Chair Zaharis called the meeting to order at 4:02 pm.

I. Approval of the February 28, 2023, PCA Minutes

Resiner made a correction to the February 28, 2023 meeting minutes as he was marked present but was absent. Pettys moved to approve the corrected February 28, 2023, minutes; Torner seconded the motion. Unanimous approval was recorded from the Committee.

II. Head Coach Introduction – Dave DiIanni, Women's Soccer

Chair Zaharis introduced Coach DiIanni giving acknowledgement to his success prior to and while at Iowa.

Coach DiIanni highlighted the programs new facility and now home for the women's soccer program. He acknowledged the facilities team that make Iowa's soccer field one of the best in the Big Ten Conference.

DiIanni then spoke on his team, noting he has a young team due to graduating 14 seniors. The team has spent time to develop the young group this spring.

The committee asked questions on the transfer portal, concussions in women's soccer, and recruiting.

The Subcommittee met with Liz Tovar to review the missed class policy. It was noted there is a shift transitioning from the allowance of 8 missed classes per team to per student-athlete. The Subcommittee also discussed the distribution of majors to ensure there is no formation of clustering by teams. It was noted there is a healthy distribution of majors.

B. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion – Torner

The Subcommittee met with Jennifer Modestou to preview the hiring report. Hiring processes and changes post covid era were discussed. The Subcommittee also reviewed diversity, equity, and inclusion external to the campus that could impact the University.

C. Student-Athlete Well-Being – Voss

The Subcommittee attended an ISAAC meeting this month. It was noted there is great support across all teams. The Subcommittee received feedback from student-athletes on policies around missed classes and travel related excused absences. A recommendation was presented from student-athletes for in-person mental health training for coaches.

IX. Athletic Director's Report – Barta


Barta highlighted the following success within the Athletics Department:

- A.** Women's basketball – Big Ten Tournament Champions and National Runner Up.
- B.** Iowa is one of six universities in the Nation to have Naismith Award winners in both men's and women's basketball.
- C.** Iowa is the only Athletics Department to be bowl eligible and have both men's and women's basketball teams reach the NCAA Tournament the past 3 years.
- D.** Iowa is the only Athletics Department to have consensus All-Americans in football and men's basketball the past 3 years and women's basketball the past 2 years.
- E.** Hawkeye fans sold out season tickets for football and wrestling this past year. Men's basketball and women's basketball had several single game sell-outs.
- F.** Women's basketball sold out the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament in just hours.
- G.** Football has seen 85-90% for renewals of season tickets and just under 2,000 new season ticket requests for the 2023 season.
- H.** Women's basketball has seen 7,000 new season tickets requests. Season tickets are currently on hold for the 2023-24 season.
- I.** Iowa has won 14 Big Ten Championships in the past 3 years; 11 of which being claimed in a two-year stretch from 2020-22.
- J.** Iowa student-athletes have averaged a GPA of 3.0 or higher in the past 8 years. In the past year 300 student-athletes have been named to the Dean's List or President's List.

K. Iowa Athletics Department has fundraised over \$65 million in the past 5 years for facilities.

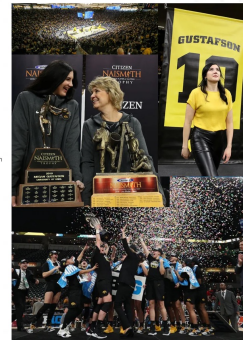
University of Iowa President Sandy Boyd elevates Women's Athletics to intercollegiate status.

Women receive funding for first ever uniforms, travel, meals, and release time for coaches who are instructors and graduate students in the women's physical education department.

The per diem meal limit was \$2 for an "evening meal" or \$4 if out of town for all three meals. The total budget for women's sports was \$30,000.

Dr. Christine Grant is named Women's Athletic Director.

Intercollegiate status programs include tennis, golf, volleyball, field hockey, fencing, basketball, softball, gymnastics, bowling, badminton, swimming, and track & field.



