Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:02 pm.

**I. Approval of the February 3, 2022, PCA Minutes**

Liz Hollingworth moved to approve the March 1, 2022, minutes; Jim Torner seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the Committee.

Chair Zaharis introduced Paul Hanley to the Committee, Hanley joined the Committee in January of 2022.

**II. Head Coach Introduction – Clarissa Chun**

Chair Zaharis welcome Chun to her first PCA meeting, acknowledging her success prior to Iowa including her experience with USA Wrestling and her upcoming induction into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in June 2022.

Chun thanked the Committee for having her attend, she addressed her current commitments to the program and the timeline of the start of the program. Burke addressed the process of hiring for future assistant and director of operation positions.

Chun answered questions regarding collegiate coaching and the international piece of wrestling. She addressed the difference in rules between men's and women's wrestling along with the separation of aspirations recruits being brought to Iowa have, not just collegiate titles being chased, but world titles as well.

**III. HERkys – Jayne Oswald**

Oswald thanked the Committee for having her present on HERkys. Oswald started by showing the Committee the HERkys website, where all things HERkys are housed. Oswald went into detail on all things HERkys: the pillars, podcast, tribute to Dr. Cristine Grant, and upcoming events. Oswald primarily addressed two upcoming milestones: the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Title IX and the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of women's athletics at Iowa.

**IV. Hiring Report – Jennifer Modestou**

Enclosed is the PowerPoint slide deck presented by Modestou entitled "UI athletics Hiring Activity Report: FY 2019-FY2021". Modestou's report covered topics on P&S search policies and procedures, demographics data for applicants, recruitment activity and trends, the representation of women and people of color, and lastly best practices for diversity, equity, and inclusion in the workplace.

At the conclusion of Modestou's presentation, she opened the floor to questions. Chair Zaharis thanked Modestou for her presentation to the Committee.

**V. Chair Report – Zaharis**

Chair Zaharis reported on the Speak your Truth event and thanked Armando for hosting this event. She noted she was particularly pleased with the climate within athletics and how female student-athletes feel safe while they are within athletic complexes.

Chair Zaharis announced to the Committee she will be serving as chair for the 2022-23 academic year.

**VI. Athletics Department Searches – Grooms**

Grooms shared with the Committee the open assistant football coach position.

**VII. Subcommittee Updates**

**A. Academic Achievement – Vogan**

The Subcommittee has met twice since its last report, first on February 10, 2022. The Subcommittee received a presentation on the family engagement initiative, a pilot program unique to UI.

The second meeting took place on March 10, 2022. The Subcommittee was given a presentation on the Iowa Link Program. This is a campus-wide program, focusing on admitting students who may not reach the academic requirements for admission, but show promise and bring an element of diversity.

The next Subcommittee meeting will take place on April 14, 2022.

***B. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion – Lang***

Moudestou was the primary speaker at the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Subcommittee meeting last week, presenting the enclosed hiring report.

***C. Student-Athlete Well-Being – Torner/Voss***

The Subcommittee met on March 10, 2022; the main discussion was based on two potential revisions for the PCA manual. The first revision was regarding the transfer portal, the second on the NIL policy. The Subcommittee will visit the Soccer Complex and review further policies for their next meeting.

***VIII. Iowa Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (ISAAC) Report – Taiwo (represented by Harper Dunne)***

Dunne reported on the following ISAAC events:

- A.*** Members of ISAAC have submitted applications for 2022-23 positions.
- B.*** Addressed the Mental Health Summit on April 5, noting this is an area of importance to ISSAC. The summit was a great success with 100 individuals attending.

Barta reported on behalf of the group. He noted there is no new information coming at this time, the Division I Transformational Committee continues to meet and will be providing recommendations in August. The Big Ten continues to have parallel conversations, mentioning college athletics must be centered around academics.

***X. Athletic Director's Report – Barta***


Barta noted the following from the enclosed March sports report and schedules:

- A.*** Now have 11 Big Ten Championships over a two-year period, the most accumulated over two years in Iowa's history.
- B.*** The cumulative success with football, men's basketball, and women's basketball all in the Big Ten Championship has only happened one other time (2015-2016) in Big Ten history.
- C.*** Gymnastics reached the second round of NCAA's, which Larissa Libby has described as being equivalent to the sweet sixteen.
- D.*** Men's track and field won the Men's Big Ten Indoor Track and Field Championship.
- E.*** Caitlin Clark and Keegan Murray are continuing to receive post-season awards, they are both currently in the finalist pool for the Naismith and Wooden awards. Iowa is the only team to have both a women's and men's finalist for these awards.

