

*Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics*

**I. Approval of Minutes - October 4, 2018**

Bowden moved to approve the October 4, 2018, minutes. Osborn seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the PCA.

**II. Subcommittee Updates**

**A. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Dillavou**

Dillavou reported Associate Director of Student-Athlete Academic Services Kara Park attended and spoke about the Hawkeye Life Program. ISAAC President Colin was present and discussed ISAAC's goals for the year.

Subcommittee members reviewed the PCA's pregnancy policy. Dillavou noted there were no substantial changes; however, updates were made to the resource contact information. The group also began discussion on "Win. Graduate. Do It Right."

***B. Academic Achievement - Bowden***

Subcommittee members met in October to discuss the eight missed-class days policy. The Committee was reminded the policy currently tracks each team to ensure no more than the eight days are missed each semester. Student-Athlete Academic Services' staff will begin to track each student-athlete's missed-class days; this pilot program will be tested with softball student-athletes in spring 2019.

***C. Equity - Osborn***

Osborn announced the subcommittee met to develop their meeting schedule and review the charge of the Equity Subcommittee. The cohort reviewed which coaches will be interviewed during 2018-19.

***III. ISAAC Report - Gustafson, Colin***

- A.*** Colin stated October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. ISAAC members sponsored an item drive in partnership with Penn State and the Domestic Violence Intervention Program.
- B.*** ISAAC members engaged in a discussion on diversity, equity, and inclusion. Colin reported a very interactive conversation took place with several creative ideas surfacing from that exchange.
- C.*** The annual holiday gift-wrapping drive will take place November 29, 2018.
- D.*** Student-athletes volunteered to participate in the annual Haunted House celebration for children in the community.
- E.*** Colin attended the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Committee meeting in Chicago, IL. Student-athletes were afforded the opportunity to report on what is happening on their campuses. Mental health was a topic widely discussed.

***IV. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth***

Barta noted the Big Ten Joint Group met October 22-23, 2018, in Chicago, IL.

***V. Athletics Director's Report - Gary Barta***

- A.*** The November sports report and schedules are attached. Highlights follow:
  - 1.*** The field hockey team had its most successful season since 2013. Iowa won its match against Penn State in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament and competes tomorrow against Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals. The outlook is favorable for Iowa to receive an invitation to the NCAA Tournament.
  - 2.*** Junior tennis student-athlete Kareem Allaf won the ITA Central Regional Championship.

3. Men's basketball competes in an exhibition game Sunday, November 4, with Guilford College at 2:00 p.m.
  4. The men's and women's swimming teams next home competitions are Friday and Saturday, November 2-3, 2018, with Michigan and Denver.
  5. Volleyball has home matches with Rutgers and Penn State on November 2 and 3, 2018, respectively.
  6. Women's basketball is ranked thirteenth in preseason polls. Media day was held October 31, 2018.
  7. Wrestling media day is Monday, November 5, 2018.
- B.** A brief question and answer period ensued. Topics discussed were Finkbine Clubhouse, University Club, and Kinnick Stadium's closed captioning and sound systems.


**VI. Overview of UI Sports Medicine Services - Dr. Brian Wolf, Head Team Physician and Director of UI Sports Medicine Clinic**

# NOVEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

**Head Coach:** Randy Hasenbank

**Next Event:** Nov. 9 at NCAA Regional - Peoria, Illinois

**Notables:** Junior Nathan Mylenek placed 11th overall (24:00.5) at the 2018 Big Ten Championships, earning second team all-conference honors and improved 17 places from his 2017 Big Ten showing. The Hawkeyes' sixth-place finish was their best since 2009.

Eight of the men's nine competitors recorded career best 8,000-meter times, including Mylenek (24:00.5), junior Brandon Cooley (24:36.9), senior Ian Eklin (24:58.7), freshman Noah Healy (25:24.5), senior Bailey Hesse-Withbroe (25:05.2), senior Daniel Murphy (24:37.0), freshman Spencer Smith (24:59.8), and junior Karson Sommer (24:40.5).

## WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

**Head Coach:** Randy Hasenbank

**Next Event:** Nov. 9 at NCAA Regional - Peoria, Illinois

**Notables:** Senior Andrea Shine led the Hawkeyes at the 2018 Big Ten Championships, placing 15th overall and improved 14 spots from the 2017 season. Iowa placed ninth at the conference championships, their highest finish since 2011.

Four Hawkeyes set 6,000 meters personal bests at the conference meet, including Shine (20:35.4), sophomore Ashley Bryja (22:35.3), freshman Kylie Latham (22:52.8), and freshman Jessica McKee (22:11.5).