ELITE ERA

Beginning in 2010 the Hawkeye Basketball team appears in eight (8) NCAA Tournaments.

Ending the decade on a very high note, in 2019 the team captures the Big Ten Tournament title, advances to the Elite Eight, Megan Gustafson wins the Naismith Trophy, and Head Coach Lisa Bluder brings home the Naismith Coach of the Year award.

As part of their NCAA Tournament run, Iowa breaks the NCAA all-time attendance record for the first two rounds of the NCAA tournament with a combined two-day total of 23,096.

APRIL REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

BASEBALL

Head Coach: Rick Heller

Season Record: 20-6 Overall (1-2 Big Ten)

Next Event: Wednesday at Bradley at 6 p.m. – Peoria, Ill.

Notables: At the midway point of the season the Hawkeyes have a 20-6 record overall and a 10-2 record at home. The Hawkeyes got off to their best start in program history (19-3), passing the 1939 team which started 18-4. The Hawkeyes are led by graduate student Brennen Dorighi with a .368 batting average and 30 RBIs, redshirt sophomore Keaton Anthony has six home runs, and redshirt junior Kyle Huckstorf has 10 stolen bases.

The Hawkeyes have series sweeps over South Dakota State, and Western Michigan. They won one game against Texas Tech and one game against Maryland.

Sophomore Brody Brecht was named a midseason First-Team All-American by Perfect Game.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 19-14 Overall (11-9 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished their season tied for fifth place in the Big Ten standings and advanced to its fourth straight NCAA Tournament. Iowa, a No. 8 seed, fell to ninth-seeded Auburn in the first round of the NCAA Tournament contested in Birmingham, Ala.

Iowa led the league in scoring for the fifth straight year, averaging 80.1 points per game.

Iowa won 14 home games this season, marking the fifth straight season the Hawkeyes won 14 games or more inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa was 12-2 this season when it made nine or more 3-pointers in a game.

Six Hawkeyes earned postseason recognition. Junior Kris Murray was a consensus third team All-American, a unanimous first team All-Big Ten honoree, NABC and USBWA All-District, a semifinalist for the Wooden and Naismith awards, and a finalist for the Karl Malone Award. Senior Filip Rebraca was third team all-conference, senior Connor McCaffery and junior Tony Perkins were honorable mention all-league, sophomore Payton Sandfort was the Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year, while redshirt junior Patrick McCaffery was the team's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award recipient.

Murray finished his junior season averaging 20.2 points per game, marking the fourth straight year a Hawkeye has averaged 20 points or more; a program best. He was the only player in the country to average 20+ points, 7+ rebounds, 2+ assists, and make 65+ 3-pointers in 2023.

Connor McCaffery posted a 3.9 assist-to-turnover ratio, ranking No. 1 in the country. He also led the nation in that statistic in 2020. He finished his collegiate career winning 111 games played, tying for the most in program history.

Following the season, juniors Ahron Ullis and Josh Ogundele announced that they would be transferring.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 31-7 Overall, (15-3 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes just recently fell in the National Championship to LSU. It was Iowa's first appearance in the National Championship. Iowa also ended up knocking off six AP Top 10 teams which is the most in school history.

Most recently, junior Caitlin Clark was named a consensus National Player of the Year, sweeping all of the awards. The most dominant player in women's college basketball, she was voted the Big Ten Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. A unanimous first team Associated Press and All-Big Ten honoree, Clark also excels in the classroom being voted the 2023 Academic All-American of the Year. Clark finished the season averaging 27.8 points per game, 8.6 assists per game, and 7.1 rebounds per game. She became the first player in NCAA Division I women's basketball history to record 1,055 points and 320 assists in a single season. Both of which shattered Big Ten and school single season records.

In NCAA Tournament play, the Hawkeyes became the nation's favorite on a historic run including knocking off the No. 1 overall seed South Carolina to earn the opportunity to play for the National title.

