The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chair Hollingworth.

I. Approval of the April PCA Minutes

Kehoe moved to approve the minutes of the April 6, 2017, meeting; Osborn seconded. Unanimous approval was granted from Committee members.

II. Head Coach Introduction - J.D. Reive, Men's Gymnastics

Chair Hollingworth welcomed Coach Reive to the PCA and asked Burke to introduce him to the Committee. Coach explained he and his staff recruit from all parts of the country as well as within the state. The team loses three seniors who will be graduating; however, he stated he is excited about his current team members as well as looking forward to the incoming freshman who are very accomplished student-athletes. The past season had its 'highs and lows' but the student-athletes remained focused and committed. Team members are preparing for Nationals. Coach Reive stated upgrades to the gymnastics facilities have allowed the coaching staff to further develop, teach, and prepare the student-athletes for competition.

Coach Reive answered questions from the PCA. Chair Hollingworth thanked him for his report.

III. <u>Presentation/Demonstration - Senior Student-Athletes: Danielle Bender (Rowing) and</u> <u>Brandis Heffner (Men's Swimming)</u>

Tovar introduced Bender and Heffner and asked them to share their experience as student-athletes at Iowa. Heffner stated he is from Bloomington, IL, and is majoring in journalism and mass communication. When asked about how he balances academics and athletics, he stated his journalism professors were very helpful in working with him to manage his school schedule around his athletics commitments. He answered questions from Committee members about his career aspirations, his role on the swim team, and what he will miss most about his time at Iowa.

Bender is from Bellevue, Iowa, and is an elementary education major. She will be a student teacher in fall 2017, will continue as a member of the rowing team, and will begin the master's program in the College of Education in spring 2018. Bender and Student-Athlete Liz Wagner were the UI's representatives on the Coach for College trip to Vietnam in April 2017. Her experiences working in the classroom and coaching junior high students were very rewarding. She also answered questions from the PCA relating to the boathouse site and balancing academics and athletics. Bender stated her professors and coaches have been very supportive in working with her to reach her goals.

Chair Hollingworth thanked Bender and Heffner for their attendance and reports.

IV. Athletics Department Searches - Dillavou

Dillavou distributed the summary of searches (enclosed) for FY17 to date. He will email PCA members over the summer if additional staff vacancies arise. Chair Hollingworth thanked Dillavou for overseeing this endeavor.

V. <u>Subcommittee Updates</u>

A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Chung

Chung thanked Hollingworth and Tovar for their input and assistance this past year. Subcommittee members convened five sessions; their final meeting takes place Tuesday, May 9, 2017. Agenda items will include student-athlete exit survey results and the social media policy. At the group's last meeting, invited guests Aubrette Kinne (Nutritionist) and Nicole White (Psychologist) explained the services they provide to the student-athletes.

Chair Hollingworth thanked Chung for his leadership of this subcommittee.

B. Academic Achievement - Kelly

No report.

C. Equity - Bowden

Bowden stated the Equity Subcommittee has completed their meeting schedule for the year. He thanked subcommittee members as well as individuals who provided reports to the group throughout the academic year. At the last meeting, they reviewed salary equity. Curtis was key in explaining how changes were made to provide more equity in salaries and how salaries are determined.

VI. ISAAC Report - Jonathan Wisnieski

Wisnieski highlighted the following ISAAC activities:

- A. The Student-Athlete Annual Day of Caring took place Sunday, April 23, 2017. Over 250 student-athletes participated in community efforts.
- **B.** The second annual Golden Herky Awards took place last night. It was a wellorganized, fun event.
- C. ISAAC elections for 2017-18 were completed. Wisnieski will be the ISAAC representative to the PCA next year.
- **D.** The Multicultural Focus Group will meet Saturday, May 6, 2017, 4:00 p.m., at Gibson Square Park by the Iowa Memorial Union.
- *E.* The Senior Recognition Reception takes place Friday, May 12, 2017, at 3:00 p.m. in the Feller Club Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Seniors will receive their I-rings at this event.

VII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Drake, Grosland

The Big Ten Joint Group meets May 15-16, 2017, in Chicago, IL.

VIII. Athletics Director's Report

- A. Burke highlighted the following from the May sports report and schedules (attached):
 - 1. The baseball team is in a four-way tie for third place in the Big Ten. The top eight teams will qualify for the Big Ten Tournament.
 - 2. The men's golf team was selected to participate in the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional on May 15-17, 2017. This marks Iowa's ninth straight NCAA appearance.
 - 3. The UI rowing team is currently 11th in the country. They compete at the Big Ten Championships on May 14, 2017.
 - 4. Softball team members have one more home series this weekend before traveling to the Big Ten Championships the following weekend.
 - 5. Track student-athletes are preparing for Big Ten Championship competition on May 12-14, 2017, at Penn State.