## FIELD HOCKEY

**Season Record:** 13-5 Overall, 4-4 B1G

**Head Coach:** Lisa Cellucci

**Next Event:** Friday at 2:30 p.m. vs. No. 7 Michigan - Big Ten Tournament Semifinals - Evanston, Illinois

**Notables:** Iowa is coming off a thrilling 3-2 double overtime win over third-seeded Penn State in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament to advance to the semifinals for the first time since 2013. Freshman Anthe Nijziel scored the game-winning goal to go along with two assists.

Iowa is ranked eighth in the latest Penn Monto/NFHCA Division I National Coaches Poll.

The Hawkeyes are led by sophomore Maddy Murphy on offense who has a team-leading 13 goals and 33 points, each best for third most in the Big

Ten. Junior Katie Birch leads the team in assists (9) and has the second most points (23), while junior Sophie Sunderland has the third most points (18) on seven goals and four assists.

Iowa's defense has recorded a Big Ten best seven shutouts this season, while its 0.91 goals against average ranks fourth nationally. The defense is led by junior goalkeeper Leslie Speight, who has the second best save percentage (.764) in the Big Ten.

## FOOTBALL

**Season Record:** 6-2 Overall, 3-2 B1G

**Head Coach:** Kirk Ferentz

**Next Event:** Saturday at Purdue at 2:35 p.m. CT (ESPN2)

**Notables:** Iowa is bowl eligible once again with a 6-2 record to date. The Hawkeyes had a three-game winning streak with victories over Minnesota, Indiana and Maryland, before dropping a 30-24 decision at #17 Penn State. Both Hawkeye losses this fall have been to ranked opponents.

On the strength of the winning streak, Iowa moved into the national rankings, and are currently ranked (18/19) for the second straight week.

Iowa's four remaining games are all against West Division opponents. After visiting Purdue, the Hawkeyes host Northwestern (11/10), travel to Illinois (11/17) and host Nebraska (11/23).

In the six wins to date, Iowa has won trophy games over Iowa State (Cy-Hawk Trophy) and Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale).

Iowa's defense has led the way to date, ranking second in the Big Ten in scoring defense, rushing defense, passing defense and total defense.

On offense, junior QB Nate Stanley leads the way with over 1,200 passing yards and 16 touchdowns. Stanley had four scoring passes at Minnesota and six in the win over Indiana. Stanley earned Big Ten and national Quarterback of the Week honors for his play against the Hoosiers.

In addition to offense and defense, the Hawkeyes lead the nation in kickoff returns as a team, while sophomore WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette ranks second individually. Senior PK Miguel Recinos has made nine straight field goal attempts and leads the team in scoring.

## MEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Tyler Stith

**Next Event:** Feb. 8-9 at Big Ten Match Play - Palm Coast, Florida

**Notables:** Iowa set a new team 54-hole school record of 833 (-19) at the Notre Dame Fighting Irish Classic, placing fourth out of 15 teams. The Hawkeyes fired an 18-hole team score of 277 (-7) in the first and final round, which tied for the sixth lowest 18-hole score in program history. Junior Alex Schaake's 54-hole score of 203 (-10) also set a new school record. Junior Benton Weinberg tied Raymond Knoll for the second lowest 54-hole score in program history with a 205 (-8).

The Hawkeyes were disqualified from their first tournament in October at the Marquette Intercollegiate at Erin Hills after not being able to count four scores in the second round (Matthew Walker – injury; Gonzalo Leal Montero – disqualified). Iowa closed out the fall with an eighth place finish in the 14-team field at the Royal Oaks Intercollegiate.

Schaake led the Hawkeyes in the fall with a stroke average of 70.7, three top-10 finishes, four top-20 finishes, nine rounds at or below par, and tied for the lowest 18-hole score with a 67.

## WOMEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Megan Menzel

**Next Event:** Friday-Sunday at Battle at the Beach - Cabo San Lucas, Mexico

**Notables:** Senior Shawn Rennegarbe earned Big Ten Golfer of the Week on Oct. 3 after her performance at the Diane Thomason Invite on Sept. 29-30. She carded a 54-hole total of 221 (+5) to finish in first place. It is the first weekly honor of her career.

Rennegarbe also tied for 24th at the Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational on Oct. 9-10, carding a 54-hole score of 227 (+5). She also recorded five birdies en-route to a two-over-par second round.

Freshman Manuela Lizarazu tied for 30th at the Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational. Lizarazu finished the first round one-over-par with three birdies. She finished with a 54-hole total of 229 (+13).

