Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

I. Approval of the November 4, 2021, PCA Minutes

Weinstein moved to approve the November 4, 2021, minutes; Grooms seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the Committee.

II. Head Coach Introduction – Rick Heller, Baseball

Chair Zaharis introduced Rick Heller describing his success before arriving at Iowa. Heller gave an overview of the baseball program in the following areas:

- A.** Heller addressed the COVID year, starting with the success the team had before their season came to a halt. He also discussed the many accomplishments the team had this past season coming out of the COVID year.
- B.** The recruiting process for baseball, how his team has benefitted from the transfer portal, and the effect the professional league has on their roster.

- C. Overview of the program addressing coaching staff, scheduling for the upcoming season, and fundraising goals.

The Committee posed questions to Heller regarding the recruiting process and the connection between baseball players transitioning to the professional league and graduation rates.

III. Opening Remarks – President Wilson

President Wilson thanked the Committee for having her attend and thanked PCA members for serving on the Committee.

President Wilson started by highlighting the recent excitement and success of the football program. She recognized the great sense of commitment and collaboration between the Athletics Department and the university, describing Athletics as the corridor to the university.

President Wilson elaborated on the emerging priorities for the university; providing further details on the importance of these priorities, the contingents involved, and the timeframe associated.

Chair Zaharis thanked President Wilson for speaking to the Committee. President Wilson responded, showing her excitement for the upcoming Big Ten Football Championship.

Chair Zaharis had no new information to present to the committee. She thanked everyone for their continued participation.

VI. Subcommittee Updates

- A. **Academic Achievement – Vogan**

The subcommittee met on November 11, 2021. Liz Tovar attended the meeting and presented on student-athlete achievement. Tovar referenced Big Ten academic honors, community service engagement, the Helper Helper app, and mentorship programs to help transition from student-athlete to life after sports.

- B. **Diversity, Equity, Inclusion – Lang**

Lang confirmed the subcommittee has finalized a questionnaire and selected coaches for interview.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being – Torner

The subcommittee met with Lyla Clerry on November 18 to discuss code of conduct policies. Topics discussed include the process of grievances, student-athlete rights and responsibilities, pregnancy policies, FLIGHT programming, social media platforms, and how student-athletes are using their social media platforms for NIL purposes.

VII. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report – Taiwo (represented by Allie Gilchrist)

Gilchrist reported on the following semester-end items and goals:

- A. Upcoming DeStress Fest – combines academic success with health and wellness.
- B. Currently having a Dance Marathon fundraising push.
- C. Partnering with UI Food Pantry to collect donation items for those in need.
- D. Adopt a Family – the Committee is wrapping gifts for the adopted family this evening.
- E. ISAAC is tracking all community engagement activities through the Helper Helper app.
- F. ISAAC is having a social on Wednesday, December 8 to watch the women’s basketball game.

VIII. NCAA Report – Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Barta reported on behalf of the group. Voting will occur regarding the new constitution at the NCAA Convention in January. In the months from January to August, expecting to see significant changes within the Divisions.

IX. Athletic Director’s Report - Barta

Barta noted the following from the enclosed December sports report and schedules:



DECEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 7-0 (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday at #2 Purdue at 8 p.m. - BTN

Notables: For the first time since the 2013-14 season, Iowa has won its first seven games of the season. The Hawkeyes won their first six contests at home by an average of 31.7 points per game. Iowa won its first road game of the season in dramatic fashion, edging Virginia 75-74 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge on Monday night in Charlottesville.

Keegan Murray and Jordan Bohannon led the Hawkeyes during the month of November. Murray is leading the country in scoring, averaging 24.6 points per game. Bohannon, who is averaging 11.4 points per game, has made a team-best 21 3-pointers and became the Big Ten's all-time leader in 3-pointers made on Nov. 18. Murray is one of three Big Ten players since the 2002-03 season with six consecutive 20-point games to start a season. He was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Nov. 22, averaging 26.5 points, 13.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.5 blocks in a pair of convincing victories over N.C. Central and Alabama State. His 27-point/21-rebound performance against N.C. Central is something that has not been done in over four decades by a Hawkeye. Murray is the first Hawkeye to total 25+ points and 20+ rebounds in a game since Bruce King in 1977. Murray is one of four players over the last five decades to post a 20-20 game.

Iowa posted school single-game records in 3-pointers made (20) and attempted (44) against Alabama State on Nov. 18, besting the previous records of 19-of-43 against Savannah State on Dec. 22, 2018. Iowa's 20 3-pointers made equals the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record (20 by Purdue on Jan. 20, 2018).

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 4-0 (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Thursday at Duke at 8 p.m. - B1G/ACC Challenge - ESPN

Notables: Iowa is 4-0 on the season with P. Sue Beckwith, MD, Head Coach Lisa Bluder one win away from reaching her 800th career win. The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 11 in the WBCA Coaches Poll.

Iowa defeated each of its four opponents by at least 20 points this season, seeing a season-high spread against New Hampshire, 93-50, on Nov. 9.

Sophomore Caitlin Clark earned Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll on Nov. 15 after averaging 23.3 points, 7.7 rebounds and 5.7 assists in three games.

