

*Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics*

*Room 212, Gerdin Athletic Learning Center*

*May 3, 2018*

Chair Hollingworth called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

**I. Head Coach Introduction - Kirk Ferentz, Football**

Burke introduced Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz who is entering his 20<sup>th</sup> season at the University of Iowa and is the longest tenured head football coach in collegiate football. Coach Ferentz' team graduation rate ranks near the top of the Conference annually.

Coach Ferentz spoke about his previous stint at Iowa from 1981 through 1989 under Head Coach Hayden Fry. The stability and culture in the sports programs at Iowa were what Coach Ferentz said were so important to him when he became Iowa's Head Coach in 1998. He embraced those values in the staff he has hired and the student-athletes he recruits. His program's goals focus on the "Win. Graduate. Do It Right." mantra. It's important to him that student-athletes graduate, have a good academic and athletic experience, and are involved in community service. Coach Ferentz gave kudos to the UI faculty/staff for their involvement in the student-athlete experience; he also thanked the Student-Athlete Academic Services' staff for their assistance.

Questions were posed to Coach Ferentz on a variety of topics. He then thanked PCA members for the opportunity to visit. Chair Hollingworth thanked him for his comments.

**II. Approval of the April 5, 2018, PCA Minutes**

Rhodes moved to approve the April 5, 2018, PCA minutes; Dillavou seconded the motion. Committee members voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

**III. PCA Manual**

A. Chair Hollingworth emailed the revised Knight Commission Principles (attached) to PCA members earlier this month. She moved to adopt the revised principles and update the *PCA Operations Manual*. Committee members were in agreement.

B. Chair Hollingworth stated there will likely be additional updates to the *PCA Operations Manual* over the summer. In these cases, incoming PCA Chair Matheson will email Committee members to conduct an electronic vote on revisions.

**IV. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Dillavou**

Dillavou reported three searches are in progress. Friestad is the PCA representative in the search for the Associate Head Swimming & Diving Coach; Dillavou is the Committee representative on the Assistant Soccer Coach search; and, Kehoe is serving as the PCA member on the search for an Assistant Strength & Conditioning Coach for wrestling.

**V. Subcommittee Updates**

**A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Bruhn**

Chair Bruhn stated at the April 19, 2018, subcommittee meeting Colin reported on ISAAC's initiatives: career development and post graduate life, uniting the Hawkeye community, and mental health awareness. Clerry addressed NCAA team travel deregulation as it relates to the new rules allowing student-athletes traveling to away competitions to leave earlier and return later to campus. Clerry explained the UI opted out of that policy so student-athletes are not away from campus longer than necessary.

**B. Academic Achievement - Bowden**

Chair Bowden reported Tovar and Clerry spoke to subcommittee members about time management, missed-class days, and a communication & operations platform entitled "Teamworks" used by Athletics Department staff. The group's final meeting of the academic year is May 10, 2018.

**C. Equity - Matheson**

At the April 23, 2018, Equity Subcommittee meeting, Chair Matheson stated Hilleman finished her report on coaches' salaries. Hilleman and Burke answered questions from subcommittee members to ensure equitable compensation practices are in place.

## **VI. ISAAC Report - Colin, Guagliardo**

Colin's and Guagliardo's reports follow:

- A.** Colin extended thanks to everyone involved in the third annual Golden Herkys event. The Female Athlete of the Year and the Female Hawkeye of the Year awards were presented to Megan Gustafson, women's basketball; the Male Athlete of the Year was given to Josey Jewell, football. Tennis player Jason Kerst received Hawkeye of the Year honors. Colin thanked Associate Director of Student-Athlete Academic Services Kara Park for her oversight of the event. A round of applause was attributed to Colin for his time commitment and efforts in making the Golden Herkys a success again this year!

Guagliardo added the Community Service Awards were given to the softball and women's gymnastics teams.