## ROWING

**Head Coach:** Andrew Carter

**Next Event:** Mar. 30-31 at PAC 12 Invitational - Redwood Shores, California

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes traveled to the Head of the Charles in Boston, Massachusetts, which is the largest rowing event held in the United States, and featured many top world teams. The Iowa 4+ crew placed 10th among college teams, while the 8+ placed 15th.

## SOCCER

**Season Record:** 8-7-3 Overall, 4-5-2 B1G

**Head Coach:** Dave Dilanni

**Notables:** Iowa finished the season unbeaten at home with a record of 7-0-3. Junior Natalie Winters earned third-team All-Big Ten honors. Senior Morgan Kemerling was Iowa's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award recipient. Winters led Iowa with five goals, three assists, 13 points, 49 shots, and 21 shots on goal.

Goalkeeper Claire Graves' junior season saw her move to second in career shutouts (17), third in career victories (24), and fifth in career saves (191).

## MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

**Season Record:** 2-1 Overall, 1-1 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Next Event:** Friday-Saturday vs. Michigan and Denver - Iowa City, Iowa

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes split a double dual in Minneapolis, downing South Dakota State (248-50) and narrowly falling to No. 21 Minnesota (141.50-158.50). Redshirt senior Kenneth Mende won three events in the dual as part of the 400-medley relay and individually in the 100 and 200 backstroke.

## **WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

**Season Record:** 2-1 Overall, 1-1 B1G

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Next Event:** Friday-Saturday vs. Michigan and Denver - Iowa City, Iowa

**Notables:** Iowa went 1-1 in a double dual at Minnesota last weekend in Minneapolis, downing South Dakota State (231-64) and falling to No. 16 Minnesota (109.50-189.50). Sophomores Kelsey Drake and Jayah Mathews won a pair of events in the dual. Drake was victorious in the 100 and 200 fly, while Mathews swept the diving springboard events. Sophomore Sarah Schemmel was also victorious in the 50-free.

## **MEN'S TENNIS**

**Head Coach:** Ross Wilson

**Next Event:** Nov. 11 at National Fall Championships - Surprise, Arizona

**Notables:** Junior Kareem Allaf won six straight matches, including two over ranked opponents, to win the ITA Central Regional Championship. Allaf is one of three Hawkeyes, and first in 19 years, to accomplish the feat in school history. The victory earned Allaf a singles spot at the National Fall Championships next week in Surprise, Arizona.

Iowa had three student-athletes advance to the Round of 16 in singles play at the ITA Regionals for the first time in program history (freshman Oliver Okonkwo, sophomore Will Davies, and Allaf).

Davies advanced to the singles quarterfinals at the Big Ten Indoor Championships. Sophomores Joe Tyler and Piotr Smietana won the Flight B doubles championship. Senior Jonas Larsen and freshman Nikita Snezhko won the Flight C doubles bracket, while Okonkwo and Davies were finalists in the Flight A doubles bracket.

Allaf and Larsen are ranked 35th in the ITA doubles national rankings.

## **WOMEN'S TENNIS**

**Head Coach:** Sasha Schmid

**Next Event:** Nov. 9-11 at UNLV Invite - Las Vegas Nevada

**Notables:** Iowa hosted the ITA Central Regional Championship on October 12th-16th.

Freshman Sophie Clark advanced to the Round of 16, ultimately losing to the #1 overall seed Marie Rioux, 6-1, 6-4. She went 3-1 overall in the main singles draw. Freshman Sam Mannix advanced to the Round of 16. She lost to #4 overall seed Sandra Honigova, 7-6 (4), 6-4. Mannix went 3-1 overall in the main singles draw. Freshman Michelle Bacalla advanced to the Round of 32 with an overall record in the singles main draw of 2-1.

The doubles teams of Mannix and Clark, and freshman Michelle Bacalla and sophomore Ashleigh Jacobs advanced and were eliminated in the Round of 16.

## **VOLLEYBALL**

**Season Record:** 12-11 Overall, 4-8 B1G

**Head Coach:** Bond Shymansky

**Next Event:** Friday vs. at 7 p.m. - Iowa City, Iowa; Saturday v.s No. 7 Penn State at 7 p.m. - Iowa City, Iowa

**Notables:** Iowa looks to return to the win column this weekend against Rutgers and Penn State.

Junior Cali Hoyer recorded 30 kills for the second time this season in a five set loss against Northwestern. Hoyer joins elite company as only one of five athletes in the country with multiple 30+ kill matches.

