NOVEMBER REPORT TO THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON ATHLETICS

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Fran McCaffery

Season Record: 6-1 Overall (0-0 B1G)

Next Event: Tuesday vs. Duke at Jimmy V Classic at 8:30

p.m. (New York City - ESPN)

Notables: Iowa has won six of its first seven games, including its first road game at Seton Hall (83-67) in the Gavitt Games. The Hawkeyes notched a convincing victory over Georgia Tech (81-65) in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Iowa concluded the Challenge winning eight of its final 10 games, including five straight at home. Coach Fran McCaffery has won 499 career games as a head coach.

Juniors Kris Murray and Patrick McCaffery were named to the Emerald Coast Classic All-Tournament Team on Nov. 26. Murray averaged a double-double in the two games in Florida, while McCaffery equaled a personal best with 21 points in Iowa's triumph over Clemson in the semifinals.

Kris Murray ranks second in the Big Ten in scoring (21.0) and rebounding (10.6) per game. Murray exploded for 31 points, 20 rebounds, four assists, and two blocks in Iowa's win over the Yellow Jackets on Nov. 29. Murray is the first Hawkeye to amass 30 points and 20 rebounds in the same game since Bruce King in 1977. He is also the only NBA, WNBA, or Division I men's or women's player in the last 20 years to total 30+ points, 20+ rebounds, 4+ assists, 4+ 3-pointers, and 2+ blocks in the same game. Kris and his brother Keegan are the only brothers in Division I in the last 20 years to each have a 20-point/20-rebounds performance at the same school.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Head Coach: Lisa Bluder

Season Record: 5-2 Overall, (0-0 B1G)

Next Event: Thursday vs. #12/11 NC State at 7:30 p.m. at

Carver-Hawkeye Arena (ESPN2)

Notables: The Hawkeyes won five games in November and set a new program scoring record on Nov. 10 after scoring 115 points against Evansville to surpass the previous record of 108 (12/31/19, vs. Illinois). Iowa is currently ranked 10th in the nation in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. The Hawkeyes were runners-up at the Phil Knight Legacy Tournament after falling to No. 3 UConn. Redshirt senior Kate Martin and junior Caitlin Clark were crowned All-Tournament Team.

All-American Caitlin Clark was named Big Ten honor roll on November 21st and 28th after scoring 20+ points in all seven games, surpassing Sabrina Lonescu for most career games scoring 20+ points, 5 rebounds, 5 assists. Clark ranks top five in the country for points (162), points per game (27.0), free throw attempts (55), and free throws made

(44.) She also recorded her 28th double-double at Kansas State on Nov. 17, where she broke the Bramlage Coliseum record for most free throw attempts made with 13.

Fifth-year Monika Czinano was named the first Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 14 after scoring 36 points and shooting 66% from the field in the team's overtime win against Drake on Nov. 13. She also recorded her seventh career double-double with 11 boards.

Clark and Czinano were also named to the Naismith Trophy Watch List and Wooden Award Watch List.

CROSS COUNTRY

Head Coach: Randy Hasenbank

Notables: The Hawkeyes finished their 2022 season at the NCAA Midwest Regional on Nov. 11 in Columbia, Mo. Seniors Emma Gordon and Konnor Sommer led the way for their respective races.

Gordon used a 20:37.1 personal best to pace the Hawkeye women to a 14th-place finish. Her time ranks seventh in program history, and her 18th place finish makes Gordon the third Hawkeye in the last 10 seasons to finish in the top 20 at the NCAA Midwest Regional.

Sommer led the Hawkeye men to a 17th-place finish in the 10,000-meter race. His personal record of 30:48.4 was a near three-minute improvement from last year's regional.

FIELD HOCKEY

Head Coach: Lisa Cellucci

Season Record: 12-8 Overall (4-4 B1G)

Notables: The Hawkeyes advanced to the Elite Eight at the NCAA Tournament for the 21st time in program history, finishing the year 12-8 overall. Iowa defeated No. 5 Virginia, 2-1, via a shootout in the Sweet 16 to advance to the Elite Eight where it fell in a shootout to No. 3 Northwestern, 2-1. Three Big Ten teams advanced to the Final Four with the Wildcats finishing as the national runner-up.

Three Hawkeyes – Anthe Nijziel, Esme Gibson and Lokke Stribos – earned All-Big Ten and NFHCA All-West Region honors.