- B.** Executive Committee elections took place resulting in the following slate of officers for 2018-2019: Chair Ben Colin (swimming), Vice Chair Molly Kelly (volleyball), and Secretary/Treasurer Megan Gustafson (basketball).
- C.** ISAAC members voted to change their constitution relating to the application process to serve on ISAAC. Student-athletes who are interested in serving on ISAAC will now complete an application. Those individuals will then be voted upon by the ISAAC Executive Committee.
- D.** Guagliardo, field hockey, and Logan Samuelson, swimming, won the Robert F. Ray Faculty Representative Awards. The tribute honors them as outstanding student-athletes; each will receive a stipend for post-graduate education at the UI.
- E.** The Day of Caring took place on Sunday, April 22, 2018. Over 250 student-athletes participated in 21 community projects.
- F.** In aggregate this past year, student-athletes volunteered over 10,000 hours in various community service events.
- G.** Student-athletes are enjoying the refurbished Gerdin Athletic Learning Center per Guagliardo. She has received positive feedback from her peers.

## **VII. NCAA Report - Burke, Drake, Grosland**

- A.** Grosland stated that she, Drake, and Tovar met with 60-75 student-athletes to conduct end-of-year interviews. A common theme surfaced indicating student-athletes have a sense of pride in their sport teams and in Iowa Athletics as a whole.
- B.** The Big Ten Joint Group meets May 14-15, 2018, in Chicago, IL. Grosland, Drake, Hollingworth, Burke, and Barta will attend.


- C. Burke reported the Rice Commission on College Basketball published recommendations on April 25, 2018. PCA members who would like a copy should contact Parker.

**VIII. Athletics Director's Report - Burke**

- A. NCAA legislation has been updated as follows:
  - 1. In sports other than football and men's basketball, official and unofficial recruiting visits can now begin September 1 of a student-athlete's junior year in high school.
  - 2. Baseball can compete in two additional outside competitions in the fall, increasing the total number of fall competitions to 58.
- B. The Office of Civil Rights (OCR) staff has responded to information sent by the UI on January 30, 2018. Their response stated no further action is required on the interest & abilities and financial aid; the UI met requirements in both areas. Athletics staff continue to communicate and respond.
- C. Burke highlighted the following from the attached sports report and schedules:
  - 1. Baseball has seen a marked increase in attendance. To accommodate the fan experience, additional seating, ticket personnel, and concessions will be in place for remaining home games.
  - 2. Softball has its last home game series May 4-6, 2018. Friday's game promotion is "Props to Our Professors;" Saturday's game is the Alumni Day; and Senior Day is Sunday. Softball will compete in the Big Ten Championships next week.
  - 3. The rowing team is currently ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation. They compete in the Big Ten Championships in Indianapolis, IN, on Sunday, May 13, 2018.
  - 4. Women's track is currently ranked 24<sup>th</sup> in the nation.
  - 5. The men's track & field team won the Hy-Vee Cup for the second year in a row at the Drake Relays.
  - 6. Sophomore men's golf student-athlete Alex Schaake was selected to play in the NCAA Regionals in Columbus, OH.
  - 7. The UI hosted the Big Ten Men's Tennis Championships April 26-29, 2018.
- D. Burke thanked everyone who helped make the Golden Herkys event a success.
- E. The following report on facilities was given by Burke:
  - 1. Construction on the Kinnick Stadium north end zone is on schedule.

2. Athletics staff members are reviewing facilities projects in lieu of the UI's facility moratorium to ensure those involving student-athlete safety concerns are being addressed.
- F.* Burke and Hollingworth presented the annual PCA report to the UI Faculty Senate on April 24, 2018.
- G.* The *herky's* BRUNCH will take place Saturday, May 5, 2018. The event will celebrate women's athletics.

With no further agenda items, the meeting adjourned at 4:53 p.m. A tour of the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center followed.

## **CURRENT APPENDIX A**

### **Appendix A. Knight Commission Principles**

Principle I. The educational values, practices and mission of this institution determine the standards by which we conduct our intercollegiate athletics program.

Principle II. The responsibility and authority for the administration of the athletics department including all basic policies, personnel, and finances, are vested in the president.

Principle III. The welfare, health and safety of student-athletes are primary concerns of athletics administration on this campus. This institution will provide student-athletes with the opportunity for academic experiences as close as possible to the experiences of their classmates.

Principle IV. Every student-athlete - male and female, majority and minority, in all sports - will receive equitable and fair treatment.

Principle V. The admission of student-athletes - including junior college transfers - will be based on their showing reasonable promise of being successful in a course of study leading to an academic degree. That judgment will be made by admissions officials.

Principle VI. Continuing eligibility to participate in intercollegiate athletics will be based on students being able to demonstrate each academic term that they will graduate within five years of their enrolling. Students who do not pass this test will not play.

