III. President Wilson – opening remarks

President Wilson thanked Committee members for their commitment and emphasized the importance of their work for the Committee. She acknowledged Athletics as the university's corridor, bringing community members and students to the university.

Highlights were given on student-athlete and team success, graduation rates, and academic honors (with an overall emphasis on the student portion of student-athlete). President Wilson addressed the continuous change in intercollegiate athletics including Educationally Related Benefits, NIL, concussion initiatives, and mental health, noting how Iowa has focused and adapted to these topics.

President Wilson opened the floor to questions and comments, concluding with the following focuses for the Committee:

- **B.** Focus on the academic success of our student-athletes and the importance of obtaining a collegiate degree.
- C. Continuous conversations on the emerging issues in intercollegiate athletics.

- **D.** The importance of educating our student-athletes about NIL; bringing Michael Haddix to campus for multiple NIL education opportunities and emphasizing the Athletics Department's mission to "Do It Right".
- E. This summer the Big Ten Conference added USC and UCLA.
- **F.** New hires to the department in the areas of DEI, Mental Health, and Athletic Training.
- **G.** Exciting financial upside coming from the new television deal as well as the distribution of these funds; funds will start to be received during the 2024-25 year.