Men's track won the 2017 Hy-Vee Cup at the Drake Relays last weekend.

- **B.** Three sports programs have been cited by the NCAA for academic success: women's swimming & diving, men's golf, and men's gymnastics. Every NCAA Division I school calculates an Academic Progress Report (APR) for each team, each year. Iowa's three teams are in the top ten percent of all teams in their specific sport.
- **C.** Discussion is ongoing after the NCAA Board of Directors approved the elimination of two-a-day practices for football last month. There could be some language changes yet relating to student-athletes arriving on campus earlier than August 1 each year.

Another discussion on student-athlete transfers is ongoing. Barta holds a seat on the Transfer Working Group Committee addressing this topic.

- **D.** The University of Iowa and the Athletics Department are each on pace to reach record-high fundraising efforts this year.
- *E.* Burke reported on the following facility projects:
 - *1.* The Gerdin Athletic Learning Center (GALC) renovation is moving forward. Preparations are underway to move the staff to the Jacobson Athletic Building.
 - 2. Infrastructure work outside of Kinnick Stadium is underway in preparation for the renovation of the north end zone. The turf is being removed; new turf will be installed.
 - 3. Discussion and planning continue for the Finkbine Club House project.
- *F.* Burke added the Golden Herky event was a success. She encouraged PCA members to attend next year.

A. Thanks to Curtis Chung for His Service

Hollingworth formally thanked Chung for his service as a PCA member and a subcommittee chair. He received a round of applause from Committee members.

B. 2017-18 PCA Report to President Harreld by End of May

C. Feedback from PCA Member Survey

MAY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

BASEBALL

Season Record: 27-16 Overall, 9-6 Big Ten Head Coach: Rick Heller

Next Event: Friday-Sunday at Michigan State

Notables: The Hawkeyes swept their first Big Ten Conference series since 2015, taking three games from Penn State last weekend at Duane Banks Field.

lowa's starting pitching was superb, posting a 1.33 ERA and allowing five runs in three games. Junior Nick Gallagher scattered three hits and struck out a career-high 10 batters in the series opener, which led to him earning his first career Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honor. Four Hawkeyes have earned a weekly distinction this season.

Offensively, Iowa is one of the Big Ten's top teams, ranking among the top-five in virtually every offensive category. The Hawkeyes have a .284 team batting average and have belted 41 home runs -- the most of the Rick Heller era.

Three players -- Jake Adams, Robert Neustrom, and Mason McCoy -- rank among the top 15 in the conference in team batting average. Adams is the Big Ten's top slugger with 16 home runs -- the most by a Hawkeye since 2002 -- and has a Big Ten-best 51 RBIs. Neustrom is second in the league with 63 hits and third with 42 RBIs.

lowa is 16-3 at Duane Banks Field this season with four home games remaining. In the Big Ten race, lowa is in a four-way tie for third place with a 9-6 record with three weekend series left. The top eight teams qualify for the Big Ten Tournament, which will be held May 24-28 in Bloomington, Indiana.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Notables: The University of Iowa men's golf team finished second at the Hawkeye Invitational on April 15-16. The Hawkeyes posted a 54-hole total of 859 (-5; 289, 285, 285) to edge out No. 43 Kansas (-4; 860). Senior Carson Schaake led the team with a three-round total of 211 (-5; 69, 71, 71) to finish fourth. It marked his first top-10 finish and his best 54-hole total of the season.

The Hawkeyes finished third at the Robert Kepler Intercollegiate on April 22-23 with a three-round total of 899 (+47; 300, 293, 306). Schaake notched his second top-10 finish in as many weeks, finishing third with a 54-hole total of 218 (+5; 75, 70, 73).

Iowa jumped three spots on the leaderboard in the final round to tie for fourth at the Big Ten Championships on April 28-30. Freshman Jack Simpson had the best tournament for the Hawkeyes, tying for 16th with a three-round total of 214 (+4; 74, 68, 72) -- the lowest 54-hole score of his career.

The Hawkeyes now await their NCAA Tournament. fate. The 2017 NCAA Men's Golf Selection Show is set for Thursday, May 4 at 11 a.m. (C).