FOOTBALL

Head Coach: Kirk Ferentz

Season Record: 7-5 Overall (5-4 B1G)

Next Event: Bowl game announcement, Sunday, Dec. 4 **Notables:** lowa closed the regular season with four wins in five games, becoming bowl eligible once again. The Hawkeyes are expected to be selected to their 20th bowl game under Moon Family head coach Kirk Ferentz on Sunday.

lowa's four-game winning streak including victories over Northwestern (33-13), Purdue (24-3), Wisconsin (24-10), and Minnesota (13-10), before the winning streak was snapped with a 24-17 loss to Nebraska in the final outing. lowa was the only team in the West Division to face both Michigan and Ohio State during the regular season, with the other three losses came by a total of 13 points.

Senior linebacker Jack Campbell was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and Linebacker of the Year to highlight Iowa's all-conference selections. Senior tight end Sam LaPorta was selected as the Tight End of the Year.

Nationally, Campbell is a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which will be announced Tuesday, Dec. 6. He is also one of five finalists for the Butkus Award, while LaPorta is one of three finalists for the John Mackey Award.

Other Hawkeyes who earned first-team All-Big Ten recognition include defensive backs Riley Moss and Cooper DeJean, and punter Tory Taylor.

MEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Tyler Stith

Next Event: Feb. 6 at Black & Gold Alumni Match Play at

Jupiter, Fla.

Notables: The Hawkeyes won the Iowa Fall Classic at Riverside. All seven Hawkeyes that competed finished top 25 on the leaderboard. Senior Mac McClear led the tournament wire-to-wire, shooting even-par (72) to finish at 214 (-2) through 54 holes. The former Big Ten Champion earned his third career medalist honor, outpacing the competition by three strokes. The Iowa Fall Classic marks McClear's second top-five finish in as many weeks. His three-career individual titles are the most since current Iowa volunteer assistant Steven Ihm achieved four medalist honors in 2014.

WOMEN'S GOLF

Head Coach: Megan Menzel

Next Event: Jan. 27-30 vs. Colorado at Seal Beach, Calif.

Notables: The Hawkeyes closed out their fall season with a 15th place finish at the Marilynn Smith Sunflower Invitational in Lawrence, Kan. The tournament was shortened to 45 holes due to weather. Sophomore Paula Miranda led the team, tying for 33rd place with a 196.

WOMEN'S SOCCER

Head Coach: Dave Dilanni

Season Record: 5-6-7 Overall (2-3-5 B1G)

Notables: Iowa registered its first ranked win of the season over No. 13 Northwestern in Evanston on Oct. 20. It was the fifth ranked win against a top-15 foe in program history. The Hawkeyes posted a record of 2-2-3 in the month of October. Senior Hailey Rydberg was named third

team All-Big Ten. Sophomore Ellie Otto earned the sportsmanship award for Iowa.

SWIMMING & DIVING

Head Coach: Nathan Mundt

Season Record: 1-2 Overall (0-2 Big Ten)

Notables: Sophomore Alix O'Brien won the 1,000 free with a career-best performance (10:18.21) and Sheridan Schreiber won the 100 breast (1:03.54) in lowa's sole event in November against No. 25 Minnesota. Thirteen additional individual bests were set against the Golden Gophers.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

Head Coach: Sasha Schmid **Next Event:** Jan. 20 at Charlotte

Notables: The Hawkeyes concluded fall competition in early November at the Watanabe Classic in Las Vegas. Freshman Pia Kranholdt and sophomore Marisa Schmidt each won two singles matches and one doubles match in the event.

WRESTLING

Head Coach: Tom Brands

Season Record: 5-0 Overall (0-0 B1G)

Next Event: Sunday vs. Iowa State at 1:30 p.m. at Carver-

Hawkeye Arena (BTN)

Notables: The No. 2 Hawkeyes won their fifth dual of the season, downing No. 21 Penn, 26-11, on Nov. 26 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa won seven of 10 matches in the dual, including three via bonus points. Junior Cobe Siebrecht closed out the meet with a fall at 157 pounds. Iowa is ranked in all 10 weight classes this season. Spencer Lee is No. 1 at 125 and the Hawkeyes boast a total of four wrestlers in the top five — Real Woods (3rd, 141), Tony Cassioppi (4th, 285) and Jacob Warner (5th, 197).

VOLLEYBALL

Head Coach: Jim Barnes

Season Record: 10-21 Overall (4-16 B1G)

Notables: Iowa closed out its season winning three of its last five matches. The wins came over Rutgers on senior day in sweeping fashion, and over Michigan and Michigan State, both in five sets. Senior middle hitter, Amiya Jones, finished the season ranking seventh in the Big Ten for aces per set (0.36) and 5th in the conference for total aces (40). Senior libero, Mari Hinkle, finished ranking 9th in digs per set (4.01) and total digs (405).
