

Notes of the Presidential Committee on Athletics

Big Ten/Iowa Room, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

February 3, 2022

Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:02 p.m.

I. Approval of the December 2, 2021, PCA Minutes

Liz Hollingworth moved to approve the December 2, 2021, minutes; Hand seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the Committee.

Chair Zaharis introduced Moran to the Committee and asked members of the Committee to re-introduce themselves.

II. Head Coach Introduction – Lisa Cellucci, Field Hockey

Chair Zaharis introduced Lisa Cellucci, noting that Coach Cellucci is the only coach named Big Ten Coach of the Year three seasons in a row. Zaharis also acknowledged Cellucci's prior success.

Cellucci thanked everyone for having her speak to the Committee. She began by referencing her upbringing and what led her to come to the University of Iowa as a student-athlete, as well as her progression through coaching positions to become the Head Coach and remain at Iowa for 27 years.

Cellucci discussed this past season, recognizing the high expectations set forth for the team this season based on past success. Cellucci addressed their rankings, victories,

athletics community support, conference regular-season title, and ultimately the highly competitive conference, with the team making it to the Elite Eight.

Cellucci opened the floor to questions, including inquiries regarding recruiting, the number of internationals she recruits to Iowa, and adjustments international student-athletes have to make. Cellucci stated there aren't club teams in the state, which correlates to branching out and recruiting in multiple states and countries.

Barta concluded by acknowledging Cellucci's success not only as a coach but as a student-athlete at Iowa.

III. Mental Health – Aubrette Kinne

Barta introduced Kinne, commenting on the Athletics Department's commitment to supporting the Sport Psychology Services, and noted the hiring of a Director of Mental Health position is in progress. Barta also addressed the transition from these employees being Athletics Department staff to hospital employees and thanked Kinne for being on the front line throughout these years.

Kinne started by speaking to her passion for mental health and primarily helping Iowa's student-athletes. She addressed that mental health is brain health and that reducing the stigma associated with mental health is a huge need and task.

Kinne spoke on the expansion of staff this year to meet the needs of the student-athletes. The staff's work consists of individual treatment, clinical, consulting services, performance enhancement, etc. The demand is consistently high from student-athlete, averaging roughly 200 student-athletes a year for services.

For the remainder of the time Kinne discussed COVID; the effect mentally and physically COVID had on their department and Iowa student-athletes.

Questions were brought up regarding the category of patients and eating disorders. Kinne addressed these questions, noting at this time counselors are only seeing student-athletes as patients, not staff. She also mentioned that eating disorders are prevalent in both men and women.

Kinne concluded by mentioning that she is blessed to be able to serve the Hawkeye student-athletes. Chair Zaharis thanked Kinne for presenting to the Committee.

IV. Chair Report – Zaharis

Chair Zaharis reported on the following items:

- A. The wonderful opportunity to represent the PCA Committee at the Citrus Bowl game in Orlando.

- B. Presenting on behalf of the PCA at faculty council.
- C. HERkys Hawk Walk will be held on Saturday, May 7, 2022. This event is in celebration of 50 years of Title IX.
- D. David Fisher Senior Banquet for student-athletes will take place on Monday, April 11, 2022. This is a networking opportunity for student-athlete and working professionals.

V. Athletics Department Searches – Grooms

- A. There are two current searches in progress:
 - 1. Associate or Assistant Women’s Wrestling Coach
 - 2. Assistant Track and Field Coach

Grooms thanked the Committee for their participation in these and past searches.

VI. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement – Vogan

The subcommittee met on December 9, 2021; two guests were brought to this meeting. The first spoke on the Hawks to Professional (H2P) program, job shadowing, and creating new spaces for student-athletes to access. The second guest spoke on student support resources and retention.

B. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion – Lang

The subcommittee meeting was canceled due to COVID precautions. Chair Zaharis is in the process of meeting with coaches during this time.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being – Torner/Voss

The subcommittee is in the process of transitioning the chair responsibilities to Voss for the spring. The subcommittee met and discussed the code of conduct; moving forward this spring members are planning to meet with the Registrar and visit the new Soccer Complex Facility.

VII. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report – Taiwo (represented by Harper Dunne)

Dunne reported on the following goals for the semester:

- A. Dance Marathon will be hosted virtually. Presently, ISAAC has raised \$3,000 to contribute.