Barta also spoke on athletic facilities, primarily the process associated with renovating facilities. He noted to the Committee facilities that are currently in the feasibility study phase.

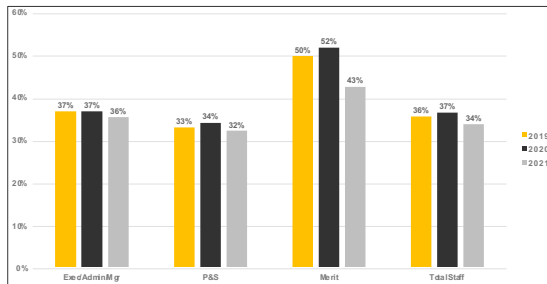

### Women Staff 2021: UI Comparisons

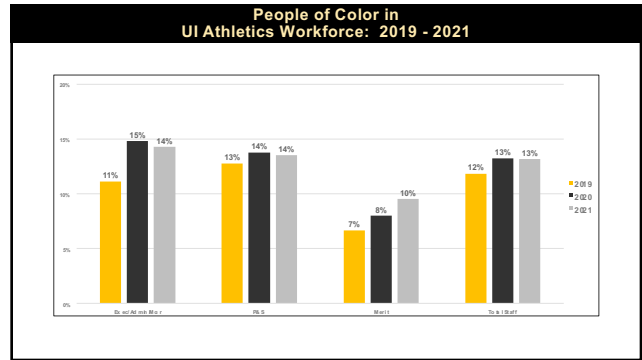

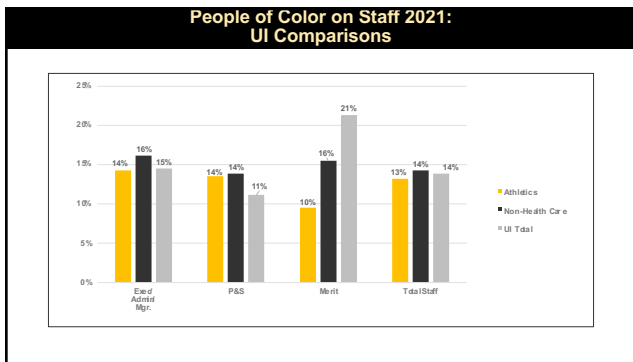

# APRIL REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

## **BASEBALL**

**Head Coach:** Rick Heller

**Season Record:** 14-10 Overall (2-1 Big Ten)

**Next Event:** Wednesday at Bradley at 6 p.m. - Peoria, Ill. - ESPN+; Friday-Sunday vs. Illinois - Iowa City, Iowa - B1G+

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes opened Big Ten Conference play by taking two of three games from Michigan last weekend in Ann Arbor in a battle of two teams picked to finish second and third in the preseason coaches' poll. The road series win at Michigan was the first since 2015.

Iowa is 7-3 over its last 10 games to improve to 14-10 overall.

The Hawkeyes' pitching staff has been spectacular, posting a 3.43 ERA and limiting hitters to a .186 batting average in 24 games. Iowa has 300 strikeouts in 212 1/3 innings and has only surrendered 142 hits. The team is leading the nation in strikeouts per nine innings, averaging 12.7 per game, while staff is second in the NCAA in hits allowed per nine innings (6.02).

Sophomore Ty Langenberg is 4-0 with a 1.86 ERA with 42 strikeouts to just nine walks. Iowa's rotation has settled in with Dylan Nedved (2-2, 4.35 ERA) and Adam Mazur (2-2, 3.60 ERA) joining Langenberg. Four different relievers have tallied a save.

Offensively, redshirt freshman Keaton Anthony is leading the team in batting average (.364), doubles (12) and RBIs (21), while tying for the team lead in hits (32). He is also second in runs (19), home runs (4), total bases (56), slugging (.636) and on-base percentage (.448). Anthony was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week for a third time on April 5. Redshirt sophomore Peyton Williams, meanwhile, is hitting .356 with 11 doubles, five home runs, 21 runs and 17 RBIs.

The Hawkeyes will play two straight home Big Ten Conference series, hosting Illinois and Minnesota the next two weekends.

