The meeting was brought to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chair Hollingworth.

# I. Approval of the September 1, 2016, PCA Minutes

Osborn moved to approve the September 1, 2016, minutes. Dillavou seconded. Full approval was granted by Committee members.

### II. Head Coach Introduction - Sasha Schmid, Women's Tennis

Head Women's Tennis Coach Sasha Schmid was a UI student-athlete from 1992-1996 in the sport of tennis. She earned a law degree from the University of Iowa but explained her passion was in coaching. Schmid addressed her career path and family.

Schmid spoke highly of the current tennis team. She defined her team members as dedicated and good citizens. She is impressed with Iowa's tennis facilities and looks forward to beginning their official season in spring 2017.

Questions regarding scholarships, recruiting, and facilities were addressed to Schmid. Chair Hollingworth thanked her for the report and invited her to stay for the remainder of the meeting.

# III. <u>Report on Athletics Department Finances - Mick Walker, Greg Davies</u>

Davies' PowerPoint presentation (copy enclosed) ranked the UI Athletics Department's \$102 million budget eighth among Big Ten peers. He reminded PCA members that Athletics is totally self-supporting and proceeded to explain the differences between revenue and expense figures for 2017 vs. 2016. Davies answered questions relating to Big Ten revenue sharing and numbers of sports at peer institutions. Chair Hollingworth thanked him for the report.

# IV. <u>Report on Athletics Department Facilities - Gene Taylor, Damian Simcox</u>

- A. Simcox asked Head Women's Tennis Coach Schmid to talk about the installation of the PlaySight System at the Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Center. She explained the cutting-edge technology provides a high-level video analysis of matches and assists men's & women's coaching staffs and student-athletes to analyze matches in depth. This new technology also enables matches to be streamed live.
- **B.** Simcox reported on the following facility projects:
  - *1.* Wrestling room improvements made to the strength and conditioning area include a new floor, wall protection, graphics, and strength equipment.
  - 2. Sod was replaced on soccer's competition field.
  - *3.* Tennis locker rooms were upgraded for the men's and women's teams.
  - 4. Heaters are being installed in baseball and softball dugouts.
  - 5. The two grass fields at the outdoor Kenyon Practice Facility were replaced with Field Turf.
  - 6. Distributed Antenna Systems are being installed in Kinnick Stadium and Carver-Hawkeye Arena to enhance technology communication demands.
  - 7. Improvements to Carver-Hawkeye Arena include new court floor, scoreboard, LED lights, and sound system.
  - 8. Installation of LED lights and sprinkler system are underway at the Recreation Building. Upon completion, the indoor banked track will be assembled.
  - 9. The Board of Regents granted permission to hire an architect and design a new clubhouse at Finkbine Golf Course.
  - 10. Refurbishments to the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center were shown to the PCA in a PowerPoint presentation (copy attached) by Simcox. The project is in the design phase.

Simcox answered questions from PCA members. Chair Hollingworth acknowledged him for the update.

*C.* Barta added Athletics staff members are working on a ten-year Athletics facilities plan for the West Campus. Planning is being coordinated with the university's Master Facilities Plan.

Chair Hollingworth announced a thorough review of the PCA Manual will take place over the next few months.

# VI. Athletics Department Searches - PCA Vice Chair Dillavou

# VIII. ISAAC Report - Woods

Woods reported the following on behalf of ISAAC:

- A. ISAAC members established 'Brother-Sister' teams whereby a sports team will attend another team's competition and vice-versa. The paired teams will have opposing competition schedules so attendance will not be a factor. They plan to join forces for community service events too.
- **B.** A future goal is to increase networking efforts with alumni.
- *C.* ISAAC members have a new app entitled "Helper Helper." The app allows student-athletes to more easily track their voluntary community service hours. UI student-athletes currently rank very high in voluntary hours in the Big Ten as well as nationally.

# IX. NCAA Report - Barta, Jantz/Burke, Drake, Grosland

A. Drake noted he and Grosland attended the D1 Faculty Athletics Representatives meetings in Dallas, Texas, in September 2016. They attended presentations on the new NCAA academic misconduct policy and on mental health issues with student-athletes.

The NCAA sports science website has been updated. The site contains information on concussions and now includes a return to classroom policy.

**B.** The Big Ten Joint Group met in Chicago in September 2016. Discussion on student-athlete time demands culminated in a proposal entitled "Flex 21." The proposal will be voted upon at the NCAA Annual Convention in January 2017.


