

Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Zoom Meeting

May 6, 2021

The meeting was called to order by Chair Zaharis at 4:00 p.m.

I. Approval of Minutes - April 1, 2021

Courter moved to approve the April 1, 2021, minutes; Torner seconded. Committee members granted full approval.

II. HERkys Program - Jayne Oswald

HERkys was founded in 2017 by Deputy Director of Athletics Barbara Burke to celebrate the history and traditions of women's athletics at the UI. Oswald explained a small committee was formed consisting of Burke, Oswald, and four other Athletics Development staff (Lindsay Alexander, Diane Thomason, Katie Brown, and Taylor Berry) to develop a mission statement, slogan, goals, and plan events. The group developed a website and broadened HERkys exposure on social media platforms to expand the public's awareness of female sports at Iowa. Marketing goals are to increase fan attendance at sporting events and boost financial support for the women's programs through the HERkys Excellence Fund, each sport's development fund, or by providing scholarships.

Past and future events planned are included in the attached PowerPoint. The HERkys Voice podcasts, emceed by Head Women's Tennis Coach Sasha Schmid, have been well received. Committee members have started brainstorming ideas to celebrate the 50th anniversary of UI women's athletics in 2023.

A brief question/answer period took place. Chair Zaharis thanked Oswald for the report.

III. Chair Report - Zaharis

- A.*** Chair Zaharis thanked Courter, Kehoe, Friestad, Gerke, Kelly, Matheson, and Mueller, who completed their terms on the PCA. She appreciates their dedication and time commitment to assist student-athletes. A gathering will be planned for October 2021 to honor these individuals.
- B.*** PCA members were encouraged to view the YouTube broadcast on the Alston case, sponsored by the Iowa Innovation Business and Law Center in February 2021. Chair Zaharis stated it was fascinating and worthwhile. She thanked Matheson for his involvement.

IV. Vice Chair Report - Cavey Lang

Cavey Lang reported four searches are underway to hire an assistant volleyball coach, a head coach of women's swimming & diving, and two assistant rowing coaches. Chair Zaharis thanked PCA members who have agreed to serve on the search committees.

V. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement - Gerke

- 1.*** Subcommittee members met with Student-Athlete Academic Services staff Tovar, John Bruno, and Mel Sanders to discuss a pilot program for at-risk student-athletes. Gerke noted after a student-athlete permits the Athletics Academic Services staff to involve parents in a talk about his/her academics, that meeting takes place. The Subcommittee focused on those conversations and the effect the intervention had on the student-athlete's progress.
- 2.*** Gerke reminded PCA members the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Accountability Board was established in 2018 to ensure fulfillment of the DEI action plan, serve as an advisory group to the Athletics Department senior management, and act as a resource for Athletics staff and student-athletes with questions or who experience racism or discrimination. The cohort has expanded its oversight to address concerns of student-athletes of color. She also stated the Board is composed of members with valuable experience and knowledge.

3. The Athletics Department hired Licensed Mental Health Therapist Kaye Cole. Her specialty is working with collegiate athletes and professional athletes.
4. The Academic Achievement Subcommittee's last meeting takes place Friday, May 14, 2021. They will join the PCA's DEI Subcommittee to discuss student-athlete exit interview results with Tovar.

B. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) - Nonnenmann

Chair Zaharis reported the following for Nonnenmann:

1. Subcommittee members met with a group of student-athletes and discussed thoughts, feelings, and impressions on diversity, equity, and inclusion. It was a good, robust conversation; the DEI group gained valuable information.
2. Annual interviews with coaches continue.
3. DEI members will convene a joint meeting with Academic Achievement Subcommittee members and Tovar to discuss student-athlete exit interviews on Friday, May 14, 2021.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner

1. Agenda items for the April 14, 2021, meeting follow:
 - a. John Bruno, Director of Retention for Athletics, discussed the retention program. Student-athletes experiencing academic difficulties are tracked and provided assistance to remain eligible and graduate.
 - b. The Summer Bridge Program is a course designed for incoming UI student-athletes to prepare them for campus life and academics. Student-Athlete Academic Services staff focus on high school student-athletes who may have lost academic progress in their senior year and need assistance, especially in math and science. Input was sought in fall 2020 from students in the Bridge Program and their parents to gauge the effectiveness of the course. The course was held virtually in summer 2020 and will continue as such for summer 2021.
 - c. Head Coach Megan Menzel and Student-Athlete Lea Zeitler presented a virtual tour of the UI golf facilities.
 - d. Clerry noted two new members joined the wellness and mental health program. Kaye Cole, a licensed mental health therapist, and a sport psychologist, have joined the Athletics staff to assist student-athletes.