## **MEN'S BASKETBALL**

**Head Coach:** Fran McCaffery

**Season Record:** 26-10 Overall (12-8 Big Ten)

**Notables:** Iowa won 12 of its final 15 games, including four straight games in Indianapolis to capture the 2022 Big Ten Tournament Championship.

The Hawkeyes tied for fourth place in the Big Ten standings and won 26 games overall, the second most in a single season in program history (30 in 1987).

Iowa earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament but was edged by Richmond (67-63) in the first round.

Iowa joins Michigan as the only schools to win multiple Big Ten Tournaments by winning four games in four days.

Iowa led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (83.2). The Hawkeyes have led the league in scoring five of the last nine seasons, including the last four. Iowa was tops in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.74); fourth in fewest turnovers per game (9.2); and seventh in turnover margin (4.4).

Twenty-one of Iowa's 26 wins came by 10+ points, including 12 by 20 points or more.

Keegan Murray ranked fourth in the country in points per game (23.5); 34th in field goal percentage (.554); 46th in blocks per contest (1.94); and 51st in double-doubles (10). Murray was a consensus first-team All-American, unanimous All-Big Ten, recipient of the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award, a six-time Big Ten Player of the Week honoree and was a finalist for the Wooden, Naismith, and Lute Olson national player of the year awards.

Murray became Iowa's single season scoring leader (822 points). After going 117 years without a player scoring 700 points in a single season, the Hawkeyes have had a player score over 700 points in each of the last three seasons: Luka Garza scored 740 in 2020 and 747 in 2021.

Murray tallied 20+ points 26 times and 25+ points 16 times this season, both of which ranked first nationally. Murray was voted the Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player after totaling a tournament record 103 points and 38 field goals made in four games in leading the Hawkeyes to their third tournament championship and first since 2006. He tied a Big Ten Tournament single game record with eight made 3-pointers (10 attempts), in a 32-point outburst in a semifinal win over Indiana.

The Hawkeyes put together one of the most dominating runs in Big Ten Tournament history, breaking six team single Big Ten Tournament records: total points (351); field goals made (123); field goal attempts (245); 3-point field goals made (48); 3-point field goal attempts (111); and assists (75).

In Iowa's second round victory over Northwestern, the Hawkeyes broke four Big Ten Tournament records: points (112); 3-pointers made (19); field goals made (43); and margin of victory (36). Iowa broke another school Big Ten Tournament game record in its quarterfinals triumph over Rutgers, sinking 92.6 percent (25-of-27) from the foul line.

Iowa tied Big Ten Championship game record for steals, equaling Ohio State's 13 set in the 2002 title game.

Bohannon, who earned honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition, won the 2022 Men's College 3-Point Contest held on March 31, in New Orleans. He became the second Hawkeye in six years to win the 3-Point Contest; Peter Jok was the last Hawkeye to compete in the event and was crowned champion of the 2017 event in Phoenix.

## **WOMEN'S BASKETBALL**

**Head Coach:** Lisa Bluder

**Season Record:** 24-8 Overall (14-4 Big Ten)

**Notables:** After Iowa was crowned Co-Big Ten Regular Season Champions on Feb. 27, the Hawkeyes went on to become the first team in program history to also win the Big Ten Tournament. Iowa defeated Indiana for the third time this season to win the tournament title.

Sophomore Caitlin Clark was named Big Ten Player of the Year and earned unanimous first team All-Big Ten honors. Senior Monika Czinano earned first team All-Big Ten accolades from the coaches and the media, and junior McKenna Warnock earned second team All-Big Ten Honors by the media and was honorable mention from the coaches. Redshirt junior Kate Martin was named Iowa's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

Clark and Czinano were also named to the All-Big Ten Tournament team and Clark was named tournament MVP. Clark was the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year and the Dawn Staley Guard of the Year. She was also named a Naismith finalist, WBCA Wade Trophy finalist and John R. Wooden Award finalist. She is a 2021-22 first team AP All-American, John R. Wooden All-American, WBCA All-American, USBWA All-American, WBCA All-Region and first team CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Czinano was named an AP All-America honorable mention and WBCA All-America honorable mention.

The Hawkeyes made their 14th consecutive postseason appearance (12 NCAA, 2 WNIT) when a postseason tournament was held, winning the NCAA Tournament First Round matchup over Illinois State, 98-68, and falling to Creighton, 64-62, in the second round.

## **MEN'S GOLF**

**Head Coach:** Tyler Stith

**Next Event:** April 16-17 - Hawkeye Invitational - Iowa City

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes placed seventh at the Wake Forest Invite (Mar. 7-8) and sixth at the Schenkel Invite (Mar. 18-20).

