Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:02 pm.

I. Approval of the February 3, 2022, PCA Minutes

Jim Torner moved to approve the February 3, 2022, minutes; Jamie Cavey Lang seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the Committee.

II. Head Coach Introduction – Jeff Garbett, Rowing

Chair Zaharis introduced Jeff Garbett, acknowledging his previous stint at Iowa as an assistant coach and returning as the current head coach.

Garbett started by discussing his childhood, growing up in a rowing family, his collegiate career, his brief coaching career at Miami, what brought him to Iowa initially, and his return as the head coach. He highlighted how the people and student-athletes at Iowa were a draw in coming back to take this new role.

Garbett went into detail on the recruiting process, the philosophy of the program, the growth he has seen with the student-athletes since he returned to the program, and the joy of getting to work with and empower women at Iowa.

Lastly, Garbett spoke about the upcoming season and travel, upcoming clinics, and he welcomed the Committee to the boathouse.

Chair Zaharis thanked Garbutt for presenting to the Committee.

III. Compliance – Lyla Clerry

Clerry started by discussing her career before Iowa and transitioned into her current role at Iowa. Clerry discussed her compliance staff along with their responsibilities and sports assignments.

Clerry discussed the enclosed PowerPoint, including an overview of the compliance department, its reporting lines, and the mission of the department. Clerry opened the floor to any questions from the Committee. Questions were asked regarding NIL, software used to help with monitoring, and enforcement of any violations.

IV. Chair Report – Zaharis

Chair Zaharis reported on the following items:

- A.** The recent success in the track and field program, claiming the Big Ten Indoor Championship. Bryson was in attendance and spoke on the team's success.

Bryson spoke on the Speak Your Truth (S.Y.T) committee, an independent organization solely consisting of male and female track and field student-athlete with a diverse set of identities, working towards a more inclusive campus. Bryson focused on an upcoming open forum Zoom S.Y.T will be hosting, centering around how students can create a better culture for their peers. Chair Zaharis stated she would send the Zoom link to the Committee in case they'd like to join.

- B.** Spoke of how impressed she is with the Athletics Department's collaboration, comradery, and dedication to the "Win. Graduate. Do It Right" value statement.
- C.** Introduced Lew Montgomery as the Interim Associate Athletics Director for DEI.
- D.** Congratulated Steve Roe on his recent induction into the CoSIDA Hall of Fame.

V. Athletics Department Searches – Grooms

VI. Subcommittee Updates

A. Academic Achievement – Vogan

No report was presented.

B. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion – Lang

Lang discussed the departure of Broderick Binns from the subcommittee and introduced Lew Montgomery as his replacement. The subcommittee invited faculty member Packy Moran to a meeting. The current focus is coordinating head coach meetings and interviews.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being – Torner/Voss

The subcommittee met with the registrar and was given a presentation on how to track eligibility and transfers. They learned about the audit process and how student-athletes are educated on these processes. Lastly, they discussed how COVID has impacted transferring and eligibility.

VII. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report – Taiwo (represented by Harper Dunne)

No ISAAC report was presented.

VIII. NCAA Report – Barta, Burke, Grosland, Hollingworth

Barta reported on behalf of the group.

Barta reported on the Big Ten Joint Council meetings, the most notable item was the vote to extend the Big Ten Football Championship game in Indianapolis to 2024, the vote on men's and women's basketball championship locations will continue. Regarding the NCAA, conversations were had on standardized testing scores, drug testing levels, and the transformation committee.

IX. Athletic Director's Report – Barta

Barta noted the following items:

- A. From the enclosed March sports report and schedules, Barta highlighted the men's track and field team capturing the Men's Track and Field Big Ten Championship, as well as the women's basketball team clinching the Regular Season Championship for the first time since 2008. Iowa has now won nine Big Ten Championships in a two-year span. Barta congratulated the student-athletes, coaches, and fans. He thanked the staff working behind the scenes who attribute to this success.

- B.** The Iowa Wrestling Training Facility was approved by the Board of Regents this past month.
- C.** The Director of Mental Health position, understanding the need for growth and the commitment the Athletics Department has to this area.
- D.** The loss of a great Hawkeye with the passing of Henry B. Tippie.
- E.** Introduction of Lew Montgomery and his position as the Interim Associate Athletic Director for DEI. His past roles and time at Iowa as a football student-athlete were mentioned.


Lew thanked the Committee; he described the work of DEI on both athletics and the university, and we can approach this work as well as what we can improve.

FEBRUARY REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

BASEBALL

Head Coach: Rick Heller

Season Record: 4-2 Overall (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Tuesday vs. Loras College at 4:05 p.m., Iowa City, Iowa - B1G+

Notables: The Hawkeyes are 4-2 overall after going 3-0 at the Swig & Swine Classic in Charleston, S.C., and 1-2 at the Kleberg Bank Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas.

