Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

I. Approval of the October 7, 2021, PCA Minutes

Jamie Cavey Lang moved to approve the October 7, 2021, minutes; Stuart Weinstein seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the Committee.

II. Head Coach Introduction – Sasha Schmid, Tennis

Schmid thanked the committee for having her in attendance.

Schmid started by addressing her passion for the legacy of women's athletics at Iowa. The role she currently holds as the Head Tennis Coach is her dream job and the sense of responsibility she has to promote women's athletics and instill life lessons for her student-athletes.

Schmid discussed HERkys; initiative to support, empower, and engage women in athletics. She spoke of how she began the podcast revolving around HERkys and how her hosting responsibilities came to be.

Schmid addressed the teams season thus far and the momentum they are carrying moving forward. Schmid particularly mentioned student-athlete Alexa Noel, her success prior to Iowa, her recruiting process to Iowa, and how having a player of her caliber has elevated their program.

Weinstein complimented the energy and enthusiasm Schmid exhibits. Gary thanked Schmid for her commitment to HERkys and the podcast. Chair Zaharis thanked Sasha for creating the community with her team, the podcast, and the infectious environment she is creating.

III. Athletics Department Facility Report – Damian Simcox

Damian gave a complete overview of the entire facilities department including event/facilities operations, building maintenance, grounds maintenance, custodial services, facility construction/renovations, and athletic facility master planning.

Damian discussed the facility improvements that were completed under FY21 as well as the facility improvements/projects planned for FY22 and FY23. Attached is the presented PowerPoint.

IV. Chair Report – Zaharis

Chair Zaharis reported on events that are occurring within the athletic department including those directly involving women's athletics; coffee with Barbara, 50th anniversary of Title IX, 50th anniversary of women's athletics at Iowa.

Chair Zaharis recognized Armando Bryson for his accomplishments at the B1G Indoor and Outdoor Championships last season.

VI. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement - Vogan

Subcommittee members met with the the Office of the Registrar to gather insight about the athlete certification process, differences in NCAA and regular audits, and the impact the pandemic has had on academics (removal of SAT/ACT requirement).

Chair Zaharis commented on how effective the athletics department is regarding Vogan's comments.

B. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion - Lang

The subcommittee met with three student-athletes who discussed DEI efforts within their respected teams. The purpose was to highlight efforts and find any inequities.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being - Torner

The subcommittees met with members of ISAAC to discuss the organization and activities the committee partakes in. Torner commented on the committees' efforts in supporting each other, getting engaged, and their focus on mental health at this time.

VII. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report - Gilchrist

- A. ISSAC is working to bring back fuel stops for student-athletes.
- B. The Connecting @ Kinnick event in October had great attendance, student-athletes were able to connect with potential employers.
- C. Gilchrist addressed Gold Games; each team will communicate with ISAAC one specific game they would like to encourage their peers to attend.
- D. In the coming months, ISAAC will be focusing on community engagement. The committee will be participating in thank-a-thon; an event in which teams will write thank you notes to donors. The committee has also selected two families in need during the holidays and will be allocating gifts to present to the families.

Chair Zaharis thanked Allie for her ISAAC presentation.

VIII. NCAA Report - Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Barta spoke on behalf of the group noting at this time there is no new news to report on regarding the transfer portal, NIL, NCAA constitutional convention, or conference movement. More news to come on these matters after NCAA meetings in November and January.


IX. Athletics Director's Report - Barta

NOVEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Next Event: Nov. 12 - NCAA Midwest Regional - Ashton Cross Country Course - Iowa City

Notables: Iowa is currently ranked 13th in the USTFCCCA Midwest Region. The Hawkeyes had a busy month of October, competing three times. Iowa was fifth at the Gans Creek Classic in Columbia, Mo., and fourth at the Bradley Pink Classic in Peoria, Ill. Iowa traveled to University Park, Pa., on October 29 for the Big Ten Championships and finished 11th in the team standings. Sophomore Nick Trattner led the way for the Hawkeyes, finishing 42nd. Trattner has led the Hawkeyes in every race but one this season and has notched four top-10 finishes. Eight different Hawkeyes have scored points this season.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Next Event: Nov. 12 - NCAA Midwest Regional - Ashton Cross Country Course - Iowa City

Notables: The Hawkeyes are currently ranked 10th in the USTFCCCA Midwest Region. Iowa competed three times in the month of October. The Hawkeyes finished third at the Gans Creek Classic in Columbia, Mo., and were runners-up at the Bradley Pink Classic in Peoria, Ill. Iowa traveled to University Park, Pa., on October 29 for the Big Ten Championships and finished 11th in the team standings. A pair of freshmen led the way for the Hawkeyes – Brooke McKee was 52nd and Lauren McMahon finished 58th. Seven different Hawkeyes have scored points this season.

FIELD HOCKEY

Head Coach: Lisa Cellucci

Season Record: 16-1 Overall (7-1 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday vs. Northwestern/Michigan at Big Ten Tournament at 1 p.m. - Piscataway, N.J. (BTN)

Notables: The Hawkeyes won their second Big Ten regular season title in three years (and 16th title) overall after going 7-1 in league play. Iowa was the outright league champion for the first time since 1999.

Iowa won its first 16 games of the season before falling to No. 6 Northwestern, 2-1, in its regular season finale to just miss out on the second undefeated regular season in program history. Iowa heads to Piscataway, N.J., as the top seed for the 2021 Big Ten Tournament.

The Hawkeyes earned a program record eight Big Ten weekly honors during the regular season. Seniors Maddy Murphy and Anthe Nijziel each earned three weekly awards and both athletes were twice named national players of the week.