Bluder has led the Hawkeyes to seven straight 20-win seasons and has won 14 or more Big Ten conference games in four out of the last five seasons. The 31 victories the Hawkeyes racked up this season was the most in program history.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: April 15-16 - Hawkeye Invitational - Iowa City, Iowa

Notables: Iowa competed in two events during the month of March, tying for fourth place out of 12 teams at the Wake Forest Invitational at Pinehurst No. 2 (March 6-7) and tying for eighth at The Johnnie-O at Sea Island (March 13-14). Senior Mac McClear tied for second at the Wake Forest Invite, drilling a final round 67 (-3) at the U.S. Open venue. Senior Ronan Kleu tied for ninth and sophomore Ian Meyer tied for 22nd to round out a strong Hawkeye showing at the event.

Iowa hosted the Calusa Cup earlier this week at Calusa Pines Golf Club. That field features eight Golfstat top-50 ranked teams, including four of the top five squads in the nation. The Hawkeyes placed ninth, with Kleu tying for 30th to lead the team.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: April 15-16 at Lady Buckeye Invitational – Columbus, Ohio

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished in a tie for 10th place at the Fresno State Classic, shooting a 54-hole total of 909 (300-305-304). Freshman Shannyn Vogler tied for 16th place with a 224 (71-77-76) to notch the second top 20 finish of her career. Senior Jordan Amelon tied for 34th with a 229, tying the best finish of the season.

Four underclassmen lead the team in scoring average this season. Freshman Riley Lewis has the top scoring average on the team at 74.95 over 24 rounds followed by Vogler (75.13), sophomore Paula Miranda (75.50) and freshman Madison Dabagia (75.96).

GYMNASTICS

Head Coach: Larissa Libby

Season Record: 8-3-1 Overall (6-2-1 Big Ten)

Notables: The Hawkeyes qualified to the second round of the NCAA Tournament competing in the Norman Regional. The Hawkeyes finished third in their session behind Alabama and Kentucky but ahead of Illinois.

This was the 23rd straight year that head coach Larissa Libby led the GymHawks to a NCAA Regional appearance (either as a team or individually).

Iowa hosted the Big Ten Championships at Xstream Arena on March 18. The Hawkeyes finished third in their session and eighth overall.

Senior JerQuavia Henderson was named a Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association second-team All-American on floor. Henderson is the third Hawkeye in the record books to earn three All-America distinctions, joining Alexis Maday (2002-04) and Lauren Guerin (2020-2022). She was a second-team selection in 2021 and 2022.

Henderson and junior Adeline Kenlin were named to the 2023 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics All-Big Ten Teams. Henderson earned first-team honors and Kenlin earned second-team honors.

ROWING

Head Coach: Jeff Garbutt

Next Event: Friday-Saturday at Big Ten Invitational - Sarasota, Fla.

Notables: The Hawkeyes are just getting underway in their spring championship season after competing in the Big Ten/Ivy League Dust-Up on the Cooper River.

Iowa's top placements came in the 1V4 and 2V4 boats, both placing second in their respective events. Both of Iowa's 1V8 and 2V8 came in third. Iowa competed against Ohio State, Syracuse, and Yale.

SOFTBALL

Head Coach: Renee Gillespie

Season Record: 22-15 Overall (4-4 B1G)

Next Event: Friday at Michigan State at 4 p.m. - East Lansing, Mich.

Notables: The Hawkeyes currently sit in sixth place in the Big Ten standings. They opened conference play at the end of March where they went on the road and took two of three games at Penn State, who at the time had one of the top pitching staffs in the nation. They then hosted Nebraska and #20 Northwestern at home. The Hawkeyes took one game from each team, who were both picked to finish in the top three in the conference in the preseason polls. Game three against NU ended in exciting walk-off fashion in the seventh inning for Iowa, as sophomore Tristin Doster delivered a game ending single to win it.