Iowa's pitching staff has been exceptional, posting a 2.15 ERA over the first six games. The Hawkeyes have allowed six hits or fewer in every game and have 84 strikeouts and a .112 batting average against. Redshirt sophomore Adam Mazur, who was the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 23, is 2-0 with a 0.66 ERA with 18 strikeouts to two walks.

Offensively, Iowa is hitting .270 over the first two weeks and averaging 6.2 runs per game. Redshirt freshman Keaton Anthony, who was the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Feb. 23, is leading the team with a .421 average with two doubles, two home runs and six RBIs. Redshirt sophomore Peyton Williams has a pair of four-hit games, and is hitting .417 with five RBIs.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 20-8 Overall (10-7 Big Ten)

Next Event: Thursday at Michigan - 7 p.m. - FS1

Notables: Iowa has won six of its last seven games to secure its fourth straight 20 win season under Fran McCaffery. The Hawkeyes are 10-7 in Big Ten play, standing in fifth place prior to a Monday night home contest against Northwestern.

Iowa has moved into the national rankings, breaking in at No. 25 a week ago, and likely improving that ranking this week after wins over Michigan State and Nebraska.

The Hawkeyes have used a high-scoring offense and improved defense for their recent success. Iowa continues to lead the Big Ten in scoring offense, and also ranks among the national leaders in scoring offense, turnover margin and fewest turnovers per game.

Sophomore Keegan Murray continues to lead Iowa's offense and rebounding, averaging 23.2 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. Others scoring in double figures include Patrick McCaffery and Jordan Bohannon, each averaging 10.7 points per game.

The Hawkeyes closed out the home season Monday, honoring Connor McCaffery, Jordan Bohannon and Austin Ash as part of Senior Day.

Iowa closes the regular season with road games this week at Michigan Thursday and Illinois on Sunday.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 20-7 Overall (14-4 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday vs. Northwestern or Minnesota at 5:30 p.m. at Big Ten Tournament - Indianapolis, Ind. - BTN

Notables: Iowa was crowned Co-Big Ten Regular Season Champions on Sunday after defeating No. 6/5 Michigan in dominant fashion.

Sophomore Caitlin Clark earned Big Ten Player of the Week on Feb. 7 and Feb. 28, tallying 31 career Big Ten honors.

The Hawkeyes lead the country in field goal percentage (50.5) and free-throw percentage (84.6), while ranking second in scoring offense (85.4), third in assists per game (19.4) and fifth in total assists (524).

Clark leads the nation in total assists (225), assists per game (8.3), total points (743), free throws made (174), points per game (27.5) and triple-doubles (5), while ranking in the top-25 in nine additional statistical categories. She was named to the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year Late Season Watch List, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Feb. 8.

Senior Monika Czinano was named to the Lisa Leslie Center of the Year Top-10 Watch List, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced Feb. 11.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: March 7-8 Wake Forest Invitational - Pinehurst, N.C.

Notables: The Hawkeyes placed third at the Big Ten Match Play Championships (Feb. 4-5) and 10th at the Puerto Rico Classic (Feb. 13-15).

Iowa entered Big Ten Match Play as the seven-seed before defeating Minnesota (4-1), two-seed Northwestern (3-2), and one-seed Purdue (2.5-2.5) on tie-breaking criteria. Iowa fell in the third round to Michigan State (4-1). Juniors Mac McClear and Garrett Tighe finished with team-best 3-1 individual records at the event, and all five Hawkeyes competing won at least one match.

McClear led the way for Iowa at the Puerto Rico Classic with a tie for ninth place, finishing with a 54-hole score of 203 (-13). He registered a final round of 64, matching the third-lowest 18-hole score in program history. McClear's round matched the low round at the event, and his 20 birdies tied Georgia's 15th-ranked Trent Philips for the second most in the field. Senior Gonzalo Leal Montero also secured a top-25 finish, tying for 22nd with an 8-under par 208.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: March 27-28 at Chattanooga Classic, Chattanooga, Tenn.

Notables: The Hawkeyes competed in two tournaments in February, placing 13th at the Tulane Classic (Feb. 13-15) and 14th at the Westbrook Invite in Peoria, Ariz. Today.

Freshman Paula Miranda led the team at both events, placing 30th at the Tulane Classic and 23rd at the Westbrook Invite.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Season Record: 10-5 overall (4-4 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday at Iowa State, 6:30 p.m.

Notables: The Hawkeyes posted a 196.375 score in their most recent meet – a road contest at No. 8 Minnesota. Iowa had six gymnasts either tie or set season bests with five placing in the top three in four events.

Iowa is ranked 19th in the Road to Nationals rankings with a 196.325 national qualifying score. The team is tied for seventh nationally on floor, 16th on beam, 17th on vault and 35th on bars. Two gymnasts – senior Lauren Guerin and junior JerQuavia Henderson – are tied for eighth nationally on floor.

SOFTBALL

Head Coach: Renee Gillespie

Season Record: 9-4 Overall (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday-Sunday at Blues City Classic - Memphis, Tenn.

Notables: The Hawkeyes have started the 2022 season, 9-4, and have had a positive record at every tournament they have attended.