# X. <u>Athletics Director's Report</u>


- *A.* The October sports report and schedules are enclosed. The following report was given by Barta:













































# OCTOBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

#### MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Next Event: Oct. 15 at Pre-Nationals - Terre Haute, Indiana

**Notables:** The No. 12-ranked Hawkeyes won their second race of the season at the Regional Preview on Oct. 1 in dominant fashion. The team claimed the top eight spots without top runners Michael Melchert and Ben Anderson.

The duo of Melchert and Anderson have been the team's top two runners in every meet they have competed in, including a second place finish for Anderson and fourth place finish for Melchert in a victory at the Illinois State Invitational on Sept. 9.

Melchert set a school record in the men's 6,000meters at the Hawkeyes Invitational on Sept. 2.

#### WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Next Event: Oct. 15 at Pre-Nationals - Terre Haute, Indiana

**Notables:** Senior Tess Wilberding has led Iowa in every race this season, earning her first career win in Iowa's season opener at the Hawkeye Invitational on Sept. 2.

#### FIELD HOCKEY

Season Record: 7-5 Overall, 1-3 Big Ten Head Coach: Lisa Cellucci

**Next Event:** Friday vs. Central Michigan - 3 p.m at Grant Field - Iowa City

**Notables:** Senior goalkeeper Alexandra Pecora was named Longstreth/NFHCA Division I Player of the Week on Sept. 14. It marked the first national weekly honor of her career. Pecora, who earned her second career Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week award on Sept. 13, helped the Hawkeyes post wins over Monmouth (4-0) and Kent State (2-0) the previous weekend. Pecora registered back-to-back shutouts recording one save against Monmouth and six against Kent State. She has five shutouts in her career.

Iowa's 11 goals and 39 shots in its 11-0 win over Saint Louis are the second and third most, respectively, by a Big Ten team in a match this season.

Senior Natalie Cafone ranks second in goals (11) and goals per match (0.92) in the Big Ten. Her 11 goals this season gives her 59 career goals, which ranks ninth all-time at Iowa. She is three goals behind former Hawkeye Kelly Flanagan (62) for eighth.

#### FOOTBALL

Season Record: 3-2 Overall, 1-1 Big Ten Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

**Next Event:** Saturday at Minnesota - 11 a.m. at TCF Bank Stadium - Minneapolis, Minnesota

**Notables:** Iowa has posted three wins and two narrow losses in the first five weeks of the season, with the losses coming on a last-second field goal and by a seven-point margin in the most recent outing.

The victories include a 42-3 decision over Iowa State in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game, and a win at Rutgers to open the Big Ten season. With the win in the first-ever meeting with Rutgers, Iowa improved its road winning streak to seven straight games.

All-American defensive back Desmond King has been a leader for the Iowa defense and special teams. King has recorded 23 tackles and leads the team with four pass break-ups. He also ranks among conference and national leaders in both kickoff (29.5 average) and punt (11.4 average) returns.

Junior linebacker Josey Jewell leads the team in tackles with 49, pushing his career total to 226.

Senior QB C.J. Beathard leads the offensive, completing 61.7 percent of his pass attempts for 945 yards and nine touchdowns. Running backs LeShun Daniels, Jr. (69 attempts, 373 yards, 4 TDs) and Akrum Wadley (51-309-6 TDs) have led the rushing attack.

Iowa returns home to host Wisconsin on Oct. 22, and has home game remaining vs. Michigan (Nov. 12) and Nebraska (Nov. 25).

#### MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

**Next Event:** Oct. 10-11 at Paintbrush Intercollegiate – Denver, Colorado

**Notables:** Iowa finished seventh in a 12-team field at the annual Golfweek Conference Challenge at Spirit Hollow Golf Course in Burlington, Iowa. Senior Raymond Knoll was Iowa's top finisher, placing third overall with a 54-hole total of 209 (-7; 69, 71, 69). Sophomore Matthew Walker followed, tying for eighth with a career-best 66 (-6) on the final 18 holes. The sophomore finished with a 54-hole total of 214 (-2; 74, 74, 66).

#### WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: Oct. 17-18 at Greenville Regional Preview - Greenville, North Carolina

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes tied for sixth place in a field of 15 teams at the Red Raider Invitational on Sept. 12-13. Junior Jessica Ip earned a second-place finish with a score of 215 (-1; 71, 74, 70), recording the sixth-lowest individual performance for 54-holes in Iowa history.

Iowa placed 14th at the Golfweek Conference Challenge from Sept. 26-28. Freshman Sophie Liu led the Hawkeyes, carding a 223 (+7; 75, 76, 72) – the Iowest 18-hole and 54-hole score of her collegiate career.