The Hawkeyes lead the nation in shutouts with 11, the most for the program since 1993 (16). Offensively, Iowa has scored 61 goals with 15 different players finding the back of the cage, including eight goals apiece from Seniors Ellie Holley and Ciara Smith.

FOOTBALL

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Season Record: 6-2 Overall (3-2 Big Ten)

Next Event: Saturday at Northwestern, 6 p.m. (BTN)

Notables: Iowa opened the season with six straight victories, moving as high as No. 2 in the national rankings. The six wins included three victories over ranked opponents. The Hawkeyes most recent victory was a 23-20 come-from-behind win over No. 4 Penn State in Kinnick Stadium.

Most recently, Iowa has dropped consecutive games against Purdue (24-7) and at Wisconsin (27-7). Despite the losses, the Hawkeyes remain in the national rankings, including 16th in the Coaches poll and 19th by the Associated Press.

Five Hawkeye players recently received midseason All-America recognition. That list includes junior center Tyler Linderbaum, who was a first team selection by four media outlets.

Others earning first or second team honors include senior defensive backs Matt Hankins and Riley Moss, junior linebacker Jack Campbell, and sophomore punter Tory Taylor.

Iowa's final two home games of the season include hosting Minnesota Nov. 13 and Illinois Nov. 20.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Notables: Iowa has completed play in its four fall events. The Hawkeyes placed ninth at the Marquette Invitational, 13th at the Gopher Invitational, 10th at the Fighting Irish Classic and tied for ninth at the Williams Cup.

Transfer student Ronan Kleu completed the fall season with a 71.1 stroke average, with two top 10 finishes. Defending Big Ten champion Mac McClear and senior Gonzalo Leal Montero were just behind Kleu with 72.7 stroke averages. Both McClear and Leal Montero had one Top 10 finish.

Kleu has two Top 20 finishes this fall, while McClear and senior Gonzalo Leal Montero each have one. Kleu and McClear are both juniors.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: Jan. 31 at Big Ten Match Play - Palm Harbor, Fla.

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished the fall season with a seventh-place finish at the White Sands Invitational in the Bahamas. Sophomore Klara Wildhaber tallied her first top-20 finish of the season, tying for 17th place with a 221 (+4).

Freshman Paula Miranda had the best finish of the fall for the team, tying for second at the Ron Moore Intercollegiate. Miranda finished with a four-under par 212, which is tied for the second-lowest 54-hole score in school history. She was named the Big Ten Golfer of the Week on Oct. 13. Miranda, who had two top 20 finishes, paced the team with a 73.67 scoring average over 12 fall rounds.

SOCCER

Head Coach: Dave Dilanni

Season Record: 12-5-2 Overall (5-4-1 Big Ten)

Next Event: Thursday at Rutgers at 12:30 p.m. (BTN)

Notables: The Hawkeyes tied for fourth in the Big Ten, their highest finish since 1999.

Iowa opened the conference tournament with a 1-0 at Michigan State. The fifth-seeded Hawkeyes face top-seed Rutgers in the semifinals Thursday at 12:30 p.m. Iowa has won five straight conference tournament games.

Head Coach Dave Dilanni earned his 300th career win on Oct. 21, a 1-0 victory at home over Minnesota. Dilanni has 80 wins in eight seasons at Iowa, tying Ron Rainey for most in program history.

Five Hawkeyes earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors. Senior Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team. Seniors Alyssa Walker and Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team, and senior Riley Whitaker was one of 14 players to earn the conference sportsmanship award.

SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Nathan Mundt

Season Record: 0-3 Overall (0-2 Big Ten)

Next Event: Nov. 18-20 at Georgia Tech Diving Invitational (Atlanta, Ga.); Nov. 18-20 at Miami Invitational (Coral Gables, Fla.)

Notables: The Hawkeyes dropped a 193-59 road dual at Nebraska on Oct. 23. Senior Sam Tamborski won the 1-meter springboard against the Huskers. It was her fourth diving win this season.

Tamborski is one of three Hawkeye divers (Sarah Ballard, Makayla Hughbanks) to post NCAA Zone Diving standards this season.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Next Event: Nov. 4-7 at ITA Fall National Championships (Alexa Noel) // Nov. 12-14 at UNLV Invitational (Team)

Notables: Sophomore Alexa Noel is ranked No. 12 in the ITA Preseason Singles Rankings. Noel qualified for the ITA All-American Championships in October, and advanced to the championship match, where she retired due to injury. She will compete this week at the ITA Fall National Tournament, where she is the first student-athlete in Iowa program history to earn an invitation.

Making her collegiate debut, Barbora Parkona, and senior Samantha Mannix both advanced to the Main Draw Round of 32 at the ITA Regional Championships held in Iowa City, Oct. 21-24. Senior Samantha Gillas defeated two opponents in the qualifying round to advance to the Main Draw. The doubles duo of Mannix/Gillas won two matches in the doubles draw, advancing to the Round of 16.

VOLLEYBALL

Head Coach: Vicki Brown

Season Record: 3-19 Overall (1-11 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday vs. Indiana - Xtream Arena - 7 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeyes took down Michigan State on the road last Friday, 3-1. This was Iowa's first Big Ten win of the season.

Senior outside hitter Courtney Buzzerio leads the team in kills with 314. Buzzerio ranks third in the conference in kills per set (3.97) and total kills (314). Junior libero Mari Hinkle leads with digs (222). Junior setter Bailey Ortega paces the squad with 604 assists.

Iowa has played the eighth toughest schedule in the country (based on opponent win percentage).

The Hawkeyes will finish their 2021 season with four straight home games, followed by four consecutive matches on the road.
