

Minutes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Big Ten/Iowa Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

October 3, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 4:02 p.m. by Chair Matheson.

I. Approval of Minutes - September 5, 2019

Courter moved to approve the September 5, 2019, minutes. Weinstein seconded the motion. Unanimous consent was granted from Committee members.

II. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Update and Introduction of New Staff - Tovar

Tovar introduced Easley and Binns. The staff positions will further enhance opportunities for a more inclusive environment for student-athletes and provide additional academic tools and support for increased graduation rates, especially among African American student-athletes.

Easley spoke about her educational background and job experience. She works with student-athletes daily who are at risk academically. Easley has formed a partnership with the UI's First Generation Task Force and has received positive feedback from student-athletes.

Binns works with minority student-athletes to develop a culture that allows them to feel they belong at the University of Iowa. He has met with various sports teams and each team's Multicultural Focus Group representative. Binns plans to get-together with

ISAAC representatives next. Tovar added he has been instrumental in two successful events recently—the Multicultural Focus Group Kickoff Event and Hawkeye Connections, a faculty mentorship program.

III. Report on Athletics Department Finances - Greg Davies

Attached is the PowerPoint presentation given by Davies. His report focused on the Athletics Department's budget for FY2019 and FY2020. Revenue sources and expenses were reflected for each fiscal year. Davies' report illustrated the UI's budget in comparison with other Big Ten institutions for this same period.

After a brief question and answer period, Chair Matheson thanked Davies.

IV. Report on Athletics Department Facilities - Damian Simcox

Simcox presented the enclosed PowerPoint presentation on Athletics facilities. The attached slides encompass 19 projects completed to date. Other construction tasks for this fiscal year are: completion of the new Finkbine Clubhouse, teardown of the old clubhouse at Finkbine, outside structural work on Kinnick Stadium, locker-room improvements for the swim program, office creation for the Athletics wellness staff at the Jacobson Athletic Building, and finalize work on the outdoor courts at the Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Center.

Simcox answered questions posed by Committee members. Chair Matheson thanked him.

V. Athletics Department Searches - Kehoe

Kehoe reported interviews will take place next week for the position of Assistant Director of Sports Nutrition. He will email PCA members seeking a volunteer to serve on the search committee.

VI. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement - Bowden

Bowden's subcommittee met last week. Discussion items were: yearly agenda, charge of the subcommittee, miss-class day policy, and roles/responsibilities of Binns' and Easley's positions.

B. Equity - Dillavou

Dillavou reported the subcommittee would hold its first meeting of the year the following week.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner

Subcommittee members met September 23, 2019. Torner reported members discussed the subcommittee's charge, responsibilities, and priorities. They reviewed recommendations from Protection For All executives (formerly known as the Dan Beebe Group) and how they might impact student-athletes. Murphy, a student-athlete representative on this subcommittee, will present those

recommendations to ISAAC and provide feedback to Toner and subcommittee members. The Athletics Event Management staff will be invited to a future meeting to discuss fan interaction and steps to maintain student-athlete safety.

VII. ISAAC Report - Kerst

Tovar reported the following in Kerst's absence:

- A.** At the last ISAAC meeting, reports were presented from representatives from the UI Office of Sustainability and from Hawkeye Sport Humanities, a group that fundraises for national disasters.
- B.** ISAAC would like to thank PCA members in celebrating over 200 student-athletes recognized at halftime of the Iowa vs. Middle Tennessee State football game for receiving 3.0 or higher academic honors.
- C.** ISAAC sponsored "Networking @ Carver" last week, whereby student-athletes had the opportunity to meet potential employers.
- D.** Annual Senior Night was held, providing student-athletes with information to ensure they are prepared to graduate. A speaker that evening spoke about sports wagering.