Junior Mac McClear tied for seventh at the Wake Forest Invite with a 54-hole score of 216 (+6). He shot an 18-hole 71 (+1) on the final day to secure his third top-10 finish of the season. Consistency was key for the reigning Big Ten champion, who tied for third in the field in par five scoring (-3) and seventh in par fours scoring (+6).

Junior Ronan Kleu led Iowa at the Schenkel Invite with a 213 (-3) 54-hole score to tie for 12th on the leaderboard. Kleu drained 16 birdies at the tournament, tying for the second most in the field. Freshman Ian Meyer was next, tying for 23rd at 217 (+1). Meyer posted 38 pars at the event, matching the sixth best total in the field en route to his first career top-25 finish.

## **WOMEN'S GOLF**

**Head Coach:** Megan Menzel

**Next Event:** Tuesday-Wednesday at Maryb S. Kauth Invite - San Antonio, Texas

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes are currently wrapping up their final regular season meet in the Lone Star State before heading to the Big Ten Championships in Pittsburgh at the end of the month.

In its most recent tournament, the Hawkeyes had a strong finish at the Chattanooga Classic, firing a four-under par 284 during the final round to move into a tie for 13th place. The 284 was the second-lowest round in program history.

Three players – Jacque Galloway (70), Paula Miranda (69) and Lea Zeitler (70) – finished under par during the final round. Galloway led the team, tying for 20th place with a 221.

## **WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS**

**Head Coach:** Larissa Libby

**Season Record:** 11-6 Overall (5-4 Big Ten)

**Next Event:** April 14 at NCAA Championships - Fort Worth, Texas

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes posted the second-best score in program history, finishing with a 197.075 at the NCAA Raleigh Regional Final on April 2. Iowa advanced to the Regional Final for the first time since 2004 after posting a 196.900 to finish second in the regional round. The Hawkeyes upset No. 6 LSU to advance.

Sophomore Adeline Kenlin scored a 9.950 in the Regional Final to earn a spot in the NCAA Championships as the highest scoring individual not from an advancing team. The Iowa City, Iowa, native is the first Hawkeye to qualify for the NCAA Championships since 2017. She will compete as an individual on the beam.

The Hawkeyes also performed well at the Big Ten Championships, placing third overall (out of the first session) with a 196.950. Senior Lauren Guerin defended her floor title, posting a 9.950 to become a co-champion.

Guerin, Clair Kaji, Bridget Killian and JerQuavia Henderson each earned All-Big Ten honors. The five honorees were the most for the program since 2017 and tied the most in a single season in program history. Guerin and Henderson, meanwhile, earned WCGA All-America honors on floor, both garnering second-team honors.

## **ROWING**

**Head Coach:** Jeff Garbutt

**Next Event:** Saturday at Pac 12 Invite - Las Vegas, Nev.

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes have competed in two events this spring - facing Harvard in Yale in New Jersey at the end of March and starting the month of April at the Sunshine State Invite in Sarasota, Fla.

Iowa won two races vs. Harvard, with the first Varsity Eight earning Big Ten Boat of the Week honors on March 30. The Hawkeyes followed that up with two wins in Florida, with the first Varsity Four earning Big Ten Boat of the Week honors on Tuesday.

## **SOFTBALL**

**Head Coach:** Renee Gillespie

The home run count for the season is currently at 13: Doster has five, Loecker has four, sophomore catcher Marissa Peek has two, junior infielder Kalena Burns has one, and sophomore outfielder Brylee Klosterman has one as well.

## **TENNIS**

**Head Coach:** Sasha Schmid

**Season Record:** 4-13 Overall (0-6 Big Ten)

**Next Event:** Friday at Maryland at 4:30 p.m.; Sunday at Rutgers at 10 a.m.

**Notables:** Iowa has faced a daunting schedule competing with only six players this spring after All-American Alexa Noel underwent season-ending surgery. Eight of the Hawkeyes' last 11 matches have come against ranked opponents.

Four of Iowa's defeats have come by a narrow 4-3 margin.

Freshman Barbora Pokorna and sophomore Vipasha Mehra lead the team with nine and eight singles victories, respectively. Freshman Marisa Schmidt has recorded seven wins – five on court one and two on court two.

Iowa will host the Big Ten Championships, April 27-May 1, at the Hawkeye Tennis & Recreation Complex.