Principle VII. Student-athletes, in each sport, will be graduated in at least the same proportion as non-athletes who have spent comparable time as full-time students.

Principle VIII. All funds raised and spent in connection with intercollegiate athletics programs will be channeled through the institution's general treasury, not through independent groups, whether internal or external. The athletics department budget will be developed and monitored in accordance with general budgeting procedures.

Principle IX. All athletics-related income from non-university sources for the coaches and athletics administrators will be reviewed and approved by the university. In cases where the income involves the university's functions, facilities or name, contracts will be negotiated with the institution.

Principle X. We will conduct annual academic and fiscal audits of the athletics program. Moreover, we intend to seek NCAA certification that our athletics program complies with the principles herein. We will promptly correct any deficiencies and will conduct our athletics program in a manner worthy of distinction.

## **PROPOSED NEW APPENDIX A**

### **Appendix A. Knight Commission Principles**

- I. Athlete health, safety and well-being must be a guiding imperative.
- II. The educational experience and outcomes of college athletes must be paramount.
- III. Institutions and their associations must demonstrate fiscal responsibility and prioritize athlete health and safety, athlete education and campus academics in the allocation of athletics revenues.
- IV. The governance of associations must demonstrate integrity, advance the educational missions of institutions and the well-being of college athletes and share voting power with college athletes.

# MAY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## BASEBALL

**Season Record:** 26-14 Overall, 9-7 B1G

**Head Coach:** Rick Heller

**Next Event:** Friday-Sunday vs. Oklahoma State – Iowa City

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes won two of three games last weekend against No. 7 Michigan. It is the third Big Ten series win for Iowa this season, moving its conference record to 9-7.

Senior Tyler Cropley is leading the team offensively in batting average (.367), slugging percentage (.599), hits (54), RBIs (34), doubles (16). Junior Chris Whelan follows with a .320 batting average with three homeruns and three doubles.

On the mound, Iowa has used the same starting weekend rotation throughout the season. Friday night starter Nick Allgeyer is 5-3 with a 2.18 ERA, with 67 strike outs. Allgeyer was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on for the second time this season after going seven strong innings to earn his fifth victory of the season on against Michigan.

## MEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Tyler Stith

**Notables:** Iowa put together a solid spring, finishing sixth or better in all three of its April events.

Iowa finished second at the Hawkeye Invitational behind two top-five finishes from sophomore Alex Schaake, who finished second at four-under-par, and redshirt sophomore Alex Moorman, who shot three-under-par to finish third as an individual.

The Hawkeyes placed sixth in the 16-team Robert Kepler Intercollegiate that featured five ranked teams. Iowa improved every round and junior Matthew Walker led the way, tying for sixth place at one-over-par, a season best finish.

Iowa's highlight of the year came at the Big Ten Championships where the team finished in third place and ahead of three ranked teams. All five Hawkeye golfers were inside the top 31 with sophomore Benton Weinberg tying for eighth – his best career finish. Led by Moorman's 66 (-4), the Hawkeyes shot a season-best 275 in the second round. The finish was Iowa's sixth consecutive finish inside the top four at the Big Ten Championships.

Schaake led the team in 18-hole scoring average (71.74), rounds at or below par (13), and top-10 finishes (4). His efforts throughout the season earned All-Big Ten second team accolades. Walker was second on the team, averaging 72.87 strokes per round with 11 rounds at or below par.

## WOMEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Megan Menzel

**Notables:** Senior Jessica Ip led the team with a stroke average of 74.9. Freshman Rachel Fujitani recorded the best individual finish for the team at the Arizona State Invitational (T29) and Bruzzy Challenge (T13). Fujitani earned her first B1G Golfer of the Week award for her play at the Bruzzy Challenge. Ip carded seven rounds at-or-below par on the season -- a team-best.

## MEN'S GYMNASTICS

**Season Record:** 7-19 Overall, 2-16 B1G

**Head Coach:** JD Reive

**Notables:** Senior Austin Hodges reached the podium at the Big Ten Championship event finals with a fifth-place finish (13.750) on pommel horse.

Five Hawkeyes qualified for a total of 11 routines to day two of the NCAA Championships, including freshman Bennet Huang, sophomores Nick Merryman and Andrew Herrador, and juniors Jake Brodarzon and Kevin Johnson.