- e. Clerry gave an overview of the 2020-21 nutrition program for student-athletes. Food and drink were provided by the ‘grab and go’ method; Athletics staff will continue this procedure for the near future.
 - f. Torner stated the Student-Athlete Code of Conduct, Statement of Student-Athletes’ Rights and Responsibilities, and the PCA Pregnancy and Parenting Policy were reviewed by Subcommittee members.
2. At Chair Zaharis’ request, Torner gave an update on COVID testing and reporting procedures. He praised UI athletic trainers and doctors for coordination and oversight of the testing program.

VI. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report - Mueller

- A. The Golden Herkys took place May 4, 2021. The event can be viewed at <https://youtu.be/QmGWSyXOo1c>.
- B. ISAAC members held their last meeting of the academic year on April 28, 2021. They spoke of the myriad virtual events which took place as they maneuvered through the pandemic. Manuela Lizarazu, women’s golf, will be president of ISAAC starting fall 2021. The Executive Committee roster for 2021-22 will be published soon.
- C. The Week of Caring is currently underway.
- D. The Hawks 2 Professionals program will continue throughout the summer.
- E. De-Stress Fest will take place during final exam week. Activities are planned to help student-athletes relax.
- F. Senior student-athletes will graduate next week. They can schedule a 15-minute segment of time to go on the field at Kinnick Stadium and take pictures. Graduates will receive a sash and gift bag.
- G. Mueller expressed thanks to Student-Athlete Alexis Sevillian and Broderick Binns for their DEI efforts on behalf of student-athletes and staff. She also credited Eddie Etsey, Assistant Athletics Director/Chief Technology Officer, for his help in developing the DEI website.

VII. NCAA Report - Grosland, Hollingworth

Hollingworth reported the following:

- A. In April 2021, the NCAA D1 Council voted to allow college athletes in all sports to transfer one time as an undergraduate without having to sit out a year.

- B.** Deadlines have been established for those student-athletes who wish to transfer. Beginning in 2022, Winter sport athletes must notify the institution of their desire to leave by May 1; student-athletes in spring sports must express their wishes by July 1.
- C.** The Alston Case, which relates to limiting compensation for student-athletes, is still under consideration by the Supreme Court. The final ruling in the case will directly affect how name, image, and likeness (NIL) are managed. Several states have taken a proactive approach by enacting regulations on the use of NIL, whereas others are waiting for the outcome of the hearing. Linked to this case will be the Supreme Court decision on if the NCAA violated antitrust laws with its amateurism rules.

Clerry reported Athletics Department staff members have been working with UI officials to identify issues and develop draft policies to address NIL before having established rules from the NCAA. The cohort is focusing on the legislative proposal scheduled to be voted upon at the January 2021 NCAA Convention but tabled. They reviewed other state and federal bills to develop a plan to educate, track, and monitor NIL. She is working with outside vendors and third parties to review their platforms to address NIL. Athletics staff members will make adjustments and rollout NIL procedures once the NCAA has established rules and regulations.

VIII. Athletics Director's Report - Athletics Senior Staff

- A.** A video entitled “Year of Champions” highlighting UI student-athletes remarkable athletic accomplishments to date was shown to PCA meeting attendees. Henderson explained the External Relations staff created the video and will add highlights from the nine teams still competing. Currently, the UI has one NCAA Championship, four Big Ten (B1G) Team Championships, one National Coach of the Year and Regional Coach of the Year, five B1G Coaches of the Year, two National Players of the Year, one National Freshman of the Year, six B1G Players of the Year, three B1G Freshmen of the Year, and many All-Americans & B1G All-Conference. All of these honors garnered—without sacrificing academics—and occurring during the COVID-19 pandemic is a remarkable feat.

Henderson attributed successes to Barta, who heads the program and developed the culture of “Win. Graduate. Do It Right.” He named numerous groups of people who worked tirelessly to help Athletics Department staff navigate through the pandemic to ensure the safety of the student-athletes and return them to competition.

- B.** Football ticket renewals are underway. The Athletics Department is currently planning for 100% capacity in their venues this fall; however, they will follow the Center for Disease Control, state, and local guidelines and adjust capacity as required.
- C.** Tovar and Grosland served on the UI Presidential Search Committee. Tovar

is excited to welcome Dr. Barbara Wilson. President-Elect Wilson will arrive on campus in mid-July 2021. She is scheduled to meet with Athletics Department staff this summer.

