

*Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics*

*Ted Pacha Family Club, Kinnick Stadium*

*November 7, 2019*

Chair Matheson called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

**I. Approval of Minutes - October 3, 2019**

Kelly moved to approve the October 3, 2019, minutes; Dillavou seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was received from PCA members.

**II. Presentation of New Athletics Department Strategic Plan**

Henderson, Etsey, and Laverdiere explained the process followed by Athletics staff to develop the 2020-2025 Athletics Department Strategic Plan (copy enclosed). After receiving guidance from Athletics senior staff members, the Hawkeye Leadership Team (HLT), led by co-chairs Etsey and Laverdiere, drafted a plan focusing on six areas: Athletic Success, Academic Success, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, Hawkeye Pride, Fiscal Responsibility, and Fan Engagement. Throughout the process, HLT members sought input from several groups, i.e., PCA members, Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee members, Athletics coaches and staff, UI alumni, UI faculty/staff, etc., and incorporated the input in the draft document. Discussions on publishing the Strategic Plan are taking place.

The next phase is to formulate action steps/metrics for each of the six categories. The document will guide Athletics Department staff members in safeguarding its value statement of “Win. Graduate. Do It Right.”

Henderson thanked Etsey and Laverdiere for leading this effort. Chair Matheson thanked them for the presentation.

**III. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Kehoe**

Gerke served on the search committee for the Assistant Director of Sports Nutrition. The finalist accepted the position and begins employment on Monday, November 11, 2019.

**IV. Subcommittee Updates**

**A. Academic Achievement - Bowden**

Chair Matheson gave the Academic Achievement Subcommittee's report in Bowden's absence. The group met October 19, 2019, where a presentation on the LINK program took place. Senior Associate Director of Academic Advising Brian Corkery and Tovar explained the program provides opportunities for students who fall below admission standards to enter the University of Iowa. Class size is limited to 30-50 students—approximately one-third of those individuals are student-athletes.

Tovar reviewed the distribution of majors of student-athletes. Subcommittee members were satisfied with the impressive variety of majors across academic programs.

**B. Equity - Dillavou**

Dillavou reported the Equity Subcommittee met October 19, 2019. The group plans to interview five or six coaches this academic year and formulated a list of goals. Clerry will attend the November meeting to discuss scholarships and equity data.

**C. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner**

Gail Meade and Merrie Yates from the Registrar's Office attended the October 21, 2019, meeting. They spoke about communication lines between them and the Athletics Department staff. Meade and Yates discussed their involvement in the recruiting process; they also addressed the NCAA Transfer Portal. Dan Murphy, cross country, reported on ISAAC activities.

Athletics event management staff will attend the next subcommittee meeting.

**V. ISAAC Report - Kerst**

Kerst presented the following ISAAC Report:

- A.** ISAAC Diversity & Inclusion Chair Alexis Sevillian spearheaded a campaign to raise support for Hurricane Dorian victims.
- B.** Liz DeShields spoke about the importance of sharing what is discussed at ISAAC meetings with their sport team.

- C.** ISAAC members held anti-hazing forums last week in support of National Hazing Prevention Week.
- D.** ISAAC participated in the UI's Fresh Check Day on October 16, 2019. The event focuses on the importance of mental health and wellness, suicide prevention, and campus support resources. ISAAC's theme was pre-game mindset.
- E.** Marissa Mueller, who sits on the UI Student Government (UISG), will propose to incorporate language into UISG bylaws stating student-athletes cannot be involved in any activity that will break NCAA or team rules.
- F.** Clerry spoke to ISAAC members about Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL). Barta will hold a town hall meeting with student-athletes to discuss NIL and other topics affecting student-athletes on Sunday, November 10, 2019.
- G.** Kerst will attend the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Committee meeting next week in Chicago, IL.

**VI. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth**

Barta stated ongoing discussions on a variety of national topics are taking place, but there is nothing new to report. At the October 2019 Big Ten Joint Group meetings, legislation was discussed to present at the 2020 NCAA Annual Convention.