The Hawkeyes average 88.3 points per game while holding opponents to 58 points per contest. Iowa is shooting 50.6 percent from field goal range and 86.2 percent from the free-throw line.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Notables: Iowa capped off its season, hosting the NCAA Midwest Regional at the Ashton Cross Country Course in Iowa City on Nov. 12. The Hawkeyes finished 13th in a competitive 28-team field. Iowa was led by senior Noah Healy (31:33.6; 46th) for the second time this season, with freshman Kal Lewis (52nd) and sophomore Nick Trattner (64th) close behind. Freshmen Jack Pendergast (95th) and Ian Geisler (119th) rounded out scoring for the Hawkeyes. Trattner led the Hawkeyes in every race but two this season and notched four top-10 finishes. Eight different Hawkeyes scored points on the season.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Notables: Iowa capped off its season, hosting the NCAA Midwest Regional at the Ashton Cross Country Course in Iowa City on Nov. 12. The Hawkeyes were 14th in a field of 32 teams. In the 6,000-meter race, freshman Lauren McMahan led Iowa — finishing 56th in 21:43.9. The McKee sisters were next in for the Hawkeyes with senior Jessica McKee (58th) finishing seconds before her freshman sister Brooke (62nd). Sophomore Amber Aesoph (102nd) and junior Gabby Skopec (113th) were fourth and fifth in for the Hawkeyes to round out scoring. On the season, eight different Hawkeyes scored points.

FIELD HOCKEY

Head Coach: Lisa Cellucci

Season Record: 17-3 Overall (7-1 Big Ten)

Notables: Iowa won an outright Big Ten regular season title — the first since 1999 — and advanced to the Elite Eight for the 19th time in program history before falling 1-0 to eventual national champion Northwestern.

Senior Anthe Nijziel was named the NFCA West Region Player of the Year (one of five players honored nationally), becoming the third Hawkeye and fourth honoree in school history. Nijziel was also one of six All-Region honorees along with seniors Grace McGuire, Maddy Murphy, and Lokke Stribos and junior Esme Gibson, who were named first-team selections, while senior Ellie Holley was named to the second team. The six honorees were the most for the program since 2008.

Nijziel also was named the Big Ten Co-Player of the Year and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year for a second straight season. She is the third player in Big Ten history (all Hawkeyes) to earn Player of the Year honors twice. Head coach Lisa Cellucci was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year for a third straight year.

Along with Nijziel being a unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection, Murphy was also named to the first team for her fifth career All-Big Ten recognition. McGuire, Stribos and Gibson were second-team All-Big Ten honorees.

FOOTBALL

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Season Record: 10-2 Overall (7-2 Big Ten)

Next Event: Saturday vs. Michigan at 7 p.m. CT - Big Ten Championship Game - Indianapolis, Ind. - FOX

Notables: Iowa won its final four regular season games to post a 7-2 record in conference play, earning the West Division Championship.

In posting a 10-2 overall record, Iowa has been in the national rankings every week of the 2021 season, ranking as high as No. 2 nationally after posting a 6-0 record.

Several Hawkeye players have earned recognition for their play this season. Junior center Tyler Linderbaum was named the Rimington-Pace Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year. He is also a finalist for the Outland Trophy, the Lombardi Trophy and the Rimington Trophy.

Senior defensive back Riley Moss was named the Tatum-Woodson Big Ten Defensive back of the Year. Senior wide receiver and return specialist Charlie Jones was named the Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year.

Those players earning first-team All-Big Ten honors include Linderbaum, Moss, Jones, junior defensive back Dane Belton, and junior linebacker Jack Campbell.

The Hawkeyes will learn their bowl destination on Sunday, Dec. 5.

SOCCER

Head Coach: Dave Dilanni

Season Record: 12-5-2 Overall (5-4-1 Big Ten)

Notables: The Hawkeyes tied for fourth in the Big Ten, their highest finish since 1999.

Head Coach Dave Dilanni earned his 300th career win on Oct. 21, a 1-0 victory at home over Minnesota. Dilanni has 80 wins in eight seasons at Iowa, tying Ron Rainey for most in program history.

Five Hawkeyes earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors. Senior Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team. Seniors Alyssa Walker and Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team, and senior Riley Whitaker was one of 14 players to earn the conference sportsmanship award.

SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Nathan Mundt

Season Record: 0-3 Overall (0-2 Big Ten)

Next Event: Dec. 10 at Iowa State – Ames, Iowa

Notables: The Hawkeyes traveled to Atlanta and Coral Gables, Florida, for a pair of midseason invitationals.

Senior Samantha Tamborski paced the team at the Georgia Tech Invitational, finaling off both the 1-meter and 3-meter springboards. She placed fifth off the 1-meter and sixth off the 3-meter, while sophomore Sarah Ballard also finaled off the 1-meter, placing seventh overall.

VOLLEYBALL

Interim Coaches: Dave Brown and William Tatge

Season Record: 6-24 Overall (4-16 Big Ten)

Notables: Iowa finished its season with four conference wins, including defeating Michigan State, Indiana, Maryland, and Rutgers. Season leaders include senior right side hitter Courtney Buzzerio with 436 kills, junior setter Bailey Ortega with 838 assists, junior libero Mari Hinkle with 336 digs, and senior middle blocker Hannah Clayton with 53.5 blocks.

WRESTLING

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Season Record: 2-0 (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Sunday at #13 Iowa State at 6 p.m. - Ames, Iowa

Notables: Iowa is ranked No. 1 in the country for the 24th consecutive week. The Hawkeyes have won two duals and crowned 15 champions at a combined three open tournaments.

Seven Hawkeyes are ranked in the top five nationally, including top-ranked Spencer Lee at 125 pounds and Alex Marinelli at 165.

The Hawkeyes sold out of season tickets prior to the season. It marked the first time in program history Iowa sold out of season tickets. The Hawkeyes are on likely to lead the country in attendance for the 15th season in a row.