- D.** Tovar reported student-athletes had a very successful year academically. The Athletics Department reached the highest grade point average in a long time of 3.18 for the term.

Student-athlete annual activities continued virtually during the pandemic year. She mentioned the following:

- 1.** Twenty-six Golden Herkys Awards were presented virtually to individuals and teams. Student-athletes participated in the Golden Carpet, socially distanced to comply with pandemic guidelines.
- 2.** One hundred fifty-nine graduating senior student-athletes will be recognized next week on Kinnick Stadium field, where they will receive their senior gift bag and sash. They will also have their pictures taken on the Tiger Hawk logo. In addition, many plan to participate in the UI Celebration of Graduates at Kinnick Stadium on Sunday, May 16, 2021.

Over the past four years, the senior class had 78 Academic All-Americans, over 600 Academic All-Big Ten Awardees, two NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipients, and Mueller, who is a Rhodes Scholar.

- 3.** The Annual Polk County Senior Recognition event was held virtually.

- E.** The Athletics Department had over 800 student-athletes, coaches, and staff participate in DEI-related programming throughout the year. Tovar stated Binns did a terrific job of getting student-athletes engaged in conversations around DEI and mental health.

- F.** Some student-athletes will remain on campus this summer to take part in summer school. Others will come to the UI campus to participate in the Summer Bridge Program.

- G.** An update on COVID protocols was given by Clerry. The NCAA recently ruled that student-athletes, coaches, and staff who have been fully vaccinated and have gone two weeks since their last shot no longer need to be tested if participating in NCAA Championships. Athletics Department staff are waiting to see if the Big Ten Conference will modify their testing protocol based on the NCAA's announcement.

- H.** The Big Ten Conference announced fan attendance at sporting events will now be governed by local rules and regulations. Fan capacity for UI baseball and softball games was set at 50%.

- I.** Clerry reported the over one year-long recruiting dead period ends May 31, 2021. Coaches can recruit beginning June 1, 2021.