VIII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

- A.** The Big Ten Joint Group meeting takes place October 21-22, 2019.
- B.** Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL), which seeks payment to student-athletes for the use of their NIL, is a topic of discussion nationally. Barta reminded the PCA that California passed legislation which allows student-athletes to earn income from their NIL, effective in 2023. The NCAA has established a working group to address this topic; recommendations from this cohort are expected to be released in December 2019. Barta expressed his desire for the current collegiate model to remain intact.


IX. Athletics Director's Report - Barta

- A.** Barta highlighted the enclosed October sports report and schedules:
 - 1.** Football is 4-0 and ranked 14th nationally.
 - 2.** Soccer is 10-2. The team is ranked 19th in the United Soccer Coaches poll.
 - 3.** The field hockey team is ranked 7th by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association.
 - 4.** Vicki Brown was hired as the permanent Head Volleyball Coach.
 - 5.** Cross Country teams have won all meets to date.
- B.** The Athletics Department's new Strategic Plan will be published soon.

C. Athletics staff members have put additional measures in place to ensure the safety of everyone who visits UI sporting events. In follow-up to recent news about alleged incidents during the Iowa vs. Iowa State football game, President Harreld and Barta met with the Hawkeye Marching Band. Moving forward, President Harreld plans to meet with officials from Iowa, Iowa State, and Northern Iowa to provide a safe, enjoyable environment for all participants and fans.