- B.** Student-athletes can participate in engagement opportunities through the Helper Helper application.
- C.** DEI initiative for ISAAC has led to the creation of affinity groups. The following affinity groups have been created for student-athletes; HERky's, iHawks, HawkeyePRIDE, and the Black Student-Athlete Alliance.
- D.** Golden Herkys will take place on May 2, 2022, in Hancher Auditorium.
- E.** Student-Athletes have the opportunity to attend financial literacy sessions hosted by Empower3d in the coming weeks.

Lastly, Dunne reported on each of the six ISAAC Subcommittees and provided their goals for the semester.

Chair Zaharis thanked ISAAC for how much work they do outside of their sport and academic responsibilities.

VIII. NCAA Report – Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Barta reported on behalf of the group.

Barta discussed the NCAA Constitutional Convention hosted on January 20, 2022. Barta went into further detail on Division I athletics and how it is consistently changing and evolving, referencing NIL, the transfer portal, and Educationally Related Benefits. With a two-thirds vote, the constitution was amended, allowing the ability for the three divisions to have autonomy. Moving forward, updates will come from the Division I Transformation Committee, which was formed as a result of the January 20 meetings.

IX. Athletic Director's Report – Barta

Barta noted the following from the enclosed February sports report and schedules.

Barta spoke on the loss of Christine Grant; he highlighted her career and how she brought women's athletics to Iowa. A celebration of life will be coming in the spring and fall for her.


Barta highlighted the winter sports currently in season. The Iowa vs Penn State wrestling dual was the largest BTN viewed wrestling event, the Brands Brother documentary following the dual had over 200,000 views that night. Women's basketball then followed with the largest BTN viewed women's basketball game. Women's gymnastics hosts its final home event tomorrow night and is currently ranked #16 in the country. Women's wrestling signed its first-ever wrestler to a National Letter of Intent this week. Lastly,

Barta spoke briefly on finances, addressing the \$43M deficit during COVID restrictions and the \$50M borrow from the university that the Athletics Department will have 15 years to pay back.

X. Adjourn

Chair Zaharis thanked the Committee for attending and participating. She informed the group that the next meeting will take place on a Tuesday afternoon due to Big Ten Basketball Tournaments.

FEBRUARY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 14-7 (4-6 Big Ten)

Next Event: Thursday at #16 Ohio State at 7 p.m. – FS1

Notables: Iowa has won seven of its last 11 contests. Five of the Hawkeyes' seven losses have come to teams ranked in the AP Top 25, with another coming in double overtime at Penn State on Monday.

Iowa ranks No. 24 in the NCAA NET Ranking. The Hawkeyes have one Quad 1 and three Quad 2 victories on their resume.

Iowa is led by sophomore forward Keegan Murray, who is a three-time Big Ten Player of the Week and selected to the Wooden Award Late-Season Top 20 List. Murray is fifth in the country in points per game (22.3); 39th in field goal percentage (.551); 45th in blocks per contest (2.05); and 57th in free throws made.

Iowa has been making the most of its trips to the foul line. The Hawkeyes are shooting 77 percent from the foul line, which is tops in the Big Ten and 24th nationally. The 330 free throw makes are 15th most in the NCAA. Iowa made 17 straight free throws in its 10-point loss to No. 6 Purdue on Jan. 27.

Redshirt seniors Jordan Bohannon (112) and Connor McCaffery (93) rank second and fifth, respectively, in most career wins among active Big Ten players.

Four of Iowa's next six games will be played at home.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 14-5 (8-2 Big Ten)

Next Event: Thursday at Wisconsin at 6:30 p.m. - B1G+

Notables: Iowa leads the country in field-goal percentage (.496) and free-throw percentage (.846), while ranking in the top-20 in seven additional categories, including third in scoring offense (84.2), fifth in assists per game (19.7), seventh in defensive rebounds per game (30.7), 10th in total assists (374) and assist turnover ratio (1.28), 14th in scoring margin (16.1) and 20th in free throws made (286).

Sophomore Caitlin Clark has registered four triple-doubles this season and leads the country in most career triple-doubles by an active player with five. Clark joins the likes of Kobe Bryant, LeBron James, Russell Westbrook, James Hardin, Luka Dončić and Giannis Antetokounmpo as the only NBA, WNBA, Division I men's and women's basketball to record back-to-back 30-point triple doubles since 2000. She is one of 10 women's basketball players (15 times) to register back-to-back triple doubles in their careers -- the only to do so with 30-plus points in the pair, registering 35 points, 13 rebounds and 11 assists at

Minnesota (Jan. 20) and 31 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists against Nebraska (Jan. 16). The Des Moines, Iowa, native is the first Big Ten women's basketball player to register consecutive triple-doubles and four triple doubles in one season.