Senior Molly Kelly has become a very formidable libero in her first season in the role. Kelly ranks first in the conference with 443 total digs and second with 5.01 digs per set.

Freshman Amiya Jones is the only freshman to start every match for the Hawkeyes. The middle blocker from Indianapolis has played in all 88 sets for Iowa this season, averaging 1.28 kills per set.

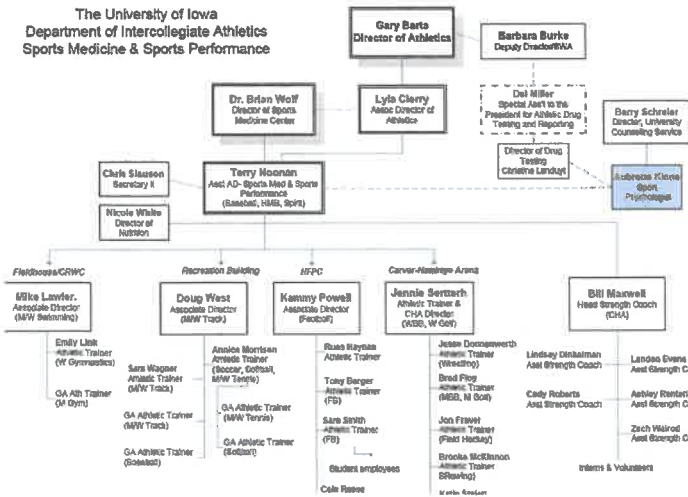

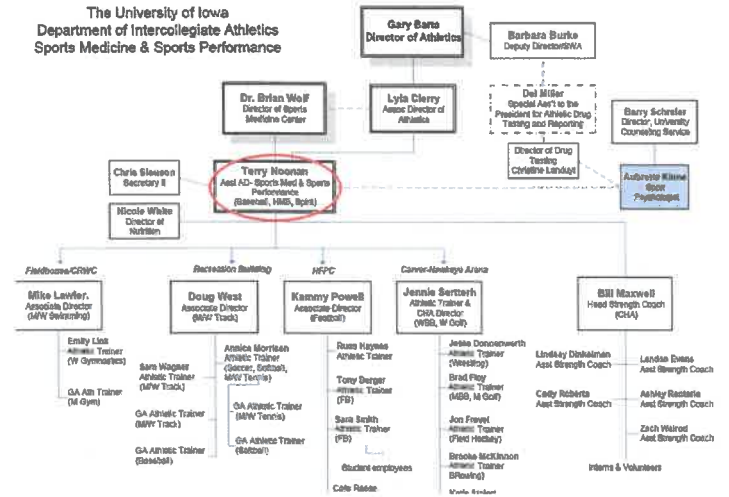

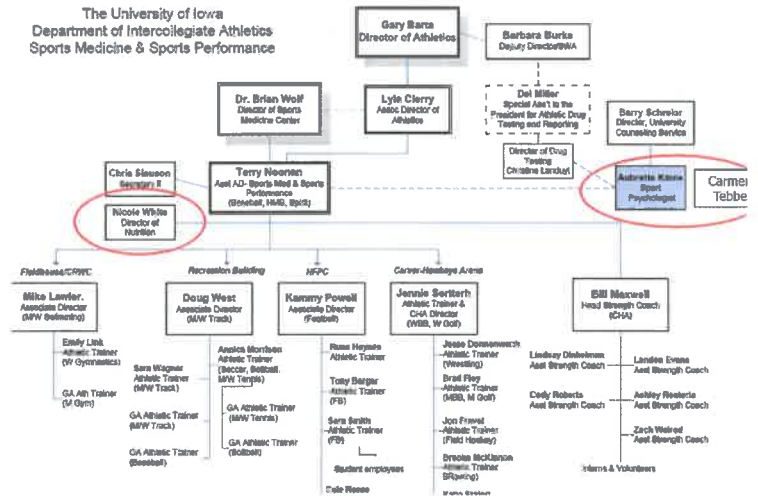

- **Athletes seen in clinic or training room**



# Team / Event Coverage

    - Depends on sport and injury risk stratification
    - Golf, track, rowing, tennis - on call
  - Cover athletes from both home and visiting teams

    - Travel with team for games Fri-Sat
    - Sunday injury check

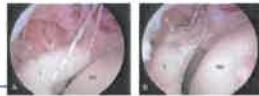

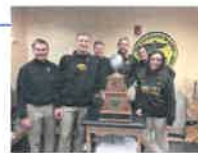