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Notables: The Iowa women's golf team finished 10th at the Big Ten Championships in Cincinnati, Ohio. The Hawkeyes carded a three-round score of 931 (+67) with rounds of 312, 311, and 308. Junior Jessica Ip led the Hawkeyes tied for 12th with a 54-hole score of 221 (+5) with rounds of 75, 76, and 70.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 9-18 Overall, 2-10 Big Ten

Head Coach: JD Reive

Notables: Iowa finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships with a score of 402.150. Five gymnasts advanced to day two of the Big Ten meet, with senior Cory Paterson earning a silver medal on high bar (14.350) and earning second team All-Big Ten accolades. Iowa finished fourth in day one of the NCAA Championships with a score of 412.500. Eight gymnasts combined for 17 routines advanced to day two of the NCAA Championships.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Season Record: 15-6 Overall, 7-2 Big Ten Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Notables: The Hawkeyes concluded the season ranked in the Top 20 nationally and Iowa head coach Larissa Libby received Big Ten Coach of the Year honors. Iowa finished third at both the Big Ten Championships and the NCAA Regionals. Senior Angel Metcalf went on to represent Iowa in the all-around and freshman Claire Kaji competed on beam at the NCAA Championships.

ROWING

Head Coach: Andrew Carter

Next Event: May 13-14 at Big Ten Championships **Notables:** Iowa defeated Big Ten rival Rutgers but fell to Ohio State at the Big Ten Double Duals in Bloomington, Indiana, last month. The #11-ranked Hawkeyes also edged #15 Syracuse in the critical NCAA event scoring last weekend in Princeton, New Jersey.

SOFTBALL

Season Record: 18-29 Overall, 8-12 Big Ten

Head Coach: Marla Looper

Next Event: Friday-Sunday vs. Northwestern - Pearl Field - Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: The Hawkeyes went 11-8 in the month of April and won three of their five conference series (Purdue, 2-1; Nebraska, 2-0; Rutgers, 2-1).

Cheyenne Pratt has seven multi-hit games through the month of April. She ranks second on the team with 31 hits.

Kaitlyn Mullarkey's double against Rutgers on April 14 gave her 11 doubles this season. Mullarkey now has 31 in her career, which ties for 15th in program history.

MEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 14-15 Overall, 2-9 Big Ten Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Notables: Junior Josh Silverstein and senior Robin Haden earned postseason Big Ten recognition. Silverstein became Iowa's 19th all-conference selection, while Haden was named the team's Sportsmanship Award honoree. Silverstein, the 115th ranked singles player in the country, was second on the squad with 18 overall singles wins, but led the team with six wins during conference competition. Iowa won its last two matches of the season, blanking both Michigan State (4-0) and North Dakota (7-0) on Senior Day. The Hawkeyes lost in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament to Penn State (4-0) on April 27, on the campus of Purdue University.

lowa graduates two seniors (Nils Hallestrand and Robin Haden) and will return two juniors, a sophomore, and two freshmen. Iowa will welcome four talented freshmen to the roster in 2017-18.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Season Record: 16-9 Overall, 5-7 Big Ten Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Notables: Iowa's season came to an end April 27 at the Big Ten Championships in Champaign, Illinois.

No. 7 lowa lost, 4-2, to No. 10 Indiana in the opening round. The Hawkeyes were making their first conference tournament appearance since 2014. Iowa finished the season with 16 wins, the most since 2006, after opening the season 9-0, the second best start in program history.

Iowa graduates two players, No. 6 singles Aimee Tarun, and Natalie Looney, who missed the majority of the season with an ACL injury. The Hawkeyes have three new players joining the team in the fall.

TRACK & FIELD

Director: Joey Woody

Next Event: May 12-14 at Big Ten Championships **Notables:** The Hawkeye men won the Drake Relays Cup on April 29 after winning three event relays for the first time in the 108-year history of the event. The men won the 4x400, 4x800, and sprint medley relays.

Iowa won six Drake Relays flags over the weekend. The women's 4x100 took home the Hawkeyes' fourth relay title, and Aaron Mallett (110-meter hurdles) and Reno Tuufuli (discus) each won individual events.

Entering the conference championships, the Hawkeyes are ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten in four events, including the 200 meters (Brittany Brown), Aaron Mallett (110-meter hurdles), the women's 400meter relay, and the men's 1,600-meter relay.

The conference championships are hosted by Penn State. The NCAA Championships begin May 25 at Austin, Texas, and the NCAA Finals are June 7-10 in Eugene, Oregon.