Huang finished 12th in the all-around (80.298), Brodarzon notched a 15th-place finish on vault (14.366), and Herrador posted a 15th-place finish on high bar (13.533) at the NCAA Championships.

## ROWING

**Head Coach:** Andrew Carter

**Next Event:** May 13 at Big Ten Championships - Indianapolis

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 8 nationally heading into the Big Ten championships. Iowa had been ranked as high as No. 7 following performances at Ann Arbor, Michigan, and Princeton, New Jersey. That ranking was the highest in program history.

The I Varsity 8 boat earned consecutive Big Ten Boat of the Week honors following four straight wins against Michigan, Michigan State, Princeton, and Yale.

## **SOFTBALL**

**Season Record:** 20-28 Overall, 6-13 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marla Looper

**Next Event:** Friday-Sunday vs. Purdue - Iowa City

**Notables:** Sophomore Allison Doocy leads Iowa with a 1.67 ERA and 180 strikeouts in 176.0 innings of action, which ranks fifth in the Big Ten. After pitching a shutout game against Wisconsin, throwing 18 strikeouts in a combined 14 innings, and aiding the Hawkeyes in their sweep of the Badgers, Doocy was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week and College Sports Madness Big Ten Player of the Week.

Freshman Aralee Bogar leads Iowa with 42 hits, 26 runs, 22 stolen bases, and a .278 batting average during her first season with the Hawkeyes. She is fourth in the Big Ten with 22 stolen bases - currently a perfect 22-for-22 in stolen base attempts. She is the only student-athlete in the top five with a perfect stolen base percentage.

## **MEN'S TENNIS**

**Season Record:** 16-15 Overall, 4-7 B1G

**Head Coach:** Ross Wilson

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes finished the year with 16 wins, which ranks fourth in program history. Iowa registered four wins in conference play, the most since 2015. The Mellecker Family donated \$2.4 million to the Iowa men's tennis program, endowing the first coaching position at the University of Iowa.

Seniors Jake Jacoby and Josh Silverstein were a part of 56 team wins over a four-year span, which ranks ninth in school history. Jacoby finished his career ranking fifth in school history in combined singles and doubles wins (128). Silverstein ranks eighth in school history with 117 combined victories. Both of Iowa's top two doubles teams (No. 1 Kareem Allaf/Jonas Larsen and No. 2 Will Davies/Piotr Smietana) finished the year with 17 wins in dual match play, ranking third in program history.

## **WOMEN'S TENNIS**

**Season Record:** 10-14 Overall, 2-9 B1G

**Head Coach:** Sasha Schmid

**Notables:** Sophomore Elise van Heuvelen and senior Anastasia Reimchen finished the regular season ranked No. 80 in doubles by the ITA with an 8-5 record, including five wins at the No. 1 position. The duo climbed as high as No. 47 in the country this season.

## **MEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** May 11-13 at Big Ten Championships - Bloomington, Indiana

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes won the men's 4x400 meter relay to clinch back-to-back Hy-Vee Cups at the 109th Drake Relays on April 28.

The Hy-Vee Cup is awarded to the men's and women's team with the highest point total in five relays – the 4x800, distance medley relay, sprint medley relay, 4x100, and 4x400.

Iowa won its second Hy-Vee Cup since its inaugural season in 2013. After finishing second in the 3,200-meter relay on Friday night, the Hawkeyes added a runner-up finish in the sprint medley relay, third place finish in the distance medley relay, and first place finish in the 4x400-meter relay to total 32 points for the Cup.

Junior Mar'yea Harris leads Iowa into the Big Ten Championships with the top 400-meter time in the conference (45.71). He also anchors the top 1,600-meter relay in the Big Ten.

## **WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** May 11-13 at Big Ten Championships - Bloomington, Indiana

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 24 in the country in the latest poll by United States Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association.

Iowa is led by seniors Brittany Brown and Jahisha Thomas, and sophomore Laulaua Tausaga.

Brown leads the Big Ten and ranks 12th in the country in the 200 meters (22.76). Thomas leads the Big Ten in the triple jump (43-8 1/2, 13.32m) and ranks second in the Big Ten in long jump (21-1 1/2, 6.44m). Tausaga won the Drake Relays title in the shot put, setting a school record that ranks third in the Big Ten (54-11 1/4, 16.74m). Her discus mark (196-4, 59.86m) ranks atop the conference and fifth in the country.