Clark earned four-consecutive Big Ten Player of the Week Awards and one Honor Roll Honor in the month of January. She also named Naismith National Player of the Week on Jan. 25 and USBWA Player of the Week on Jan. 18.

In January, Clark averaged 30.4 points, 7.7 rebounds and 9.1 assists – the only basketball player (male or female) to record that stat line in a month since Michael Jordan in 1989.

Clark, junior McKenna Warnock, senior Monika Czinano and freshman Addison O'Grady have each tallied double-doubles this season. Clark has tallied 10 on the season, including a Big Ten record four triple-doubles, while Warnock has registered two and Czinano and O'Grady have recorded one apiece.

FOOTBALL

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Season Record: 10-4 Overall (7-2 Big Ten)

Notables: Iowa finished the season with games against Michigan in the Big Ten Championship Game and Kentucky in the Vrbo Citrus Bowl.

Iowa was in the national rankings every week of the 2021 season, ranking as high as No. 2 nationally after posting a 6-0 record to start the season.

The Hawkeyes completed the season ranked 23rd in the nation by both the Associated Press and in the coaches poll. It marks the fourth straight season the Hawkeyes have ended the year in the Top 25 rankings.

Several Hawkeye players earned recognition for their play this season. Junior center Tyler Linderbaum was named the Rimington-Pace Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year. Linderbaum also became the first Iowa player to win the Rimington Trophy, which is presented annually to the best center in the nation.

Linderbaum became the 12th Iowa player to earn unanimous consensus All-America recognition. In addition, defensive backs Matt Hankins and Riley Moss, linebacker Jack Campbell, and kicker Caleb Shudak, each earned All-America recognition.

Offensive lineman Connor Colby and defensive lineman Lukas Van Ness were both named Freshman All-America by the Football Writers Association of America.

In addition to the recognition for their play on the field, 40 members of the football program earned Academic All-Big Ten honors during the fall semester.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: Feb. 13-15 at Tulane Classic - New Orleans, La.

Notables: The Hawkeyes went 1-2 during Big Ten Match Play competition in Palm Harbor, Fla., downing No. 2 seed Indiana on the final day of action. Freshman Paula Miranda, sophomore Klara Wildhaber, junior Lea Zeitler and junior Morgan Goldstein each tallied victories during the weekend.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Season Record: 5-1 (2-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday vs. Penn State - 6:30 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeyes posted three event season bests and won three event titles and the all-around in its win over Nebraska on Jan. 29. Iowa finished with a season-high 196.825, tying the fifth-best score in program history. Iowa is ranked 16th in the Road to Nationals on Jan. 31.

Junior JerQuavia Henderson won the all-around against the Huskers, finishing with a career-high score of 39.475. She shared two event titles, tying for first on vault with a 9.900 and first on floor with a 9.925, while finishing second on beam with a 9.850.

Iowa has earned two Big Ten weekly honors this season. Henderson was named the Gymnast of the Week on Jan. 10, while Marissa Rojas was tabbed as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Jan. 25.

Friday's meet against Penn State is the home finale and Senior Night.

SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Nathan Mundt

Season Record: 0-7 Overall (0-5 Big Ten)

Next Event: Feb. 16-19 at Big Ten Championships – Madison, Wis.

Notables: The Hawkeyes closed out the regular season with a tri-meet in Minneapolis. Iowa fell to Minnesota, 299-41, and Northwestern, 295-42. The team finished the weekend with nine season-best times

TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Season Record: 3-1 (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday at Kansas at 5 p.m., Sunday at Kansas State at Noon

Notables: The Hawkeyes are coming off the ITA Kickoff Weekend event where they recorded their first ITA Kickoff victory since a 4-2 win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Feb. 1, 2010, in Waco, Texas.

Freshman Marisa Schmidt bounced Mississippi State's Emmanouela Antonaki, ranked No. 50 in the country, in straight sets (6-3, 6-4) at Jan. 28 at the ITA Kickoff in Georgia.

Sophomore Alexa Noel is ranked No. 3 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's national ranking, which is the highest individual ranking in program history.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at Meyo Invite (South Bend, Ind.) and Frank Sevigne Husker Invite (Lincoln, Neb.)