Two Hawkeyes are batting over .400 (juniors Nia Carter and Sophia Maras). Six Hawkeyes have at least 5 RBIs and Iowa has scored 56 runs in 13 games.

Sophomore Denali Loecker has a 6-0 record in the circle with a 1.27 ERA. Sophomore Grace Banes and freshman Tristin Doster were named to the 2022 Northern Lights/Southern Nights Invitational All-Tournament Team.

The win against Cornell on Sunday was head coach Renee Gillispie's 900th career win. Gillispie ranks 19th among active coaches in D1 and 38th all-time.

SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Nathan Mundt

Season Record: 0-7 Overall (0-5 Big Ten)

Next Event: March 5-9 at NCAA Zone D Diving Championships - Madison, Wis.

Notables: The Hawkeyes placed 12th at the Big Ten Championships, scoring 165 points. Junior Alexandra Olesiak and sophomore Sarah Ballard both "finaled" in the 100 breast and 3-meter, respectively.

TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Season Record: 4-4 Overall (0-0 Big Ten)

Next Event: Friday at Kansas State at 12 p.m; Monday vs. Minnesota at Noon

Notables: The Hawkeyes travel to Manhattan, Kan., for a makeup date on Friday before returning home to host Minnesota in the Big Ten Conference opener.

The Hawkeyes are playing without sophomore Alexa Noel, who is ranked No. 3 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's national ranking, which is the highest individual ranking in program history.

Freshman Marisa Schmidt has stepped into the No. 1 singles position. Schmidt has one win over a top 50 player and has climbed as high as No. 118 in the national rankings.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: March 11-12 at NCAA Indoor Championships - Birmingham, Ala.

Notables: The Hawkeyes successfully defended their Big Ten Indoor title on Saturday at the SPIRE Institute in Geneva, Ohio.

Iowa tallied two Big Ten Champions (Jenoah McKiver; 600m, men's 4x400-meter relay) and eight additional medalists. McKiver claimed the first Big Ten title of his career, winning the 600 meters in 1:15.67. He doubled back to run the anchor leg on the 4x400-meter relay, consisting of freshman Everett Steward, junior Julien Gillum, freshman Armando Bryson and McKiver and helping the Hawkeyes to their second Big Ten title of the day.

Sophomore Austin West was runner-up in the heptathlon, junior James Carter, Jr. was runner-up in the long jump and sophomore Grant Conway took runner-up in the 60-meter hurdles. Sophomore Gratt Reed took bronze in the hurdles, sophomore Kalen Walker was third in the 60 meters, and senior Nik Curtiss was third in the shot put. Junior Julien Gillum was third in the 600 meters behind McKiver, and junior Wayne Lawrence, Jr. won his ninth career Big Ten medal with a third-place finish in the 400 meters.

The Hawkeyes advanced nine individuals and the 4x400-meter relay to the NCAA Championships in Birmingham, Alabama. The complete list of qualifiers is: 4x400-meter relay; 400 meters - Jenoah McKiver, Chadrick Richards, Wayne Lawrence, Jr.; Heptathlon - Austin West; Weight Throw - Tyler Lienau; Shot Put - Nik Curtiss; 60-meter Hurdles - Grant Conway, Gratt Reed; and 60 Meters - Kalen Walker.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: March 11-12 at NCAA Indoor Championships - Birmingham, Ala.

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished sixth at the Big Ten Championships on Saturday (Feb. 26) at the SPIRE Institute in Geneva, Ohio.

The 4x400-meter relay of junior Mariel Bruxvoort, seniors Payton Wensel and Mallory King and freshman Tesa Roberts took bronze and qualified for the NCAA Championships in Birmingham, Alabama.

Sophomore LaSarah Hargrove earned two medals. Hargrove was the runner up in the 200 meters (23.55) and took third in the 60 meters (7.35).

WRESTLING

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Season Record: 14-1 Overall (7-1 Big Ten)

Next Event: Saturday and Sunday at Big Ten Championships - Lincoln, Neb.

Notables: Iowa is ranked No. 2 in the country and enters the Big Ten Championships as the two-time defending Big Ten champions.

Defending Big Ten champions Jaydin Eierman and Alex Marinelli are two of five Hawkeyes entering the tournament as the No. 2 seed. Eierman is No. 2 at 141 pounds and Marinelli is second at 165. They're joined on the No. 2 line by Austin DeSanto (133), Kaleb Young (157) and Tony Cassioppi (285).

Defending conference tournament champion Michael Kemerer (174) is one of three Hawkeyes seeded fourth. He's joined by Max Murin at 149 and Jacob Warner at 197. All eight wrestlers seeded fourth or better return to a postseason lineup that won the Big Ten and NCAA team titles in 2021.

The Big Ten Championships is one of seven NCAA qualifying tournaments across the country. The NCAA has awarded the conference 88 of the 287 automatic qualifying bids for the national championships in Detroit on March 17-19. The national tournament field will be announced March 9.