**VII. Athletics Director's Report - Barta**

Barta highlighted the following from the enclosed November sports report and schedules:

- A.** Field hockey won a share of the Big Ten Championship regular-season title. Cellucci received Big Ten Coach of the Year honors.  
  
The team will participate in the Big Ten Championship Tournament.
- B.** Soccer tied for the most regular-season wins in the history of this UI sport. They participated in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Championship but lost to Penn State. The NCAA Selection Show is Monday, November 11, 2019.
- C.** Ticket sales are ongoing for women's basketball, wrestling, and men's basketball.

**VIII. Presentation on the North End Zone Project - Barta, Henderson, Davies, Simcox**

Barta stated the Athletics Department follows the same procedures when building facilities, as do other departments on the UI campus. Discussions start with President Harreld and Lehnertz; upon their endorsement, a proposal is presented for review by the Board of Regents (BOR), State of Iowa. Upon BOR approval, the next steps are to hire an architect and develop a finance plan.

Simcox spoke about the North End Zone renovation. The Board of Regents approved the project in 2015, a budget was prepared, and in November 2016 JE Dunn Construction

was hired as the architect. Athletics took the lead on the project; UI Facilities Management staff managed day-to-day oversight.

Davies worked with UI Controller Terry Johnson to develop a financing plan for the \$89 million project. They developed a method and timeline to issue \$90 million in bonds.

Chair Matheson thanked everyone for the presentation.

***IX. Adjourn***

The meeting adjourned at 4:51 p.m. A tour of the Ted Pacha Family Club and North End Zone seating ensued.