Notables: The Hawkeye men opened the season ranked No. 9 in the inaugural USTFCCA Track & Field Rating Index on Jan. 24, tying the highest-ranking to begin a season in program history (2021). Iowa is currently ranked No. 10. Additionally, four Iowa school records have been broken by the men so far this season (Tyler Lienau; weight throw, Austin West; heptathlon, Jenoa McKiver; 600 meters, Kalen Walker; 60 meters).

The men's team has five event groups ranked in their respective top-10. The 400-meter group is ranked second in the NCAA and is led by standout freshman Jenoa McKiver and returning All-American Wayne Lawrence, Jr. McKiver currently leads the Big Ten in three events. The freshman has the fastest 400-meter time (45.78), fastest 600-meter time (1:16.08) and has ran the fastest split on an Iowa 4x400-meter relay this season (45.12). The men's 4x400-meter relay of junior Julien Gillum, sophomore Spencer Gudel, Lawrence, Jr. and McKiver is currently seventh-fastest in the NCAA (3:05.68) and leads the Big Ten.

The Hawkeye men also rank third in the NCAA in both the 60-meter hurdles and the weight throw. Iowa has four hurdlers currently ranked in the NCAA's top-50, led by sophomore Grant Conway (12th). Senior Tyler Lienau ranks second in the Big Ten and No. 13 in the country in the weight throw to lead the men's throws. Sophomore Austin West's 5,832-point total is currently the fourth-most in the NCAA. Also ranking in the top-10 in the country is the 800-meter group (No. 5) and the shot put group (No. 6).

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at Meyo Invite (South Bend, Ind.) and Frank Sevigne Husker Invite (Lincoln, Neb.)

Notables: The Hawkeye women are currently ranked third in the Midwest Region in the USTFCCA Track & Field Rating Index. Sophomore LaSarah Hargrove broke the Iowa 60-meter school record (7.31) at the Larry Wieczorek Invitational on Jan. 22. She earned Big Ten Women's track Athlete of the Week honor for her performance on Dec. 15. Hargrove's time is second-fastest in the Big Ten and No. 20 in the NCAA.

The Hawkeye women currently have four event groups ranked in their respective top-10. Both throws events rank third in the NCAA, and the 400-meter group and the 60-meter hurdle group are both currently ranked No. 10. The 800-meter group checks in at No. 12 in the country.

The throws are led by senior Nia Britt, who won the weight throw at the Razorback Invitational on Jan. 28 and moved to second on Iowa's all-time list (20.68m/67'10.25"). Britt already ranked second on Iowa's all-time shot put list. Three other Hawkeyes have also thrown top-10 all-time program marks this season in the weight throw (2. Amanda Howe (20.67m/67'9.75"), 4. Jamie Kofron (19.39m/63'7.5"), 9. Alivia Bauer (18.11m/59'5"). Sophomore Kat Moody recorded the third-best shot put in Iowa History at the Hawkeye Invitational on Jan. 15.

The 60-meter hurdle squad is led by sophomore Myreanna Bebe. Bebe moved to third all-time at Iowa in the event (8.26) at the Razorback Invitational on Jan. 29. That time is currently second-fastest in the Big Ten this season and No. 26 in the NCAA. Sophomore Tionna Tobias also broke into the top-10 in program history (8.44) with her performance at the Wieczorek Invitational and also leads the Big Ten in the long jump (6.13m).

The 400-meter group is led by 4x400-meter relay members junior Mariel Bruxvoort, senior Payton Wensel, and freshmen Jaiden Itson and Tesa Roberts. The quartet's time (3:35.90) is currently ninth-fastest in the NCAA and fourth all-time at Iowa.

WRESTLING

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Season Record: 11-1 Overall (1-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Saturday vs. #9 Wisconsin at 2:30 p.m. - Carver-Hawkeye Arena

Notables: Iowa is ranked No. 2 in the country and has 10 wrestlers ranked in the top 20 and six in the top five.

The Jan. 28 dual between top-ranked Penn State and No. 2 Iowa at Carver-Hawkeye Arena averaged 363,000 viewers, making it the most-watched wrestling broadcast in Big Ten Network history. The previous record was 343,000 viewers, also set by Penn State vs. Iowa in January of 2020.

Iowa wrestles at the Bout at the Ballpark in Arlington, Texas on Feb. 12. The Hawkeyes will wrestle No. 10 Oklahoma State at Globe Life Field, home of MLB's Texas Rangers.

The Hawkeyes sold out of season tickets prior to the season. It marked the first time in program history Iowa sold out of season tickets. The Hawkeyes are on likely to lead the country in attendance for the 15th season in a row.