#### SOCCER

Season Record: 7-6 Overall, 1-4 Big Ten Head Coach: Dave Dilanni

**Next Event:** Thursday at Minnesota - 7 p.m. at Elizabeth Lyle Robbie Stadium - Minneapolis, Minn.

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes defeated Purdue, 1-0, in their last contest. Iowa has shutout three teams this season. Senior Bri Toelle leads the team with five goals; junior Karly Stuenkel follows with four. Freshman goalkeeper Claire Graves has made 51 saves and started every match.

#### **MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING**

Season Record: 1-1 Overall, 1-0 Big Ten Head Coach: Marc Long

**Next Event:** Saturday - Intrasquad Meet at 9 a.m. -Campus Recreation & Wellness Center - Iowa City **Notables:** The Iowa men's swimming and diving program opened the 2016-17 season last weekend with an outdoor double dual meet at Michigan State. The Hawkeyes fell to Notre Dame, 151-72, before picking up their first Big Ten dual win of the year in a 130-87 victory over Michigan State.

The Hawkeyes combined for 10 top-three finishes. Sophomore Jack Smith recorded three top-three finishes on the night, including second place finishes in the 100-meter freestyle and as a member of the 400-meter medley relay. He was lowa's top finisher in the 100-meter freestyle.

In the diving well, senior Brandis Heffner notched two top-three finishes, including a first-place finish in the 1-meter, tallying a score of 302.95.

#### WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

Season Record: 1-1 Overall, 1-0 Big Ten Head Coach: Marc Long

**Next Event:** Saturday - Intrasquad Meet at 9 a.m. -Campus Recreation & Wellness Center - Iowa City **Notables:** The Iowa women's swimming and diving program opened the 2016-17 season last weekend with an outdoor double dual meet at Michigan State. The Hawkeyes fell to Notre Dame, 154-69, before picking up their first Big Ten dual win of the year in a 147-76 victory over Michigan State.

Junior Tereysa Lehnertz notched Iowa's lone firstplace finish of the day, clocking in at 2:19.54 in the 200-meter butterfly to beat second-place by four tenths of a second. Lehnertz also led the Hawkeyes to a pair of top-three finishes as a member of the 400meter freestyle relay and 400-meter medley relay.

In the diving well, sophomore Jacintha Thomas led Iowa with a pair of top-three finishes in the diving well, including a first-place finish in the 1-meter. Her third-place score of 283.35 in the 3-meter was a career best.

#### **MEN'S TENNIS**

**Next Event:** Oct. 14-16 at Crusader Invitational - Valparaiso, Indiana

**Notables:** Junior Josh Silverstein was placed in the Qualifying bracket at the ITA All-American tournament. He is the first Hawkeye to skip the Pre-Qualifying bracket since 2002. Sophomore Tony Leto placed first in the Flight C bracket at the Valpo Fall Invitational. Leto and freshman Jason Kerst placed second in the Flight A doubles bracket.

#### WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schimd

**Next Event:** Oct. 13-17 at ITA Central Regionals - Minneapolis, Minnesota

**Notables:** Sophomore Adorabol Huckleby and freshman Elise van Heuvelen both won their respective flights in the Gopher Invite (Sept. 22-25). Huckleby has a 5-2 singles record this fall, while van Heuvelen has a team-best 6-1 singles mark.

#### VOLLEYBALL

Season Record: 12-4 Overall, 2-2 Big Ten

Head Coach: Bond Shymansky

**Next Event:** Friday vs. Purdue – 7 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena/Saturday vs. Indiana – 7 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes improved to 12-4 on the season and 2-2 in Big Ten action with back-to-back Big Ten wins over Maryland (Sept. 28) and Northwestern (Oct. 1) last week. Iowa's 12-4 overall record marks its best start to a season since 1994.

lowa hit a season-high .413 against Northwestern to register its second Big Ten sweep of the season. Three Hawkeyes -- senior Lauren Brobst (14), redshirt freshman Meghan Buzzerio (11), and senior Ashley Mariani (10) -- reached double digits in kills in the victory.

The Hawkeyes are currently tied for sixth in the Big Ten standings. Nine Big Ten teams are ranked in the most recent AVCA Division I Top 25 poll. The Hawkeyes are third in the conference is assists per set (13.27), fourth in hitting percentage (.288) and opponent hitting percentage (.157), and fifth in kills per set (14.10) and total kills (719).