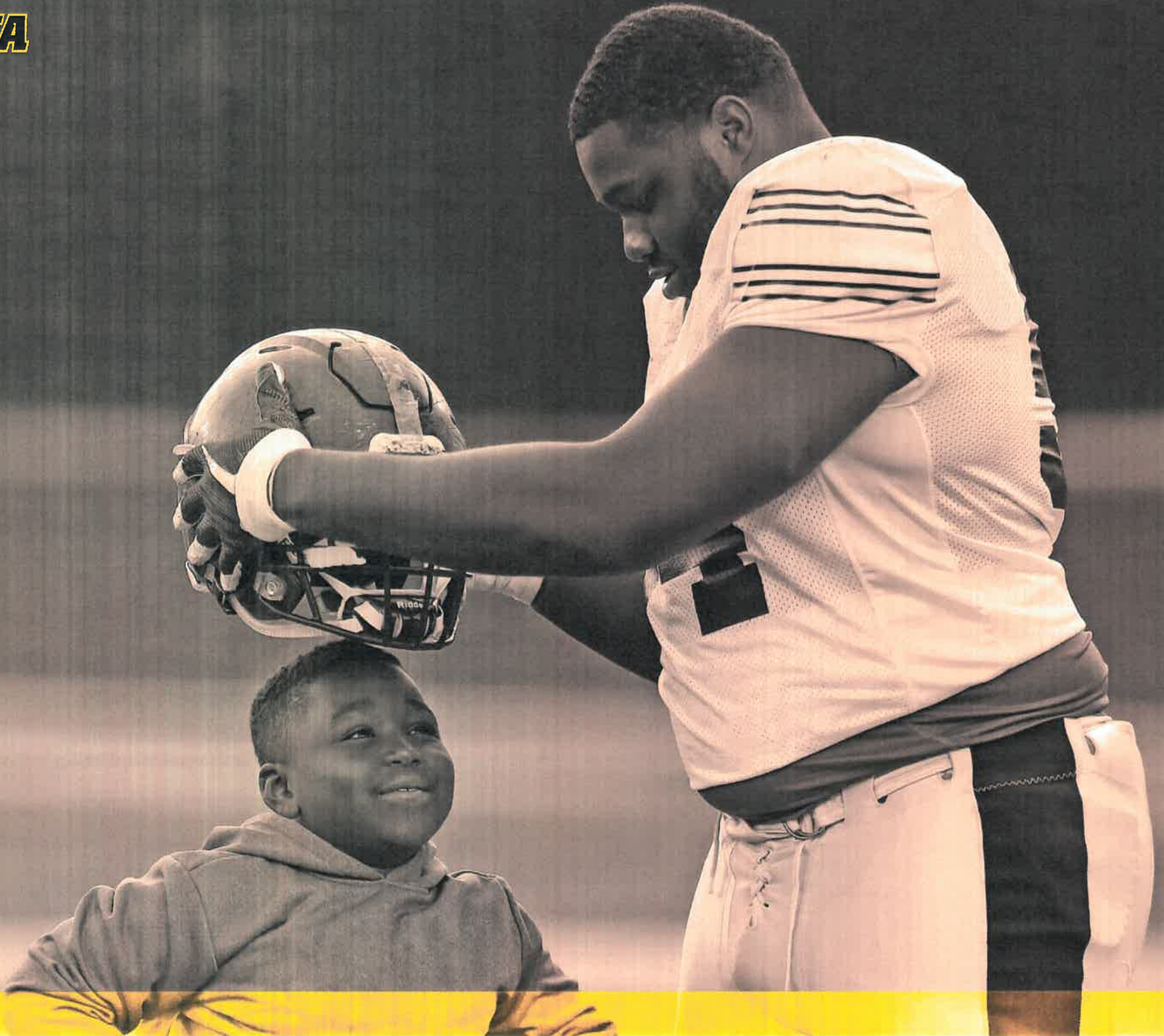
## ***ACADEMIC SUCCESS***

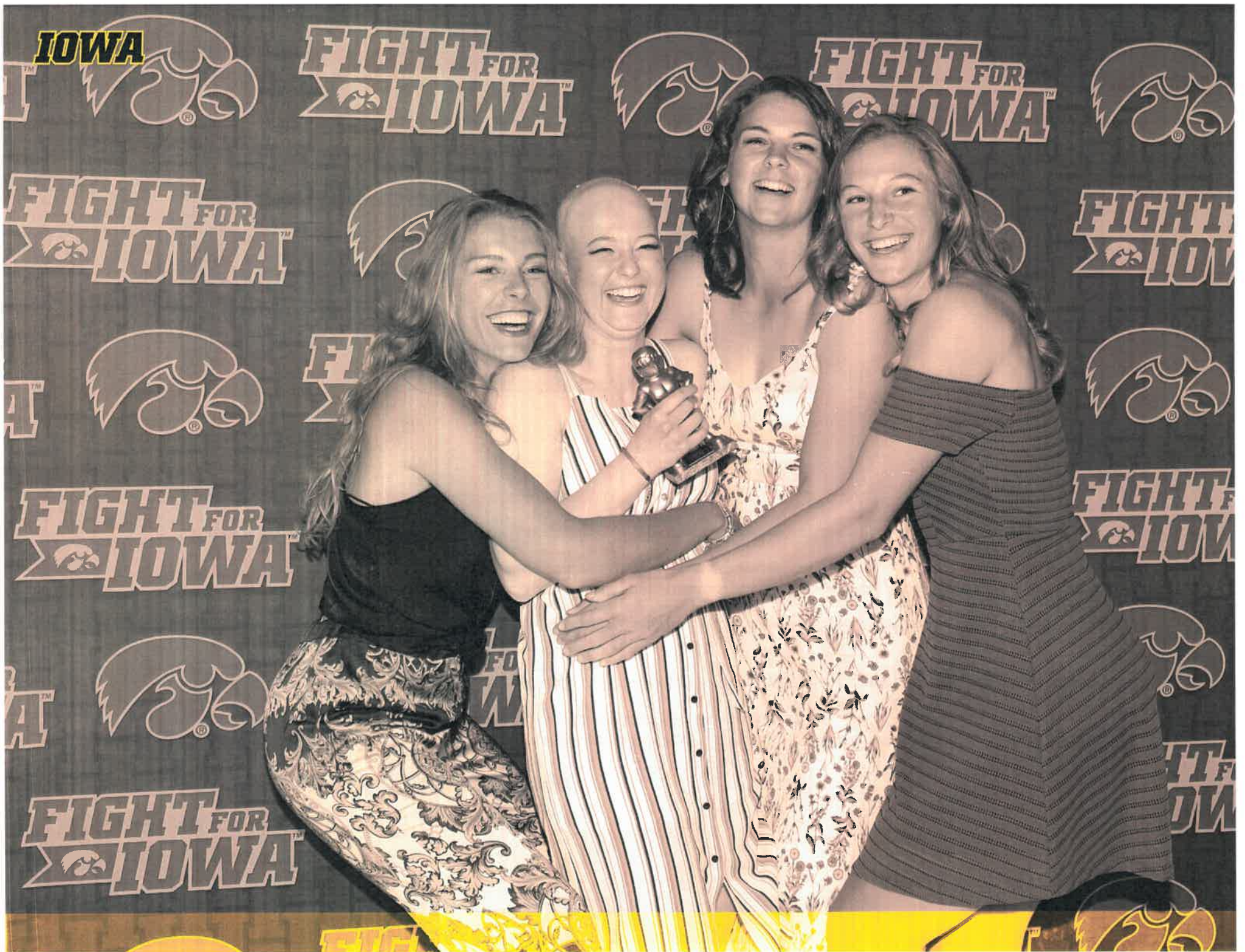


## ***DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION***

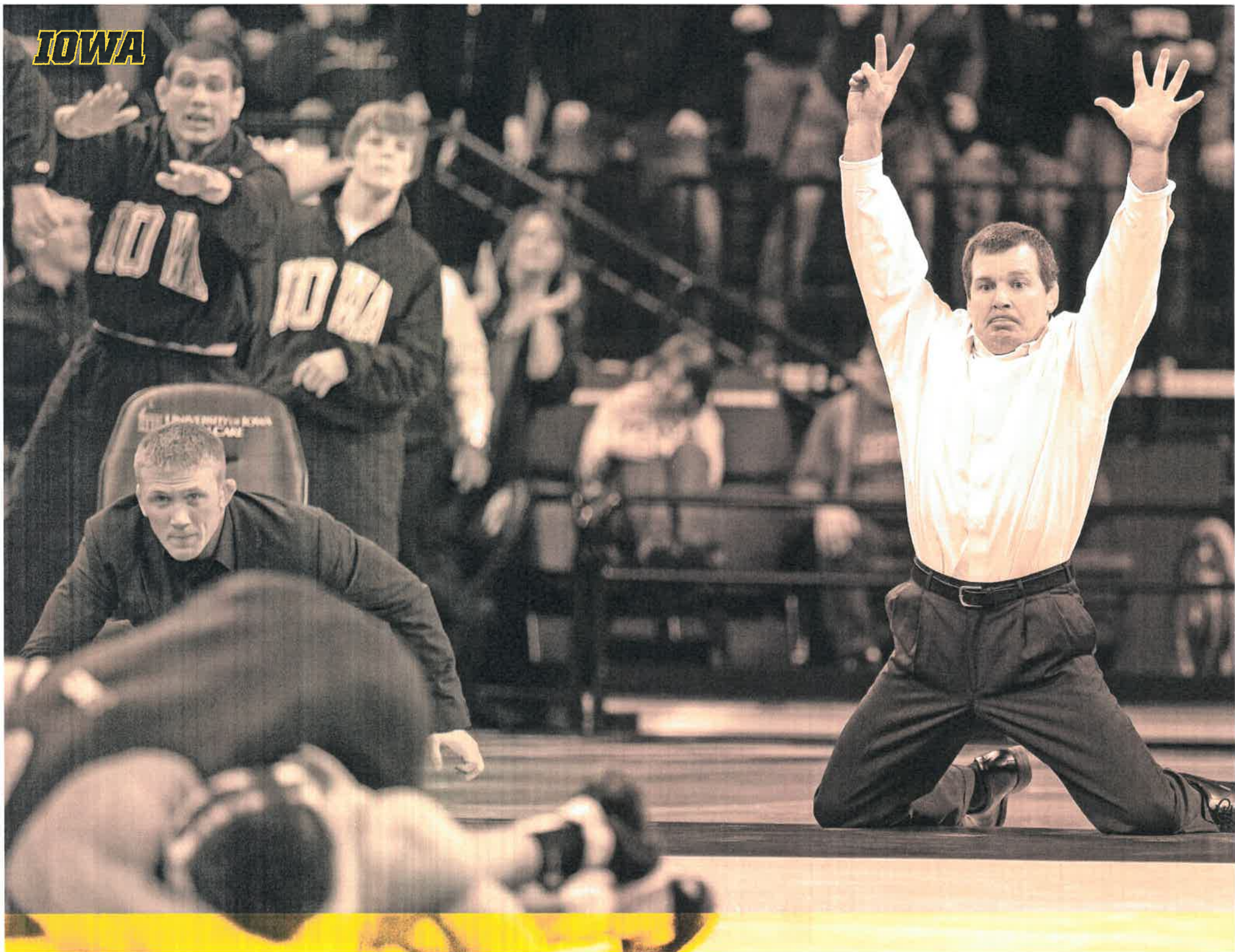

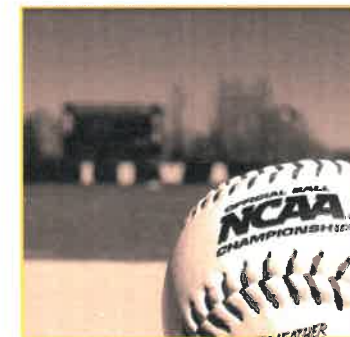

# NOVEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

**Head Coach:** Randy Hasenbank

**Next Event:** Nov. 15 at NCAA Midwest Regional - Stillwater, Okla.

**Notables:** Senior Nathan Mylenek was the top Hawkeye finisher for nine straight meets. This hasn't been accomplished since Jeff Thode in 2010-11 with eight meets. Junior Noah Healy earned 2019 Big Ten Sportsmanship Award Honor. Mylenek is the first Hawkeye since 2008-09 to earn back-to-back All-Big Ten honors. He placed 10th at the 2019 Big Ten Championships.

## WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

**Head Coach:** Randy Hasenbank

**Next Event:** Nov. 15 at NCAA Midwest Regional - Stillwater, Okla.

**Notables:** Junior Elyse Prescott earned the 2019 Big Ten Sportsmanship Award Honor. The Hawkeyes placed 9th at the Big Ten Championships. Freshman Leah Kralovetz was the top Hawkeye finisher with a new career best (21:16) in the 6,000 meters, placing 42nd.

## FIELD HOCKEY

**Head Coach:** Lisa Cellucci

**Season Record:** 13-4 Overall (7-1 B1G)

**Next Event:** Thursday at B1G Tournament - University Park, Penn.

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes are seeded second for the B1G Tournament at Penn State. Iowa claimed a share of the B1G regular season title, defeating No. 8 Michigan last week (1-0) in Ann Arbor. The team now has six wins against ranked opponents on the season, including No. 10 Wake Forest, No. 14 Ohio State, No. 24 Michigan State, No. 18 Rutgers, No. 10 Northwestern, and No. 8 Michigan.

Junior Maddy Murphy leads the team in goals (11) while senior Katie Birch leads in assists (10). Three Hawkeyes have recorded hat tricks this season, including Murphy, Sophie Sunderland, and Ellie Holley.

## FOOTBALL

**Head Coach:** Kirk Ferentz

**Season Record:** 6-2 Overall (3-2 B1G)

**Next Event:** Saturday at Wisconsin at 3 p.m. (FOX) - Madison, Wis.

**Notables:** Iowa is currently ranked No. 18 in the national polls, including the first College Football Playoffs rankings released this week. The Hawkeyes, with six wins to date, are bowl eligible for the 18th time in the last 19 seasons.