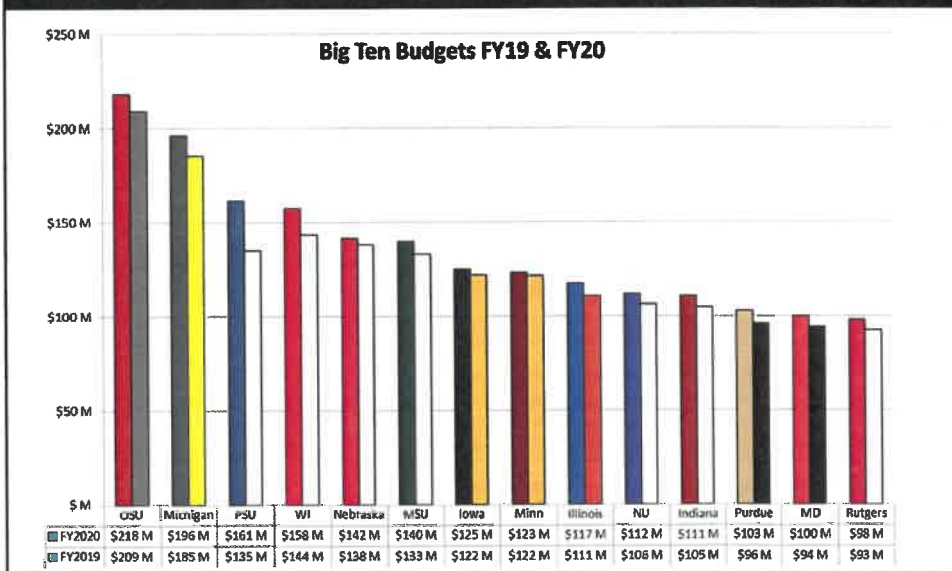

Fiscal Year Comparison

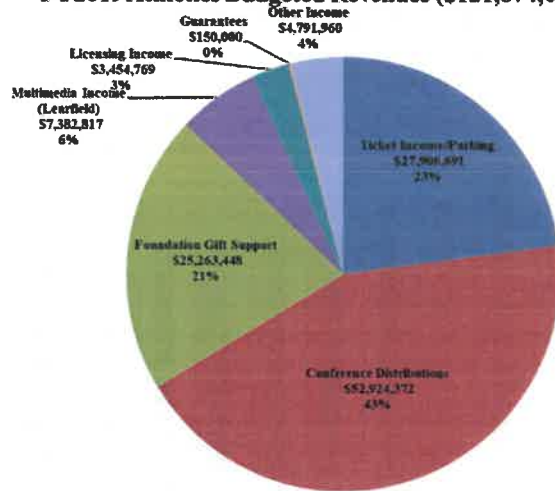

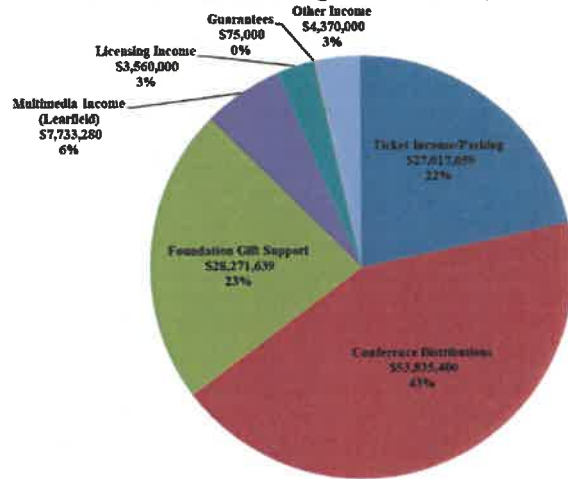
University of Iowa Athletics 2019 Fiscal Year Budgeted Revenue

FY2019 Athletics Budgeted Revenues (\$121,874,056 Total)



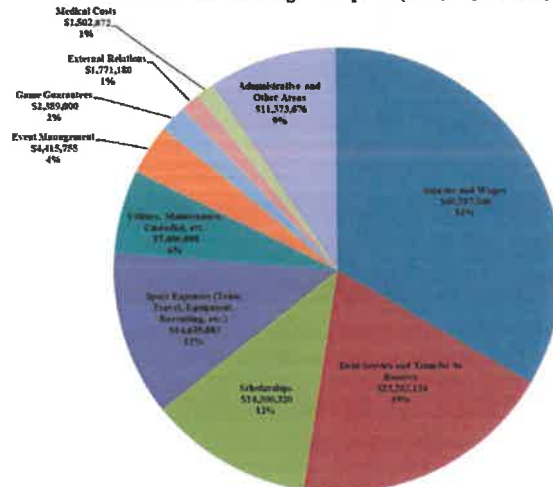
University of Iowa Athletics 2020 Fiscal Year Budgeted Revenue

FY2020 Athletics Budgeted Revenues (\$124,862,379 Total)



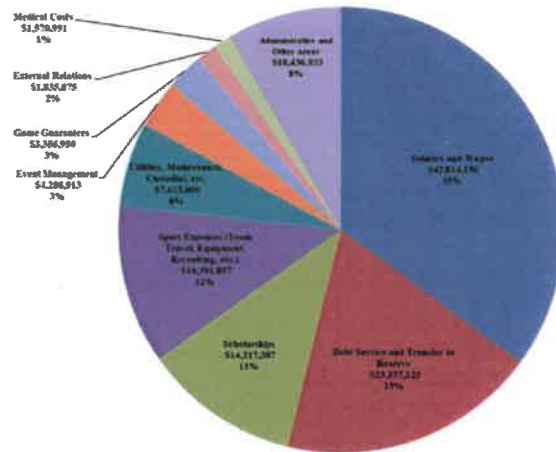
University of Iowa Athletics 2019 Fiscal Year Budgeted Expense

FY2019 Athletics Budgeted Expense (\$121,874,056 Total)