## **MEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** Thursday-Saturday at Jim Click Invite (Tucson, Ariz.) and Sun Angel Classic (Tempe, Ariz.)

**Notables:** The Hawkeyes advanced a program-record nine individuals and the 4x400-meter relay to the NCAA Indoor Championships in Birmingham, Alabama.

Freshman Jenoa McKiver finished as the NCAA runner-up in the 400 meters, and freshman Chadrick Richards (6th) and junior Wayne Lawrence, Jr. (7th) also finished as first-team All-Americans. Those three and junior Julien Gillum finished as second-team All-Americans in the 4x400-meter relay. Senior Tyler Lienau earned first team All-America honors in the weight throw with an eighth-place finish.

Sophomore Austin West placed 10th in the heptathlon, sophomore Kalen Walker finished 13th in the 100 meters, and senior Nik Curtiss was 14th in the shot put, all earning second team All-America honors. Sophomores Gratt Reed (12th) and Grant Conway (15th) also finished as second team All-Americans in the 60-meter hurdles.

The Hawkeyes finished tied for 18th in the team race with 14 points.

The Hawkeyes jumped straight into the outdoor season. Walker took down the 100-meter school record at the Baldy Castillo Invite in his first outdoor race for Iowa (10.20) – breaking Justin Austin's record set in 2011. Indoor shot put school-record holder Nik Curtiss moved to sixth on Iowa's all-time outdoor list.

Last weekend at the Florida Relays, weather hindered the Hawkeyes' plans when Saturday thunderstorms rained out the meet. On Friday, Gillum (51.33) and freshman Drake Woody (52.24) each recorded career-best time in the 400-meter hurdles.

The Hawkeyes were also represented at the Stanford Invite last weekend where freshman Max Murphy (28:57.96) and sophomore Nick Trattner (29:39.83) ran the fourth and sixth-fastest 10K times in school history, respectively.

## **WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD**

**Head Coach:** Joey Woody

**Next Event:** Thursday-Saturday at Jim Click Invite (Tucson, Ariz.) and Sun Angel Classic (Tempe, Ariz.)

**Notables:** The 4x400-meter relay of junior Mariel Bruxvoort, seniors Payton Wensel and Mallory King and freshman Tesa Roberts qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships in Birmingham, Alabama, and finished eighth place to earn first team All-America honors.

Jumping to outdoor season, the women's 4x100-meter relay of sophomore LaSarah Hargrove, freshman Lia Love, sophomore Tionna Tobias and freshman Paige Magee ran the ninth-fastest time in school history, and senior Erin Dowd ran the fourth-fastest 400-meter hurdle time in school history.

Freshman Amber Aesoph ran a personal-best time (2:09.56) in the 800 meters at the Stanford Invite last weekend. At the Florida Relays last weekend, Hargrove moved to No. 4 all-time in the 200 meters (23.09) and Love jumped to No. 10 (23.64). Junior Mariel Bruxvoort (57.83), senior Payton Wensel (58.05) and Magee (58.48) ran the fifth, sixth and eighth-fastest 400-meter hurdle races in school history.

## **WRESTLING**

**Head Coach:** Tom Brands

**Season Record:** 14-1 Overall (7-1 Big Ten)

**Notables:** Iowa placed third at the Big Ten Championships (March 5-6) and third at the NCAA Championships (March 17-19). The Hawkeyes have won a team trophy at 13 of the last 14 NCAA Championships.

Senior Alex Marinelli won a Big Ten championship, becoming the eighth four-time conference champion in school history.

Iowa had five All-Americans at the NCAA Championships, including NCAA runner-up Jacob Warner. Warner placed second in the 197-pound bracket and earned his fourth All-America honor.

Marinelli and senior Austin DeSanto also earned their fourth career All-America honors. Iowa has 25 four-time All-Americans in school history.

Senior Michael Kemerer became the first Hawkeye in school history to become a five-time All-American. Kemerer placed fourth at 174 pounds.

Junior Tony Cassioppi also earned All-America honors with a seventh-place finish at 285 pounds. Iowa has had at least five All-Americans in nine straight seasons and 14 times under head coach Tom Brands.

Iowa set a national dual average attendance record in 2021-22. The Hawkeyes averaged 14,905 fans at each of their six home dates. All six dates were sellouts.

When official attendance numbers are officially announced following the season, Iowa will have led the nation in attendance for the 15th consecutive season. (Official attendance records were not kept in 2020-21.)