Iowa has won consecutive games over Purdue and Northwestern after narrow losses to nationally-ranked opponents Michigan and Penn State.

The Hawkeyes are nationally ranked in several defensive statistical categories, including first downs allowed (2nd), scoring defense (3rd), time of possession (3rd), total defense (6th), fewest penalties per game (5th), and red zone offense (6th). Senior QB Nate Stanley ranks second in career touchdown passes (62) and fourth in career passing yards and total offense, while K Keith Duncan leads the nation with 19 made field goals.

Following the game at Wisconsin, Iowa returns home the following two weekends to host Minnesota (Nov. 16) and Illinois (Nov. 23), before closing the regular season at Nebraska (Nov. 29).

## MEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Tyler Stith

**Next Event:** Feb. 7-8 at Big Ten Match Play Championship in Palm Coast, Fla.

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes wrapped up their fall slate at the Royal Oaks Intercollegiate, Oct. 22, finishing 10th. Sophomore Gonzalo Leal Montero tied for a season-best eighth place with at five-under-par 208, which was the low-Hawkeye score of the season and tied for the seventh-lowest 54-hole total in school history.

Iowa's third-place finish at the Notre Dame Fighting Irish Classic and its tied-for-fourth finish at the Golfweek Conference Challenge were the highlights of the fall. In the Fighting Irish Classic, the Hawkeyes placed ahead of No. 3 Arizona State, Iowa State, and three B1G Teams.

All eight Hawkeyes competed in at least one tournament in the fall. Senior Alex Schaake led Iowa in 18-hole stroke average (71.8) and rounds at or below par (7), while recording one top-10 finish and two top-20 finishes. Leal Montero and senior Benton Weinberg recorded six rounds at or below par. Four Hawkeyes carded at least one round below 70.

## WOMEN'S GOLF

**Head Coach:** Megan Menzel

**Next Event:** Feb. 16-18 at All-State Sugar Bowl - New Orleans, La.

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes wrapped up their fall season at the Battle at the Beach; Nov. 3, tying for 12th. Freshmen Lea Zeitler (T16; +2) and Jacquelyn Galloway (T21; +3) placed inside the top-25.

The team traveled to Starkville, Mississippi, Oct. 13-15, and placed ninth at the Magnolia Invitational. Freshman Jacquelyn Galloway had career-bests, firing a three-round total of 217 (+1) to finish in eighth. She recorded her season-best 18-hole score of 68 (-4).

Zeitler's top-five finish at the East West Match Play Challenge on Sept. 22-24 landed her on Golfweek's top-50 list in October.

## SOCCER

**Head Coach:** Dave Dilanni

**Season Record:** 15-4-1 Overall (7-3-1 B1G)

**Next Event:** TBA - NCAA Tournament

**Notables:** Iowa is currently 15-4-1 after losing in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals at Penn State on Nov. 3. The NCAA Tournament Selection Show is slated for Nov. 11 at 3:30 p.m. (CT) where the Hawkeyes are looking for their second appearance all-time.

Iowa enjoyed one of the best regular seasons in program history, winning 15 games to tie the program record for wins in a season. (The 2013 team needed two Big Ten Tournament wins to get to 15 victories.) The Hawkeyes won seven B1G games, tying a program record, to place fifth in the league standings. It was tied for the second highest finish in program history.

Iowa tied a school record with three student-athletes earning All-Big Ten recognition. Senior Natalie Winters was second-team All-Big Ten, senior Devin Burns earned third-team honors, and Gianna Gourley was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. Senior Claire Graves was Iowa's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree.

The Hawkeyes were the Big Ten's most prolific offensive team, scoring 45 goals during the regular season -- four off the school record and in the top 10 nationally. Iowa had 16 different players find the back of the net, which were the most by a team across the nation.

## MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Season Record:** 2-2 (2-2 B1G)

**Next Event:** at Minnesota Invitational, Dec. 4-7 - Minneapolis

**Notables:** The 19th-ranked Hawkeyes defeated Michigan State and No. 23 Minnesota earlier this month, but fell to top-ranked Michigan and second-ranked Indiana. Individually, Iowa has amassed 17 wins so far this season, with Anze Fers Erzen, Michael Tenney, and Aleksey Tarasenko leading the team with three each. Iowa diving posted wins on the 1-meter against Minnesota and Michigan State, and took the 3-meter against MSU.

## WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

**Head Coach:** Marc Long

**Season Record:** 2-2 (1-2 B1G)

**Next Event:** Nov. 8 - Rutgers - Iowa City, Iowa - 2 p.m.

**Notables:** Iowa has put up impressive times against tough opponents so far this season. Iowa captured wins against Michigan State and Northern Iowa, but fell to Minnesota in a close battle. Iowa also faced No. 3 Michigan and notched eight first place finishes, falling 173-127. The team has collected 25 individual wins so far this season.

## MEN'S TENNIS

**Head Coach:** Ross Wilson

**Next Event:** at Oracle ITA Fall Nationals, Nov. 6-10

**Notables:** Iowa entered the fall season ranked No. 43 nationally.

The Hawkeyes are sending five student-athletes (one singles player and two doubles teams) to the Oracle ITA National Fall Championships at Newport Beach, California this week. Iowa is one of only three schools in the country (Baylor, Oklahoma State) to have multiple doubles teams compete in the 32-team bracket.

Senior Kareem Allaf, ranked No. 69 nationally, will be making his second consecutive appearance at Fall Nationals. He was selected as one of the top 64 singles players in the country. Allaf became the first Hawkeye in 19 years to qualify for this prestigious event a year ago. The Hawkeye senior posted a 7-3 record in October, including advancing to the semifinals of ITA Central Regionals for the second consecutive season.

The doubles teams off junior Will Davies/sophomore Oliver Okonkwo and freshman Matt Clegg/sophomore Nikita Snezhko are the first Hawkeye doubles teams to qualify for this event in 20 years.

Junior Joe Tyler won four singles matches at last weekend's B1G Indoor Championships in Nebraska to finish as champion of the consolation bracket. Tyler also partnered with Okonkwo in doubles, winning three matches and finishing as finalists in the championship draw.

## **WOMEN'S TENNIS**

**Head Coach:** Sasha Schmid

**Next Event:** Jan. 18 vs. South Alabama at Fort Myers, Florida

**Notables:** Senior Elise van Heuvelen Treadwell advanced to the quarterfinals at the ITA Central Regional Championships. van Heuvelen Treadwell, junior Danielle Bauers, and freshman Erika Dodridge all lead the Hawkeyes with seven singles wins this fall. Bauers and junior Ashleigh Jacobs had the best record for the Hawkeyes in doubles this fall at 4-2. The Hawkeyes finish the fall with a 38-34 record in singles and a 17-16 record in doubles.

## **VOLLEYBALL**

**Head Coach:** Vicki Brown

**Season Record:** 9-14 Overall (3-9 B1G)

**Next Event:** Wednesday vs. #21 Illinois at 7 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City; Saturday vs. #7 Nebraska at 7 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Iowa City.

**Notables:** Junior Halle Johnston took over as Iowa's libero and has risen to the occasion. Johnston is second in the Big Ten with 4.79 digs/set and second with 407 total digs. Johnston is on pace to record the fourth-highest digs/set mark in school history and could become the third consecutive Hawkeye libero to lead the Big Ten in digs and digs/set.

Sophomore Amiya Jones set a career-high with seven aces, including three consecutive, and a career-high 15 kills in a five-set victory over Indiana. Seven aces are the most in the Big Ten this season and seventh in the NCAA.

Freshman Blythe Rients totaled 11 blocks against Indiana on Oct. 20 to tie her for sixth in Iowa single-match history. 11 Blocks are tied for the most in the Big Ten this season and most by a Hawkeye since Sept. 2, 2011.