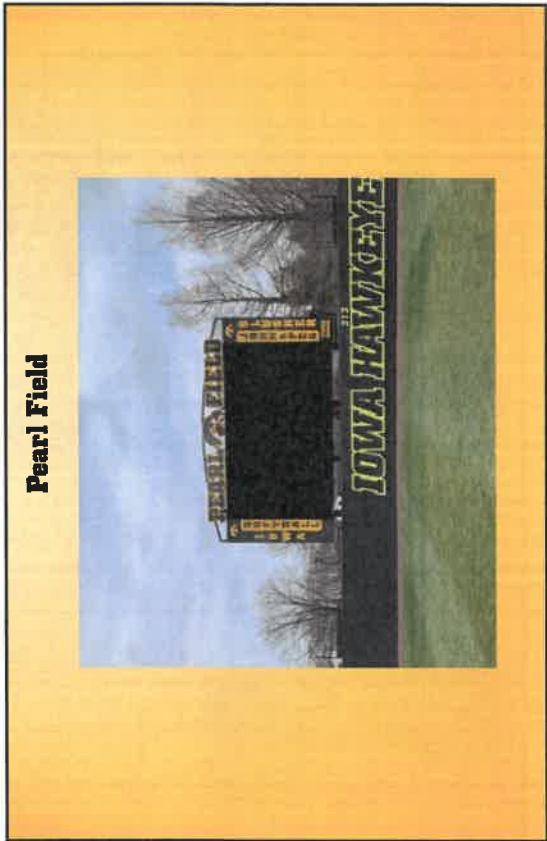


University of Iowa Athletics 2020 Fiscal Year Budgeted Expense

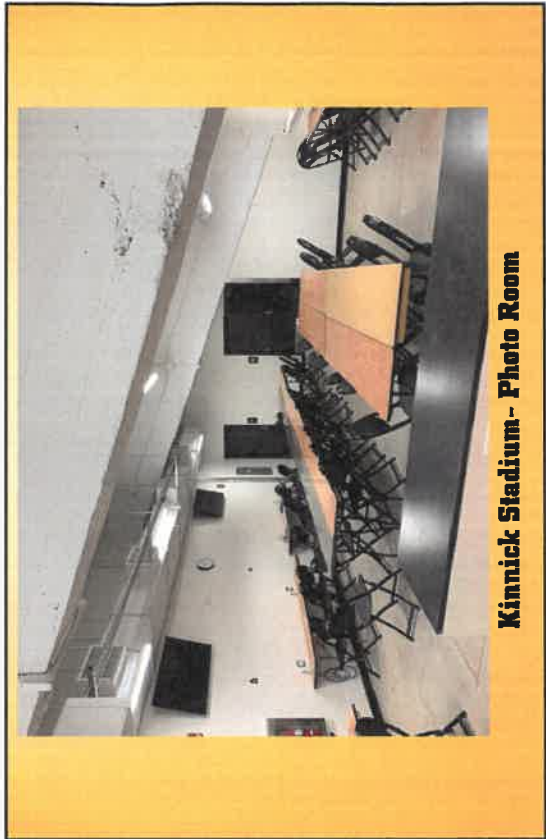

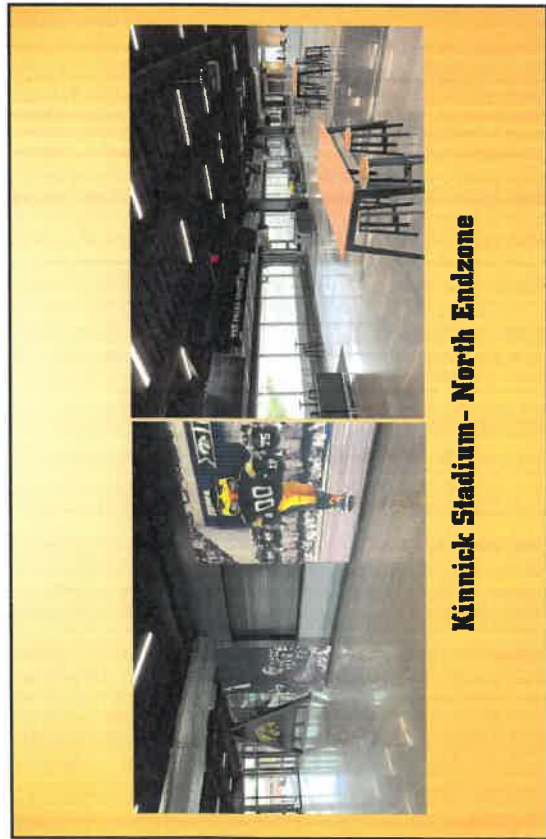




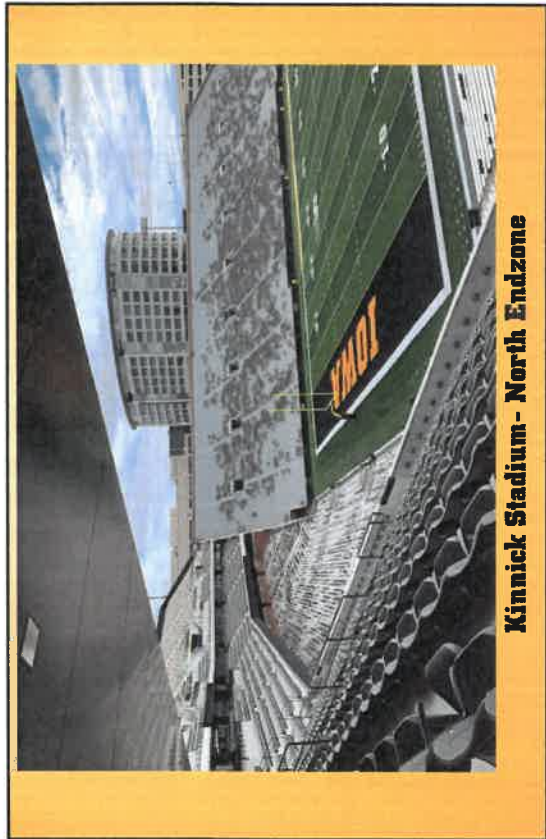
Kinnick Stadium - Turf Replacement

OCTOBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Next Event: Friday at Notre Dame Invite - South Bend, Ind.

Notables: The men have won both meets to date, winning team titles at the Hawkeye Invitational and the Woody Greeno Invitational. Nathan Mylenek was named Big Ten Athlete of the Week on Sept. 11. He finished the 6,000 meter race in 18:16 to jump from sixth to third on Iowa's all-time list.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Next Event: Friday at Notre Dame Invite - South Bend, Ind.

Notables: The women have won both meets to date, winning team titles at the Hawkeye Invitational and the Woody Greeno Invitational. Freshman Leah Kralovetz led Iowa at the Woody Greeno, placing fourth overall. Senior Megan Schott was Iowa's top finisher at the Hawkeye Invitational.

FIELD HOCKEY

Head Coach: Lisa Celluci

Season Record: 7-2 Overall (2-0 B1G)

Next Event: Friday vs. No. 18 Rutgers at 2 p.m. - Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeyes are currently ranked No. 7 in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association poll. Iowa has wins against three ranked opponents, including No. 10 Wake Forest, No. 14 Ohio State, and No. 24 Michigan State.

Three Hawkeyes lead the team in scoring this season with five goals: senior Katie Birch, junior Maddy Murphy, and senior Sophie Sunderland. Sunderland and junior Ellie Holley have had hat tricks. Sunderland was named Big Ten Offensive Athlete of the Week (Sept. 9)

FOOTBALL

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Season Record: 4-0 Overall (1-0 B1G)

Next Event: Saturday at Michigan at 11 a.m. - Ann Arbor, Mich.

Notables: Iowa is currently ranked No. 14 in the national polls. The Hawkeyes won the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game at Iowa State (18-17).

The Hawkeyes are nationally ranked in several statistical categories, including scoring defense (3rd), time of possession (3rd), total defense (5th), third down defense (8th), turnovers lost (1st) and penalties per game (4th). Senior QB Nate Stanley has moved up to third place in career touchdown passes (60).

