hawkeyes reached the podium at the Big Ten Championships in East Lansing, Michigan, on March 4. The Hawkeyes placed fourth as a team.

Freshman Spencer Lee placed third and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Lee is 17-2 this season, and finished the Big Ten schedule 6-0. He is the sixth Hawkeye in program history to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Year.

Brandon Sorensen was runner-up at the Big Ten Championships. He will be the No. 2 seed in Cleveland and is aiming to become the 20th four-time All-American in program history.