Senior Nia Carter is leading the team offensively through 37 games. She is hitting .449 and has 57 hits on the season, which both lead the conference. Junior Denali Loecker has 31 RBIs on the season which is tied for ninth in the Big Ten. The pitchers are led by senior Breanna Vasquez who has 11 wins to go with a 1.96 ERA (7th in the B1G).

TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid

Season Record: 8-7 Overall (3-2 B1G)

Next Event: Friday at Penn State at Noon (CT)

Notables: The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 57 nationally. Iowa won four of six matches, including three straight, during the month of March. Senior Samantha Mannix has won a team-best eight singles matches this spring playing at No. 2. After playing four straight home matches, the Hawkeyes finish the regular season with four of six on the road before competing at the Big Ten Championships at the end of the month.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Saturday at Fighting Illini Challenge - Champaign, Ill.

Notables: Iowa concluded the indoor season at the NCAA Championships in Albuquerque, N.M. Junior Peyton Haack finished fifth in the heptathlon, earning first-team All-America honors and breaking the school record with 6,048 points. Junior Austin West finished ninth with 5,965 points. Senior James Carter Jr. and junior Grant Conway earned second-team honors in their respective events.

The Hawkeyes recently broke three school records. At the Texas Relays, junior Austin Kresley broke the 100-meter dash record with a time of 10.19, while the 400-meter relay team of Kresley, and juniors Kalen Walker, Gratt Reed and Damoy Allen shattered the previous record with a new time of 38.70. At the Stanford Invite, distance specialist Max Murphy set a program record in the 5,000-meter race, setting the mark at 13:39.77 and crushing a record set in 2007 by a full 10 seconds.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Head Coach: Joey Woody

Next Event: Saturday at Fighting Illini Challenge - Champaign, Ill.

Notables: Iowa concluded the indoor season at the NCAA Championships in Albuquerque, N.M. Junior Myreanna Bebe tied her career best and school record 8.07 in the 60-meter hurdles to earn second-team All-America honors. Outdoor season began in Miami, with sophomore Lia Love highlighting the short sprints with an 11.10 personal record in the 100-meter dash. Her mark was good for second in the NCAA at the time.

Love climbed to second all-time in school history with her 11.21 finish in the 100-meter dash at the Texas Relays. The 3,200-meter relay of sophomore Jaiden Itson, and juniors Grace Bookin-Nosbisch, Clare Pitcher and Katie Moore raced to a time of 8:49.00 at the Florida Relays – good for fifth in program history. In California, senior Maddie Block ran a 34:44 in the 10,000-meter race, entering the record books with the 10th-fastest time in Hawkeye history.

WRESTLING

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Season Record: 15-1 Overall (7-1 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished second at the 2023 Big Ten Championships and 2023 NCAA Championships.

Iowa crowned two champions and had all 10 wrestlers finish in the top seven at the Big Ten Championships in Ann Arbor. Redshirt senior Spencer Lee won the 125-pound title for his third Big Ten title and senior Real Woods was the champion at 141. Lee was also voted the Big Ten Wrestler of the Year and Outstanding Wrestler of the Championships. He is the second Hawkeye all-time to be a three-time Big Ten Wrestler of the Year, joining Mark Ironside.

Iowa earned a team trophy at the NCAA Championships for the 14th time in head coach Tom Brands' 16 seasons. The Hawkeyes had six wrestlers earn All-America distinction in Lee (sixth), Woods (second), redshirt senior Max Murin (sixth), senior Nelson Brands (fifth), redshirt senior Jacob Warner (fifth) and senior Tony Cassioppi (fourth). Iowa has had at least five All-Americans in 10 straight seasons and in 15 of Brands' 17 years.

Lee and Warner became Iowa's second and third five-time All-Americans, while Cassioppi is the 25th four-time All-American. Woods' final appearance extended Iowa's finalist streak to 33 consecutive national tournaments (every year since 1990).