Iowa hosts Penn State Oct. 12 (6:30 p.m.) and Purdue on Oct. 19 in the annual Homecoming contest.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: Monday-Tuesday at Notre Dame Fighting Irish Classic - South Bend, Ind.

Notables: The Hawkeyes tied for fourth out of 16 teams in their second tournament of the year at the Golfweek Conference Challenge in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Four Hawkeyes finished in the top 21 or better.

In Iowa's first tournament at the Gopher Invitational in Independent, Minn., senior Alex Schaaake tied for eighth at even-par (213). It was his 10th career top-10 finish. He leads the team in 18-hole stroke average (71.8) and is tied for the team lead in low 18-hole score (69) and rounds at or below par (3).

Junior Joe Kim and sophomore Gonzalo Leal Montero are tied for second in strokes per round at 73.5. Leal Montero and senior Benton Weinberg have fired 69s this season.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: Oct. 13-15 at Magnolia Invite - Starkville, Miss.

Notables: Iowa won its matchup on Sept. 2 against the University of Northern Iowa, 6.5 – 1.5.

The Hawkeyes traveled down to Albuquerque, New Mexico, to compete in the Branch Law Firm Invitational finishing 13th with a 54-hole total of 902 (+38).

Iowa also finished sixth in stroke play, with a 36-hole total of 595 (+19), at the East West Match Play Challenge. Freshman Lea Zeitler finished fifth in stroke play with a two-round score of 142 (-2) and won her round of match play against Indiana golfer, Alexis Miestowski, 5-3.

SOCCER

Head Coach: Dave Dilanni

Season Record: 10-2 Overall (2-2 B1G)

Next Event: Thursday vs. Nebraska at 7 p.m. - Iowa City

Notables: Iowa opened the 2019 season with nine straight victories to tie a program record. The Hawkeyes won a road game at No. 14 NC State and defeated Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, during the nonconference slate, catapulting Iowa into the national rankings for the first time since 2014. The team achieved a No. 19 ranking in the United Soccer Coaches poll (and No. 21 by TopDrawerSoccer), the highest in program history.

Iowa has had four Big Ten weekly honorees. Senior Hannah Drkulec was twice named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week (Aug. 27, Sept. 10) and she was also the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 17, becoming just the third Big Ten athlete to be named an offensive and defensive player of the week in the same season. Senior Claire Graves was also named the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week on Sept. 10.

The Hawkeyes are among the nation's top offenses, ranking fourth in the country with 31 goals through 12 games. Fourteen different players have scored, a figure that is tied for the national lead. Senior Devin Burns leads Iowa with five goals.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Next Event: Oct. 5-13 at ITA All-American - Tulsa, Okla.

Notables: Iowa competed at the Gopher Invite, going 7-7 in singles play and 7-5 in doubles play. Freshman Erika Dodridge won the Draw D championship at the Gopher Invite beating Oumaima Aziz from Iowa State in straight sets, 7-6 (5), 6-3.

Senior Elise van Huevelen Treadwell was recognized in the Oracle Intercollegiate Tennis Association Division I Preseason National rankings at No. 111 her highest career ranking.

VOLLEYBALL

Head Coach: Vicki Brown

Season Record: 7-6 Overall (1-1 B1G)

Next Event: Saturday at #5 Penn State at 6 p.m. - University Park, Pa.

Notables: Vicki Brown was named Iowa's 10th coach in program history on Sept. 26. She is the youngest coach in the Big Ten.

Iowa defeated Northwestern, 3-1, in its Big Ten opener for the team's third-straight Big Ten opening victory.

Junior libero Halle Johnston is second in the Big Ten with 4.79 digs/set and 225 total digs. She looks to become the third straight Hawkeye to lead the Big Ten in total digs and digs per set. (Olsen, 2017; Kelly, 2018)

Sophomore Courtney Buzzerio has stepped up to provide the Hawkeyes much-needed offense. Buzzerio ranks second on the team with 132 kills and is currently sixth in the conference with 18 service aces.