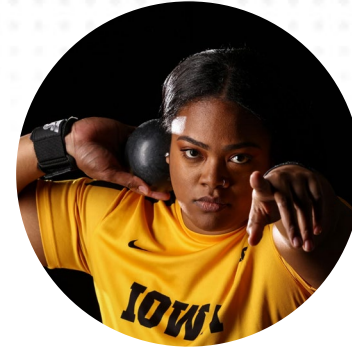

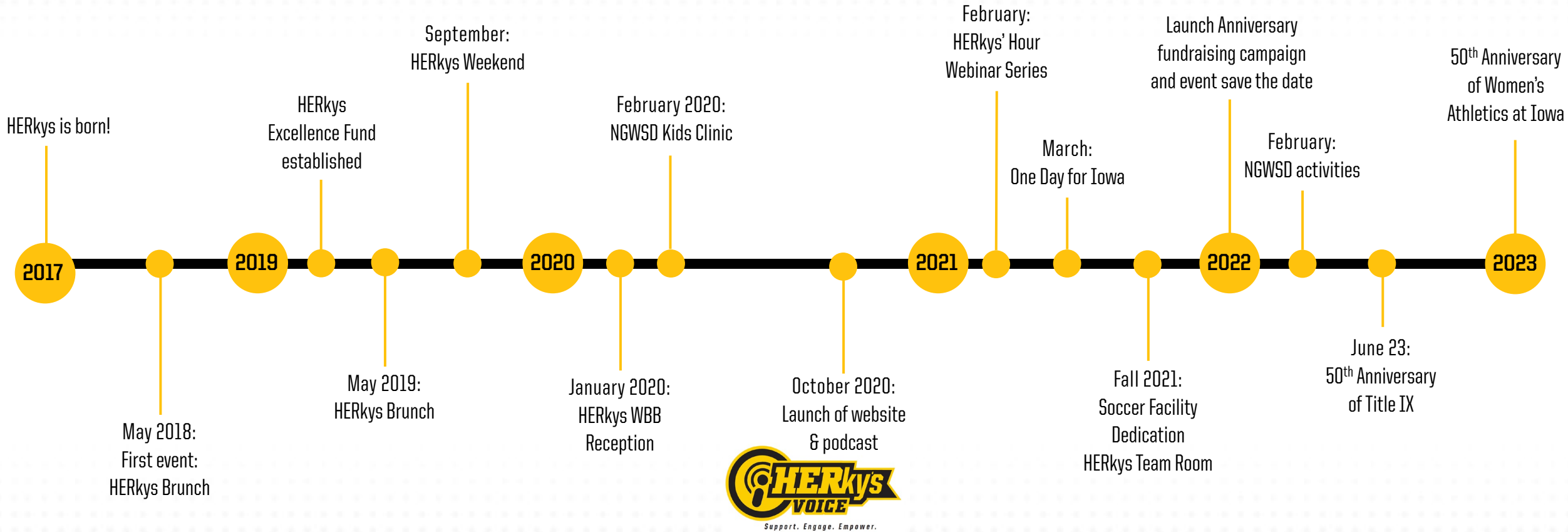

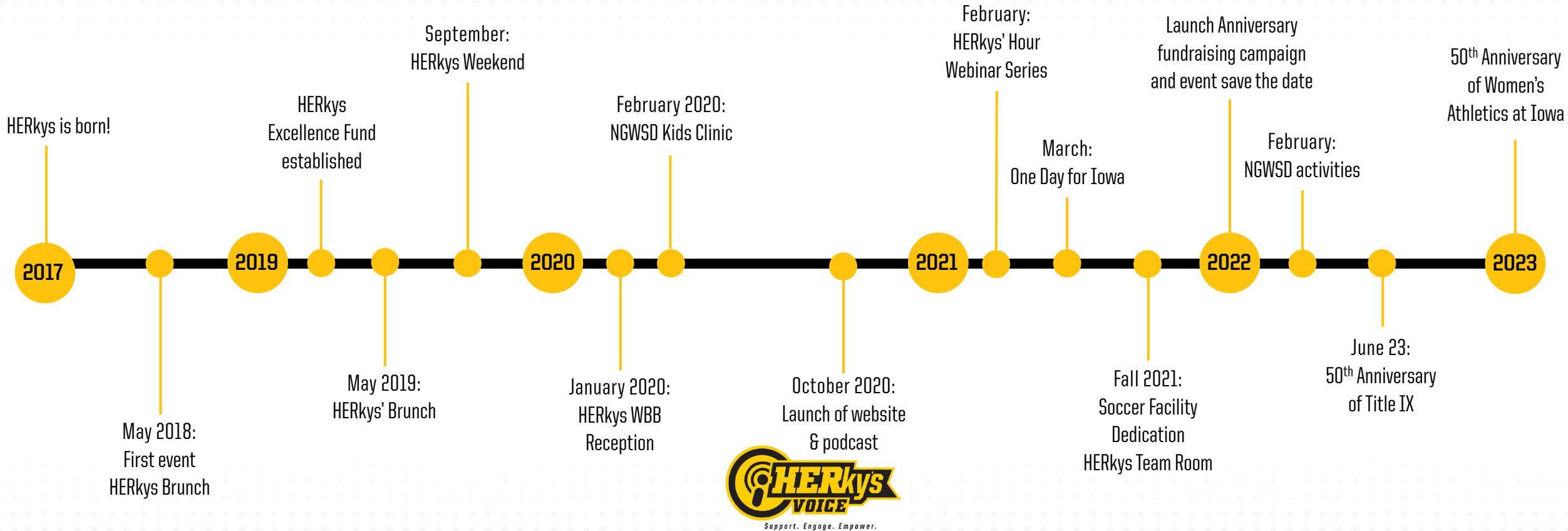

BASEBALL

Head Coach: Rick Heller

Season Record: 19-13 Overall (19-13 B1G)

Next Event: Friday-Sunday vs. Penn State (BTN+)

Notables: The Hawkeyes dropped two of three games at Indiana last weekend in Bloomington, snapping a string of five straight winning weekends, dating back to March 20. Iowa will host its final six home games of the season, facing Penn State and Illinois the next two weekends. Iowa earned back-to-back Big Ten Player of the Week honors with Ben Norman and Zeb Adreon being honored on April 20 and April 27.

Since starting the season 4-8, the Hawkeyes have won 15 of their last 20 games to improve to 19-13 overall. Iowa is currently tied for fourth in the Big Ten standings.

Senior Ben Norman is leading the team in hits (37), runs (32), home runs (10), RBIs (42), slugging percentage (.672) and steals (11). He leads the Big Ten with 42 RBIs. Redshirt junior Izaya Fullard is hitting .432 (19-of-44) over his last 10 games to move into the team lead with a .319 average.

FIELD HOCKEY

Head Coach: Lisa Cellucci

Season Record: 12-5 Overall (5-3, B1G)

Next Event: Friday at #1 North Carolina - Noon (ESPN)

Notables: The Hawkeyes ranked in the top four of the NFCA Poll during the entire season, leading to a fourth-seed in the NCAA tournament and a bye in the first round.

Junior Anthe Nijziel was named Big Ten Field Hockey Player of the Year and Big Ten Defensive player of the year, earning first team All-Big Ten honors. Senior Ellie Holley was also named first team All-Big Ten and senior Maddy Murphy was named second team All-Big Ten. Junior Lokke Stribos and sophomore Esme Gibson earned All-Big Ten Tournament honors. Head coach Lisa Cellucci earned her second consecutive Big Ten Coach of the Year nod, sharing the 2021 honor with Rutgers' Meredith Civico.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: April 17-19 at NCAA Regionals – TBD

Notables: After finishing seventh at the competitive Calusa Cup in early April, the Hawkeyes placed fourth or better in its last three tournaments, including winning the Hawkeye Invitational.

Fifth-year senior Alex Schaake was runner-up at the Robert Kepler Intercollegiate and Big Ten Championships the last two weekends. Schaake and the Hawkeyes placed fourth at the Kepler Intercollegiate and finished second

behind No. 11 Illinois by just one stroke at the Big Ten Championships. The Hawkeyes have placed third or better in eight of the last 11 Big Ten Championships, including finishing second in three of the last six.

Sophomore Mac McClear was crowned Big Ten champion. McClear was the only golfer in the field to finish the 54-hole tournament at the challenging Crooked Stick Golf Club under par (-1, 215). McClear is Iowa's fourth Big Ten champion and second since 2015 (Carson Schaake). Both McClear and Schaake earned a spot on the five-person All-Championships Team following the conference tournament.

The Hawkeyes beat Kansas by five strokes and Alex Schaake and Mac McClear finished one-two, respectively, to highlight the Hawkeye Invitational. Schaake defended his Hawkeye Invitational title, becoming a two-time champion.

Schaake has finished fifth or better in Iowa's last five tournaments, including placing second or better in four of the five.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Notables: The Hawkeyes won the UNI Spring Invitational on April 10-11 with a team score of 897 (+33). Freshman Klara Wildhaber and sophomore Morgan Goldstein tied for second on the individual leaderboard with a three-round score of 223 (+7). Sophomore Lea Zeitler finished +11 (227) to take fifth place. Jacque Galloway, Manuela Lizarazu, and Dana Lerner all finished in the group tied for sixth.

Iowa finished 10th at the Big Ten Tournament with a team score of 897 (+33). Goldstein and Wildhaber led the Hawkeyes, finishing tied for 24th with a final score of 222 (+6). Sophomore Lea Zeitler finished in a tie for 56th place, sophomore Jacque Galloway tied for 58th, and Manuela Lizarazu finished with a tie for 60th.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: JD Reive

Season Record: 4-2 Overall (4-2 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished third at the Big Ten Championships, the team's highest showing since 2006. Iowa had a Big Ten-best four athletes garner All-Big Ten recognition based on their performance as Bennet Huang was a first-team selection and Evan Davis, Stewart Brown and Peyton Hobson were second-teamers.

Huang and Davis also garnered All-America distinction. Both athletes earned the honor for ranking in the top eight in all-around. They followed it up by placing in the top eight at the NCAA Championships to earn their second All-America nod.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Season Record: 10-1 Overall (8-0 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes closed out their record-breaking 2021 season with a third-place finish at the NCAA Tuscaloosa Regional. Iowa finished with a score of 197.050, the second-highest score in school history. Sophomore JerQuavia Henderson shared the floor title at Regionals, and following the season she was selected as the CGN Comeback Athlete of the Year.

ROWING

Head Coach: Andrew Carter

Next Event: May 16 at Big Ten Championships - Indianapolis, Ind.

Notables: At the Michigan Duals, five Hawkeye boats came in second place, including the II Varsity 8, II Varsity 4, II Varsity, and I Novice 8.

On April 24, the Hawkeyes hosted their sole home regatta of the season. Iowa won the II Novice 8 race over Wisconsin and Minnesota. Hawkeyes finished in second in the I Novice 8, I Varsity 4, and I Varsity 8. Both the I Novice 8 and I Varsity 4 placed the Hawkeyes within 10 seconds of the winner, and the I Varsity 8 came down to the end with Iowa finishing .5 seconds behind Minnesota. Iowa took third in the competitive II Varsity 8 which had them within eight seconds of the winner, Minnesota.

SOCCER

Head Coach: Dave Dilanni

Season Record: 7-9-1 Overall (2-8-1 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes won when it mattered most, posting five victories in the postseason to claim their first Big Ten title and first NCAA Tournament win in program history.

Iowa beat second-seeded Illinois, third-seeded Minnesota, top-seeded Penn State, and third-seeded Wisconsin en route to the Big Ten title before defeating Campbell on its own field to notch its first ever NCAA win. The Hawkeyes led No. 3 UCLA for 84 minutes before giving up two goals in the final six minutes to miss out on the program's first Sweet 16 appearance.

Iowa's win over Penn State was the first in State College in program history and the fourth-ranked Nittany Lions were the highest ranked opponent Iowa beat all-time. The Hawkeyes avenged four regular season losses en route to the Big Ten title.

Freshman Meike Ingles was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Offensive Player after scoring three game-winners in the Big Ten Tournament. She added a fourth goal against UCLA. Freshman Macy Enneking was the Most Outstanding Defensive Player of the Big Ten Tournament after posting three shutouts and she notched another shutout in the win over the Camels.

Junior Hailey Rydberg and Samantha Tawharu joined Ingles and Enneking on the Big Ten All-Tournament team.

Enneking was also a unanimous selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. She was the only unanimous pick.

SOFTBALL

Head Coach: Renee Gillespie

Season Record: 20-16 Overall (20-16 B1G)

Next Event: Friday-Sunday vs. Nebraska - Iowa City

Notables: Iowa has won 10 of their last 20 games.

Denali Loecker was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on April 27. She hit .308 with six RBIs, a double, and a home run. She slugged .615 and had an on base percentage of .400.

Senior Allison Doocy recorded her 700th career strikeout on Saturday, May 1. She is just the sixth pitcher in program history to reach that milestone. A day later she threw the 18th no hitter in program history.

MEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Ross Wilson

Season Record: 5-13 Overall (5-11 B1G)

Notables: Iowa lost four of its final five matches to end the 2021 season.

The doubles team of redshirt junior Will Davies and redshirt sophomore Oliver Okonkwo beat two ranked opponents in April to improve to 10-2 and ascend as high as No. 2 in the country, the highest ranking ever for a Hawkeye doubles team. They earned a bid to the NCAA Championships, which will be held May 23-28 in Orlando, Fla.

Senior Kareem Allaf concluded his collegiate career as the all-time wins leader with 164 combined singles and doubles victories. He also finished second in career singles wins and tied for third in doubles victories.

Davies ranks third in combined singles and doubles wins in program history. He also shares the program record with Will Vasos for doubles victories in a career and is tied for sixth in career singles wins.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Season Record: 13-7 Overall (12-6 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 40 in the ITA Coaches Rankings and No. 42 in the ITA computer rankings and at one point this season climbed as high as No. 37 - it's highest ranking since 2011. The Hawkeyes won a school record 12 Big Ten Conference matches and reached the semifinals of the Big Ten tournament as the No. 4 seed.

Iowa was led by Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Freshman of the Year Alexa Noel. Noel is 23-0 at the No. 1 singles position and has been ranked as high as No. 13 nationally, the highest singles ranking in program history. Noel earned an individual bid to the NCAA Championships, which will be held May 23-28 in Orlando, Fla.

Five-time first-team All-Big Ten honoree Elise van Heuvelen anchored the No. 2 spot in the single lineup. She is 19-4 in singles and ranked No. 114 by the ITA. Van Heuvelen has 180 combined singles and doubles wins, the second most in program history.

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Saturday at Wisconsin Big Ten Invite - Madison, Wis.

Notables: The Iowa women are ranked No. 30 in the USTFCCA rankings, the third highest ranking of any Big Ten team. Iowa has four events ranked in the nation's top 10 of USTFCCA events squads, led by the top discus group in the country. 2019 NCAA champion Laulauga Tausaga leads the nation in the discus.

The Hawkeyes have set 15 marks on the school's all-time top 10 list, including school record holders Jenny Kimbro in heptathlon and Amanda Howe in hammer throw.

The Hawkeye men are ranked No. 21 in the country, the highest of any Big Ten team. Iowa has five events ranked in the top 10 of the USTFCCA event squad rankings, including the top 110-hurdles group in the country.

Jaylan McConico and Jamal Britt are ranked fourth and fifth in the country, and second and third on Iowa's all-time top 10 list. Iowa has set 11 marks total on the school's top 10 list.
